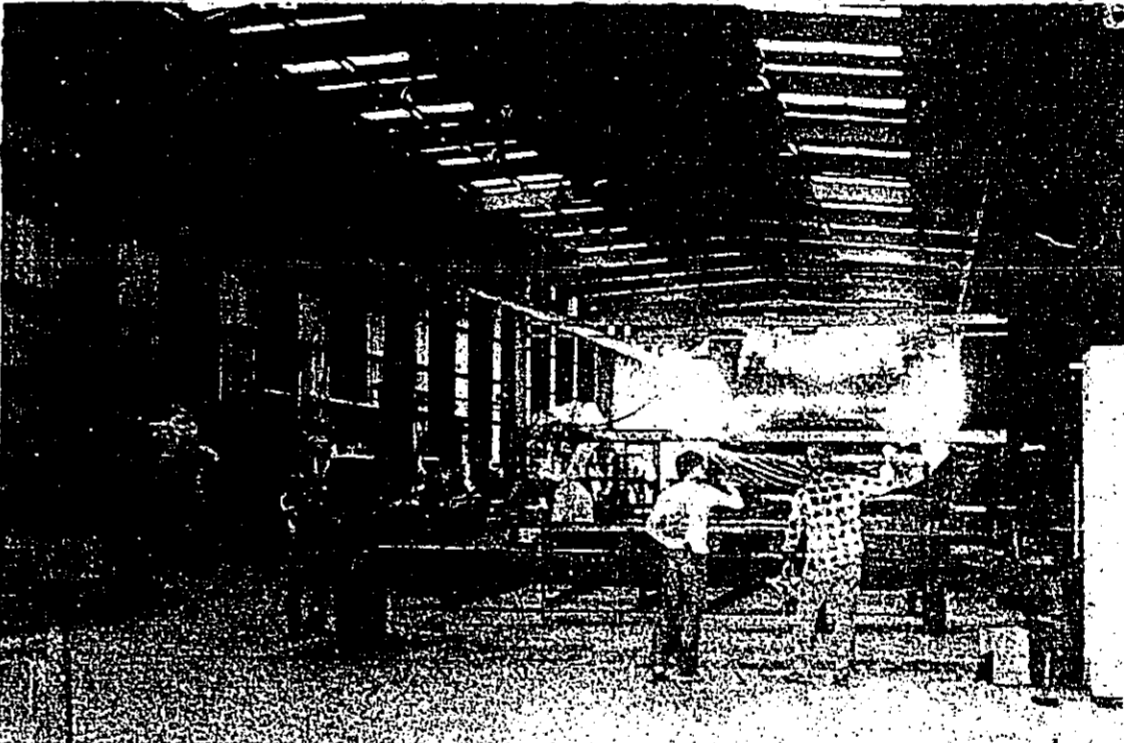
The owner of the company said the company would engage in building pressure vessels, rolled welding pipe, structural steel fabrication, and miscellaneous fabrication

To Mark Decade

The Board of Trustees and staff of Deep East Texas MHMR are celebrating the tenth anniversary of their agency this spring with local observances and proclamations of support from sponsoring groups.

It was in February, 1974, that the original Board of Trustees was formed. Wayne Lawrence began work in April of that year as executive director, and MHMR first began to see clients in September.

Since that time MHMR has grown to provide a wide array of community-based services for the retarded and mentally impaired across an 11,000 square-mile, 13-county region.

MHMR currently has a staff of 125 with an annual budget of \$3.9 million, and provides services in 26 separate locations in the Deep East Texas region. During the past 10 years over 20,000 persons have received services through MHMR.

Of the original Board of Trustees, three

remain: Ward R. Burke (Angelina County), George E. Gee (Jasper and Newton Counties), and V. B. Woods (Tyler County).

There are three employees from among the original 15 who are still at MHMR.

Marty Walker began with MHMR as director of the Jasper County Development Center. She is now director of the Jasper-Newton and the Tyler

County Sheltered Workshops. Linda Naff began as an accountant and is now director of financial services.

Felix Peebles, M.D. was the original director of psychiatric services, and is now contract psychiatrist with MHMR.

"Much gratitude is due the Commissioners, Courts, Board, staff, and Dr. Lawrence for their leadership," said Executive Director Jim

McDermott. "The past ten years can truly be viewed as a period of development, growth, and accomplishment."

MHMR is a community-based network of service facilities for the retarded and mentally impaired which includes halfway houses, sheltered workshops, outpatient clinics, and infant training services.

Clown Costume Contest Set For Kids Circus Comes To Woodville March 3.

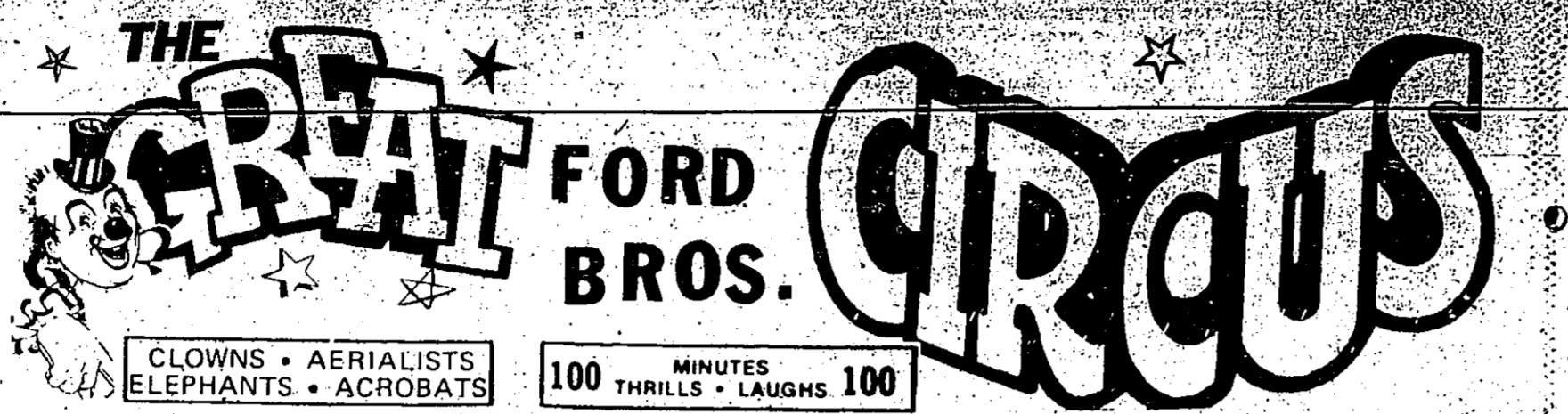

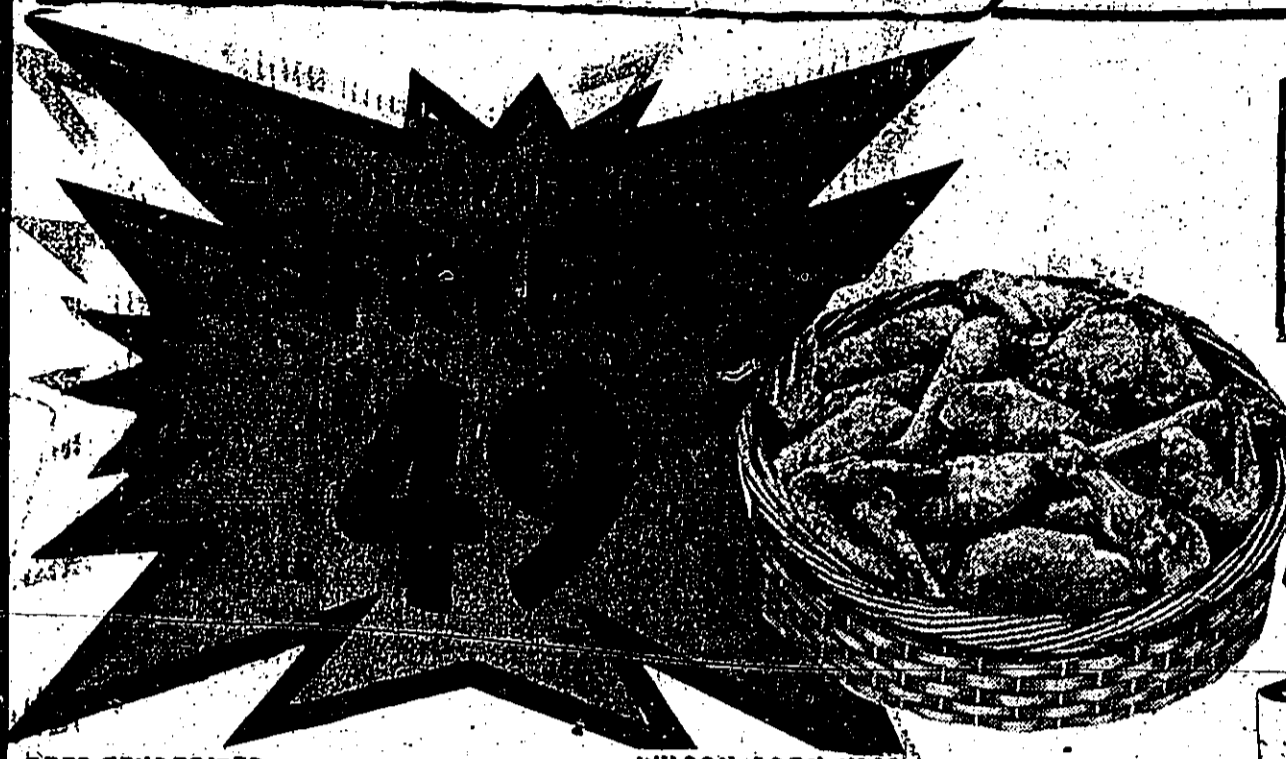

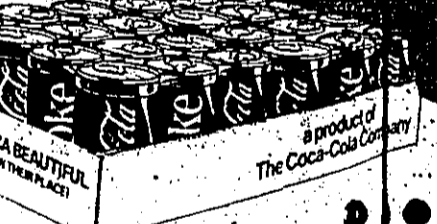
