# "We'll See They Get It..." Lake Rockland Money Due, Wilson Says

The Lower Neches Valley Authority (LNVA), the local sponsor of the \$750 million Lake Rockland Project has no plans to request funds from Congress for Lake Rockland for the next federal budget despite assurances from Congressman Charles Wilson, that if those funds were requested by LNVA and the Corps of Engineers that, "We would see they got the money" and assurances from the Ft. Worth District Office of the Corps of Engineers that they have the "approved capability" to handle the manpower and time requirements of the next phase of Lake Rockland.

"I assure you if the Corps asks for it, I'll see they get it," said Wilson.

Congressman Charles Wilson in a telephone interview with the Tyler County Booster last Wednesday, Nov. LNVA is the ultimate sponsor for the Rockland Project and they are going to have to get some commitments for the water. Personally, continued Wilson, "I would like to see Rockland built sooner, because by the time LNVA gets around to getting those commitments, we may not be able to get anything past these Dallas environmentalists. I know my job when LNVA provides the justification." "We, and I think I can speak for the two senators here, will see they get the money," Wilson said.

## Senator Roy Blake Will Address DETDA

Kent T. Adair, President of the Deep East Texas Development Association, announced today that Senator Roy Blake, will be the principal speaker for the June monthly meeting. This meeting will be held at 10 a.m. on Friday, June 24 at the Preston Inn, Nacogdoches, Texas.

State Senator Roy Blake of Nacogdoches was born in Nacogdoches County and has been a lifelong resident of Nacogdoches.

He attended the public schools in Nacogdoches. He attended Texas A&M University and Stephen F. Austin State University where he earned a B.S. Degree.

Blake is married to the former Mae Deane Goodwin of San Augustine and they are the parents of five children. Blake is in the general insurance business with his son in Nacogdoches.

He served on the Nacogdoches City Commission for six years and ran a successful race for a seat in the House of Representatives where he served for five years. He was elected to the Texas Senate in a special election in 1978 and was reelected to a full term in November of the same year. He successfully sought reelection winning without a runoff over two opponents and carrying each of the 15 counties.

Blake was appointed Chairman of the Senate Committee on Administration in 1981 and was the first freshman member to receive a committee chairmanship. He also serves on the Finance Committee, the State Affairs Committee, and the Subcommittee on Nominations.

He has always been an active member of the Legislature, but in the 68th Session which concluded in May, he was more than active. After the tragic fire which occurred in February, he was on the scene within hours. Since the Administration Committee is in charge of all of the physical facilities of the Senate, he was face with relocating ten senate

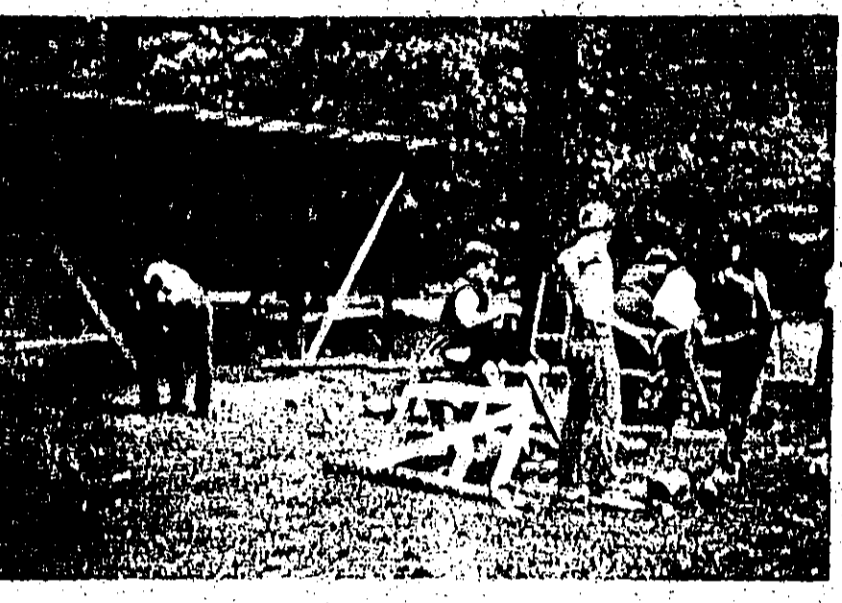
