LSD Confirmed In Local Drug Buy

The Texas Department of Public Safety Crime Lab in Houston has officially confirmed to Sheriff Leon Fowler that the 11 stamp sized pieces of paper seized in a controlled drug buy early Sunday, August 14, dist. by Sheriff Powell Lyartale Acid Diethylamide (LSD) and the 60 tablets seized in the same buy were scopolamine, a fast acting sedative (downer) with addictive potential with other than short term use.

"We asked the lab to put these drugs ahead and find out for us, if they were real or not," said Sheriff Fowler Monday afternoon. The drugs were seized after Fowler became aware that alleged drugs were being sold Saturday night, August 6, "at the Phoenix Game Room", approximately 30 yards from the Sheriff's Office. A "buy" was arranged and Karl Patrick Prince, 19 of Warren, and Kevin Leo Horn, 20 of Village Mills, were arrested by Sheriff's officers Roger Byars, Wade Skinner and Sheriff Fowler at 1 a.m. at Daniel's Union 76 convenience store south of Woodville. The Daniel's store was closed at the time, according to Mrs. Janice Daniels who told the Sheriff Monday afternoon. "We were not involved in this at all and our name and business should not have been connected to this at all."

A third suspect, Sidney Covey Morgan, 74, of Warren, was arrested Monday, August 8.

Horn was arraigned before Justice of the Peace, Wanda Brasher and is currently charged with delivery of a controlled substance LSD (Lyartale Acid, Diethylamide) with bond set at \$15,000. Prince is charged with delivery of a controlled substance, LSD, with bond set at \$15,000 and delivery of a controlled substance scopolamine, with bond set at \$5,000. All three suspects have posted bond.

While in the doctoral program, he has served as consultant for the Austin-Travis County Mental Health/Mental Retardation Center and for the Coordinating Board, Texas College and University System. During this time he has also taught at Austin Community College.

He is a 1969 graduate of the University of Texas at Austin with a bachelor of arts in psychology, and has been granted a master of arts degree in sociology from the University of Houston.

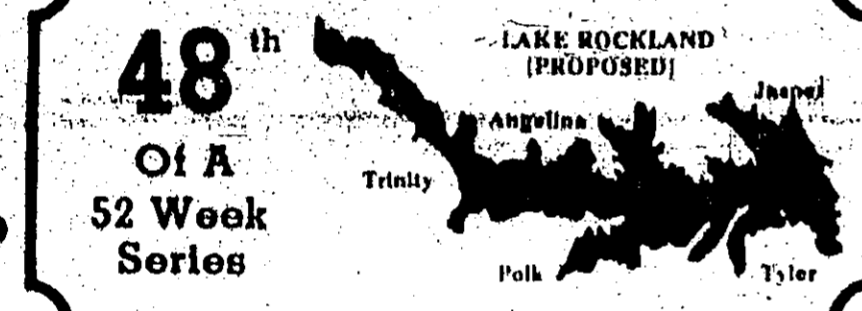

Woodville Leash Law Sept. 1

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Ma Bell Adds 'Watchdog' Equipment

Southwestern Bell is outfitting its switching offices which serve more than 4,000 customers with a sophisticated "watchdog" computer designed to head off service problems before they occur.

The Small Office Network Data System (SONDS) is a trouble-shooting computer that takes an electronic picture of the switching circuitry in the office every 30 seconds, or every day," said Gene Thacker, community relations manager for Southwestern Bell.

With it, we can find exact switches which are malfunctioning and keep count on how many are being placed," SOUNDS has already proved its usefulness in switching offices in Warren, Kirbyville, Spurger, Luna, and Woodville.

Previously, mechanical switching devices or human observation at Bell Labs engineers were able to devise SOUNDS by using the technology of modern electronics. The system is being installed throughout Southwestern Bell.

The data accumulated in each SOUNDS terminal is transmitted every night to a master computer in Pocatoway, New Jersey. Then, each unit's computer is set back to "zero." Local Southwestern Bell employees receive monthly reports on each of the switching offices but also request special reports when necessary.

In addition to reports on switching capacity, SOUNDS provides exact information on switching malfunctions. For example, a switching terminal found to be out of service for extended periods can be repaired often before customers notice them.

Another key point," said Thacker, "is that we are able to find out where and when to spend our dollars most wisely. We've found probably as many places where we've been able to delay adding equipment as we've had to speed up additions."



The Consumer Alert

During the past year, natural gas consumers and producers alike have experienced problems caused by too much gas being produced at too high a price. Now Congress is grappling with this issue to determine solutions. Instead, the Senate Energy and Natural Gas Resources Committee recently reported legislation on the subject. This bill's intent, in essence, is to bring all gas prices to a market level over a period of time. That which currently is above that level would be reduced in price, and gas which currently is less expensive would rise in price. The bill also includes provisions which would limit enforcement of "take-or-pay" contracts which require purchasers to take more natural gas than they need.

This legislation involves pricing, transportation, and it does raise two questions: and the jobs are sector do a better job of existing out the market distribution without government interference? And would creating another set of government regulations and extending the time for most contracts create more problems than it would solve?

Already, producers, pipeline and purchasers are developing creative approaches to handling the problems of oversupply and price. Many observers believe that the private enterprise system will be successful in bringing prices into line within a fairly short period of time.

If this is the case, I would have serious questions about whether we should create still more federal regulations to deal with a problem which the market is handling well. Perhaps we should consider simply allowing consumers to capture in 1983 as scheduled, and then gradually addressing the question arising from the remaining contracts.

I might note that the committee which reported the legislation currently before the Senate did so without endorsing the product of its labors.

This is an issue which will require much needed study in order to determine the approach which will be to assure adequate supplies of natural gas in the future.
