## Illegal Aliens Rounded Up

A total of 48 Mexi-  
can illegal aliens,  
residing and/or working  
in the Tyler County  
area were picked up  
and delivered to Federal  
Naturalization and Emi-  
gration Officers since  
last Thursday in a sweep  
coordinated by the Tyler  
County Sheriff's Office  
and District Attorney's  
Office.  
"We have been re-  
ceiving a lot more com-  
plaints lately from the  
public about those ille-  
gal aliens here around  
Woodville. It's got to  
be the point where we  
needed to do something  
about it," was the way  
Tyler County Sheriff  
Leon Fowler explained  
the "first time since I  
can remember us doing  
this around here."  
The sweep began  
early Thursday morning  
as Sheriff's Deputies  
north of Woodville on  
Hwy 69 and east of  
Woodville on Hwy 190  
halted stopped vehicles  
containing illegals  
coming to work in the  
Woodville area. Of-  
ficers were assisted by  
Texas Department of  
Public Safety Officers  
checking driver's license  
east of Woodville. Natu-  
ralization and Immigra-  
tion Officers processed  
39 illegals and trans-  
ported them to Houston

## Hightower Won't Enter Congressional Debate On Wilderness Bill

"If it takes a Wilder-  
ness bill to stop the  
clearcutting of thou-  
sands of acres of nation-  
al forest land then its a  
good idea", said East  
Texas State Representative,  
Allen Hightower, in a  
Booster interview Mon-  
day. I'm a supporter  
of a Wilderness bill.  
I think we need one but  
I'm not going to get in  
the middle of a squabble  
between Congressman  
Bryant and Congress-  
man Wilson, on a na-  
tional congress issue. I  
know the two Congress-  
men are negotiating at  
this time", continued  
Hightower, "the main  
issue is one of size of  
the Wilderness area and  
they can work that out  
themselves."  
East Texas Congress-  
man Charles Wilson has  
introduced a bill in Con-  
gress which would set  
aside 65,000 acres of na-  
tional forest land as Wil-  
derness Areas.  
"I would settle for a  
bill that just stopped  
clearcutting in the na-  
tional forests", contin-  
ued Hightower. "We  
need to maintain a bal-  
ance between hard-  
woods and pine in the  
national forests and if  
we just stopped using  
clearcutting then that  
would not lose jobs and  
would also help main-  
tain the ecological bal-  
ance. What the timber  
companies do on their  
land is their business  
but what they do on na-  
tional forest land is  
yours, my, all of our  
business because that  
land belongs to us all."  
Hightower was con-  
tacted following the an-  
nouncement of the Bryant  
wilderness proposal by  
all of the members of  
the Texas House of Rep-  
resentatives Environ-  
mental Affairs Commit-  
tee except Hightower.  
Those members are  
Fred Agnich (R Dallas),  
Barry Connelly (R Hous-  
ton), Debra Danburg  
(D-Houston), El Franco  
(D-Houston), and  
Frank Collazo (D Port  
Wilderness Areas. The  
remainder of the com-  
mittee are elected from  
the Committee whose  
district includes pro-  
posed National Forest  
trails.

Legal drugs have become a major problem in American society. Consider these facts:

An average of six prescriptions are filled each year for every man, woman and child in the U.S. The average doubles when prescriptions given in hospitals are included.

Some 10 billion tranquilizer capsules are prescribed each year.

• If you have any questions, ask your doctor or pharmacist.

• Use your head before you swallow.
