

# Cong. Wilson Guarantees Lake Rockland Design Funding

Congressman Charles Wilson in an interview with the Boater last Wednesday guaranteed funding for the next phase of the Lake Rockland Project and clarified his position on the issue of designation of Wilderness Areas in East Texas National Forests.

Wilson stated that "if the Corps of Engineers requests it, \$500,000 in the 1985 federal budget for the next set of studies in the Lake Rockland Project should be no problem". Wilson pledged that "even if the Corps Rockland funding request is not included in the President's budget request in January, I will see that the funds are added to the Appropriations Bill in Congress".

On another topic of local concern Wilson expressed his support for designating several areas of National Forest in his district as Wilderness. "There are areas in the East Texas National Forests which are worth preserving as wilderness for future generations and these areas are going to be preserved, but it won't be 65,000 acres of wilderness or even 30,000 acres just because Ned Fritz and his friends want that much!"

Congressman Wilson has introduced legislation in the House of Representatives setting aside a total of 9,000 acres of land

in three areas of the East Texas National Forests land. Wilson's proposal is in agreement with the U.S. Forest Service recommendations from the Forest Service's 1979 Rare II Land Use Study. Dallas Congressman John Bryant recently introduced legislation setting aside a total of 65,000 acres of Texas National Forest land in ten Wilderness areas. Bryant's bill is in agreement with proposals endorsed by Terra Club, National Audubon Society Wilderness Society and the Dallas-based Texas Committee on Natural Resources. The chairman is Ned Fritz.

Wilson points out that there is already 69,000 acres of Wilderness land in his district included in the Big Thicket Preserve and that in the Big Thicket, "if you look at visitation you will find there has been virtually none when compared with visitation to the area lake parks." "One area they want for Wilderness is the Indians Mounds Unit of the Sabine National Forest, but that area has had 28 clear cuts in the last five years and development of oil and gas wells. There are permanent roads in the area which if we closed we would face a citizens rebellion from area residents," Wilson concluded.

### For Wilderness Walk

## Environmentalist Fritz Here

Last Saturday afternoon Dallas environmentalist and chairman of the Texas Committee on Natural Resources Ned Fritz led a small group of Dallas and East Texas residents including this reporter on a four-hour "wilderness walk" through the proposed Graham Creek or Upland Island Wilderness Area of the Angelina National

Forest. The area of approximately 9,200 acres is one of 10 areas proposed for Wilderness designation in Dallas Congressman John Bryant's recently introduced bill in the House of Representatives but is not included in the Wilderness proposal of area Congressman Charles Wilson. Most of the area is currently classified by the Forest Service as a Further

Study Area. "We can have this area for hunting and recreation; it is important to preserve these valuable ecosystems for future generations to enjoy," says Fritz. "In this area the Bouton Lake and Coney Creek Camping Areas could be expanded so people who just wanted to spend a few hours in the wilderness could camp in an established camping

area. Of course lots of hunters and hikers will probably want to pitch a camp." Congressman Wilson is now beginning to recognize the value of preserving some wilderness areas. He is now taking a personal interest in how much we get says Fritz. "We started off asking for 100,000 acres and may have made a mistake in voluntarily reducing the areas to

65,000. We are now having to discuss something on less than 65,000 acres. Our criteria will include large areas of the area and diversity of plant communities. Large areas is important, we need to move toward having large wilderness areas even if it means fewer Wilderness areas," says Fritz. "This Upland Island Area is high priority area on everybody's list

for wilderness. The Upland Island area is roughly the area of the Angelina National Forest which lies North of the Neches River and east of Hwy 69. It is bordered by Forest Road 344 also known as the Bouton Lake Road on the road to the "Blue Hole" swimming hole. According to Fritz the

## Wilson Fields Local Questions

Congressman Charles Wilson visited in Tyler County last Wednesday, receiving a home-made quilt from a constituent, speaking to Woodville Rotarians, visiting with Tyler County Booster newspaper and taking a short walking tour of the local Keller Industries plant.

Wilson began his visit in Tyler County by visiting with Mrs.

Thelma Lois Miller of Doucette, a 56 year resident of Tyler County, who presented the congressman with a home-made "Texas Star" quilt. Mrs. Miller indicated that she had recently begun giving one quilt a year as a gift and had chosen Wilson to make the quilt for out of gratitude for help the Congressman had provided her several years ago in "straightening out a problem I had in

getting my social security." "I signed up for social security back in 1937 when I was working with the county sewing room," Miller told Wilson, knowing he was a Democrat, she had started to quilt a donkey design on the quilt but that her daughter had suggested "the donkey might not be the right thing" so she had quilted the Texas Star design instead. Miller said the quilt had taken

about a month to make. Wilson then proceeded to Woodville where he spoke briefly and answered questions at the weekly noon meeting of the Woodville Rotary Club at the Woodville Inn. Wilson told the approximately 20 Rotarians and their guests that Congress had recessed without settling main issues before it. Economic recovery was described as being underway in

the congress man's district with the Lufkin and Orange areas dependent on the oil equipment industry being the two remaining pockets of "economic dislocation" remaining. Wilson characterized the high federal deficits as the only clouds on the economic horizon but felt that when Congress finally deals with the deficits it will have to act in a painful manner and therefore this would

be postponed until after the 1984 elections. Wilson lauded the president's actions in Grenada feeling that the real reason for the interest in having another surrogate of Communist Cuba in the Western Hemisphere. "We have made the small democracies in the Eastern Caribbean feel much

He was a member of the faculty of Oklahoma State University and South Plains Research and Extension Center, Lubbock, Texas where he conducted natural resource economics research and taught natural resource economics, price theory, statistics and production economics.

In September of 1968 Grubb became director of economic analysis section of the governor's office. His duties there included direction of staff of economists and statisticians to collect data, analyze and estimate econometric models of the Texas economy for use in economic development, natural resources development and employment programs of the state.

In March of 1976, Grubb served as Director of Planning and Development Division, Texas Department of Water Resources, Austin. The planning staff conducted water resource use

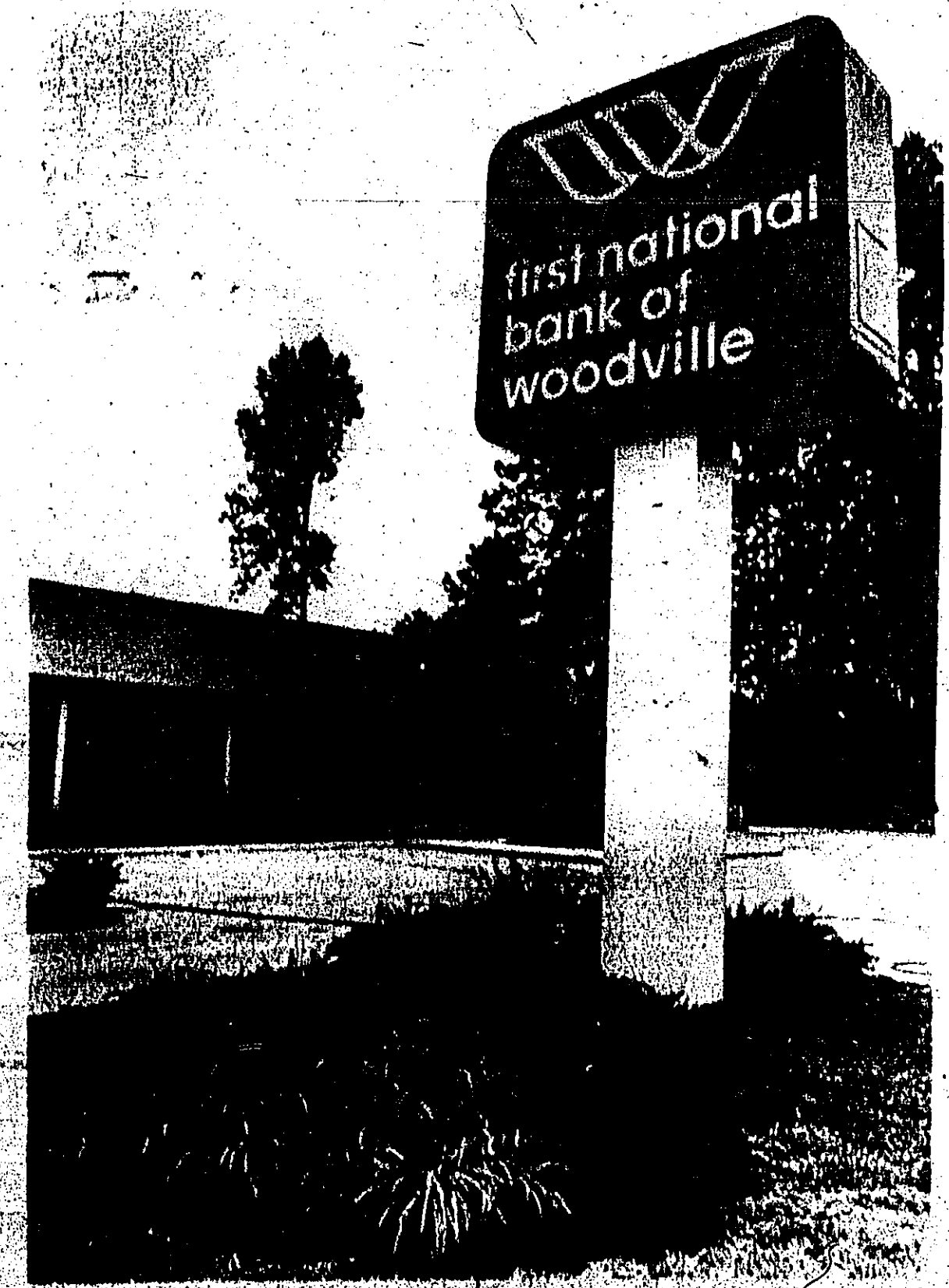

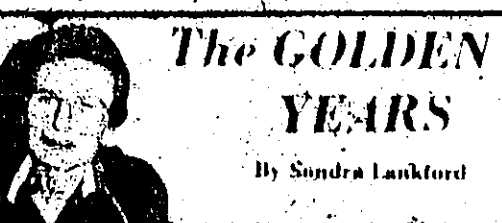
