# Citizens Mini Bank Sets Fall Opening

An all new 3,000 square foot modern "Mini-Bank" is scheduled for completion according to John Coker, President of Citizens State Bank here, within 180 calendar days.

The new 5-lane expandable drive-in facility will help lend customer ease in banking transactions. The bank now has two night drive-in stalls which will be removed at the opening of the new facility.

According to Coker the drive-in equipment will be expandable to include two additional

lanes as the bank and the community of Woodville experiences growth.

All drive-in lanes will be protected from inclement weather.

The new Mini-Bank facility will have a night depository and will offer a special lane for commercial use only. There will also be special adapted higher lanes for use by trucks and travel trailers.

The vehicles coming through the teller areas will exit onto either Wheat or West Bluff

Streets. Entrance will be made from the Reid Street side of the new bank facility.

The bank will create a sidewalk on the northern side of the tract on the West Bluff Street.


According to Coker there will be a lobby facility for walk-in use and provisions for a bank officer's desk.

The land around the facility will be landscaped to include ground water sprinklers.

The facility will be well-lighted with parking in front of the building.

Coker said the bank will move the IMPACT machine from its present location behind the bank over to the new Mini-Bank for the benefit of local customers and for traveling tourists who will be coming through Woodville.

The steel and masonry structure should be completed in 180 days Coker said. Hours of operation will be from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. on Mondays through Thursdays with 8 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. the hours of operation on Fridays.

## Keller Industries Sale In Progress

Keller Industries of Woodville may be under new ownership soon if reports in Monday's Wall Street Journal prove accurate, as that leading financial news paper reports that Keller, Inc. of Miami, Fla. had negotiated an

oral agreement for the sale of all the outstanding stock from the company to a group of five investors.

Keller Industries has 3,459,890 shares outstanding and its reported that the transaction will be based on a value of \$24.25 a

share. Total transaction will involve \$83.9 million.

A group of five investors, according to a story in the Miami Herald says that Citicorp Capital Investors, Ltd. of New York and Dugald Plotcher, a private investor, will package the

deal. Keller Industries of Woodville issues a weekly payroll amounting to \$50,000 with a total yearly payroll output of \$2.6 million. Currently there are 275 employees at Keller of Woodville.

The manufacture of aluminum windows and furniture sold that negotiations are continuing to reach agreement on other terms of the sale. The transaction is subject to the approval of the board and other holders of Keller Industries stock, but as yet a date has not

been set. Hank Keller, controlling interest owner in the company, visited Woodville in January 1981 he said. "To show up against the downturn trends in company sales caused by a recession in the housing

business." Keller, who is known as a maverick in the manufacturing business saw his company trim down its operation from 67 to 29 sales warehouses and from 20 to 15 manufacturing plants.

### Alan Miller's T-WHEELER

This is one of those times when we wish we had more information. But one of those all too familiar items on the news is the other evening read got us wondering about the credibility of the federal safety inspection of American automobiles.

We've all seen Detroit's pride and joy being checked into factories with plastic detectors circling around the passenger compartment. And gasoline tanks expelling their violent collisions.

It left us with the impression that auto designers might have a little more homework to make a safer automobile.

Then came the nagging thought. Should General Motors be held really responsible for careless design? Or should it be designed to perform well under normal driving conditions.

Adv. five year old kid with access to his Dad's tool box could dismantle a lawn mower in a matter of minutes. Is the manufacturer responsible? And after some driving you can see in seven years and put a hundred thousand miles on it should GM still be standing there ready to make the repairs to your "perfect" constant equipment?

The short news item brought on the tube went one step beyond what we've discussed so far.

The question was whether or not the auto housing on certain General Motors products were subject to failure. Would the auto actually pull away from its housing and leave you hanging down the highway on three wheels?

The picture we saw was a test track somewhere here. The car in question was traveling at high speed, executing hard turns in all directions. And to like the average commuter on the Eastern freeway, you've got the picture.

After going through this driving torture for a few seconds, we were in a close-up of the right rear wheel and axle enough, the wheel and axle pull away, and the rest of the car is a shambles of sparks as the brake housing meets the pavement.

For years you've been conditioned to believe that Detroit makes automobiles out of recycled tires and rag pickers collect from the roadside. But for the most part auto workers don't really care about quality, and for heaven's sake never buy a car that was built on a Monday in Frisco because the assembly line workers are tired out of their minds.

But here's the kicker: the little episode we just described. We may not have this technology correct but as we understand the comments, there is a lot that both the wheel and axle implies. It's there to prevent what the television film portrayed. And the federal inspectors, after being challenged by General Motors when they saw the film, said they would remove the car out on the test to show what would happen under those circumstances.

Why for heaven's sake? Why simulate a potentially dangerous situation that would not be met under normal maintenance?

The fact that they are saying we're wrong with the film that they did not indicate in the film that they had tampered with the car was just together. But they had told Detroit that they should consider recalling some millions of cars produced in as long as seven years ago to see if that problem existed.

Now all of this in small portions in the news. But all of us like to think that whatever we buy is a quality product. But to say the manufacturer by a damn rag as this "sit episode" would seem to indicate does put the whole federal safety program under a cloud.

We don't remember ever seeing any federal inspectors standing on the docks in Long Beach or Houston tampering with the Hondas and Datsuns before those cars tumbled off to the shops here.

Maybe we've been conditioned to the point that we really believe the Japanese cars would run on three wheels, and if Detroit was half smart they'd figure out how to build a car that would do the same thing.

Now it's shown to this. If every manufacturer is going to be responsible for maintaining everything he sells or more conditions from the day it was purchased we are laying it out with a couple of items that will test their patients.

We have had the same shaving brush for the past 12 years. The hair handle is not the height white it was when new. The bristles are not as pliable as they were. But it had a few bristles from time to time, and when just a few more disappear we're going to write the Huntington Shave people and demand a new one. You remember Huntington Shave? The people with the old higher signs written in rhyme.

You've never seen them except in old movies like Tobacco Road and Grapes of Wrath? Come to think of it, we haven't seen any ads for Huntington Shave for twenty years or more.



# Boons Crossing...at high water is seen looking from the north side of the Neches River.









**Intended Land Use Deadline Set May 1**

The Agricultural Utilization and Conservation Service recently closed the signing period for the 1983 wheat, feed grain, upland cotton, and rice program. Farmers will now be preparing to report their crop acres to the agency.

Tyler County farmers have until May 1, 1983 to report the acres and intended uses of their cropland. Small grain crops which are not reported by the deadline will be ineligible for program benefits.

She said some farmers reported their small grains when they signed up for the 1983 average reduction and land diversion program, and some reported other spring seeded crops.

ASCS randomly checks farms to verify that the average reports are accurate and also provides aerial photographs for farmers to identify their fields.

The average reports are used to determine compliance with farm programs and also serve as a basis for the 1984 program base acre for farms according to Mrs. Isaac.

Farmers who have not reported their fall seeded crops are urged to do so by May 1, 1983. The local ASCS office is open from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m., Monday through Friday.
