The Tyler County Youth Development Center, Inc. received a check from the Don Force family recently in the amount of \$900.

Force and his wife, Bernice, had toured the Youth Development Center recently, and had expressed an interest in its operation and said the board could use the money for whatever it needed to get the doors of the project open.

The Youth Development Center is nearing its goal of creating a center for dependent, neglected and delinquent children, ages 10-17, who could be encouraged back into the mainstream of our society through proper caring and handling.

According to TCYDC President, Kenny Simpson, "We really want to thank the Force's for their generosity and identification with our program. We urge all those who are able to sign up with our program to get the home open and start serving the children who are in need of this kind of help we can offer."

Simpson said, the Youth Development Center board meets on the last Thursday of each month in the Tyler County Commissioners Courtroom at 7 p.m.

The organization, which has about 50 members currently, located and remodeled a house with three bedrooms, two bathrooms and a two-car garage tract south-east of Woodville in a rural setting.

The Tyler County Youth Development Center organization is now three years old.

Simpson said the Force gift was pre-arranged by a generous gift donor, the Braden Corporation, and given to the organization through board member and former Braden employee, Martin Orlow.

Rockland Dam Inevitable!

The question of whether the Rockland Lake and Dam Project will eventually be built is not a real question. The construction of the largest of Texas' few remaining proposed major high quality water reservoirs is inevitable.

In light of the ever increasing demand of Texas' increasing population for a limited amount of high quality water, the real question is: When will Rockland Dam be built and who will build it? The Tyler County Booster believes that the time is NOW and that the U.S. Congress through the Army Corps of Engineers is who should build it and shoulder the major part of the financial burden of completion of this project.

Continually postponing the start of construction of this now 35 year old major water resource will not decrease the chances that Lake Rockland will be built. Further postponements will however result in escalation of the now very expensive \$720 million construction costs toward what very quickly becomes a multi-billion dollar project. Remember, that cost of Lake Rockland will be paid back by us and our children in the form of the future costs to us of Lake Rockland's water.


Further postponements also will act to extend to future generations the eventual pain of loss of property and relocation; same heritage for present residents to leave their children.

Among the advantages of having Congress through the Army Corps of Engineers construct Lake Rockland, is the mandated safeguards to the environment and to surveying and preserving the historical heritage of the area in and around the future lake which come with Corps projects.

Both in terms of recreational development of a major new camping, swimming, fishing, and boating lake; as source of future residential and commercial development for the area; and in terms of the economic and jobs impact of the construction work for the area, Tyler County stands to benefit considerably from construction of this lake.

Colonel Ted Stroup, District Engineer and head of the Ft. Worth District office of the Army Corps of Engineers will be in Tyler County on Thursday, October 27, for a series of public meetings to inform our people about the Corps of Engineers plan for Lake Rockland. We urge Tyler Countians and other residents of the area, to take this opportunity both to express your personal questions about the project answered and to express your concerns and opinions directly to the Rockland Project's "head man".

ever once in awhile, there would be a fence breaker. These fence breakers had a way of pushing down the rail fence and getting in side. When this happens a battle was waged that from our end of the fence to the other. Sometimes one from the inside and one from the outside and nated at each corner. This kept the fence and made fence breakers out. The rails were generally split from a pine tree with a nail and wedges. An axe and a bit were used also and a wooden glib was made from a dugwood tree which is tough when dried. The pine trees were selected for a straight split. An eight inch tree would make four rails per section. They were made to each farmers needs usually light and ten feet in length. They were left stacked in the sun to dry before being used. The rail fence was eight rails high. But mostly they ten rails high. I have read where the farmers that went by the moon built rail fences, by all an. They believed a six inch ground pole had to be laid on the dark of the moon. If laid on the light of the moon it would gradually sink into the ground and expose the bottom rail to dampness and rot. It took an Act of Congress to force the Department of Agriculture to fund the PIK program.

PIK was conceived by the department last year as a way to ensure steady farm prices, by reducing both production and commodity prices, and as a way to provide income to hard-hit farmers.

The department has proposed to overcome this shortage by offering to buy cotton from farmers, then giving that cotton back to the farmers to sell again on the open market.

As they had been earlier for wheat and grain farmers, they would expect a maximum of \$9,000 a pound.
