With Visit From Texas Senator Lloyd Doggett U.S. Senate Campaign Arrives

Woodville -- Texas Sen. Lloyd Doggett (D-Austin) charged today that the federal government's priorities under Republican leadership are "out of sync" with the needs of ordinary people, and he called for Texans to elect a "true Democrat" to the U.S. Senate in November.

Doggett told supporters here this morning that the three most important considerations to keep in mind as they go to the polls in the May 5th primary are effectiveness, electability, and commitment to working for ordinary people.

"Rich people and the big conglomerates already have enough votes in the U.S. Senate," Doggett said. "My goal is the same goal I've had for my entire 10

years in the Texas Senate: to give a voice and a vote to the people who don't have a well-heeled political action committee or a fleet of lobbyists."

Doggett is the author of 124 state laws, an accomplishment which demonstrates he "can get things done." He now serves as the Texas Senate's President Pro Tem and he has been selected twice by TEXAS MONTHLY magazine as one of the "Ten Best Legislators."

Doggett said Washington's priorities are "all mixed up."

"All too often, when sacrifices are asked by the government, those sacrifices are placed on the backs of hardworking men and women who already are struggling to make ends meet.

But when the favors are handed out, the large corporations and lobbyists usually are at the head of the line."

The Senator said these priorities are "upside down, and maybe that's part of the problem. What we need,"

he said, "is not more Washington thinking in Texas, we need more Texas thinking in Washington."

Doggett noted that his staff recently completed an analysis of the Texas thinking in Washington. [See Page 8]

What then, is law? It is the collective organization of the individual right to lawful defense. Each of us has a natural right from God to defend his person, his liberty, and his property. These are the three basic requirements of life, and the preservation of any one of them completely dependent upon the preservation of the other two. For what are our faculties but an extension of our individuality? And what is property but an extension of our faculties?

Such a perversion of force would be, in both cases, contrary to our premise. Force has been given to us to defend our own individual right. Who will dare say that force has been given to us to destroy the equal right of our brethren? Since no individual acting separately can lawfully use force to protect the right of other, does it not logically follow that the same principle also applies to the common force that is nothing more than the organized combination of the individual forces?

If this is true, then nothing can be more evident than this. The law is the organization of the natural right of lawful defense. It is the substitution of a common force for individual force. And this common force is to do only what the individual force has a natural and lawful right to do: "To protect persons, liberties, and properties; to maintain the right of each, and cause JUSTICE to reign over us all."

Alan Miller's T-WHEELER

We're glad to see that the Congress is finally trying to get a handle on the huge federal deficit. And they're meeting it head-on. Tax boosters don't cut the tax on cigarettes as much as they said they would a couple of years ago. And keep the excise tax on phone bills.

The tax folks in Washington say the booze and cigarette taxes are only a starter. That excise tax on telephone service has been there for so long that most of us can't remember why it was authorized in the first place. Probably had something to do with bringing the boys from France after World War One. Needless to say, your phone bill is going up a bunch right now anyway, and the government isn't going to help bring it down.

The other tax increases are coming at the expense of "rich folks." Now it's always handy to raise "red neck" taxes, and here they're ducking paying their fair share of taxes. But we've noticed something else in this regard. Almost without exception those talking about soaking the rich and talking about somebody who makes more money than they do, and they are probably saying the same thing today that they were screaming about the people who made \$10,000 a year ten to twenty years ago. Or to put it that little bit of telegenic: Ask somebody on the Ways and Means Committee of the House of Representatives what his or her problem is with the cigarette tax as a revenue producer. And it all started out in California, where most new legislation seems to get its start. Remember Proposition 13, the big property tax bustier?

Anybody who lives and works in San Francisco, and you're a smoker, you make a habit of sneaking outside to take a puff. If anybody in your office or the factory where you work doesn't like cigarette smoke, you'd better not light up. Your employer gets fined, you get a punch in the mouth, and your cigarettes flushed down the john, and it's all perfectly legal. Some firms are giving smoking employees smokeless whistles, some have painted lines on the floor to indicate where smoking is permitted, and some have banned it altogether. So assume that the folks in Dime Box or Dallas decide they don't want any smokers around, there ain't going to be all those federal taxes to pay either.

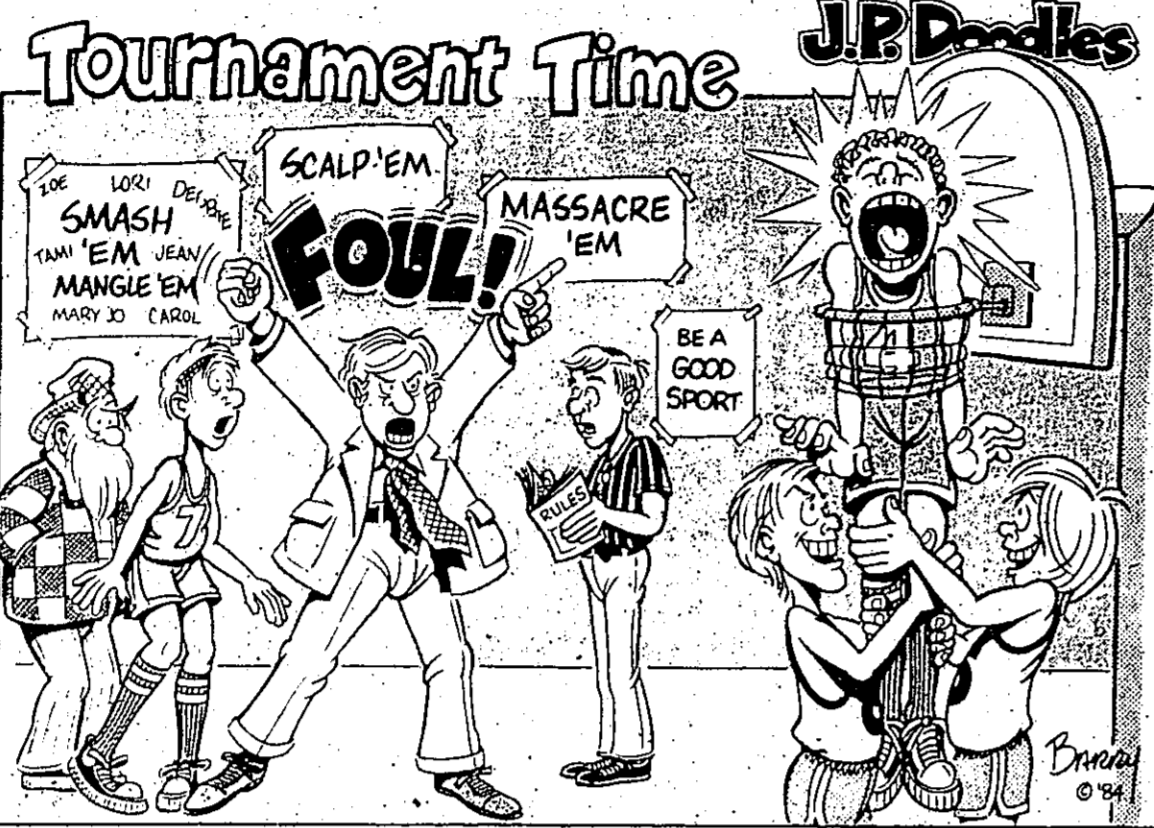
