The bank will create a sidewalk on the northern side of the tract on the West Bluff Street.

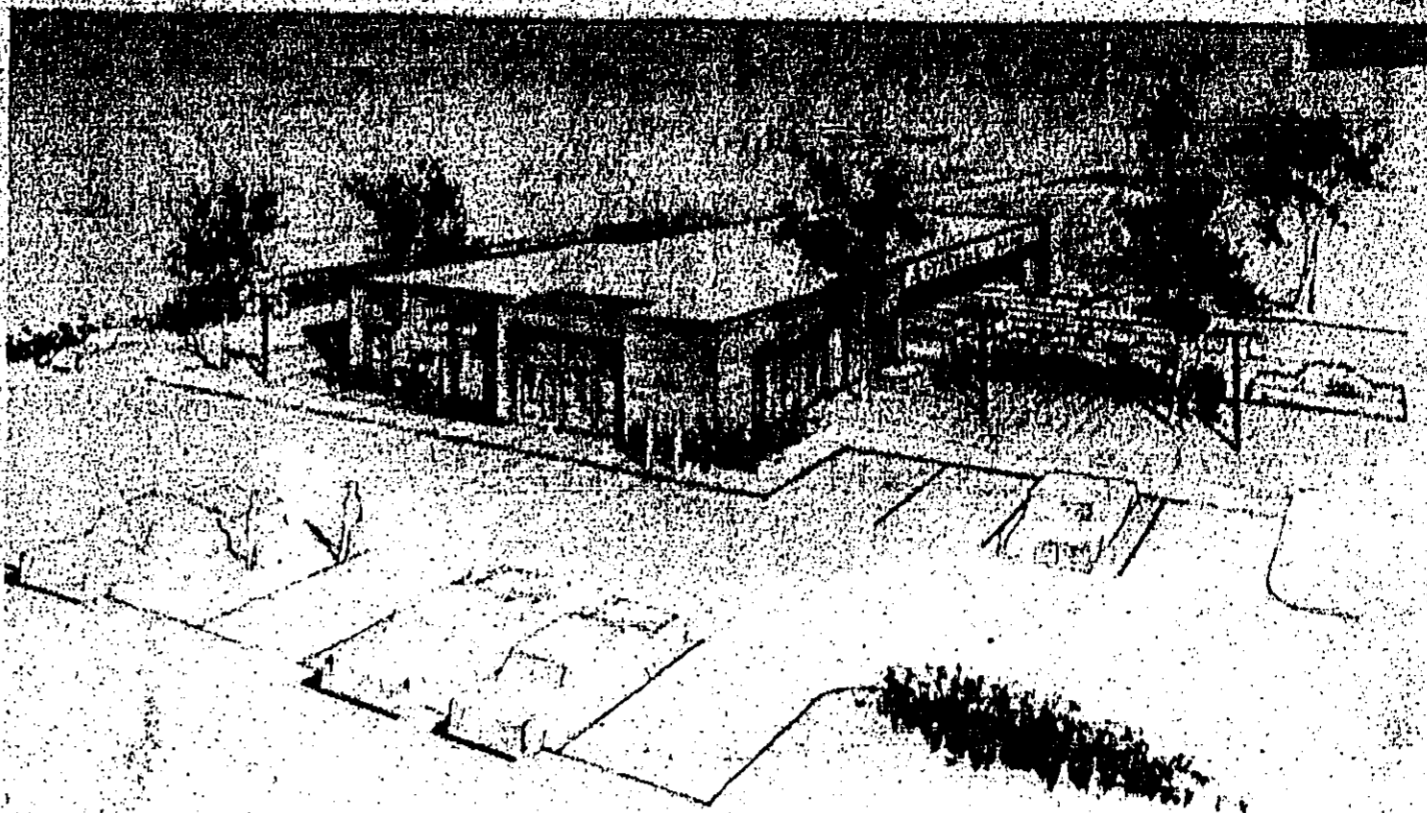
According to Coker there will be a lobby facility for walk-in use and provisions for a bank officer's desk.

Deal Still In The Works

Keller Industries Sale In Progress

Keller Industries of Woodville may be under new ownership soon if reports in Monday's Wall Street Journal prove accurate, as that leading financial news paper reports that Keller, Inc. of Miami, Fla. had negotiated an

oral agreement for the sale of all the outstanding stock from the company to a group of five investors.

Keller Industries has 3,459,890 shares outstanding and its reported that the transaction will be based on a value of \$24.25 a

share. Total transaction will involve \$83.9 million.

A group of five investors, according to a story in the Miami Herald says that Citicorp Capital Investors, Ltd. of New York and Dugald Plotcher, a private investor, will package the

deal. Keller Industries of Woodville issues a weekly payroll amounting to \$50,000 with a total yearly payroll output of \$2.6 million. Currently there are 275 employees at Keller of Woodville.

The manufacture of aluminum windows and furniture sold that negotiations are continuing to reach agreement on other terms of the sale. The transaction is subject to the approval of the board and other holders of Keller Industries stock, but as yet a date has not

been set. Hank Keller, controlling interest owner in the company, visited Woodville in January 1981 he said. To show up against the downturn trends in company sales caused by a recession in the housing

business. Keller, who is known as a maverick in the manufacturing business saw his company trim down its operation from 67 to 29 sales warehouses and from 20 to 15 manufacturing plants.

Cancer Drive Underway

Over one-half million Texas will be surveyed during April by American Cancer Society volunteers in determining local health and cancer awareness.

Some 40,000 ACS volunteers will conduct the survey door-to-door as part of the Society's annual educational and fundraising "Cancer Drive."

The results of the statewide project will be used to plan the organization's educational campaigns geographically. This is somewhat of a departure for ACS, said Charles Layzell, M.D. of Houston who is spearheading the study as a member of the state Division ACS Public Education Committee.

"Once these totals are compiled, we'll be better able to plan what our educational emphasis should be in certain parts of the state," Layzell added.

"If the survey totals in a particular area of the state indicate that few of the men have had just examination for colon rectum cancer, then we can try to boost our educational program on that site for that particular area, whether it be Dallas or Houston."

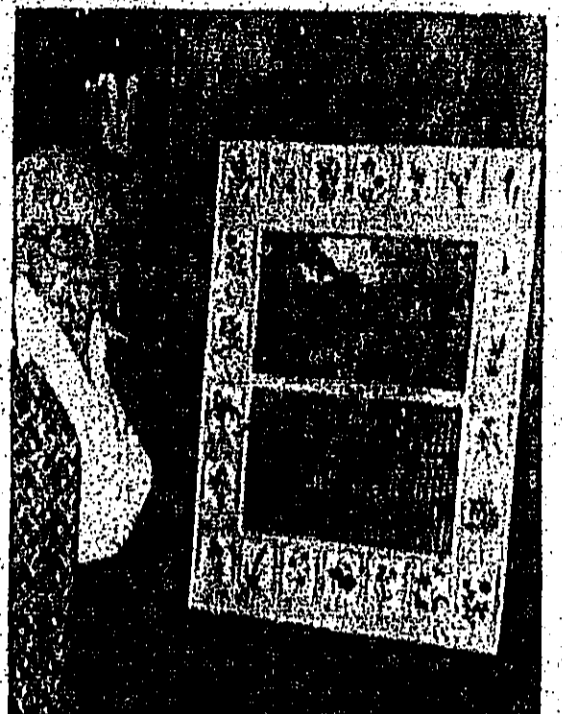

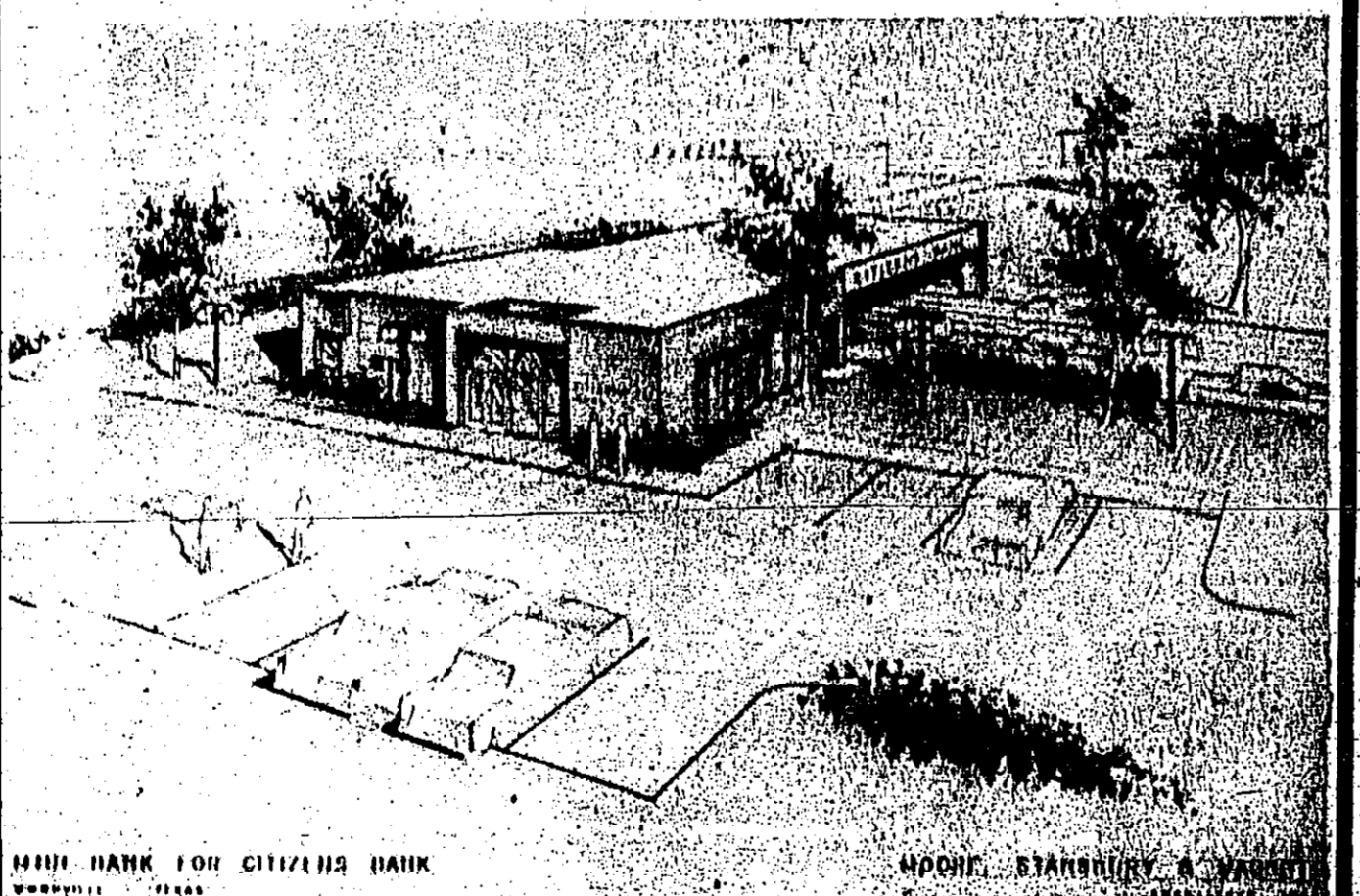

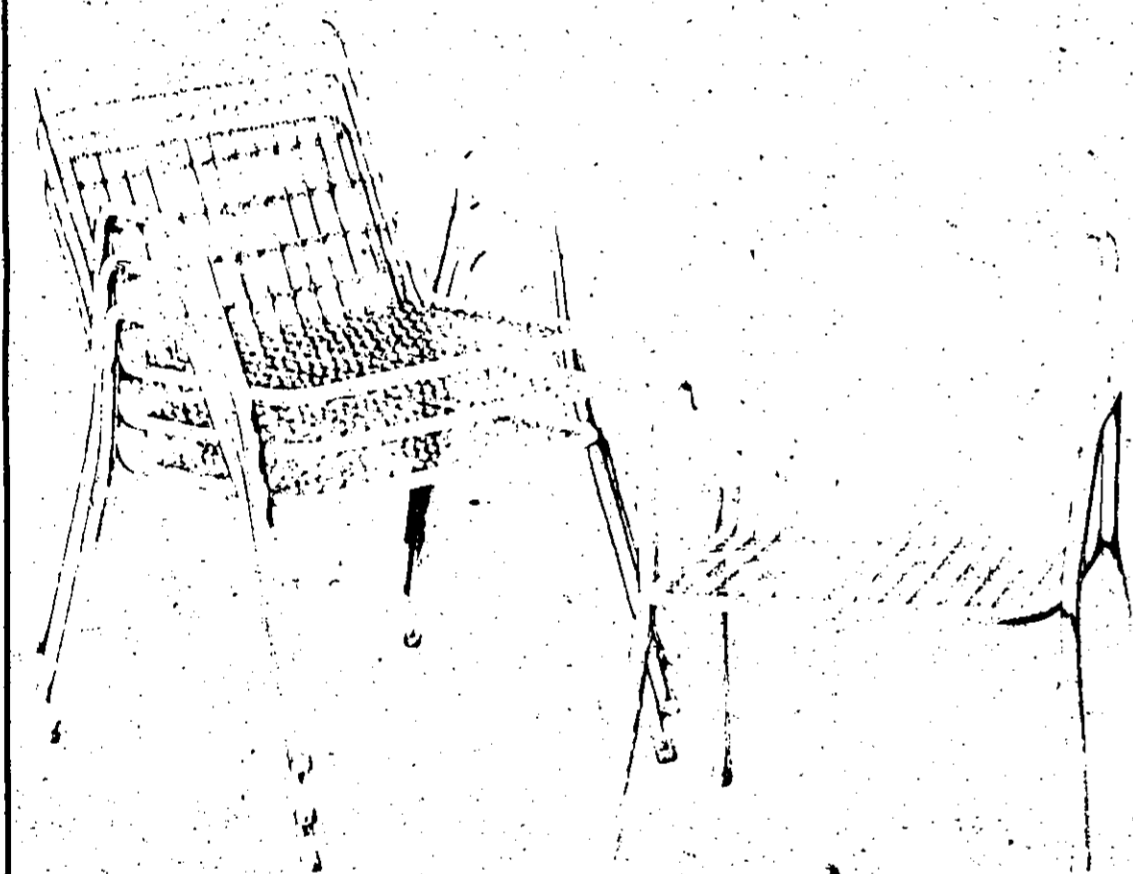
