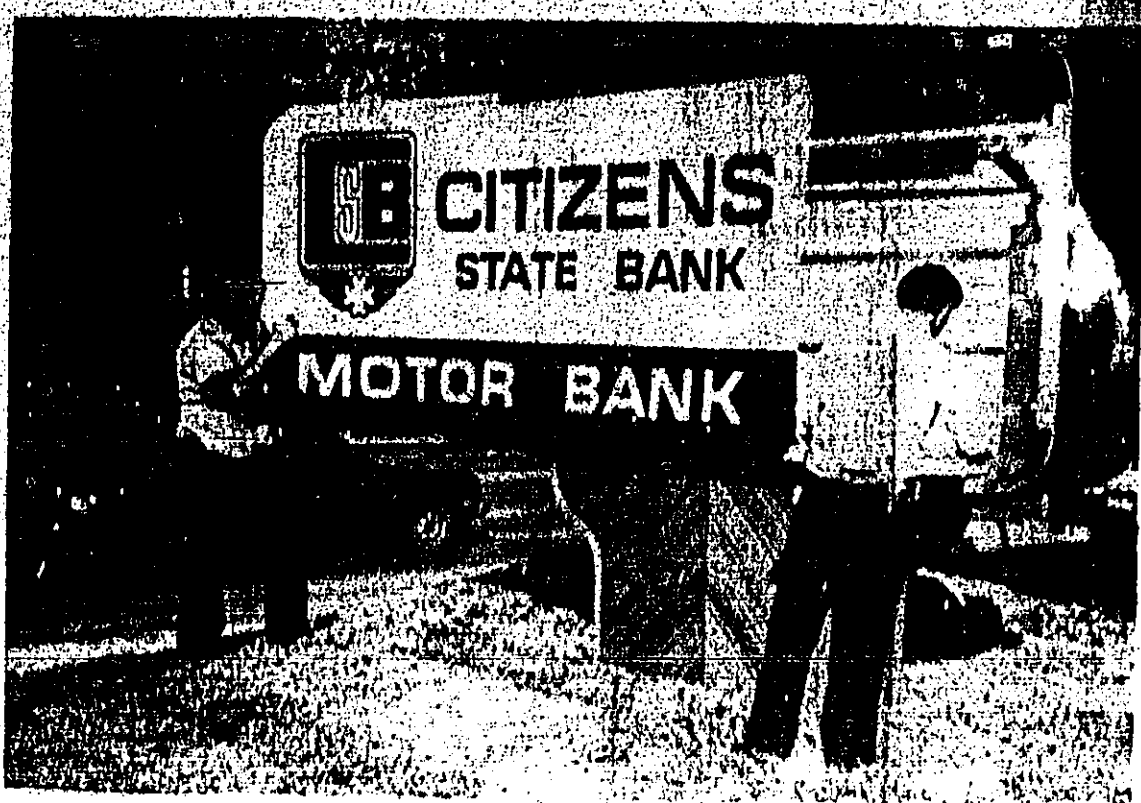

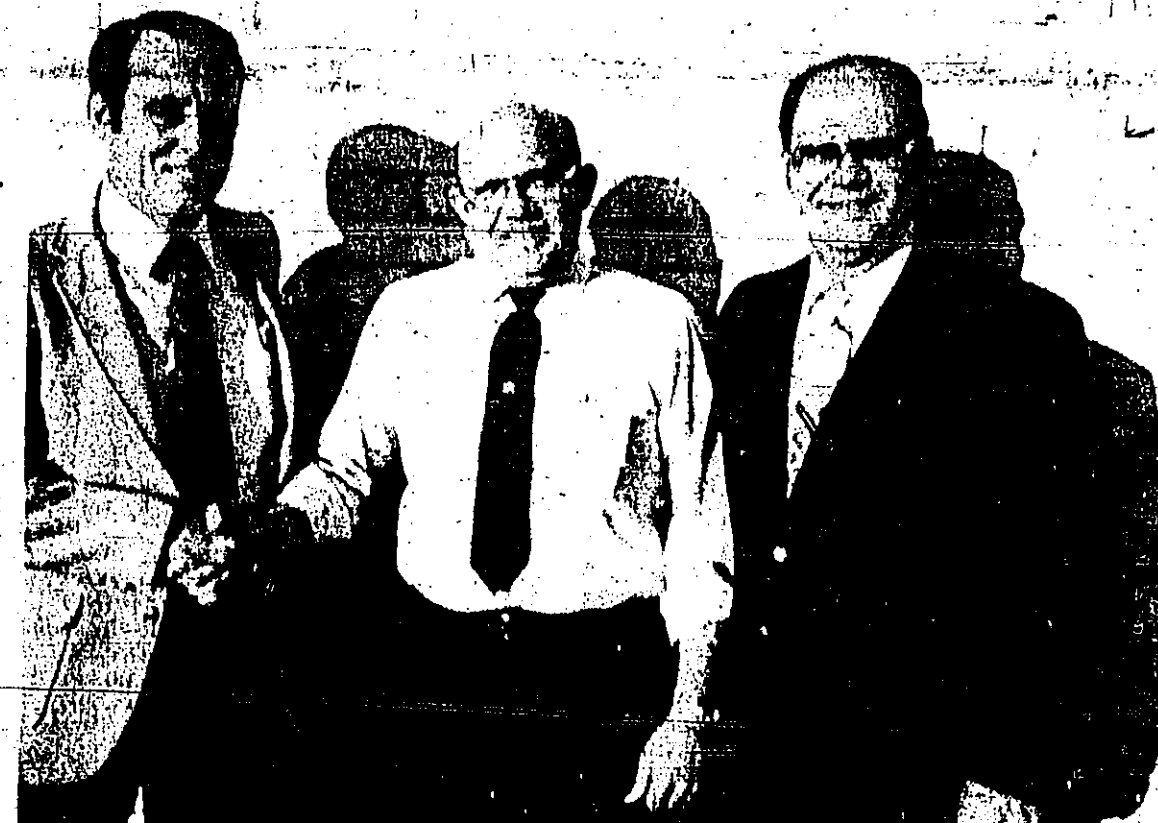

Match Funds For County Needy

Tyler County Commissioners meeting to special session Monday, approved a matching funds arrangement with the Center for Emergency Food, Shelter, Clothing and Energy to needy Tyler County citizens. Under the arrangement, the county will match dollar for dollar, \$1936 in state welfare funds and also administer the resulting program in Tyler County. This program according to County Judge Sturrock will enable the county to use its regularly budgeted welfare funds "for its own purposes" such as providing emergency medical and transportation purposes which the county funds may not be used for.

In other business, Commissioners approved a \$23,417.91 contract for the county to purchase new right-of-way and 14 new utility and moving loans to \$400 per month, an amount equal to that provided for county contracts, which are scheduled to be let in December.

Sheriff Leon Fowler requested next year's budget be amended to include an addition of \$100 per month for his personal expenses which otherwise would "have to come from my pocket". Commission agreed to Fowler's request, raising Fowler's expense at \$19 to \$40 per month.

Amendment #10 which would permit municipalities to pay for the location or repair of private sewer laterals was defeated 4-2. Finally, amendment #8 which would permit local tax on less than 8 percent of the county's voter registered voters voted in the election. Constitutional amendments approved and the amendments to name of "Mullin" Reward offered 283-3453 or 833-5411.

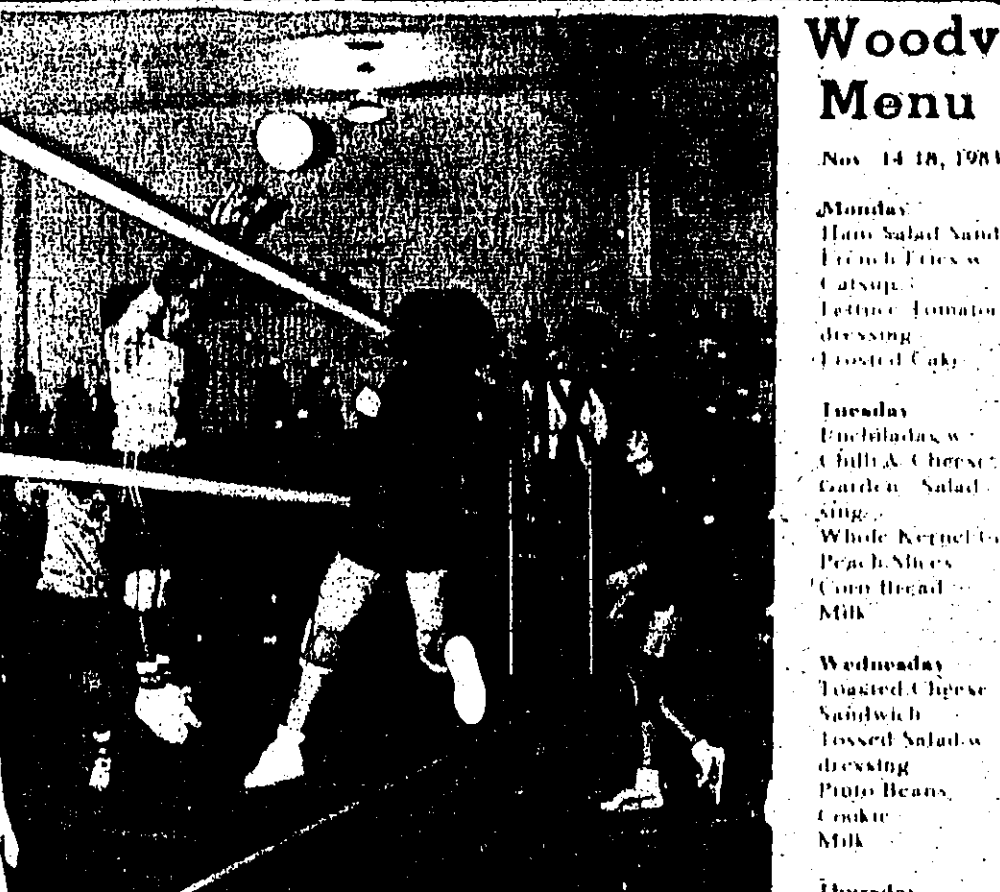

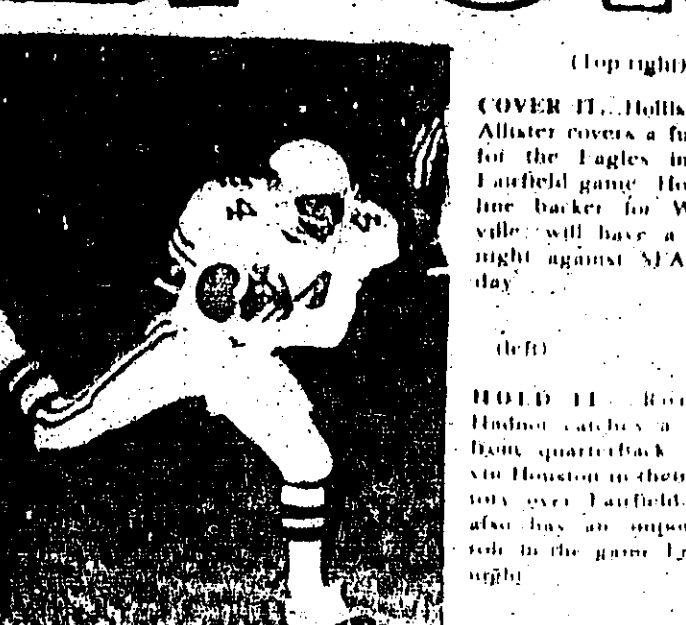

Consumer Meats Steady

COLLEGE STATION. Consumer use of red and processed meats, such as luncheon meats, has steadied after recent declines compared to the rise of poultry and fish. That finding in a recent report of the American Meat Institute and the National Live Stock and Meat Board spells good news for livestock producers and others in the meat industry, notes a meat specialist.

Basically, the report provides positive information for those in the meat industry. It points out Dr. Dennis Stiffler with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. "It notes that while consumers are still concerned with health, education, obesity, caloric intake, fat and cholesterol when buying food, there is less emphasis on price than previously thought. Major concerns seem to be quality and consistency."

The report was based on 1,050 telephone interviews with grocery shoppers and was a follow-up to a similar survey conducted in 1981 by the same agency of Yankelovich, Skelly and White, Inc. Major findings were:

Older Americans More Vulnerable

COLLEGE STATION. Many older Americans feel more vulnerable to financial exploitation and fraud. A study by the Texas A&M University System shows that older people are not victimized any more or less than other age groups but the fact does not help feelings of fear, says Walter, who works with the Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service Home Economics program.

Older people living in rural areas may feel the isolation more than they did when they were younger, she adds. "A major concern of older persons is to prevent robbery, make sure the home is locked whenever you are not home. Dead-bolt locks, locks on pins or windows and closed garage doors help keep a home secure."

The appearance of someone in the home is important too. Lights left on or a radio played at normal volume can be a deterrent.

Many neighborhoods organize a "neighborhood watch" in this neighborhood. In this neighborhood, neighbors agree to be aware of each other's home and report to the police any activities out of the ordinary.
