No Tax Hike For Tyler County

Commissioner's Court Monday, approved changing the dates of the counties fiscal year, approved a tax rate equal to last year and accepted a 9 month 1984 budget of \$1,976,656.

The 1984 fiscal year for the county as changed by Commissioners will run the nine months from January 1 until September 30 of 1984. Thereafter, the county fiscal year will begin on October 1 and end on September 30 rather than from January 1 to December 31, the same as most regional state and federal governmental agencies.

Commissioners also set an overall county tax rate of 43 cents per \$100 valuation or 23 cents for the county general fund, 13 cents for the lateral road and bridge fund and 5 cents for the county hospital district. This is the same tax rate as last year but represents a decrease in tax revenues due to a

\$57,963,478 loss in appraisal values from the 1982 to the 1981 appraisal.

The county property tax exemptions as last year, \$21,430 for over 65 year olds and use of state schedule for disabled veterans was adopted by Commissioners.

Harold Davis was appointed as a new election judge for Precinct 1, Box 4 Warren Middle School replacing Herman Ellis who resigned because of illness. Mr. A. G. Smith was appointed as alternate judge of approximately 400 ft. of right easement was accepted by the county for a road located northwest of Colmesneil.

Voting Light Tuesday

Turn out for Tuesday's eleven proposed amendments to the Texas Constitution was very light. As of 9:00 Tuesday only 762 out of 1,043 registered voters had cast a ballot at the county courthouse P.C. 1 floor.

Amendment Six would permit the legislature to permit "added remedies" including perhaps garnishment of wages to enforce court ordered child support.

Amendment Seven would allow a city or town to expend funds to relocate or replace sewer laterals.

Amendment Eight would change the definition of an Urban Homestead.

Pesticides Information System Now In National Service

WASHINGTON—A computerized system that quickly retrieves up-to-the-minute facts about registered pesticides across the country will pass from the pilot stage to full operation Oct. 10.

Management of the system will continue at Purdue University, West Lafayette, Ind., where the successful pilot program originated. Called NPIRS, short for National Pesticide Information Retrieval System, the system was developed at Purdue in cooperation with three U.S. Department of Agriculture agencies — the Cooperative State Research Service, the Extension Service and Agricultural Research Service.

Jim White, the system's user service manager at Purdue, said NPIRS provides the latest information about key characteristics of pesticide products registered by the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and participating state regulatory agencies through a computer network.

Users of the system pay what White called "nominal membership and user fees."

White said the service is available to member organizations such as land grant universities, state and federal regulatory offices, state and federal scientists, the pesticides industry, various user groups and organizations, and others working on pesticide-related activities.

"The service fills a long recognized need,"

White said. "In the past," he said, "by the time a compendium of pesticide changes was compiled and issued, it already was out-of-date. Now, through the computer network, which contains EPA and state registration data updated regularly, NPIRS members can rapidly acquire timely pesticide information."

During the past year, procedures for the system were tested in programs involving 12 states, the USDA's EPA and representatives of private industry. "Already, 30 state agencies have signed up for the service," said White. "Inquiries showing strong interest have been received from nearly 100 other groups, institutions and individuals."

Customers of the system can get pesticide label information, including active ingredients and products, via dial-up on standard computer terminals. They also can search for sites, pests, EPA registration numbers and brand names at both the federal and state levels. Entry of state data is optional for the states.

Indications are that most states with pesticide registration programs will submit their state data for use in the program," said White. "Twenty-three states already are committed."

White said the service should prove especially valuable to agricultural and pest control consultants, Extension Service, Agricultural Experiment Stations, regulatory agencies, pesticide-associated industries, trade and professional associations, teachers and others. He said a user's guide has been completed and will be available to those who join the system.
