Rockland Eyed By '85 Congress?

Fort Worth District Office of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers has already begun working on the fiscal 1985 budget requests according to Corp. Neches Basin Planning Engineer LeLand Wilson.

The fiscal 1985 federal budget is the first budget to which the recently reactivated Lake Rockland Dam and Reservoir Project will be eligible for congressional funding.

According to Corps officials the re-activation decision on the Rockland Project was made

too late in 1983 and that the final decisions on Fiscal 1984 budget requests had already been finalized.

Lake Rockland is a recently reactivated project of the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers which if built according to the early timetable of the Corps of Engineers would result in a 22 mile long, 1 mile wide reservoir on the northern border of Tyler, Polk and Trinity counties.

Lake Rockland, in addition to supplying water to municipal, industrial and agricultural users in the Neches River Basin.

Golden Triangle and Houston areas, would produce hydropower for peak demand use by area electric utilities; reduce flooding along the Neches River from Rockland to Beaumont and provide recreation amenities for area visitors and residents.

"Rockland will be considered along with the other potential projects across the state," said Wilson in an interview with the BOOSTER Tuesday morning.

"We do expect the final decisions on the budget requests to be made in November and they can be included in the President's budget with the President presenting his budget message to Congress late in January of 1984."

Commissioner's also approved a resolution expressing support for a Texas Community Development Program grant which would provide street paving and bridge repair in the Warren area.

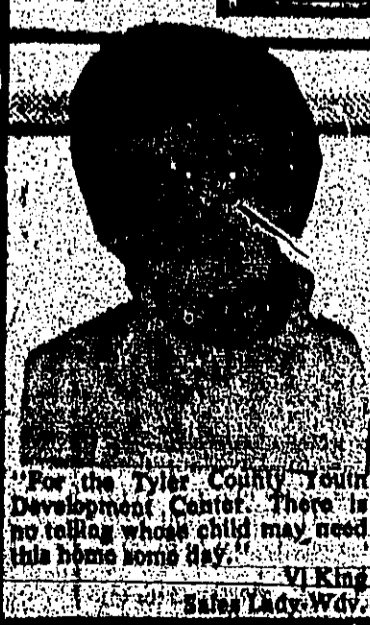

Religious leaders of all denominations in the area; civic and county leaders, priests, deacons, seminarians and Sisters are expected to attend the ceremony and all other interested persons.

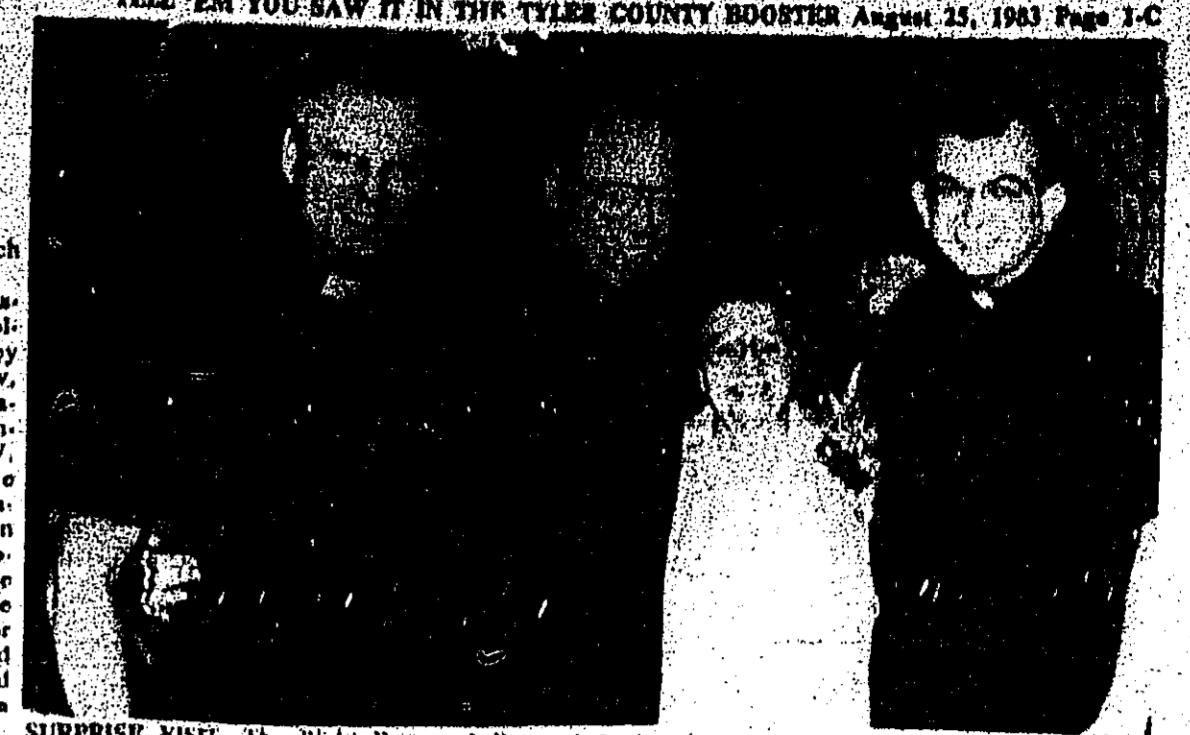
Roadbeds have been constructed, but not as yet surfaced, so arrangements are being made to drive elderly persons, from Major Drive into the property for the ceremony.

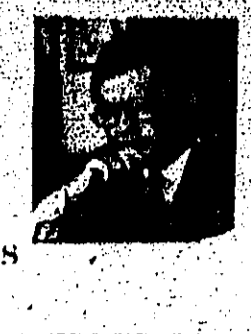

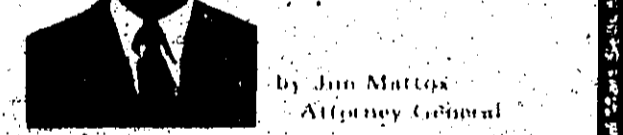
