## 'Resident' DA Bill Eyed

Legislation soon to be introduced by State Representative Allen Hightower could result in a resident District Attorney for Tyler County instead of the now cumbersome held positions of County Attorney and visiting District Attorney.

According to Hightower, "I have received a resolution from the Tyler County Commissioners, the County Judge and both District Judges. This bill creating a Tyler County District Attorney's office is an effort to clean up the felony docket. As it

is now the County Attorney tries only misdemeanor cases. In felony cases the District Attorney serves both Tyler and Hardin Counties. And there is beginning to be a backlog of felony cases."

"The new Tyler County District Attorney," Hightower said, "will prosecute both felony and misdemeanor cases. The current County Attorney Office would be abolished and the current County Attorney, Joe Smith, will become the Acting District Attorney until the next election in 1984."

## Temple Retires

DIBBLE, TEXAS "I think it is important to know the proper time to get off the stage, and in my opinion, this is it."

So spoke Temple Eustice in announcing his retirement January 15, after 45 years of guiding the company his grandfather founded 90 years ago in Dibble, Texas.

Temple, employed in 1917 as a bookkeeper at the company's retail yard in Lufkin, was named executive vice president in 1948 at the age of 28, and guided the Temple East Texas sawmilling operation through a series of expansions and new product developments to create one of the South's largest and most modern forest products operations.

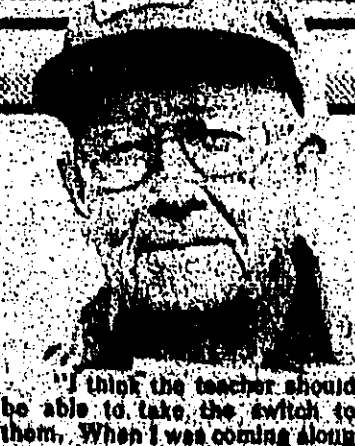

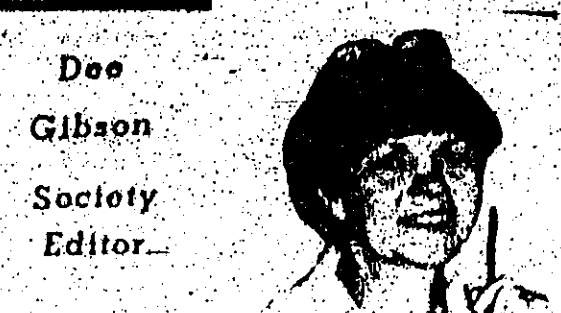

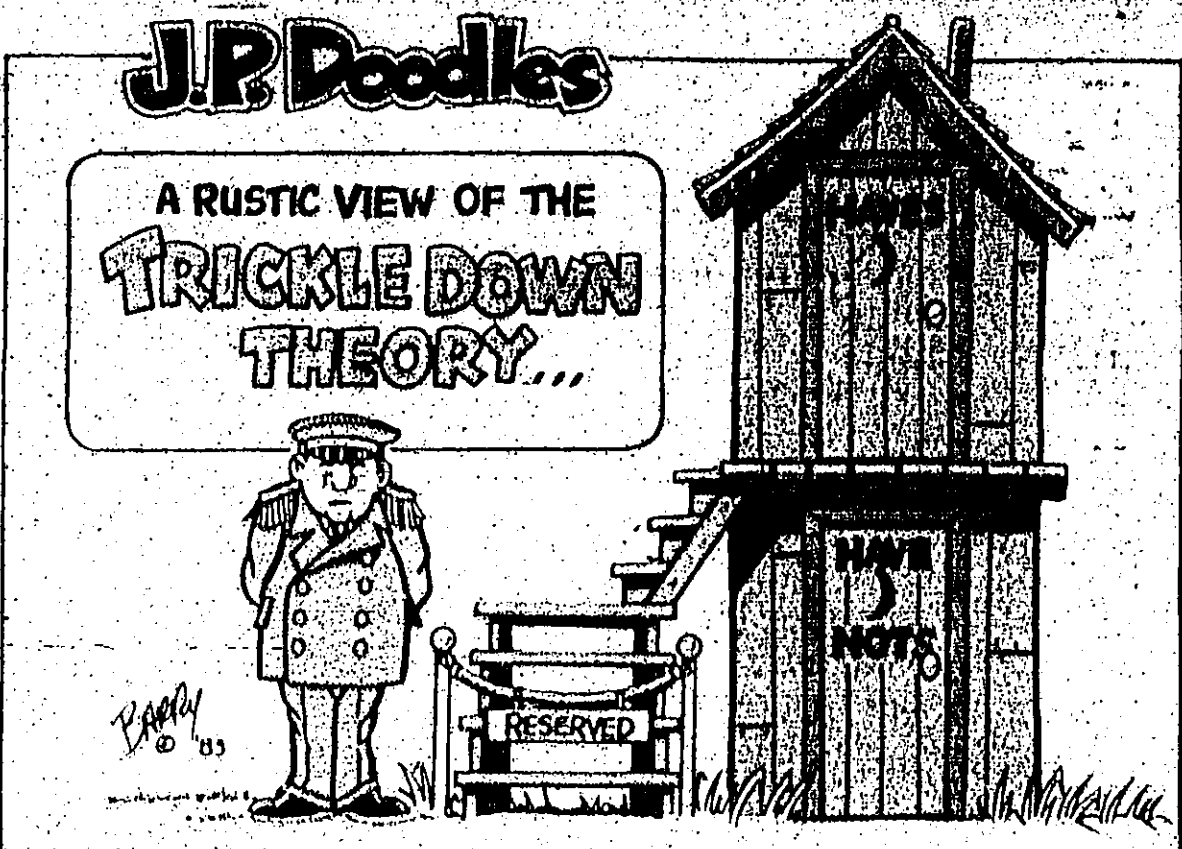

What started out in 1943 as a supplemental savings plan available to all wage earners has now become a major part of the retirement system. 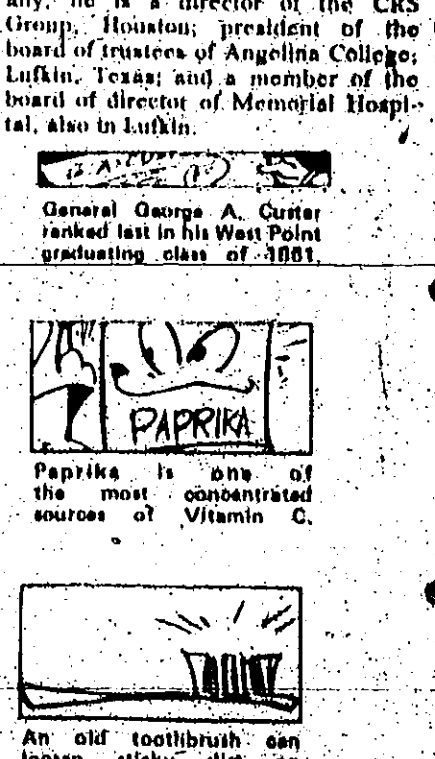

# Rockland Fact Sheet Issued By Engineers

The Fort Worth District Office, U. S. Army Corps of Engineers has issued this week a "fact sheet" describing the recently completed study of the Lake Rockland and Dam A projects of the Corps of Engineers.

The report is scheduled for only a limited public distribution. The fact sheet and accompanying map are the source for area newspaper articles which headline the "Rockland and Dam A project as 'active'."

The following is the text of the Rockland fact sheet.

Rockland and Dam A, Texas, Neches River, Texas. Review of Deferred Projects January 1983.

The purpose of this Fact Sheet is to present to all interested parties the results of studies that have been made during the last two years to determine if the Rockland and Dam A Lake projects should be reclassified from deferred to active status.

Project Descriptions  
Rockland would be a multi-purpose lake to provide for flood control, water supply, recreation, and hydropower. The project would be located in southeastern Texas in Angelina, Cherokee, Houston, Jasper, Polk, Trinity, and Tyler Counties, Texas, on the Neches River. The Dam A site would be located at river mile 182.0 on the Neches River, 15.9 miles above the confluence of the Angelina River, approximately 38 miles south east of Lufkin, Texas. The Rockland Dam site would be located at river mile 160.4 on the Neches River, 18.4 miles above Dam A and approximately 28 miles south of Lufkin, Texas.

History  
Rockland and Dam A Lake were authorized for construction in 1945 along with New Rayburn and B A Steinhagen Lakes. A report in 1947 recommended that the Rockland and Dam A Lake project be deferred to active status.

### Warren School Board In Lengthy Session

The Warren School Board met for a lengthy session on Tuesday, January 24, 1983. The board discussed various items including the budget, personnel matters, and curriculum changes. The session was held in the boardroom at the school campus.

The Environmental Affairs Committee has nine members with jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to air and water pollution, the creation, operation, and control of state parks; the regulation and control of the prairie and preservation of wildlife and fish in the state; hunting and fishing in the state; and the regulation and control thereof; the development and regulation of the fish and water industries of the state; and the following state agencies: the Texas Air Control Board, the Texas Coastal and Marine Council, the Texas Conservation Foundation, the Office of Gulf States Marine Fisheries Compact Commission by Texas the Veterans Land Board, the School Land Board, the Parks and Wildlife Department, the Battleship Texas Commission, the Texas Low Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Authority, and the General Land Office."

The various offices in the Capitol are of different sizes and shapes. When offices are vacated, they become available to other members on the basis of seniority. You have no doubt read a great deal about the political infighting as the staff of the Capitol makes for seasonal change in the Governor's office. The three most serious problems facing our state are money, money and money. In the latest estimate of revenue by the Comptroller, we have been told that we would have \$1 billion less than we had previously estimated. He also says that if any adjustments are made between now and the end of the session, they will be downward rather than upward. In the case, he has been in recent years. As I pointed out in an earlier report, the Legislative Budget Board has put down requests that exceeded estimated available funds by \$3.23 billion. The revised revenue estimate will mean that original requests will have to be cut by another \$1 billion. In a visit I had with Col. Jim Adams, the Director of the Department of Public Safety, I was told that stepped up traffic law enforcement resulted in over 400 fewer traffic fatalities last year. I am sure that increased enforcement of traffic laws will further reduce traffic deaths, especially those involving alcohol. I have received many letters urging me to support stiffer DWI laws and mandatory sentences. Some of these letters have come from people who have lost loved ones in alcohol related accidents. As I have stated many times, laws by themselves do not solve problems. Without strong enforcement of the laws, the problem is seldom eliminated. The Legislative Budget Board had approved an additional 75 DPS troopers in each year of the coming biennium. I believe this increase in the size of the traffic law enforcement division of the DPS will be at least as effective as increasing DWI penalties in reducing the carnage on Texas highways. We have the best trained state police force in the nation but we have never had enough troopers.



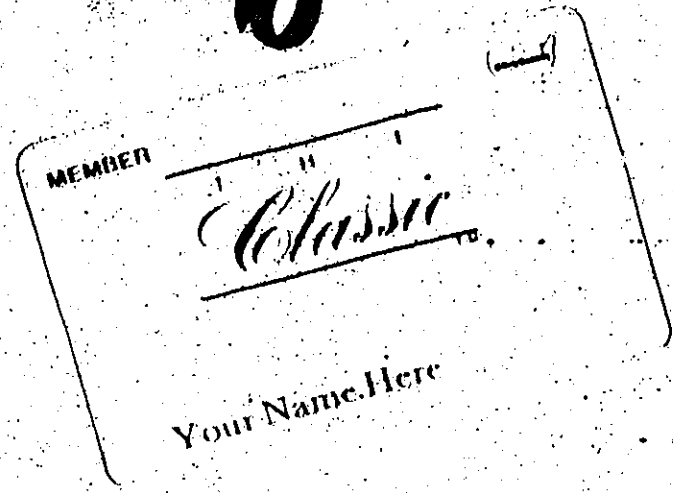

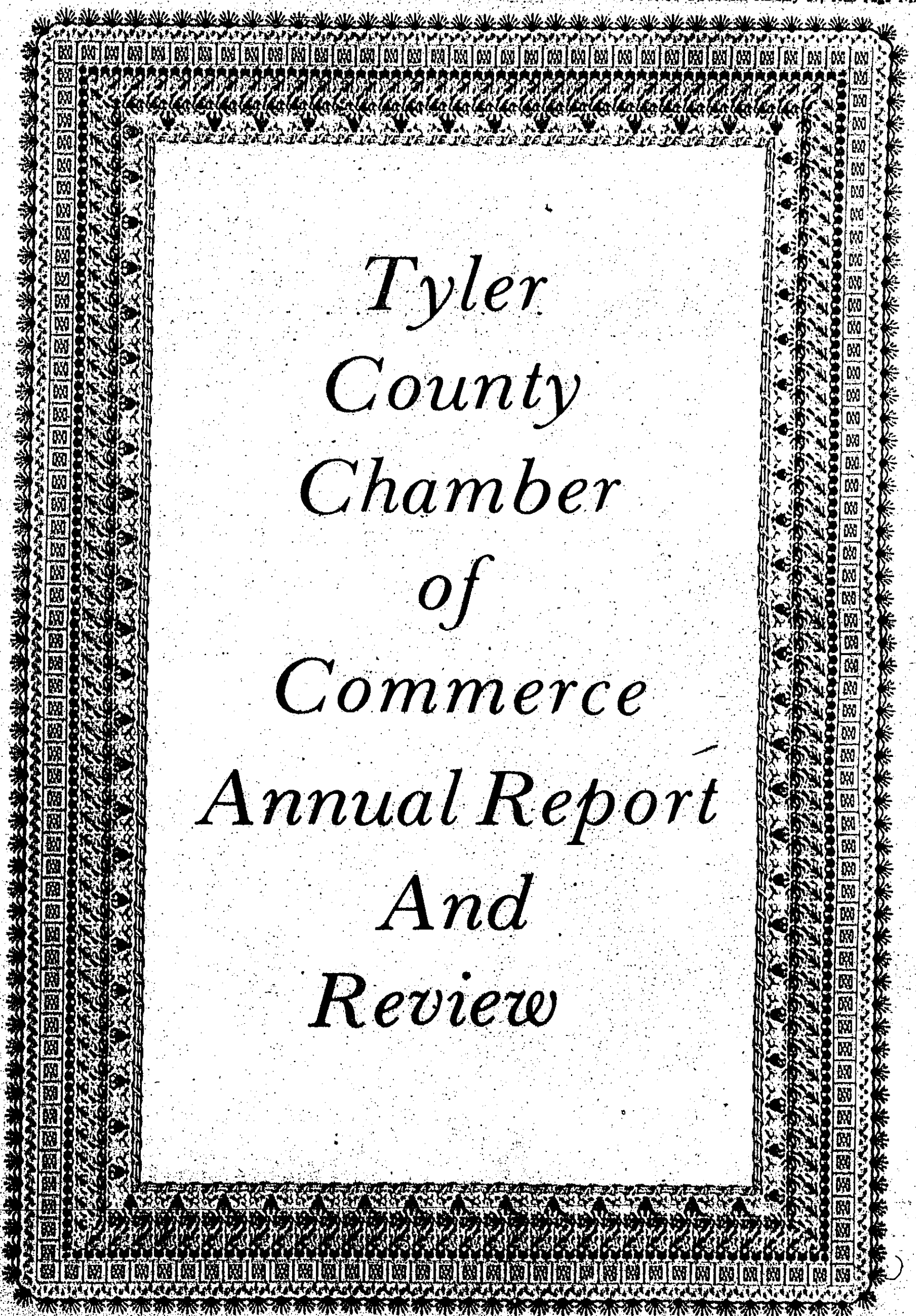

## Bradley Is 'Truly Outstanding'

The Woman's Reading Club of Woodville would like to nominate Mr. Aubrey Bradley, Superintendent of Woodville Independent School District for the honor of "Outstanding Citizen of the Year."

Mr. Bradley is married to the former Vera Welch and they have two daughters and one son. After graduating from high school, he served three years in the Navy during World War II. Mr. Bradley received his bachelor's and master's degrees from Sam Houston State University and has been in the school business for thirty-two years. He began his teaching career at Chester, Texas, in 1949 as a coach and taught American history, government, health, and biology. He drove a bus, taught six classes a day and coached all sports for both boys and girls. Later, he advanced to high school principal, still teaching and coaching.

Mr. Bradley served as superintendent from 1961 until 1974, still teaching three classes a day.
