City Budget 'Shoestring'

"You can tell the folks we're operating on a 'shoestring budget,'" said Woodville Mayor Brian Dablin as he called for and received a unanimous vote to adopt a \$1,558,898.00 budget for 1983-84 year representing a decrease from actual expenditures experienced during 1982-83.

The total budget projection for 1983-84 represents a percent decrease in expenses for city operation.

City Manager Walt Davis said that it looked like "hard times ahead" for the city fathers in paying for city services including gas and sewer consideration.

The total outstanding dept picture for the city stands at \$710,236.

The total proposed revenue picture for the city totals \$1,558,898 up from actual revenue for 1982-83 standing at \$1,584,166.

In other city business the city heard a plea from a group of Doucette businessmen who appeared before council to interest them in a takeover of the failing Doucette Gas System.

"We'd like to think of you as potential customers," said Tom Parker. "We've just about built a new system with volunteer labor but volunteer interest is low right now," he added.

The Doucette system serves 140 customers. It currently owes \$14,000 to the city of Woodville.

"We'll give it to you lock, stock and barrel," Parker said.

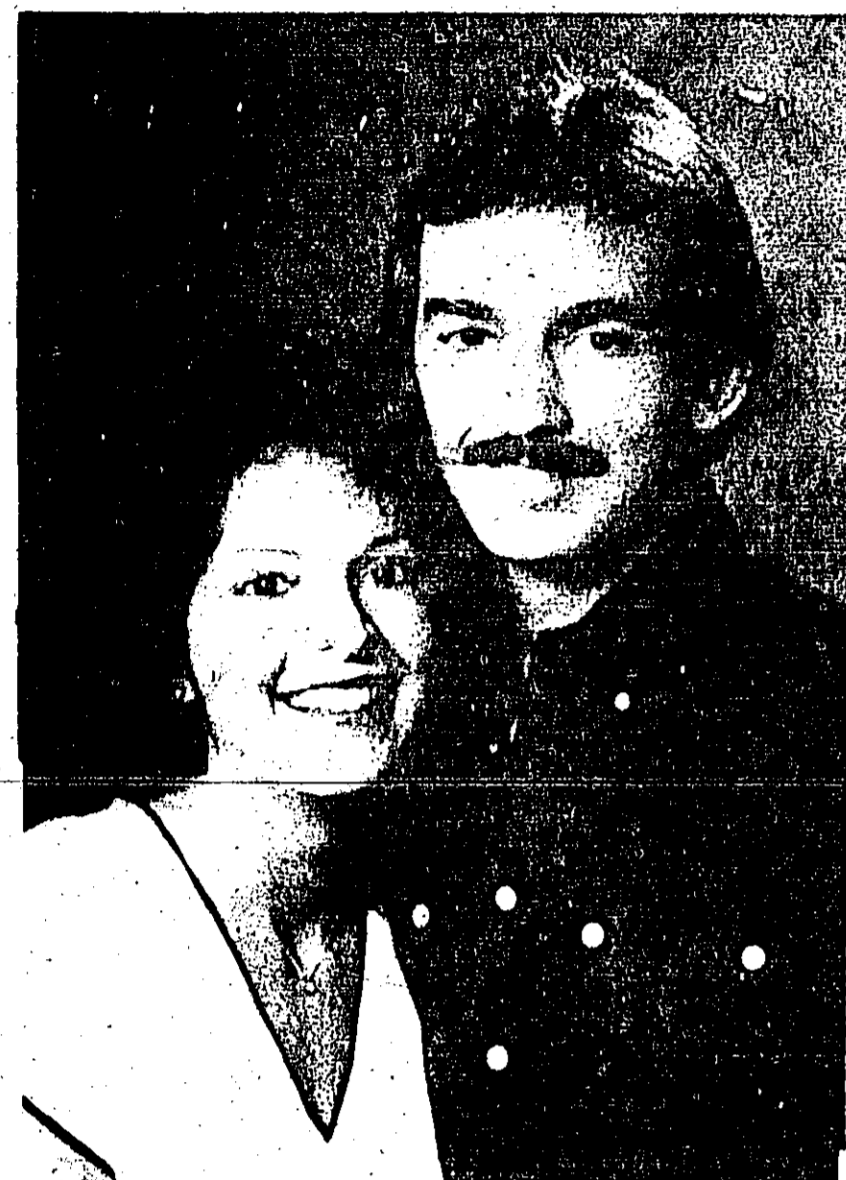

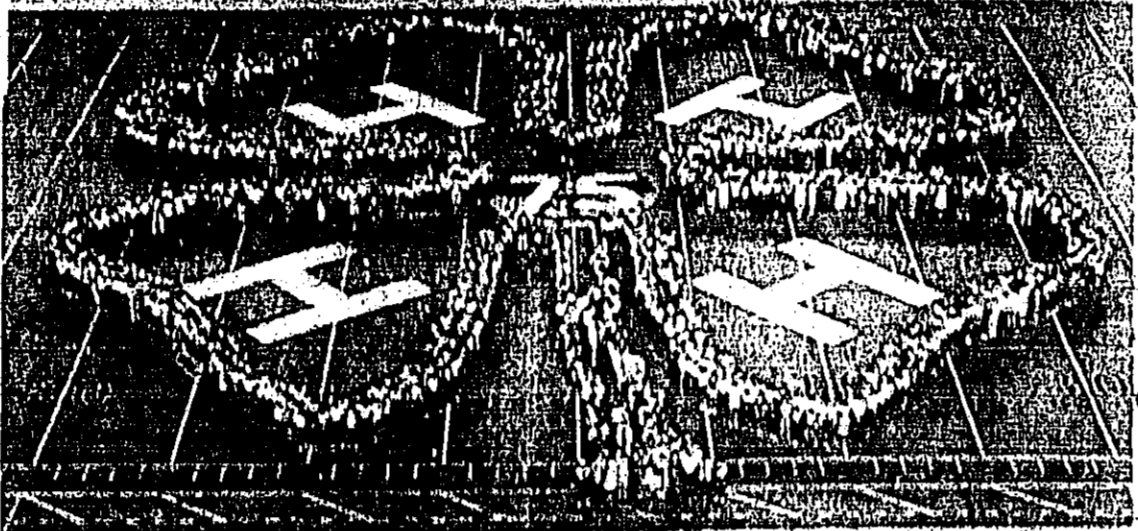

Fair Representation On Tax Board

Dear Editor,

In the controversy over ratio of Representation for Taxing Entities on Board of Directors for Tyler County Tax Appraisal District, it seems that tax units with the higher ratio of levy want a comparable voting ratio on the board of directors. At first glance, that seems to be fair enough, but, is it? Say, for example, one taxing unit has fifteen (15) times as much levy as another. If the minor taxing unit wouldn't have much of a voice in voting matters, or suppose two (2) taxing units had 51% of the total levy, they would control the board. The other five (5) directors would lose on a controverted vote. This small minority of two (2) board members would control all business.

As I understand it, the present and originally adopted plan is one (1) Director for each of the seven (7) entities in Tyler County, and Independent School Districts of Woodville, Charter, Colmesville, Sprague, and Warren. Currently each taxing units contribution to the Tyler County Tax Appraisal District is proportional to the Tax Levy of property in that district to that of the Total Tax Levy of all the seven (7) taxing units. That is, if a taxing unit's Tax Levy amounts to 20% of the total Tax Levy, it has 20% of the total operational budget for Tyler County Tax Appraisal District.

However, I see no fair or equitable basis for using the Tax Levy of each taxing unit to determine its representation on the Board of Directors of the Appraisal Board. Each taxing unit determines its own Tax Levy based on its own assessment. That Tax Levy represents nothing more than the

Watching Washington

Even with our economy on the upswing nearly 11 million Americans are still out of work. We should be doing all we can to create more jobs. The current economic picture is not a good one for small business and that does not bode well for our nation's workers.

Small companies that rely on financing on external sources are being hit hard by the Federal Reserve's tight money policy. I have introduced legislation in the Senate that addresses some of the basic problems that confront small businesses: a lack of investment funds, complex investment procedures and tax and other inequities.

The Henders bill has five provisions. One of its provisions would make small businesses more competitive by allowing them to claim the same tax credit for investing in used equipment that larger, better-financed companies get when they buy new equipment.

Under current tax law, a business operator investing in new equipment can claim 10 percent of the purchase price as a tax credit. But a smaller business, able to afford only used equipment, can claim the 10 percent credit on only \$125,000 of the purchase price. This limitation will increase to \$150,000 in 1985.

For example, an individual would have to buy more than \$600,000 of used equipment to establish a small machine shop employing 10 workers. The operator could expect an investment tax credit of only \$12,500. A business able to buy \$300,000 of new equipment would get a \$30,000 investment tax credit.

The limitation serves to eliminate the competitive disadvantage smaller businesses face in financing their growth.

Another part of my bill would encourage long-term investment in small businesses by reducing the capital gains tax rate from 20 to 10 percent for those who buy new issues of stock and hold onto it for at least five years.

The Henders bill would also permit small corporations to claim tax deductions on up to \$250,000 of the dividends they pay for small businesses and permit small businesses to use cash accounting methods similar to those now allowed farmers.

We need to encourage the entrepreneurs and risk takers to turn their ideas into small businesses so that jobs will be created and our country will grow and prosper.

My bill would help make sure that there is money available for these risk takers to get started and to stay in business.

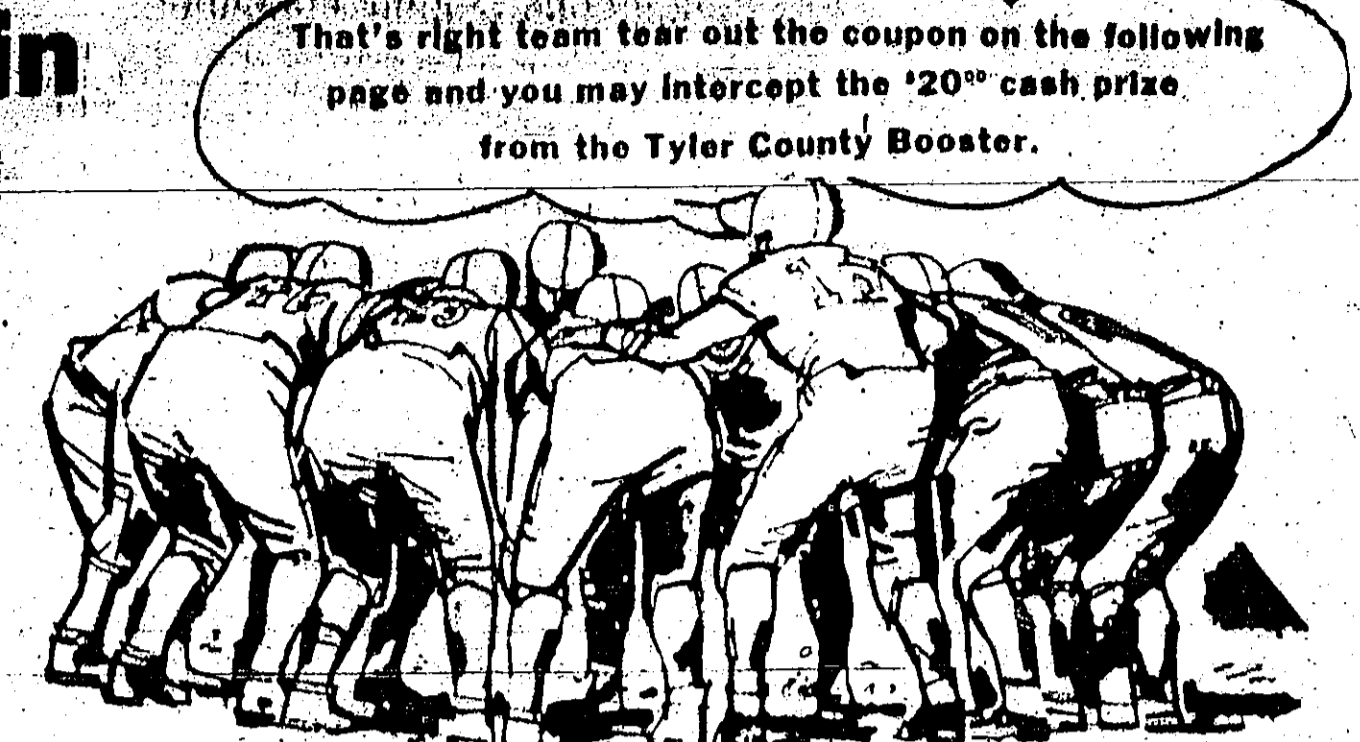

War Against Beetles Progressing

National Forests in Texas Supervisor Mike Lannan announced today that U.S. Forest Service crews are making progress in controlling the Southern Pine Beetle infestation in the Four Notch RAIN II Further Planning area located in the Sam Houston National Forest in Walker County.

Extremely wet weather hampered initial activities to control the beetle outbreak and caused the infestation to reach epidemic proportions, so we brought in crews from Virginia, Kentucky, Arkansas, and New Mexico to hand cut a buffer strip ahead of the beetles, and we now have a containment line around the major infested area, Lannan said.

Lannan said that some new beetle spots are appearing but that crews are containing them quickly and to this point have been successful in significantly decreasing the spread. We are hopeful that the containment will continue to be effective, the supervisor said.

Control actions against the destructive Southern Pine Beetle in Four Notch were begun in early July but an abnormally heavy 30 inches of rain, due in part to Hurricane Alicia, has soaked the area since that time and hindered the use of motorized equipment to carry out timber cutting and logging activities.
