Guesstimates \$500,000 To Correct Storm Damage Heavy

Tyler County Commissioners were seriously battling around a figure of \$500,000 Monday, as they informally discussed the flood damage to Tyler County infrastructure this past week-end. Estimates thus far indicate a possible 100

miles of county roads which will need to be resurfaced or which have become impassable due to washouts and extreme culvert damage.

According to Precinct 2 Commissioner Kenneth Lowe, "I've never seen anything like it before. It's terrible out there."

Lowe reported that the worst damage to his precinct was in the south and west ends. "It's the awfulest mess you ever saw."

Commissioner Jerry Mahan said, "Besides two bridges near the Wolf Creek area that

Two Wildwood Youth Drown

Two Wildwood subdivision youths, Pat Vignora, 17, a junior at Warren High School, and Kyle Burtrand, 17, a junior at Warren High School, drowned Sunday evening while traversing the rain-swollen spillway of Wildwood's

Kimble Lake. Both young men had successfully ridden over the spillway in a 14' aluminum boat as recently as Friday evening and had spent Saturday afternoon assisting in sand bagging Kimble Lake preventing it from overflowing its banks after Friday and Saturday's heavy rains. Saturday evening the 14' boat was observed to turn sideways, then capsize, throwing both young men into the waters. Both surfaced only briefly but disappeared into the fast moving waters of the spillway and

AUTHORITY—The special question we have all asked in one form or another is "How can I make more money?" The obvious answer is "How can I best invest?" to "How can I get a better return on my money?" Anyone interested in investing his or her money is aware that there is a range of alternatives available to accomplish the task. The alternative that best suits any investor depends upon the amount of risk one is willing to take, the amount of return one is willing to plan, and how far ahead one is willing to plan.

Generally, the investor is interested in income, either higher income now or higher income later based upon the growth of capital. Before anyone embarks on making an investment plan, one must first analyze one's goals for the future, because most of us will be unable to make money overnight.

One choice available is putting money in fixed dollar investments. To do this means you are lending your money to others for an agreed period of time in the marketplace. This function of our economic system should not make you nervous if investing in fixed dollar investments.

Another choice is to invest in stocks. The major benefit of investing in stocks is that you will generally know from month to month what you are receiving. Likewise, you may be able to take advantage of high interest rates. In addition, fixed interest investing may be a good choice for current needs.

Another choice is to invest in bonds. Bonds are generally considered to be a safe investment. They provide a steady stream of income and are generally less volatile than stocks.

Another choice is to invest in real estate. Real estate can provide a long-term investment and can appreciate in value over time.

Another choice is to invest in mutual funds. Mutual funds allow investors to diversify their investments across a variety of assets.

Another choice is to invest in commodities. Commodities can provide a hedge against inflation and can appreciate in value.

Message to Washington

TALKING BOOKS HELP HANDICAPPED

MESSAGE: Six months ago I was in a bad traffic accident, and I'm especially frustrated because I can no longer have the use of my hands and cannot hold a book to read. Does the federal government have a program which provides recordings of popular and classical literature that I could use? A. L. — San Antonio

SENATOR BENNTSEN RESPONDS: Library of Congress representatives tell me that they free "Talking Books" program is designed for people who can't hold a book or use their eyesight to read regular books. The books are recorded on cassette tapes and can be listened to as long as you want. You may get more details by sending a postcard with your name and address to the Consumer Information Center, Dept. 3281, Dulles, Colorado 81800 requesting a free copy of "Talking Book".

AFRICAN CATTLE IMPORTS RESTRICTED

MESSAGE: I recently came upon an article in the newspaper about long horned cattle in Africa. Could you find out what

kind of cattle they are and whether they can be brought in to the U.S.? I figure if they can thrive in Africa, they'd sure do well in South Texas. B.W. — Tilden

SENATOR BENNTSEN RESPONDS: The Animal and Plant Health Inspection Service advises me that the cattle you're interested in are from the Ankole breed, also known as the Watou breed, found in parts of Africa. If you're thinking of importing some, you may wish to reconsider. All African countries are considered to be affected by certain exotic diseases, including foot-and-mouth disease (FMD), that are not present in the U.S. Cattle from Africa, therefore, may not be imported unless they come through the Harry S. Truman Animal Import Center, which is equipped to handle shipments from FMD countries. However, if you can locate this breed in one of the countries on the list I'm sending you that APHIS regards as free of FMD, the import requirements would be less restrictive.

The former head of the Environmental Protection Agency filed earlier this year to panic Congress into watering down efforts to combat air pollution by threatening draconian sanctions against areas in Texas and other states.

Now EPA chief William Ruckelshaus has promised, though, that he will take another look at the problem. The sanctions were, indeed, severe: including a ban on construction, a shutoff of federal highway funds and a shutoff of federal funds for state air control programs.

They would have virtually shut down Houston and slammed the brakes on commerce and economic growth in areas throughout our state.

What's the problem? Why was this threat of sanctions leveled in the first place?

Congress is working on amendments to the Clean Air Act. As a senior member of the Senate Environment and Public Works Committee, I have been deeply involved in these efforts.

The Administration has proposed some amendments that would substantially weaken the Clean Air Act, amendments which have met with strong resistance from Americans concerned about the environment.

provision in the law which requires that any new source of pollution be controlled by the most modern, effective equipment available. They would replace this with a less rigorous, less general national standard for pollution control equipment. The Clean Air Act also, though, includes a deadline that calls on areas to achieve certain air quality standards by the end of last year. There is broad agreement that this deadline was unrealistic and would have to be extended. Some areas of the country have been unable to achieve the mandated air quality standards even though they have faithfully followed EPA-approved plans for doing so.

The Act provides remedies for overcoming this deadline without resorting to sanctions. The Environment and Public Works Committee, in fact, wrote the EPA last year urging some of the alternatives and urging that they be followed to allow time to make needed changes in the Clean Air Act without weakening it.

The previous administrator of EPA chose instead to threaten sanctions, trying to make Congress bite the bullet ahead of time.

Areas in Texas that have been threatened with sanctions include Dallas, Tarrant and El Paso counties, along with parts of Harris, Cameron and Nueces counties.

When William Ruckelshaus came before our committee recently, seeking confirmation as the new chief of the EPA, I questioned him about these sanctions and asked him to reconsider them, to use the more responsible options available under the law.

He pledged that he would look closely at the situation and try to take a more reasoned approach.

The people of Texas don't need the kind of threatening tactics employed by the previous administrator of EPA. We've got enough real problems without having to deal with petty harassment from Washington.
