That We're Not Building Rockland Now

'Not Alarming'

By John L. Tompkins

"It is not alarming to me that we're not building Rockland now", says Lower Neches Valley Authority (LNVA) Manager J.D. Nixon in a Booster telephone interview Tuesday. "The reason is, we have an ample supply of water for our present customers and we don't anticipate we will have need for additional water for about 20 years."

"We realize that it probably will take more than 25 years to build a dam like Rockland", said Nixon. "Just because we're not jumping up and down doesn't mean we're not going to do something in the future; we are not going to sit by and then around the year 2000 say hocus pocus let's build Rockland."

Lake Rockland is the recently activated Corps of Engineers project which if beginning construction in 1996 could furnish as a source of municipal, industrial and agricultural water for Southeast Texas, produce inexpensive hydroelectric power for peak use of area utilities; control major flooding on the Neches River between Rockland and Beattus; and provide recreation amenities for area visitors beginning as early as the year 2008.

In order for the \$750 million Lake Rockland U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Project to be built now according to Nixon, "We would have

Dan Jones Now DETCOG Head

"When I started we didn't even have a gavel", said Tyler County Judge Allen Sturrock as he presented the gavel and with it the presidency of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments to his newly elected successor, Angellina County Judge Dan Jones.

Sturrock completed his third consecutive term as President of the Area Council of Governments, which consists of elected representatives of city, county and area governmental entities in twelve East Texas counties.

In regular business the A-95 committee reviewed and approved applications from seven area governmental entities for civic and educational construction projects to be funded from the federal Economic Development Administration's Emergency Jobs Funds. Applications were considered from the cities of Jasper, Center, Trinity, Lufkin and Hemphill, Newton County and the San Jacinto County Historical Committee were other entities applying for federal jobs funds. Applications for the State Department of Health for a first of three years grant to collect information on numbers of nutritionally at risk patients seen in area maternal and Child health clinics was reviewed as was a DETCOG area Agency on Aging - Department of Human Resources project to deliver meals to home-bound elderly in the Deep East Texas area.

'Mr. Sam' Dead At 84

Frederick B. Sullivan, 84, died at 10:40 a.m. Monday, June 27, 1983 at Tyler County Hospital. He was born January 17, 1899 in Hodges, Alabama. Mr. Sullivan was the eighth child in a family of twelve children.

A graduate of Auburn University and Texas A&M University, Mr. Sullivan taught Vocational Agriculture for eighteen years at secondary schools in South Carolina, Alabama, and Texas. He came to Woodville in 1935 as Vocational Agriculture Instructor and Secretary of the Chamber of Commerce. In March of 1944 he opened Sullivan's Hardware in Woodville.
