## City Gas Rate Dips

Woodville City Council heard a report from City Manager Walt Davis Monday which reported "For the first time since I've been employed by the City of Woodville, Tennessee Gas has announced a decrease in the price of gas."

Davis said Woodville customers will get a pass through decrease in the cost of that service here, sometime in June.

In other action the council heard a

request from Lloyd Fortenberry for permission to hook onto city water, sewer and gas lines for the anticipated construction of a 30 to 40 unit housing subdivision located several hundred yards from the west city limit line on Hwy 190.

The council agreed to the development request but not without considerable discussion on the idea of annexation and the taxpayer burdens that

would have to be carried by residents currently living inside the city limits but who could be bearing some of the costs of those who live outside the city limits.

Lloyd Fortenberry said that "There's no room for growth inside Woodville now. There is nowhere to build because there is no land available."

"What persons are getting by becoming members is free ambulance service," Greenup emphasized.

The enrollment for the service at

the \$30 rate will extend only through the month of May, Greenup said.

Since the establishment of the service six years ago the Association has "bought and paid for two new ambulances and all the equipment that's on board."

This year husband and wife, Teresa and Nate will become paramedics and thereby will have to obtain and learn how to use sophisticated equipment such as heart monitors, defibrillators and electronic intravenous pumps. The team will also become skilled with new respiratory equipment.

One of the most important pieces of legislation Congress will pass this year is the Budget Resolution which sets spending levels and revenue requirements.

The House of Representatives already has passed its version of the Budget Resolution. Its content is nothing short of alarming. It threatens to undo all of the progress we have made during the past two years in controlling domestic spending, reducing the tax burden on the American citizen and rebuilding our national defense capability.

The House passed resolution would raise taxes by \$115 billion over the next five years. The only way to achieve such a massive tax increase would be to cancel the 10 percent income tax cut scheduled for July and the indexing of income tax rates scheduled to begin in 1984.

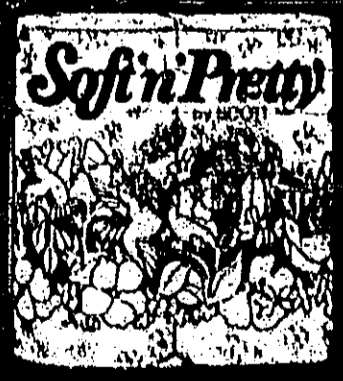
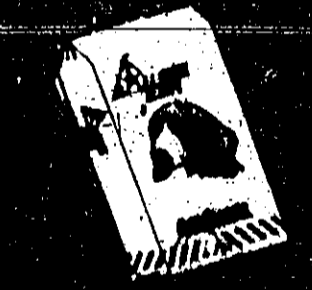

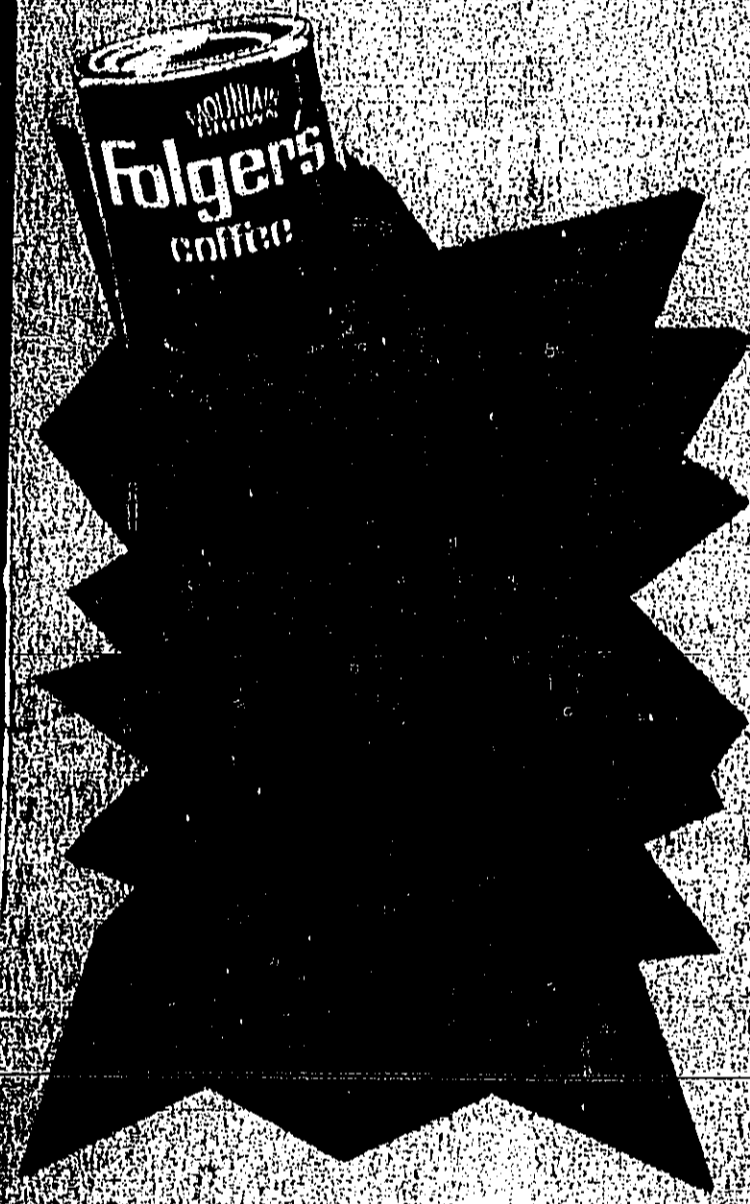
