Puneral services for Joe A. Edwards, 77, Woodville Funeral Director will be at 2 p.m. Wednesday at the Woodville United Methodist Church with the pastor, the Rev. Jack Worsham, officiating. Interment will be at 5 p.m. in the Magnolia Cemetery of Beaumont. Edwards died at 8:10 p.m. Monday at Tyler County Hospital after a short illness.

He was a native of Louisiana and was a graduate of the Ed C. Smith School of Embalming of Dallas, Texas. He was first employed as a funeral director by the Roberts Undertaking Co. of Beaumont. After moving to Woodville in 1940, Edwards became manager of the Dudley Metcalf Funeral Home, which he later purchased from the Metcalf family. Since 1941 he and his wife have operated the business as Edwards Funeral Home, also the Edwards-Bennett Association, founded by Joe.

He was a past president of the Southeast Texas Funeral Directors Association and vice-president and treasurer of Southeast Texas Savings and Loan Association. He was also a member of the Texas Association of Funeral Directors. He was very active in Woodville community affairs and very supportive of his church, the Woodville United Methodist Church.

This past spring he was honored by the local chapter of the American Business Women's Association as "The Boss of the Year." He was a Rotarian for many years.

He is survived by his wife, Mrs. Wilhelmina Ruyssenaers Edwards of Woodville; one daughter, Mrs. Richard H. Opper of Houston; three grandchildren, Julie Marie Opper, Franklin Edwards Opper and Gregory Richard Opper, all of Houston; two brothers, H. H. Edwards of Galveston and Edwin Edwards of Milwaukee, Wis.; and one sister, Mrs. Orren Pickett of Waco.

Another Editorial

Lake Rockland Vital To Area

For 52 weeks now-one full year "The Tyler County Booster" has committed itself to a comprehensive in-depth examination of the plethora of issues surrounding the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Rockland Lake and Dam Project. Now, you, our fellow Tyler Countians of the past, present and future will have your opportunity to express your support, express your concerns and criticisms - when the Rockland Project's head man, Colonel Ted Stroup comes to Woodville on Thursday, October 27 for a daylong series of public meetings.

It's a coming to find out how Tyler County fits the project.

It is the Booster's recommendation that you, our readers, express your support for this vital part of the future economic landscape of Tyler County by asking your congressman by letter or phone - to please to see that at least \$200,000 in preliminary planning funds be made part of the next Congressional budget.

The \$200,000 will not only move the long delayed Rockland Reservoir out of a 37 year submerison in federal "ice water" but will assure that it is the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Project which is built. Should Congressional funding for the project continue to be delayed or should Congress give in to the Reagan Administration's infeasible proposals for 100 percent "up-front" financing for federal water projects, it is possible that local sponsors Lower Neches Valley Authority (LNVA), in combination with the City of Houston or some other entity willing to put up money for Rockland's 605,300 acre-foot per year of high quality water might fire the federal delay and red-tape and build the project without the Corps of Engineers. After all, Lake Livingston, Lake Conroe, and Lake Toledo Bend are all area lake projects built by Texas River authorities.

The problems with this approach is that unlike the Corps of Engineers, lakes Baytown and now Rockland area river authority lakes have not been designed or built for specific purposes of downstream flood control or for public recreation use. Likewise, some reservoirs have not, (evidently for cost reasons) been built as large as their sites would justify. After last year's disastrous Deweyville floods in the lower Sabine River Basin, it was proposed that the Sabine River Authority's Toledo Bend Dam be heightened and that the additional water capacity be used for flood control. Needless to say after all of the development which has taken place around the lake, the expense of buying that property for the lake makes such an idea impractical. Such things as flood control and development of facilities for public paths, camping areas, and other recreation, need to be designed into a project from the start and with no short cuts. It is in this area of design and planning that the Corps of Engineers is especially proficient. Likewise, the Corps is mandated to address the value of understanding and preservation of the historical and archeological sites in the reservoir area. Also, in a reservoir site as large as Lake Rockland, the Corps of Engineers would replace lost wildlife habitat of approximately 65,000 acres of woodland.

Finally, one final reason for the Corps to build Rockland that we should not forget is that the LNVA is already paying money towards the local sponsors cost of the project to the Federal Government.

The Corps of Engineers multipurpose reservoir plans for Lake Rockland make it a strong project with many possible positive impacts on the future of our area. If we are to realize the full potential of this project, it is important that the Corps of Engineers receive funding in the next congressional budget. But don't take our word for it. Come listen to the "Army Answer Man" from Fort Worth and to your neighbors and their opinions on the project, and make up your mind for yourself.

School Principal Joe Woodland and Jr. High Principal C.J. Heriard. The two principals had made a study of several Detention Halls in Texas and concluded that, if run properly, they have a positive effect in reducing discipline prob-

lems. The Detention Hall will be a room with blocked cubicles. Each student will sit in his/her cubicle facing the wall. The District will employ a full-time certified teacher to supervise the area. Students will work on assignments during the school day. There will be no P.E. and no contact with other students. The Detention Hall will begin as soon as personnel and facilities can be obtained.

Computer Use In The Home

COLLEGE SENIORS... When it comes to household management, a computer is just another appliance, says loan counselor Homer Plimont.

A home computer can assist in keeping household records of checks, including address, telephone numbers, special days and appointments. It can also maintain an accurate record of household goods, such as the stamps in your collection, she explains.

But a computer will not make you a good record keeper, says Plimont, who specializes in family resource management for Texas A&M University's Agricultural Extension Service.

Home computers can also assist in financial decision making. Financial modeling programs allow the household to do a cost benefit analysis of large investments such as a home or car, rather than guessing at the financial consequences of a purchase decision, notes Plimont.

The computer can also be especially useful in forecasting the impact of a purchase on their budget.

Some computer programs will even help families compare their spending to that of families in similar circumstances, says Plimont.

But the computer can't tell you how to budget, she adds, "since budgeting decisions rest on the family's value system and priorities."

Many public education agencies, including county Extension offices, have financial decision making and budgeting programs available to help families. Plimont says that if you are interested in such programs, you should contact your local Extension office.

Organize To Reduce Stress

Eliminating the unhealthful stress caused by an overly complicated life is frequently just a matter of exercising common sense and practicing a few simple techniques. If you feel you could benefit from a bit more order in your day-to-day existence, make a firm commitment to put your hurried past behind you and use the following tips to guide you toward better organization and less stress.

Keep a planning notebook. By maintaining a cumulative master list of jobs that need doing, problems to be solved

and goals you'd somewhat like to reach, you'll find yourself focusing on achieving your aims rather than simply on trying to remember what they are.

Maintain a "daily to do" list. Each day, as things come to mind, compose a list of tasks to do tomorrow. The next morning put numbers beside the different jobs to rank them in order of importance. As you go through your day, try not to give in to the temptation to skip over high-priority tasks to do less important ones. Stick to your original ratings and at

tempt to cross out all the entries by the end of the evening.

Establish lifetime objectives. Ask yourself, "How would I really like to spend the next five, ten, or fifteen years? If I knew I were going to die in six months, what would I want to do between now and then?"

Another technique is to compose a scenario for an ideal day in your life five or ten years hence. Describe where and how you'd be living, and follow your activities from morning through night. Make it a day that you'd find fully satisfying in terms of work and play,

friends and family, health and environment.

Once you've given the matter some thought, you should be able to come up with a list of very specific lifetime objectives. Write them down in your planning notebook, and review them from time to time...just to keep your self on track.

Use an appointment calendar and schedule time for self care. A day book can help you remember meetings, bill payments, and such. And be sure, too, to make appointments with yourself for relaxing, reading, exercising, lis-

tening to music, or whatever, and with your family and friends.

Also, try to structure breaks for yourself during working hours. Obviously, this won't be as easy for some as for others, but you should try to schedule one or two brief periods in which you'll take a walk or pet your dog, or a friend. Do your best to quit working at a fixed time each day. Most people are more productive when they know they have a deadline to meet.

Establish a regular

plan of time. Once a day, sit down and review your cumulative list of goals and tasks, and prioritize your "to-do" list for the next work or school day. Once you've gone planning, try to look at least several months ahead to get a better idea of what you'll be doing then, and to determine whether you need to be making preparations now.

Nothing how you use

your days. If you keep a detailed time log over a period of just three days, you'll probably be surprised at the results. Most people find that they spend only one-third to one-half as much time on unproductive projects as they thought. Once you're aware that you're wasting much of your day, you can make a conscious effort to avoid all the sidetracks that rob you of putting time to its best use.


