Jan. 6, 1983
Seniors Get Pay Day Break
Gulf States Utilities is instituting a new program that will make it a little easier for many senior citizens to pay their monthly GSU bills. Beginning in January, qualified retirees throughout the GSU system will be able to pay their monthly bills on a designated date that coincides with the date their retirement checks arrive.

February 10, 1983
\$50,000 In Heritage Society Goal
A goal of \$50,000 has been set by the Tyler County Heritage Society for relocation and renovation of the historic old McCready house. The house, offered to the Heritage Society by Morris Clemmons, must be moved from its present site on Nellius Street in Woodville.

February 17, 1983
Council Gives TV Cable \$1 Rate Increase
Woodville City Councilmen acted Monday night to allow a \$1 hike in monthly American Cablevision fees and agreed to file with the Texas Department of Water Resources and the Farmers Home Administration for \$2,000,000 in funding for an additional sewer plant here.

February 24, 1983
Governor White Will Appoint New Judge Soon
Governor Mark White is expected to name a new judge for the 88th Judicial District replacing District Judge Clyde Earl Smith, who submitted his resignation asking that a replacement be named soon to fill the bench seat.

March 3, 1983
Rare Bird Discovered Near Tyler-Park Border
At least three of the rare endangered woodpeckers and one roosting or nesting tree has been identified in the Big Sandy Unit of the Big Thicket National Preserve in southern Polk County, says Greg Gatzel, Park Ranger with the Big Thicket Preserve.

March 10, 1983
Singer George Jones Marries, Settles Here
Country and Western singer George Glenn Jones tied the knot for the fourth time this past week marrying Nancy F. Sepulveda, an apparent childhood sweetheart. The two are settling on a 70-acre tract of land about five miles east of Hwy. 69 on Recreation Road 255.

State Representative Allen Hightower has filed what he termed as "unsatisfactory" legislation Friday which seeks to create a Tyler County District Attorney office, one which would not allow the private practice of law.

Effective April 1, Southwestern Bell operators will no longer complete third-number calls from public telephones without verbal approval from someone at the billed number, said spokesman, Gene Thacker.

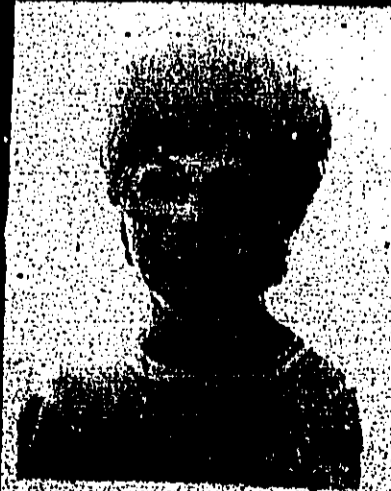
June 30, 1983

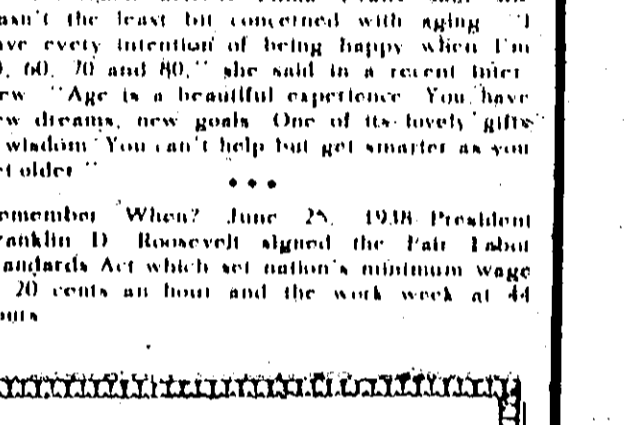

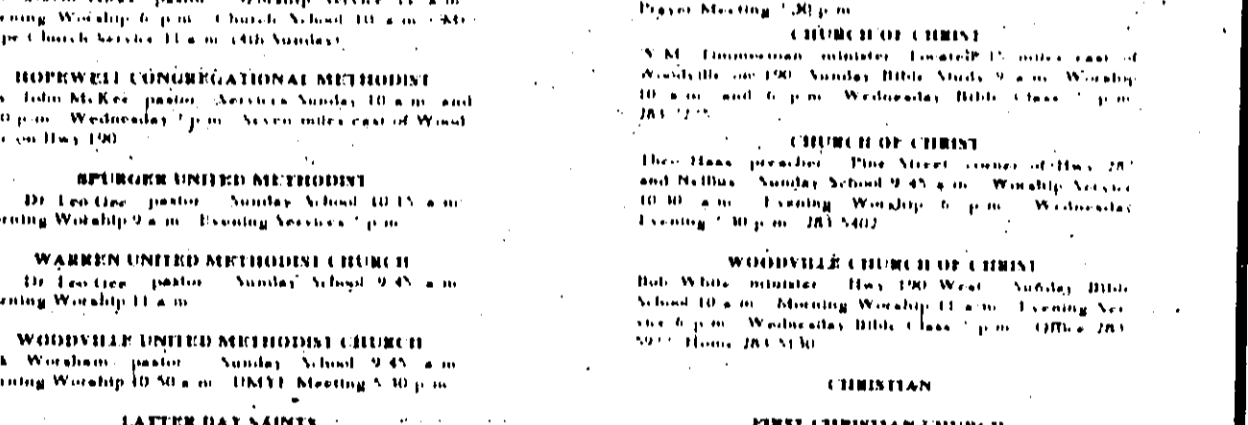

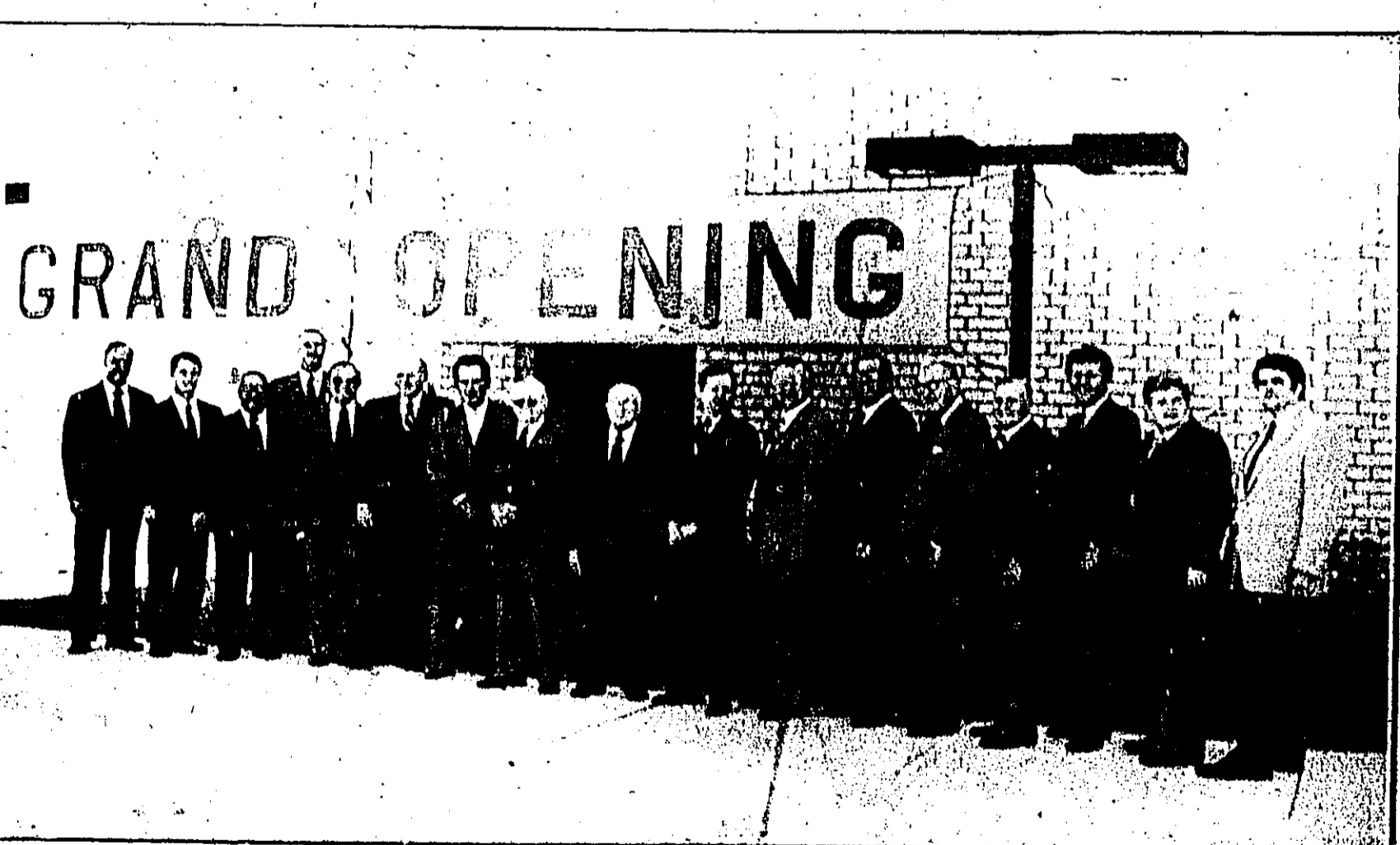

Governor Mark White REPORTS

AUSTIN The Governor's Select Committee on Education is confident in returning its draft report card on public school education by March 1, making next summer a likely candidate for a special legislative session.

We could pursue reforms in education through infinite studies, but studies have chased the problems, and the problems will outrun the reports.

The Select Committee recognizes that prolonging its much needed comprehensive review of education would only magnify existing inequities in teacher pay, in state funding for tax-poor school districts, and in educational programs for students with special needs.

After attending several of the committee's public hearings in the past six months, I have proposed a nine-point agenda for making needed changes in public school education. This includes raising teachers' salaries by 12 percent in 1984-85, while increasing beginning teacher pay from \$11,000 to \$14,000 per month.

Because educational opportunity should not depend on the wealth of a school district's tax base, Texas lawmakers need to revise the equalization aid formula to direct more state dollars to the poorest districts.

Our schools should end the practice of promoting students who cannot read and, instead, should offer summer remedial reading programs and counseling early learning programs with day care centers.

Expanding adult basic education programs to reduce the illiteracy rate in Texas.

Making scholarships in teacher education available to high school seniors in the top 10 percent of their graduating class.

Expanding teaching techniques to capitalize on the state of the art technological abilities and the talent of business and industry.

Texas taxpayers are paying billions of dollars for education, but they are not getting a first-class system in return.

Expanding programs and raising teacher salaries will add to the cost of public education—and that means increasing taxes. The only thing worse than raising taxes would be to refuse to do what is necessary to improve our educational system.
