DETDA Meets March 25

The first monthly meeting of the Deep East Texas Development Association for 1983 will be held at 10 a.m., Friday, March 25 at the First National Bank Meeting Room in San Augustine, Texas.

Dr. Kent T. Adair, who was installed as President of the Deep East Texas Development Association at the annual meeting, which was held at the University Center, SPASU, Nacogdoches, Texas in February, will conduct the meeting. Dr. Adair, plans to conduct this meeting with the idea in mind of setting up the various committees needed, their assignments and goals. Dr. Adair has a number of ideas to present to the membership and will elaborate on these in detail. He has expressed his hopes that in 1983 the Association will move forward, even more so than in the past, keeping in mind that the Deep East Texas Development Association will continue to strive for new ideas and will work

for the betterment of the area as a whole. This should be one of the most important meetings the association will have in 1983 and one all members should attend, if possible.

No More Third Party Calls Says Ma Bell

In an effort to reduce the number of fraudulent third-number telephone calls, Southwestern Bell is making a change in how some of those calls are handled.

Effective April 1, Southwestern Bell operators will no longer complete third-number calls from public telephones without verbal approval from someone at the billed number, said spokesman Gene Thacker.

In 1982, nearly \$175 million was

lost through 200,000 fraudulently billed third number calls in Southeast Texas, said Thacker.

These revenue losses must be borne by all customers, he said.

"We're trying to stop the cheaters and give the honest people the break they deserve," said Thacker.

The verification process takes about 35 seconds to complete, said Thacker.

Thacker stated that customers who frequently make third number

calls from public telephones would find a Southwestern Bell Calling Card a time and money saver.

Customers using the Calling Card can save as much as 50 cents on out-of-state or 75 cents on intrastate long distance calls over operator-assisted rates.

Thacker said the Southwestern Bell customers who do not have a Calling Card may apply for one by contacting the business office



Where Are Your Teepees?

Whether they're from as far away as London or Tokyo, or as near as Dallas or Houston, visitors to the Alabama-Coushatta Indian Reservation in West Texas sometimes ask for one direction their friendly hosts can't readily point to.

"Where... they inquire... are your teepees?" The native Indian guides have fielded the question so many times their patient reply is almost automatic: the Alabama and Coushatta tribes, you see, are known as Woodland Indians because they lived in the forests of wood. Their villages were built on a permanent basis, their houses were constructed of logs. Teepees were used by nomadic tribes (the Plains Indians, for example) to follow a game like buffalo.

Once they recover from initial disappointment that no teepees are in sight, visitors almost invariably express the wealth of information about Indians they gain during a stop at the Reservation which is fo-

undled in Big Thicket Country on Highway 190, between Livingston and Woodville, about 90 miles north of Houston.

Especially fascinating is the Living Indian Village in the Reservation's Tribal Interpretive Complex. During a 20-minute walking tour, the past merges into the present for the visitor as many of the ancient customs and traditions of the Alabama-Coushatta people are resurrected by their descendants.

An Indian guide shows the visitor through an exact replica of a woodland Indian log cabin and the activities of 150 years ago as well as through a native crafts village.

At the Reservation this week (February 29), residents are gearing up for the March 5 opening of the following weekend, the first of the season. Hours of operation during the spring are 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Reservations are made by calling the Reservation office at 283-3716. The Alabama and Coushatta Indians, members of separate

the Texas War for independence, is presented each year in the new "Sunset Outdoor Amphitheatre" at the Reservation. Performances this summer are scheduled at 8:30 p.m. nightly, except Sunday from June 17 through August 20.

Gov. White will continue a long standing tradition when he comes here this week to open the 1983 operating season of the Texas State Railroad Historical Park and Ride. The first train of the year - from Houston to Palestine.

The special Governor's Run will be staged Saturday, March 19, beginning at 3 a.m. Mrs. White and the three children will accompany the governor's committee. State and area officials, and numerous local and area citizens are expected to be here to greet the governor and his family.

Gov. White will speak here briefly before the train departs, and again before arrival at the Palestine Depot, Texas State Railroad Supt. Curtis Pruitt also noted that the Governor will be given an opportunity to tour the engine cab and try his hand at "blowing the whistle" during his visit to this popular state park.

At Palestine, the Governor and his party will be greeted by city, county and area officials as part of the kick-off to the annual Deepwood Festival, staged there the last two weekends in March and the first weekend in April.

Plans call for the Governor and his party to fly back to Austin about an hour after arrival at the Palestine Depot.

Gov. White is the third Texas Governor to visit the park, which began the steam-railroad in this century. The steam-trains, which offer 50-mile round trips from both depots, operate Saturdays and Sundays only during the spring and fall. During the summer, from May 30 through August 28, the trains run five days a week, Thursdays through Mondays. The 1983 season will end on Oct. 30.

Both trains leave the depot at 11 a.m. and return at 3 p.m., with an hour lay-over at the opposite depot for lunch. Prior to departure, passengers are given an opportunity to tour through the engine cab to see the inside of the old steam locomotives and to visit with the train crew.

Because of the popularity of the trains, reservations are recommended, noted Supt. Pruitt. Reservations may be made by calling 214-683-2361 or 1-800-442-8551. Fares for the ride are \$8 for adults and \$4 for children 3-12 years.

Leaders of the two communities urge area residents to share in this season kick-off by greeting the Governor and other state officials at the two depots. The schedule calls for the train to leave Rusk at 11 a.m. and arrive in Palestine at 12:30 p.m.

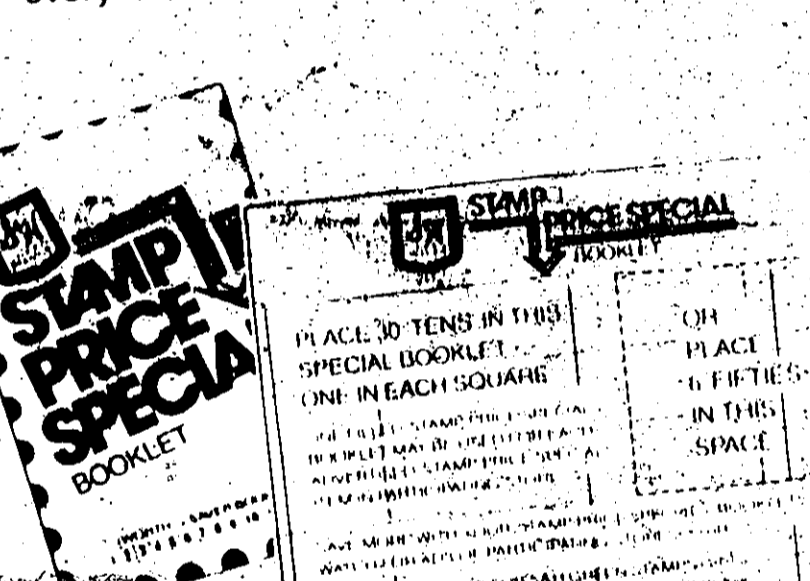



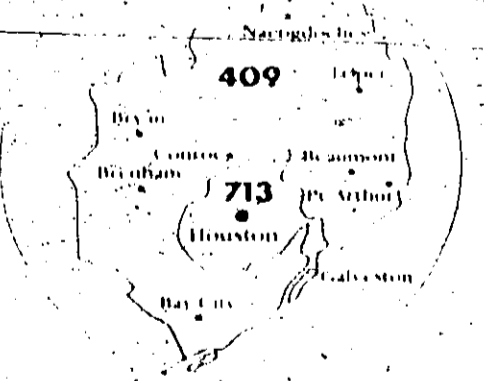

Beaumont Judge Jack Brookshire Will Lead Dogwood Parade

Chosen as Dogwood Queen and Parade Marshal, 58th District Court Judge Jack Brookshire of Beaumont knows Tyler County and its environs well.

Brookshire was born in Beaumont in 1921 attending local schools and graduating from Beaumont High School in 1938; having served as President of the student body during his Senior year. He was Valedictorian of his graduating class.

His pre-law work was taken at the University of Texas, where he was elected to several honorary scholastic societies. While a Junior, he was elected to Phi Beta Kappa, the oldest honorary scholastic fraternity in America. He served as a Quiz Master at the University's law school, where he took his L.L.B. Degree and later was awarded a Doctor of Jurisprudence Degree. His Bachelor of Arts Degree was with honors.

Brookshire served as a crash boat officer with the United States Navy in the Atlantic in World War II. Crash boats were mainly engaged in rescuing Naval aviators downed at sea.

Brookshire ran for his first full term as judge of the 58th District Court in 1962. Since then he has been re-elected to that bench for four more terms, each for four years, without opposition.

Prior to 1961, he had served for two full terms as judge of the Corporation Court of the City of Beaumont. He also served three years as United States Commissioner, having been appointed to that Federal Judicial post by Judges Joe Sheehy and Lamar Cecil. Additionally, he had served as Commissioner in Admiralty and Trustee in Bankruptcy in the United States District Court for the Beaumont Division of Texas.

The Docket of the 58th District Court has mainly been of a civil nature, but Brookshire also shared the Criminal Court docket with retired Judge George Taylor and also the current Judge, Larry Olat, during Olat's first term.

In addition to the criminal docket, Brookshire has presided over a large number of proceedings involving delinquent and neglected children, under the new Family Code of the State of Texas.

Prior to Judicial service, he had been engaged in the general practice of law in Beaumont since the end of World War II.

He is a member of the Continuing Legal Education Committee of the 2nd Administrative

Judicial District of Texas and has delivered papers and talks to the Judicial section.

Brookshire has worked under chairman District Judge, Pete Salito of Houston, Harris County, Texas on the Continuing Education committee for seminars held twice a year at Huntsville for all the judges of Texas with

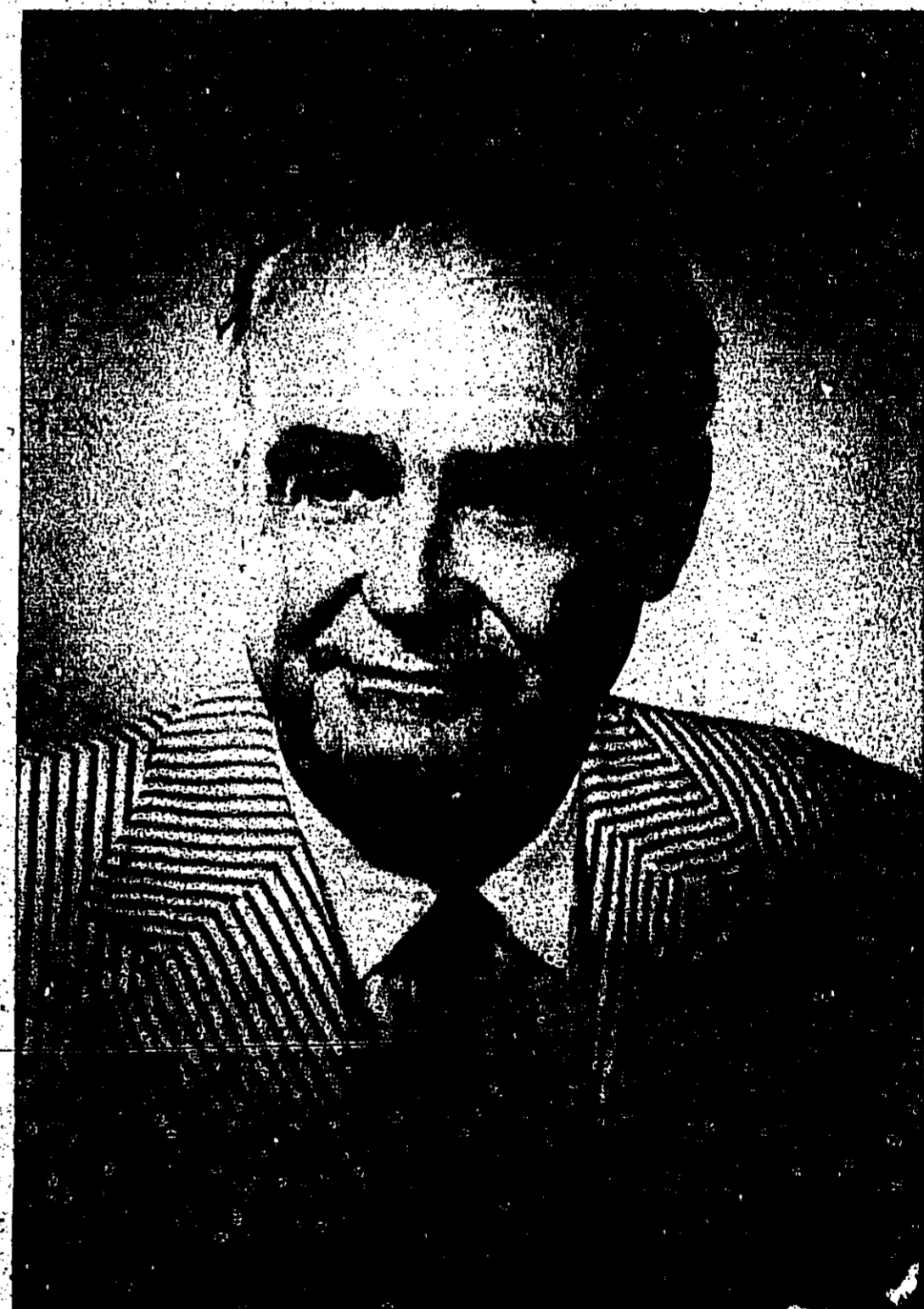
special emphasis on the criminal law for and especially for the judges of the 2nd Administrative Judicial District of Texas.

He is a member of the committee, The Commission on Social Concerns and Past Chairman of the Committee on Social Concerns of the First United Methodist Church in Beaumont. He also has

been Judge of Oratorical Contests sponsored by the Veterans of Foreign Wars of the American Legion as well as Lamar University.

He is a member of the Lions Club and the First United Methodist Church. He has been active in many civic affairs.

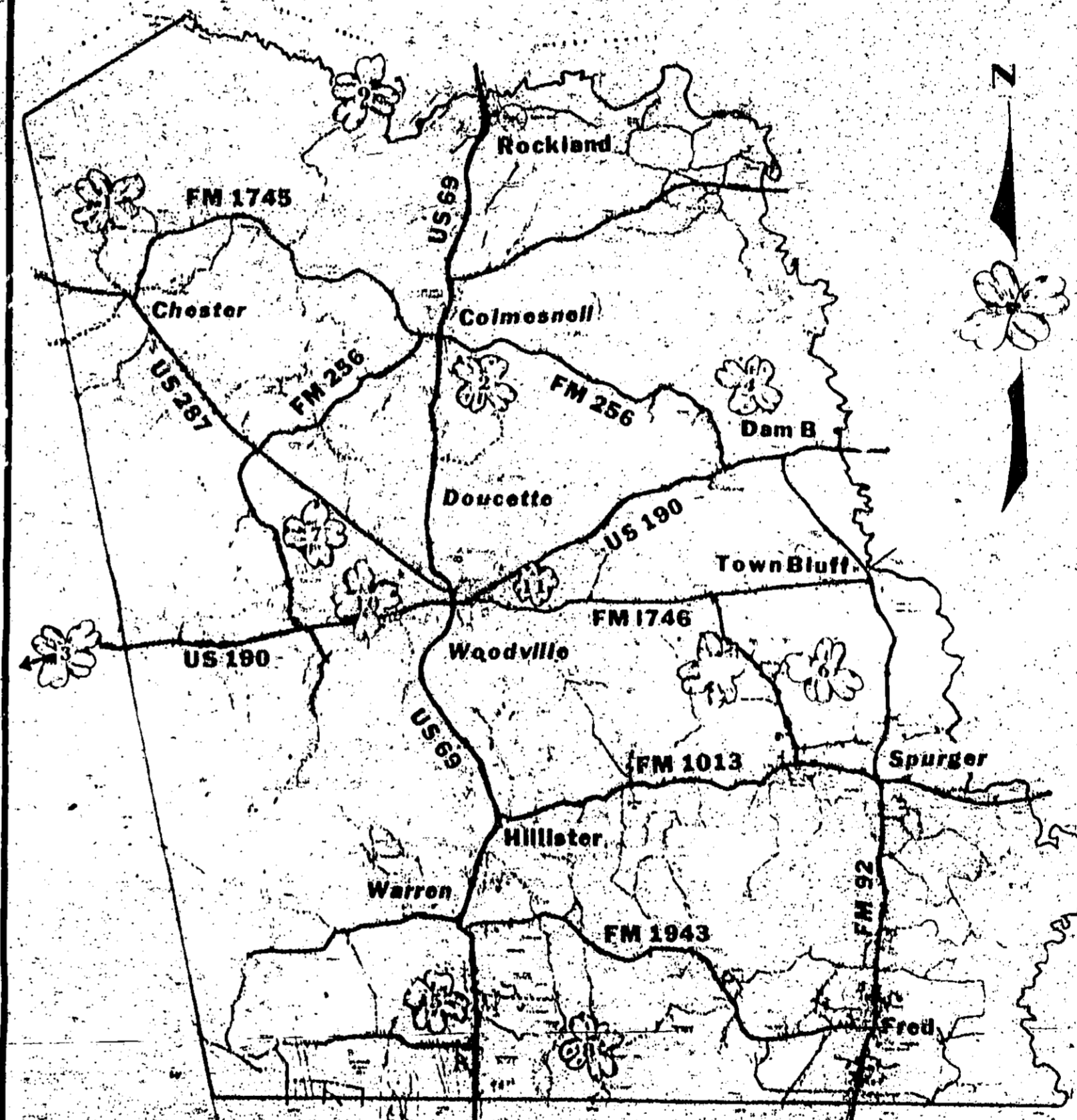

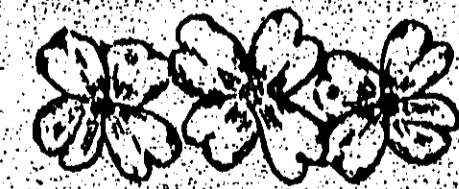

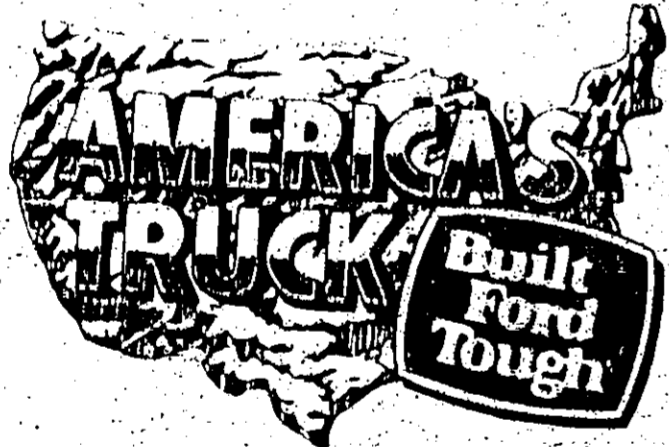

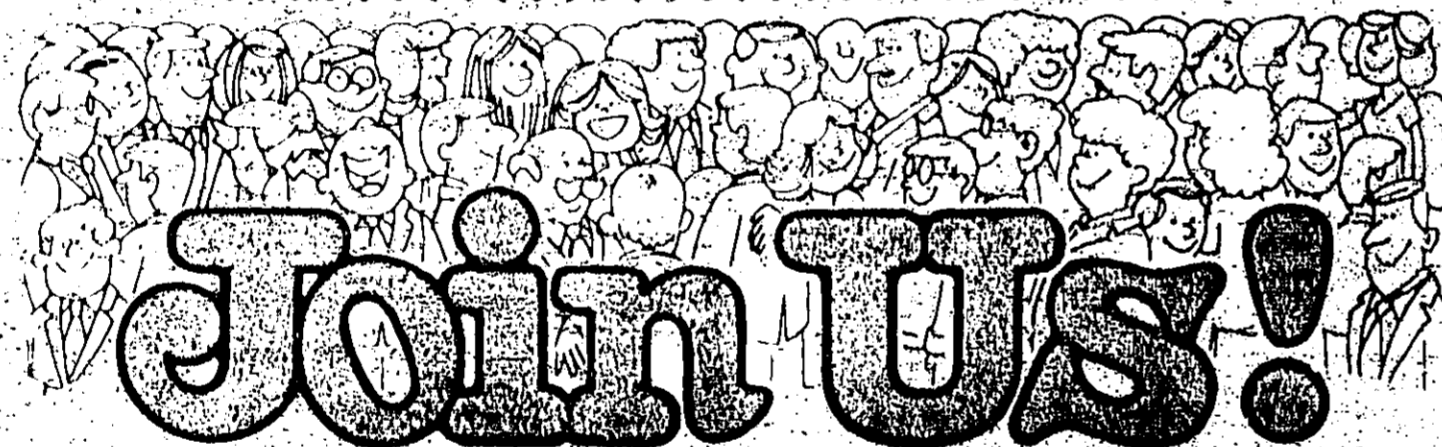
Woodville Princess Is Ama Durham

'Mr. East Texas' Is Schmucker

Widely known for his progressive work in the field of agriculture and civic work, C. L. (Charlie) Schmucker, 73, of Beaumont has been selected as "Mr. East Texas" by the Tyler County Dogwood Festival Board of Directors.

Schmucker was born in Nappanee, Indiana in 1910. His family then moved to Hamshire-Winnle community, Jefferson County, Texas in 1918 where they farmed rice, figs, dairy, watermelon; in fact any crops that could be sold during the 1920's and 1930's.

Father, the Rev. S. J. Schmucker, was a layman minister in the Methodist Church and often held services in the East Texas communities of Buns, Kirbyville, Beamway, Call, as well as Sabine Pass, High Island, and Port Dolivar.

He is married to the former Nola Mae Jewell of Jacksonville, Cherokee County, Texas since 1935 (48 years); a now retired school teacher, formerly very active and an officer in the Beaumont and Texas Classroom Teachers Organ-

ization. They have one daughter, Linda, a teacher in Pasadena (Texas) public schools and also a history instructor in Houston Community College.

Schmucker graduated from Winnle High School in 1926 and entered Lamar Junior College in 1932 where he was a member of the first football team to be called the Lamar Cardinals. He graduated from Lamar Junior College in 1934 and then graduated from Texas A&M College in 1937 where he earned a B.S. Degree in Agricultural Education and a M.S. Degree in Agricultural Education and Horticulture in 1948.

Schmucker has taught in field of vocational agriculture 17 years at Bellville, Texas; Yoakum, Texas; Beaumont, Texas; and Texas A&M University.

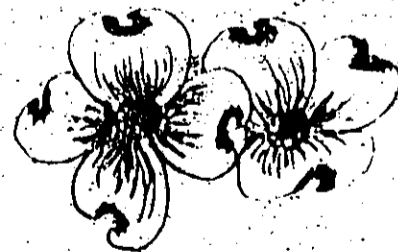
