Rockland PowWow Near

The project of the \$650 million U.S. Army Corps of Engineers Rockland Dam and Dan Project will be the topic of discussion when Rockland "PowWow" comes to Woodville Thursday, October 27. The Colonel will speak and answer questions at four meetings in Woodville.

'Tell Public No Exemptions For Timber Lands', Mahan

"I want you news media people to tell the people out there that the Commissioner's Court hasn't can't give tax exemptions to the timber companies," said Jerry Mahan Monday at a county budget planning meeting.

Commissioners facing a decrease in tax revenues were last week asking county officials to review and cut their budget requests. However, by Monday morning Commissioners were considering going to a

nine month budget for this year in order to avoid having to cut county services. Decreased tax revenues were a result of a approximately \$14 million decrease in appraisals of which \$29.9 million, according to head appraiser Leslie Silva of the Tyler County Appraisal Board, were due to increase use by individual users of the productivity use exemptions on timber and agriculture land. The timber companies according to Silva, took their productivity exemptions in 1982 when the county's timber lands were reappraised so that the total lost because of use of the productivity use exemption "is now more like \$29 million in appraisals."
