

16,000 Attend Jones Park

With estimated crowds of 10,000 on Sunday and 6-7,000 on Monday, Jones Country Music Park in Colmanell was officially opened. Although there were a few minor electrical problems, a transformer out on the first day and an amplifier out on the second, both shows ran smooth in spite of sweltering temperatures.

Those who saw the show on Sunday as well as Monday's performance, had some fine entertainment. It may have been due to the unmerciful sun on Sunday, but it seemed that the performers were more in the mood to play and sing on Monday and the crowd was definitely more involved.

The music both days began with powerful performances by Gail Davies and Leona Williams, followed by Little Jimmy Dickens, whose songs and country humor kept the audience chuckling.

John Anderson's appearance on Monday made a noticeable difference in the two shows with his act lasting nearly an hour starting with "I'm Just An Old Chunk Of Coal" and ending with the crowd pleasing favorite "Swingin'".

After about a 20 minute intermission, the show resumed with a number by The Jones Boys and then "George" was introduced. Obviously at ease with the crowd and a bit of a practical joker (On Sunday he brought the crowd to their feet when he introduced Hank Williams.

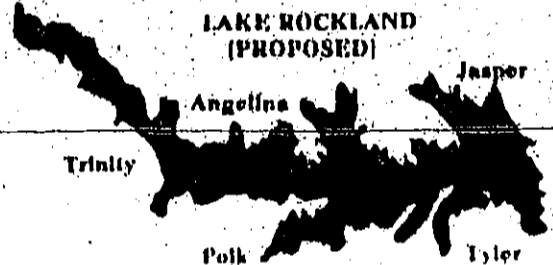

The Giant Garzbo goes for \$1,099.00. Please allow four weeks for delivery, and another four weeks to figure out how to put it together.

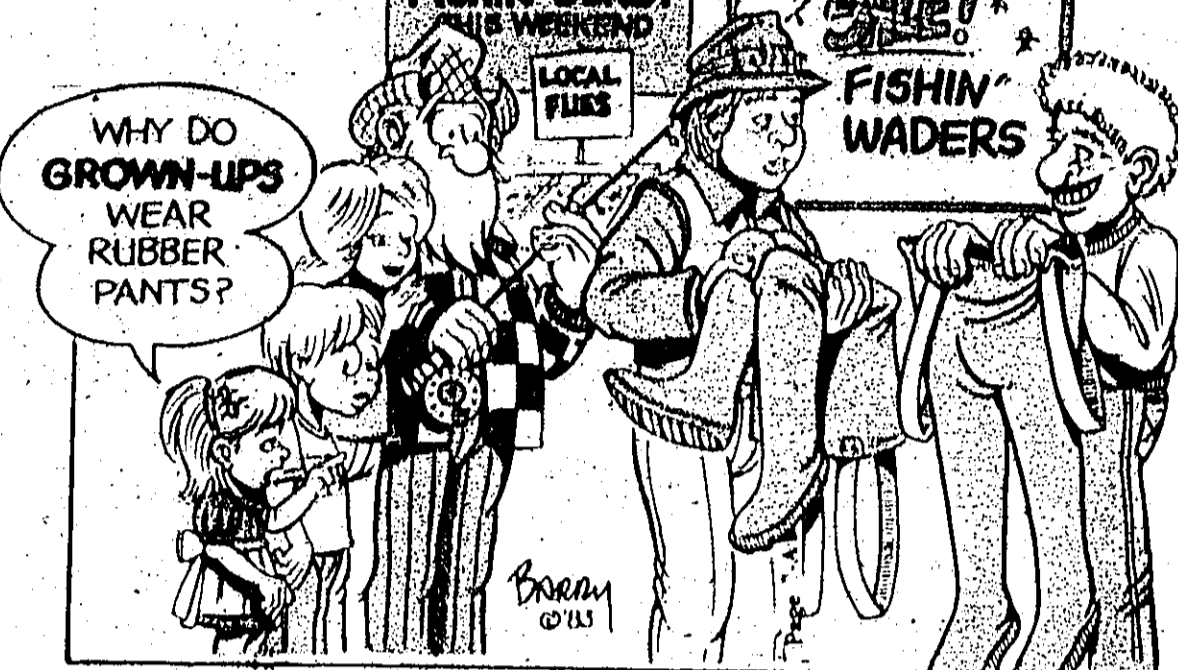

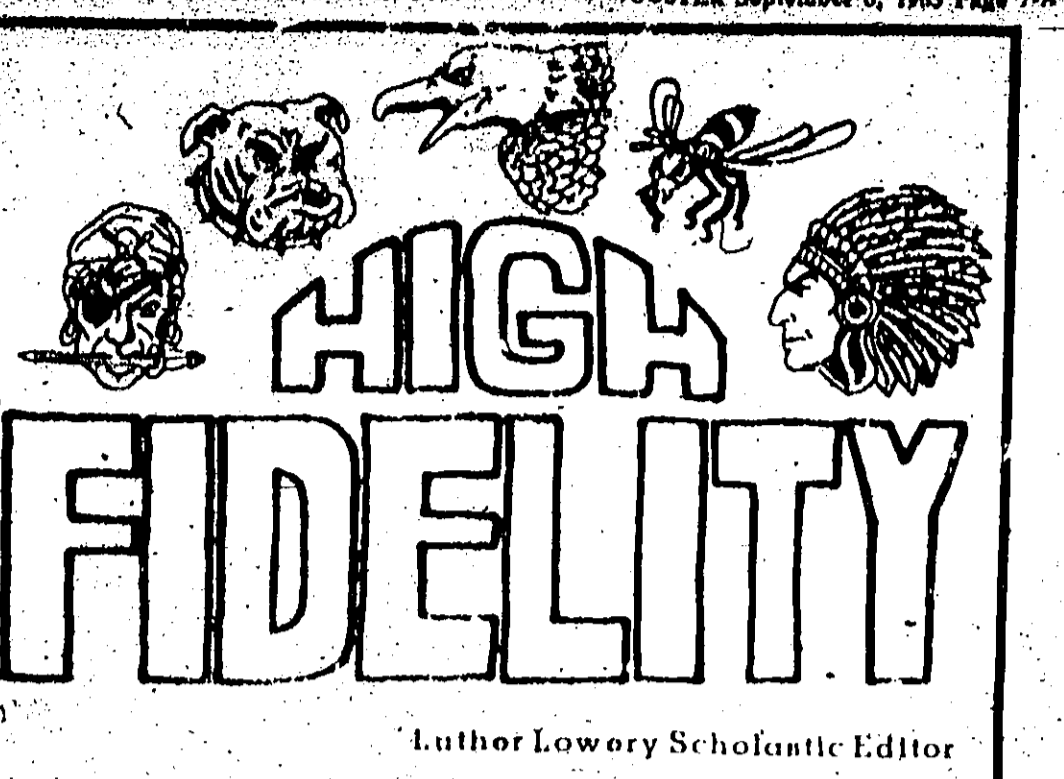

Wilson Helps Paper Drive

Congressman Charles Wilson and his staff, along with nearly 50 other members of the House of Representatives and area Boy Scout troops, participated in a highly successful news paper recycling drive on Capitol Hill earlier this month.

Four tons of news papers were collected from Congressional offices and then loaded into a truck for transport to a recycling center. The drive was a Congressional effort to demonstrate the importance of paper recycling and its positive impact on solid waste management.

"Rather than dump or burn our old newspapers and corrugated boxes, we can recycle them," he said "By increasing paper collection and recycling throughout the country, we can make a major contribution to solid waste management. Each ton of recycled paper collected prevents 27 cubic feet of landfill space that is saved."

A spokesman for the Recycled Paperboard Division of the American Paper Institute called the four tons collected on this most recent drive "a very impressive effort," and stressed the paper industry's appreciation of the Congressional support.

Yale graduate Holcomb has been studying the plant ecology of the Big Thicket for approximately three years. There has not been anything technical published on the Big Thicket before Dr. Marks and I did our study," according to Holcomb. The Rice University Associate Professor and his graduate students continue to operate three 10 acre research plots in the Big Thicket area.

"One of the questions we are asking in our research is what the role of natural disturbances, like fire, hurricanes or floods have in maintaining the composition of the forests. The forests we are studying are very close to their original composition even though they were logged 70-80 years ago. For the future the average size of trees will increase but the species there will not change very much. As to the role of disturbance, I will too early in our research to tell," concludes Holcomb.

With more income, consumer spending is up. Real sales have increased four months in a row.

Net worth is also up. The real net worth of households has grown over 14 percent in the past year. This is the best net worth gain in the postwar period.

The rate of inflation also indicates that this recovery is a normal, healthy one. Inflation was 13.3 and 12.4 percent during the last two years of the Carter Administration, but for all of 1982, the inflation rate was only 3.2 percent. This is particularly encouraging because inflation usually rises during a recovery. The fact that inflation has not increased indicates that this is a lasting recovery.

As for the future, confidence is increasing that the economy will continue to recover. Over the past 10 months, the conference board's index of consumer expectations has been at the highest level ever recorded. This index is a very good forecaster of future GNP growth. A recent poll by one of the most respected consumer polling organizations at the University of Michigan shows that 68 percent of consumers expect to buy autos and houses in the next year. And, a recent National Federation of Independent Business survey found that 68 percent of the companies polled expected business to improve this year.

I believe, if Congress can continue to hold the line on federal spending and continue to chip away at the federal deficit, then we will see our nation's economy become even more solid.

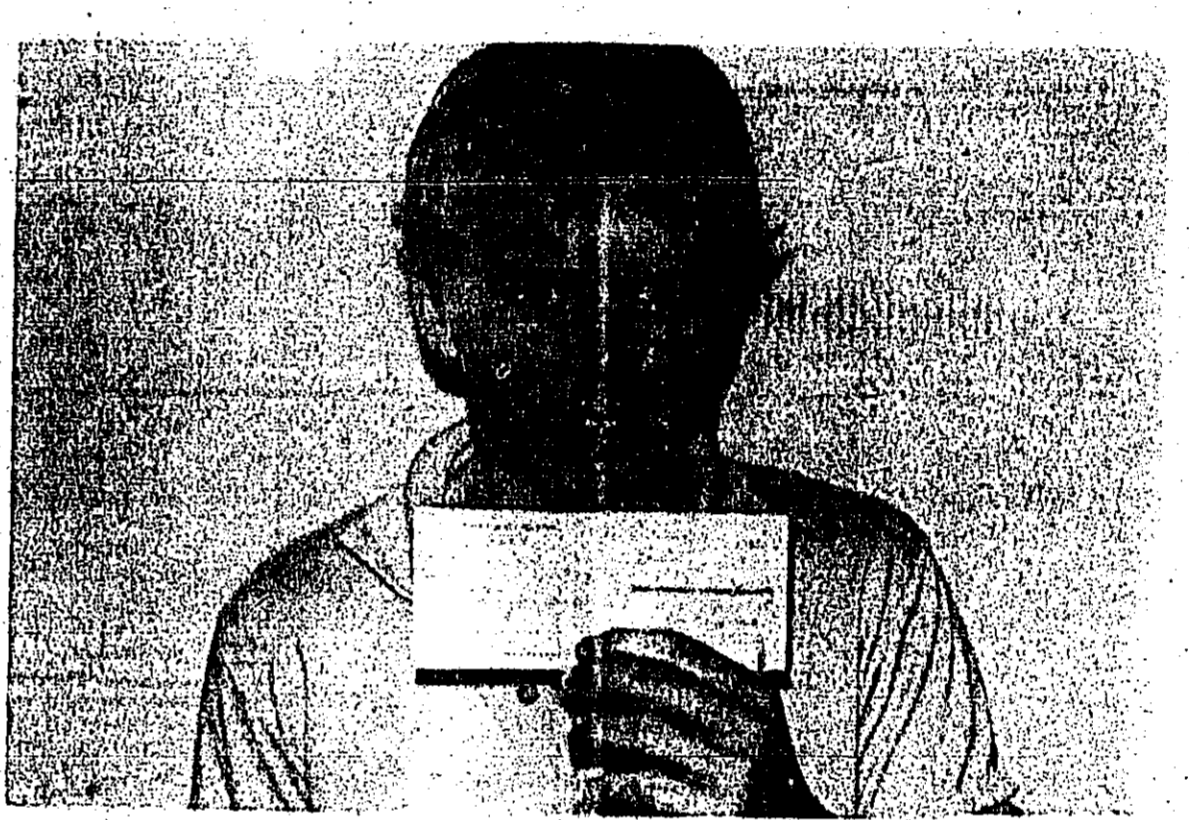
