The Tyler County Community will have a chance to pump tough questions about economic and other impacts of a sort of Lake Rockland Lake and Dam Project "Answer-man" on Thursday June 30.

MHMR's Lawrence Resigns

Wayne Lawrence, Ph.D., announced his resignation as executive director of Deep East Texas Regional Mental Health Services and his plans to enter private

business at the regular meeting of the Board of Trustees in Lufkin, Tuesday, May 24.

Dr. Lawrence is the founding executive director of MHMR. He has seen the Center

grow over the past nine years from 15 staff and an annual budget of \$650,000 to 125 employees with a budget of \$3.6 million. He began work in April, 1974, and the Center began serving clients in September of that year.

Over the years, services have expanded from a few, small outreach centers operated by state institutions serving about 1,000 clients per year, to the current 26 regional programs, serving over 5,000 annually.

Dr. Lawrence is leaving MHMR to become co-owner and president of Health Technology, Inc., in Longview. His resignation is effective July 31, 1983.

"Speaking on behalf of the Board and as one who has followed Dr. Lawrence's career over the years, I would like to express our gratitude for his years of dedicated service to the clients of our Center, and to wish him and his fine family the very best in their new life," commented Board Chairman V. D. Woods.

"It has been a pleasure to work with Dr. Lawrence, and we will miss him greatly," Woods continued.

He has established a fine organization at MHMR which will carry on in his absence and provide the basis for quality services for years to come.

"I am convinced, as a result of his leadership and contact with others that out of the 11 community centers in Texas, our Center ranks within the top three of

four in management and organization. And, Dr. Lawrence will be particularly missed by the county judges and commissioners courts in the region with whom he has been in close and cooperative relationship over the years.

Colmesnell's Ronnie Temple, 13, Will Attend Duke

Colmesnell eighth grade student Ronnie Temple has been selected as one of 3,600 students from 16 states as qualified for the prestigious Duke University Talent Identification Program. He will attend Texas Award Ceremonies Saturday June 4 at the University of Texas in Austin as one of 728 Texas students invited to these ceremonies.

Temple, 13, will also be one of 655 students who will attend Duke Summer Residential Program for Verbally and Mathematically Precocious Youths. Temple will attend July 23-August 13, taking a course in pre-calculus math.

Students ages 12 through 15 are accepted for the Duke programs based on scores on the Scholastic Aptitude Test (SAT) or on the Test of Standard Written English (TSWE). Temple scored a total score of 1030 on the SAT. High school seniors taking the same test average a score of 940.

At Colmesnell school this past year has a regular schedule of academic classes except for a high school Algebra I class which he completed this spring and his participating in the Colmesnell School District ACBS program. The ACBS program staffed

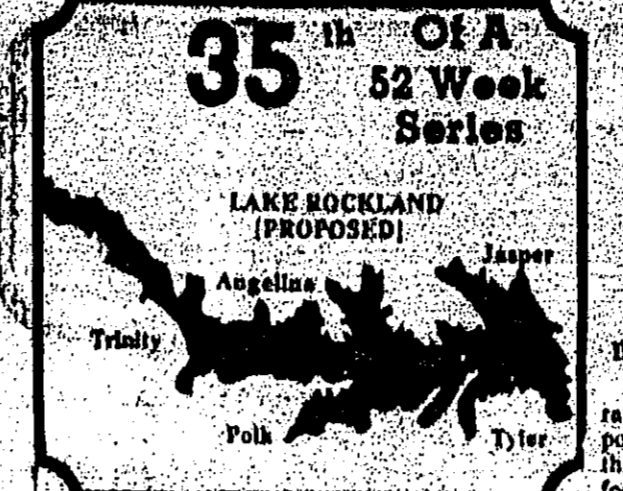

Flood Control Chief Rockland Aim Say Corps Engineer Leland Wilson

Water from heavy rains coming into proposed Lake Rockland by the creeks which will feed into the reservoir should not result in flooding problems for property owners whose land lies above the elevation of the lake," according to Neches Basin Project Engineer Leland Wilson of the Ft.
