Suspect Surrenders At Moss Hill Church

Tyler County law enforcement combined with area Department of Public Safety officers, Liquor Control authorities and other agencies for a spectacular chase and apprehension 7 miles east of Woodville around noon Tuesday, which authorities believe netted an important suspect in the killing late Monday of a 79 year old Kountze man.

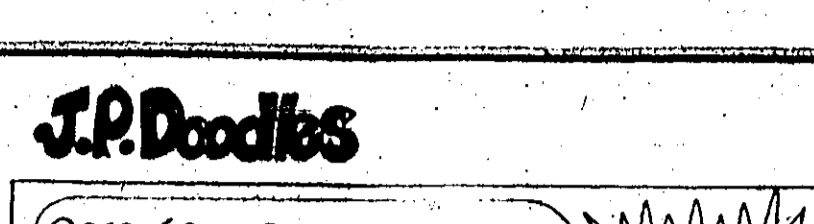

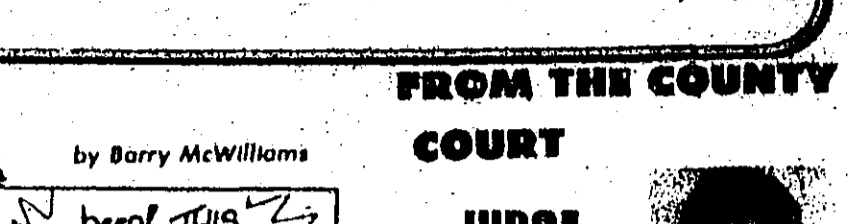

CAPITOL UPDATE

Senator Lloyd Bentsen Watching Washington

As chairman of the Senate Housing and Urban Affairs Subcommittee, I have been actively involved this year in seeking new ways to make home ownership possible for more people.

One such effort is the Secondary Mortgage Market Enhancement Act, which I have introduced. This important legislation is designed to make more money available for mortgage lending in many ways similar to other kinds of business. A storekeeper takes a portion of the money he earns from one sale and buys replacement merchandise. Otherwise his shelves would be empty and he would go out of business. Similarly, once a mortgage loan is made, the lender rarely holds it to maturity. Instead, he sells it on what is called the secondary mortgage market so that he will have the money to make more loans.

Since the 1930s, federally sponsored agencies have been the primary purchasers of these mortgages. These agencies—colloquially called "Ginnie Mae," "Fannie Mae" and "Freddie Mac"—have done an excellent job in providing this service.

However, it is clear that, as more and more demands are placed on credit markets and mortgage lenders, other sources of capital will be required during the coming decade. Already several private sector firms have begun to fill this need. But their activity has been limited because of the regulatory structure which they face. The Secondary Mortgage Market Enhancement Act, along with the Trust for Investment in Mortgage (TIM) Act, would make the necessary changes to develop a sound private mortgage securities industry.

The Secondary Mortgage Market Enhancement Act would continue the process of deregulation which already has begun in financial markets. It would remove all remaining regulatory barriers which prevent mortgage trading securities from trading at least as well as other corporate securities.

The Trust for Investment in Mortgage proposal would help lower the cost of housing capital and attract a broad range of investors to mortgage-backed securities through changes in the tax code. TIMs would be a private sector version of bonds currently provided by the federally sponsored agencies.

These changes in the rules governing mortgage securities would have a direct impact on every potential home buyer or seller. By enlarging the pool of money available to lend for mortgages, these loans would be made easier to get and, likely, less expensive.

We must do everything in our power to make home ownership a reality for as many Americans as we can. Certainly, these bills are not the sole solution. We must continue to pursue other avenues in order to reach our goal. But these pieces of legislation would make a significant contribution toward that end.

Senate Banking, Housing and Urban Affairs food prices is concerned. Committee Chairman Jake Garn (R, Utah) has joined me in opposing these bills. We have begun to have hearings on them, and I am optimistic that we will be able to obtain Congressional action.

stable during the past six months, consumers can expect to start paying more for the staples marked before long.

"It all boils down to the effects of this summer's drought," says Dr. Dick Edwards, an economist with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System.

The drought has severely reduced corn and soybean used for food, causing their prices to jump. Corn prices have already climbed about 30 percent in the past six months while soybean prices have climbed about 40 percent. This means higher food costs which, in turn, push up the cost of products like cattle, hogs, poultry and eggs, notes the economist.

"Feed and other prices, for instance, could jump as much as 20 percent," says Edwards. "Consumers have enjoyed fairly low beef and pork prices in recent months as producers have had to liquidate herds because of drought conditions. This has resulted in large supplies of red meat and subsequent low prices for consumers."

"This year's drought and hot summer weather have also taken their toll in the poultry industry. Several million broilers have died from the extreme heat, which has also had a dampening effect on egg production. All this adds up to fewer broilers and eggs in the coming months," and that's not all.

"Higher feed and poultry prices also have a tendency to pull up beef prices, too," says Edwards. "Higher beef prices will mean higher prices for beef products, too."

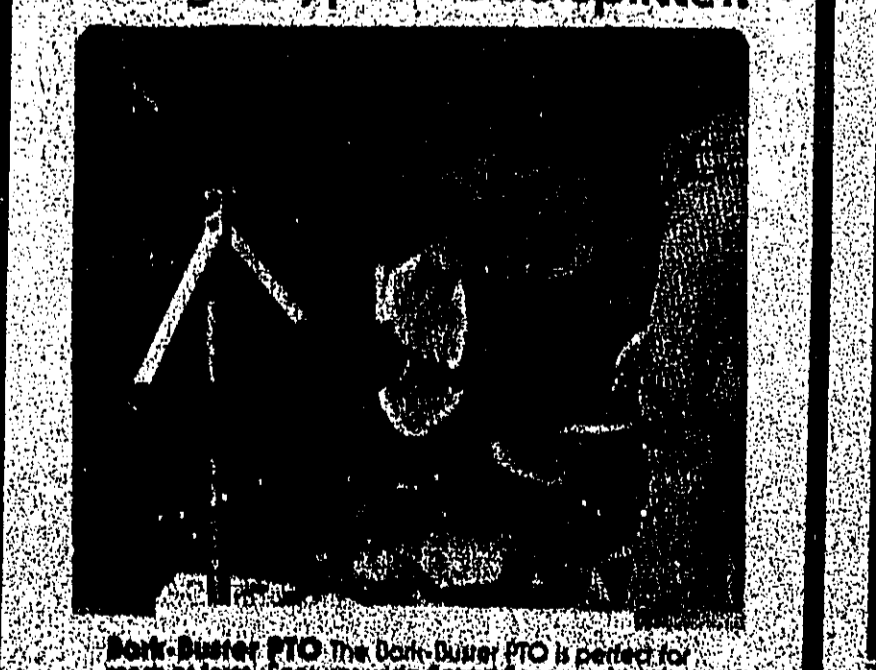

CAPITOL UPDATE

The Soviet Union outraged the world with the cold-blooded murder of 269 men, women and children flying to South Korea in a commercial passenger jet. This attack was a wanton and unprovoked act of barbarism by the Soviets. The Soviets first denied any knowledge of this inexcusable action, and then tried to brazen it out with the flimsy and unacceptable explanation that the plane was in their airspace. Later, the Soviet Union charged that the Korean airliner was on a spying mission, a totally preposterous accusation.

On occasion, planes flying over vast areas of open ocean deviate from their course because of navigational errors. However, there are internationally accepted procedures for assisting planes in distress and guiding them out of restricted airspace. To shoot down such a plane - including almost certainly the death of all who are on board - is inexcusable.

I cannot offer any explanation as to why the Soviet Union would commit such a barbaric and unprovoked act, but this terrible event does remind us that this world is simply not guided by the same moral standards that we associate with civilized nations.

What, then, should we do to express a revulsion? We have heard many suggestions - ranging from cutting off diplomatic relations with the Soviet Union to imposing trade sanctions. However, we must be certain that any action we take is effective and in our national interest.

Clearly, it is important to us that we continue to communicate with the Soviet Union, and that we seek an agreement to control nuclear weapons. We know that the 1950-51 embargo was ineffective as well as unfair to our nation's farmers, so to repeat that response would not be in order.

There are, however, two courses of action which are appropriate and President Reagan is pursuing both of them. The first is to act in concert with the rest of the civilized world to express our outrage and to penalize the Soviet Union by restricting its civil aviation. At the same time, we must work with other nations to try to find ways to ensure that nothing like this ever happens again.

The best long-term response, though, is to continue to strengthen our national defense capability. We cannot effectively prevent Soviet aggression in the world unless we possess a military capability sufficient to deter Soviet aggression. The Korean aircraft incident points out, yet again, that reason and moral persuasion alone are not enough.

The Soviet Union will refrain from aggression on both large and small scales only to the extent that it believes it is in its self-interest to do so. It is imperative, then, that we continue on the path we began three years ago to strengthen our deterrent capability.

This is a course of action which will impress the Soviet Union far more than words or sanctions, and, therefore, this is truly the best response not only to the Korean aircraft incident, but also to Soviet adventurism in Afghanistan, the Middle East, Latin America and elsewhere in the world.

AUSTIN—Every day thousands of Texas consumers receive flyers and notices promising a "special sale" on one or more items. News papers are full of "getting special" on everything from lawn and garden equipment to Easter dresses.

Price comparisons are useful in making decisions. But price comparisons based on inflated or arbitrary prices can be misleading. The Texas Attorney General's office has issued a warning that consumers should be alert to deceptive practices when they see a "special sale" advertisement. The office says that consumers should compare prices to the actual market price of the item, not to an inflated price.

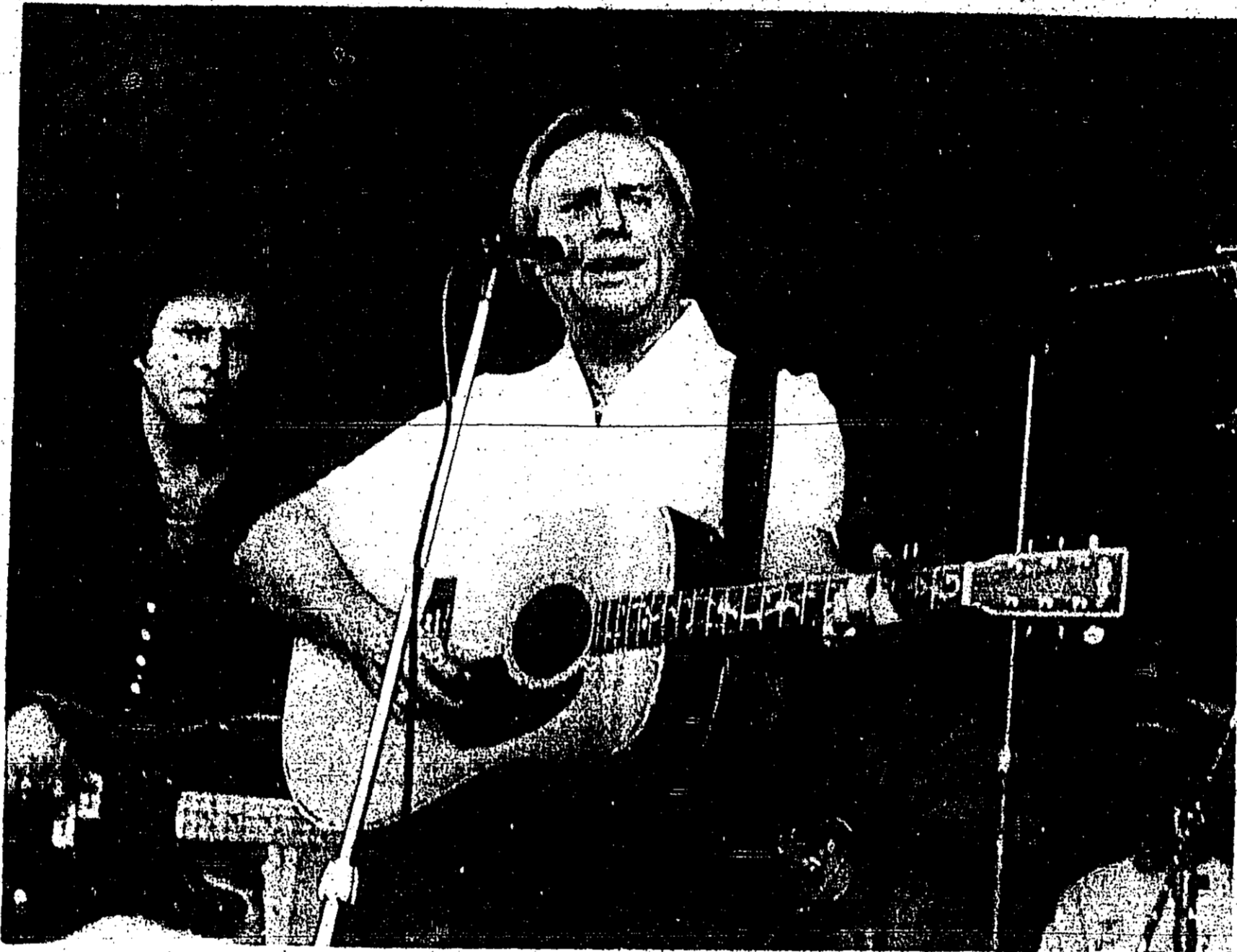

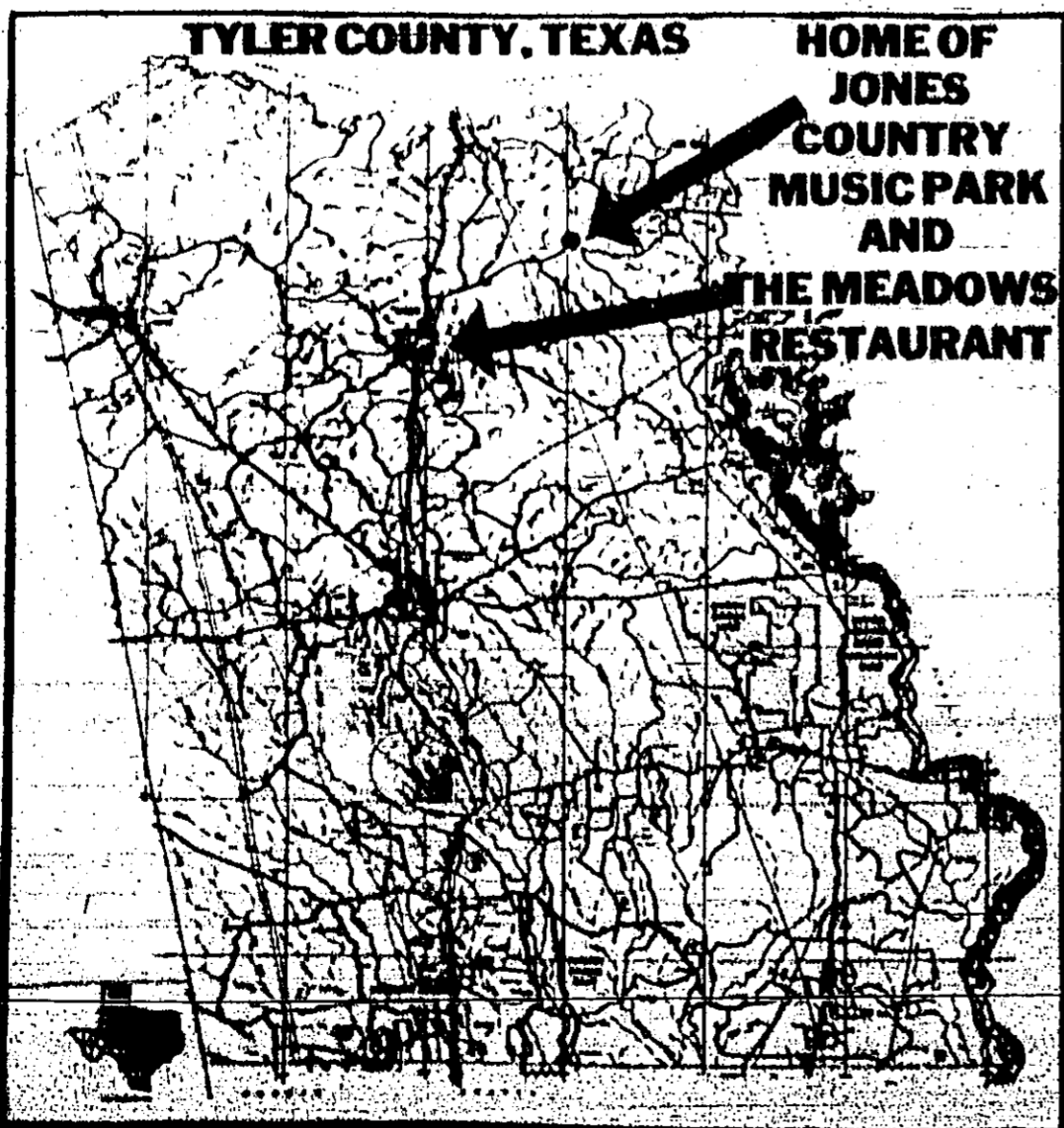
