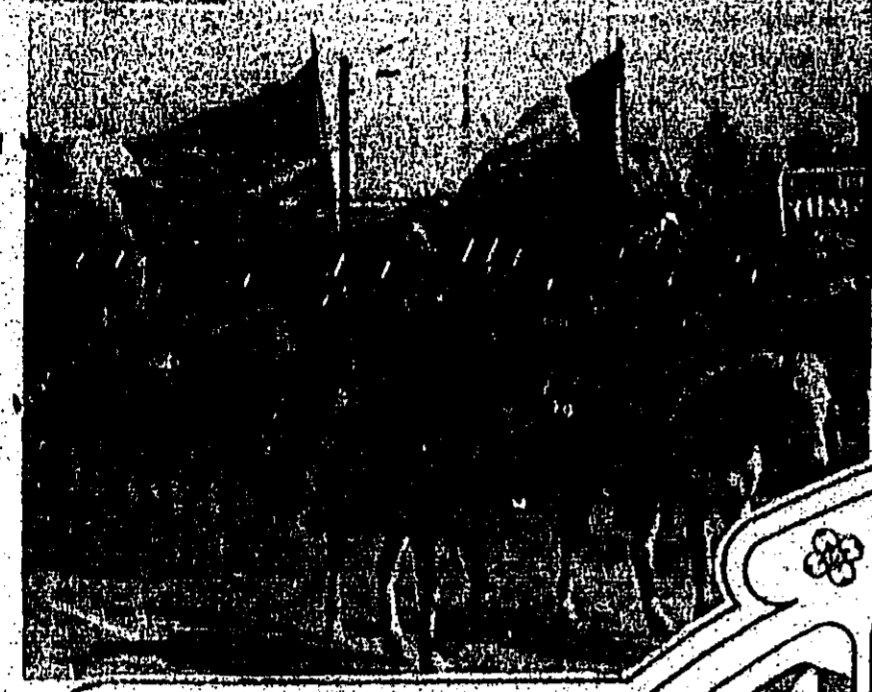

Says Local Land Appraiser, Morris Clemmons Lake Rockland: Major Growth Stimulus

By John L. Tompkins Lake Rockland will be the single major development in the area which will encourage the growth of this area in the future. I am all for it and have been for it all along. This includes when I served as the Chamber of Commerce Manager from 1950 to 1963. Says Morris Clemmons, Woodville realtor, insurance agent, appraiser and civic leader, Rockland Lake and Dam is the recently reactivated U.S. Army Corps of Engineers project which, if built, could result in a 22 mile long, 3 mile

wide lake covering 126,500 acres of land in six East Texas Counties including the northern border of Tyler County. The Corps of Engineers area the reservoir functioning as early as 2000 as a water supply for the Neches River Valley and the Houston Metropolitan population and industries. Lake Rockland would also operate as a source of relatively inexpensive hydro-electricity, reduce the severity of flooding in residential areas south of it, and offer a wide variety of rec-

reation benefits including wilderness hiking and camping to visitors and area residents. Construction is projected to begin, if funded by Congress or by local entities as early as 1990 by Corps of Engineers or as late as 2004 by Texas Department of Water Resources. Cost of the project is estimated in 1982 dollars at a total of \$650 million. Clemmons is currently working as an independent fee appraiser under contract with the National Park Service in the Big Thicket Preserve.

I am reappraising property which was originally appraised but not purchased several years ago. We have been working on the Big Thicket for about 7 years and I think over 80 percent of the total project has been acquired. The acquiring of land has been delayed because the appropriations are on an annual basis and land is acquired as funds become available. Like highway right-of-way and the Big Thicket Preserve, Rockland will be an eminent domain. Whoever builds it even if private industry

builds it they will have the privilege of eminent domain. Now the appraisal process that has to be used will be that a person is going to receive a fair value for what is purchased. One of the federal laws which have eliminated rights of the people whose land is taken is that the landowner may have the right of relocation, that is, Clemmons added, "the right to land equal or better than their present property." 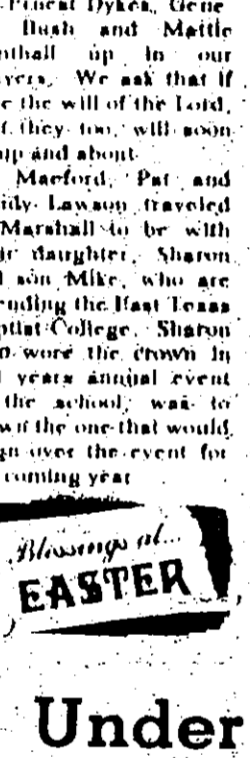

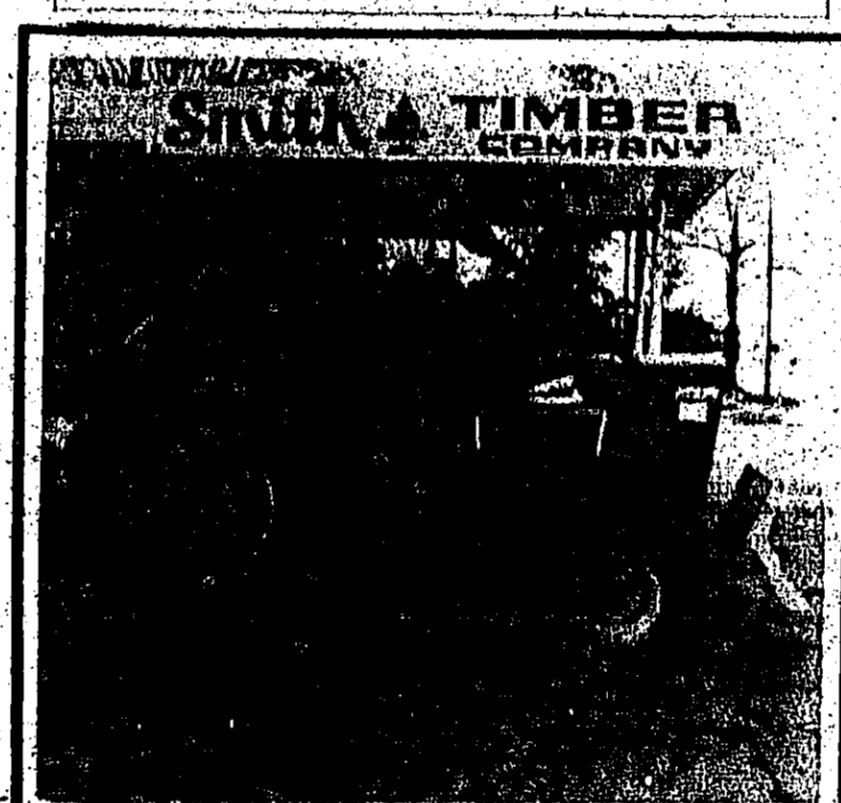

Warren School Calendar Issued

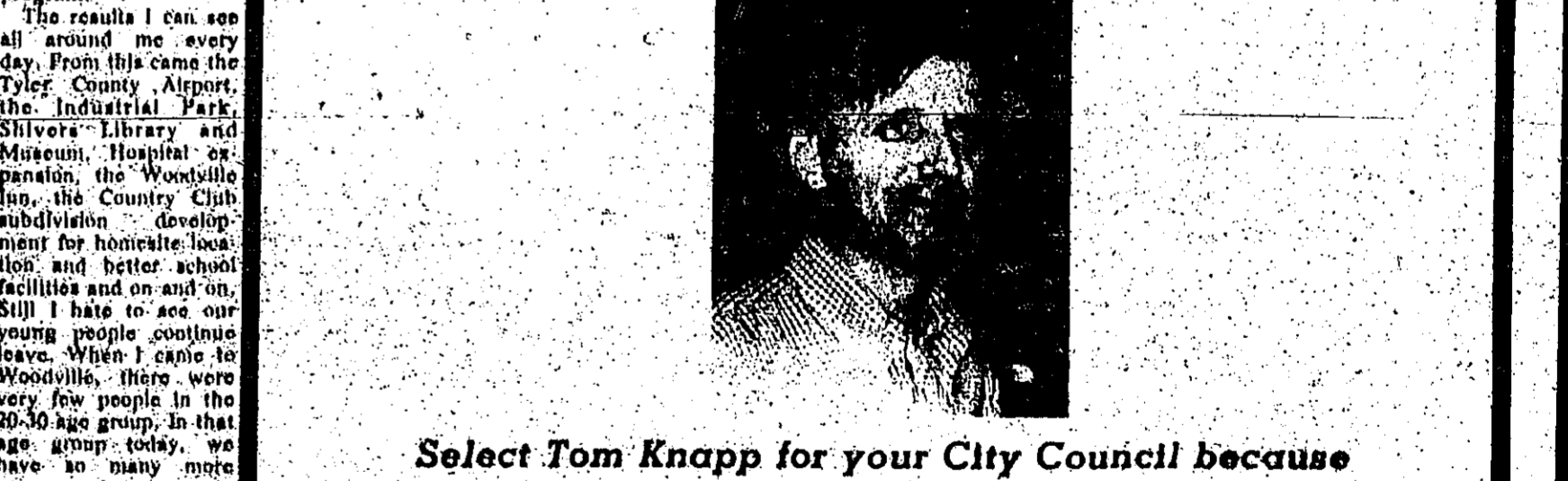
