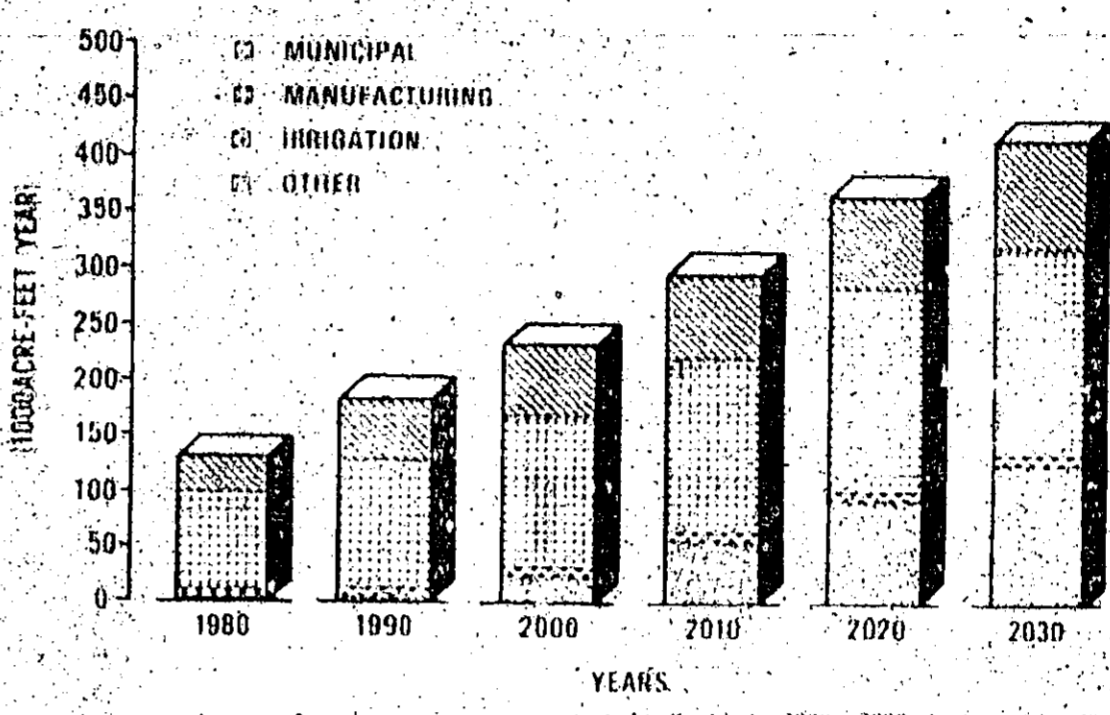
## Fight Turns Fatal

A Hillister family fight last Thursday evening ended in the fatal shooting of a 16-year-old Hillister youth and the arrest of his 19-year-old brother, after the youth reportedly lunged at Texas Department of Public Safety Officer Ronald Porter with an 18-inch bridge spike. At the time of the shooting Porter was assisting Tyler County Sheriff Leon Fowler with a family quarrel according to Sheriff Department reports.

Porter, reportedly pulled his gun when Redmon began to approach him with something in his hand, but with the assistance of the man's mother, Mrs. Dorothy Redmon and his two other brothers, Fowler was able to wrestle down Redmon and handcuff him.

Shirrell Redmon, with a gunshot wound to the left chest, arrived by ambulance at Tyler County Hospital shortly before 8:30 p.m. where, according to attending physician Dr. Stallmark, he had no discernable pulse or blood pressure. After a vigorous but unsuccessful effort to revive Redmon, the youth was pronounced dead at approximately 9:05 p.m.

## Water Is DETDA Topic

Decline of the petrochemical industry. The area, he stated, has timber resources only to support two more pulp mills by the year 2000. "There are 4 times as much BP's of energy in lignite coal in East Texas as there are in oil reserves of the area," Grubb stated. "At least two major coal gasification plants built in the East Texas Area after 2000."

water supply but as we continue to use up ground water resources that there would need to be built pipelines and water treatment plants to use these water supplies. On the state level an adequate water supply to the year 2020 will require the building of 65 of so remaining water supply reservoir sites. Even with these sites developed, and significant water conservation efforts factored into the projections, Grubb's figures show increasing water shortages beginning in Texas after the year 2020. Without the 65 water reservoirs the shortages could begin as early as the year 1990.

Among other business discussed was a recent resolution endorsing the 9,000-acre Wilderness Bill. Proposal of Congressman Charles Wilson and how the Association could encourage area organizations to endorse the Wilson Bill before Congress reconvenes at the end of January.
