## County Banks Protest Assessments

Chester State Bank of Chester, Citizens State Bank of Woodville and First State Bank of Colmesneil last week filed a Notice of Appeal of the actions of the Appraisal Review Board of the Tyler County Appraisal District in connection with the assessing of the fair market value of the stock of each bank for tax purposes.

Spokesmen for the banks stated that each of these institutions feels that not only was the value placed on their bank stock far and above the actual fair market value of the stock and that the method of determining the value by the Board did not conform to the requirements of applicable State and Federal laws and the recent decision of the Supreme Court of the United States but that the formula adopted for the evaluation of bank stock by the Austin firm hired by the District is fundamentally unconstitutional.

The banks urged the Appraisal Review Board to retain an attorney to advise the Board as to the requirements of the law before adopting the valuation formula but the Board declined to seek counsel as to what the law requires.

The spokesman for the banks stated that it was unfortunate, particularly in a county of this size, that it takes a lawsuit to finally get a public agency to talk to a lawyer as to what the law requires. Although First National Bank of Woodville did not join in the suit, inasmuch as its stock was not issued in time to be subject to review by

the Appraisal Board, a spokesman for the bank stated that the bank joined in spirit because of the precedent set by the adoption of the unlawful appraisal method by the Appraisal District.

The Warren Independent School District Board of Trustees held the first reading on two new policies which will affect promotion and retention of students in the district. Policy #530.1 regarding Promotion/Retention at Elementary School reads in part "Effective in the 1984-85 school year, a first grade student who has not mastered the primer should be retained. In the remaining elementary grades, retention will be considered if a student is one semester behind in reading. In all elementary grades retention will be recommended if a student is one semester behind in mathematics." 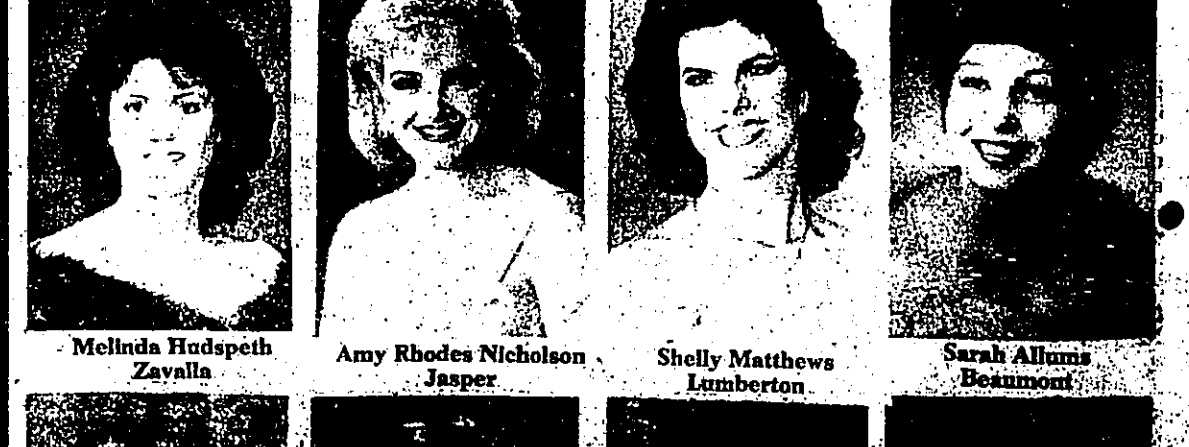

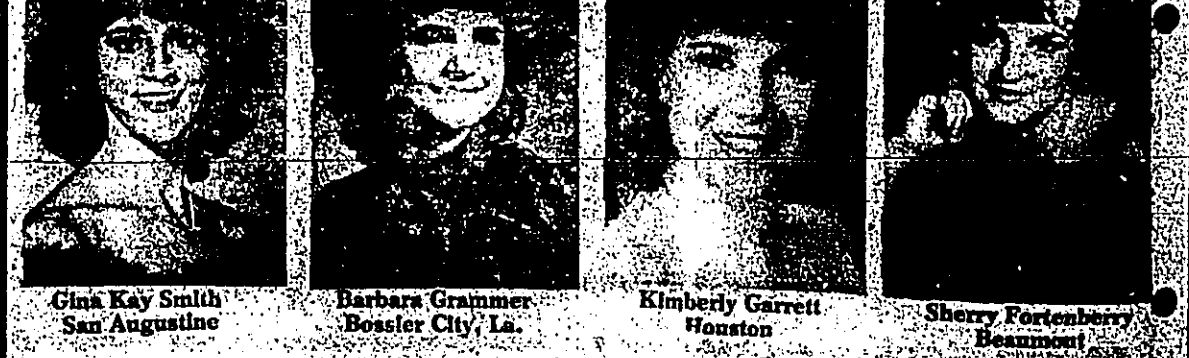

## Shopping With Diane

Wisteria, azalea, dogwood--for the past few weeks flowers have been everywhere. Tyler County is not only alive with blooms, but alive with activity as plans are finalized for the 41st Annual Dogwood Festival, now just a few days away.

In shopping Tyler County this week, we've found an item and a service that will be of special interest to "Dogwooders". We also want to remind you of one of the special shopping opportunities that comes with the Festival each year--The Big Thicket Arts and Crafts Fair. Let's take a closer look.

ONE OF A KIND - On Saturday, April 7, Tyler County will again be invited to the Big Thicket Arts and Crafts Fair. The Fair, sponsored by the Woodville Business and Professional Women's Club, is one of the special Dogwood Festival activities scheduled for Saturday. It will be held on the parking lot behind Citizens' State Bank. Booths will be open from 9:00 a. m. to 5:00 p. m.

According to Pat Brown, Fair Director, an interesting variety of arts and crafts will be available, including stained glass, snake-skin items, wooden toys, picture frames, paintings, stuffed animals, windchimes and hand-made furniture. Food booths will also be included. In all, this special shopping opportunity will offer close to 80 booths.

Whether you like to look, talk or shop, the Big Thicket Arts and Crafts Fair promises to be a lot of fun.

A PERMANENT ARRANGEMENT - In Tyler County there's not one of us that isn't familiar with the cycle. In summer, they are covered with soft green leaves. Toward autumn, as the sun's path begins to drop, the leaves whither and fall. In winter, clusters of berries appear, to be replaced in the spring, just as the temperatures begin to warm, by the delicate white dogwood flowers that dot our landscape.

Soon, to soon, the flowers are gone and the cycle begins again.

It's not easy to outsmart Mother Nature, but take some genuine dogwood twigs, some silk dogwood blooms, some moss and decorative straw baskets and put them in the talented hands of Kathi Thomas.

The result, silk dogwood trees which not only "bloom" all year long, but are so natural looking it's hard to tell them from Mother Nature's original.

The "trees" are now available at Thomas Florist and Nursery, Hwy 69 South. You can select from small ones, designed for use as centerpieces, or large "trees" (up to six feet tall) that are ideal for entryways.

Some are accented with small artificial white flowers that look like the real thing. If you've got your own special container that's just right for a silk dogwood tree, take it in to Kathi. You'll love the results.

PICTURE PERFECT - While some of us are still a little hesitant to jump on the computer bandwagon, we do have to admit, however reluctantly, that these days computers are doing amazing things. They are also touching our lives in many direct and surprising ways.

If you're a photo enthusiast, you'll be especially interested in the computerized Mini Photo Lab at Matingly Printing Service, 501 W. Bluff. Called the Photo Kit, the lab is manufactured in France and is equipped to handle 90% of all color print developing and printing.

According to owner Gary Matingly, the Photo Kit utilizes a computer to take film through the developing process. Once film is fed in, the computer takes over and within 10 minutes negatives are ready to be dried.

One dried, says technician Carol Edwards, negatives are fed into the automatic printer. Within six minutes, the machine produces the first finished photo. The remainder of the roll is processed at 15 second intervals.

With the Mini Photo Lab you can take pictures, have them developed and printed and get them back all on the same day. You may not like computers, but that's some kind of service!

## Cancer Crusade To Begin April 1

Mrs. Butch Howard of Warran will serve as Chairman of the American Cancer Society's educational and fundraising Cancer Crusade in Tyler County slated to begin April 1, 1984.

In announcing the appointment of Melinda Stryker, President of the Society's Tyler County Unit said, "Under the leadership of Butch Howard, this year's Crusade should be one of our most successful campaigns ever. We fully expect to reach all of our goals and aims."

"Here in Tyler County, we expect to raise \$4,000.00," Stryker said. This money will be used to support programs in the Tyler County area for the prevention, early detection and treatment of cancer, and to provide assistance to cancer patients.

"Another important goal is to help save lives. An Army of trained volunteers will bring information on cancer risk and detection to all the residents of Tyler County during the door-to-door drive," she said.

It is encouraging to learn about the enormous progress that has been made in the fight against cancer," she said. Close to 3 million people alive today have been cured of cancer. The battle isn't over but we are winning. This year, about 500,000 people will die of the disease, and of this number, 148,000 might have been saved by earlier diagnosis and prompt treatment."

"That's why it's crucial for everyone in Tyler County to learn how they can lower their cancer risk. The folder volunteers will be distributing is a self test on cancer risks for the two most common and deadly forms of cancer--lung cancer and colorectal cancer. We urge everyone to take this test and then practice the cancer safeguards described in the folder," Howard said.

The 1984 Cancer Crusade in Tyler County is part of statewide and national efforts involving more than 2,000,000 volunteers. Individuals interested in volunteering for the Crusade can contact the Tyler County Unit at 283-3765.

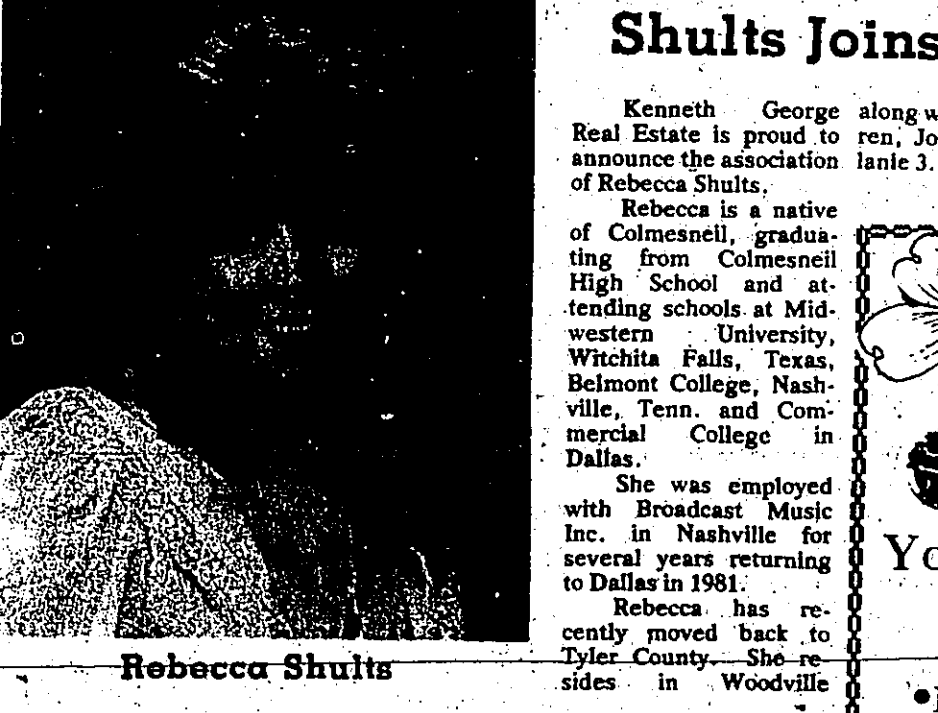

Why is it that so often the top news in the paper ends up on the back pages?

The microscopes showed right off that the substance was not chemical. It did show that thousands of bees had gone to the bathroom all at the same time. Hence the yellow rain.

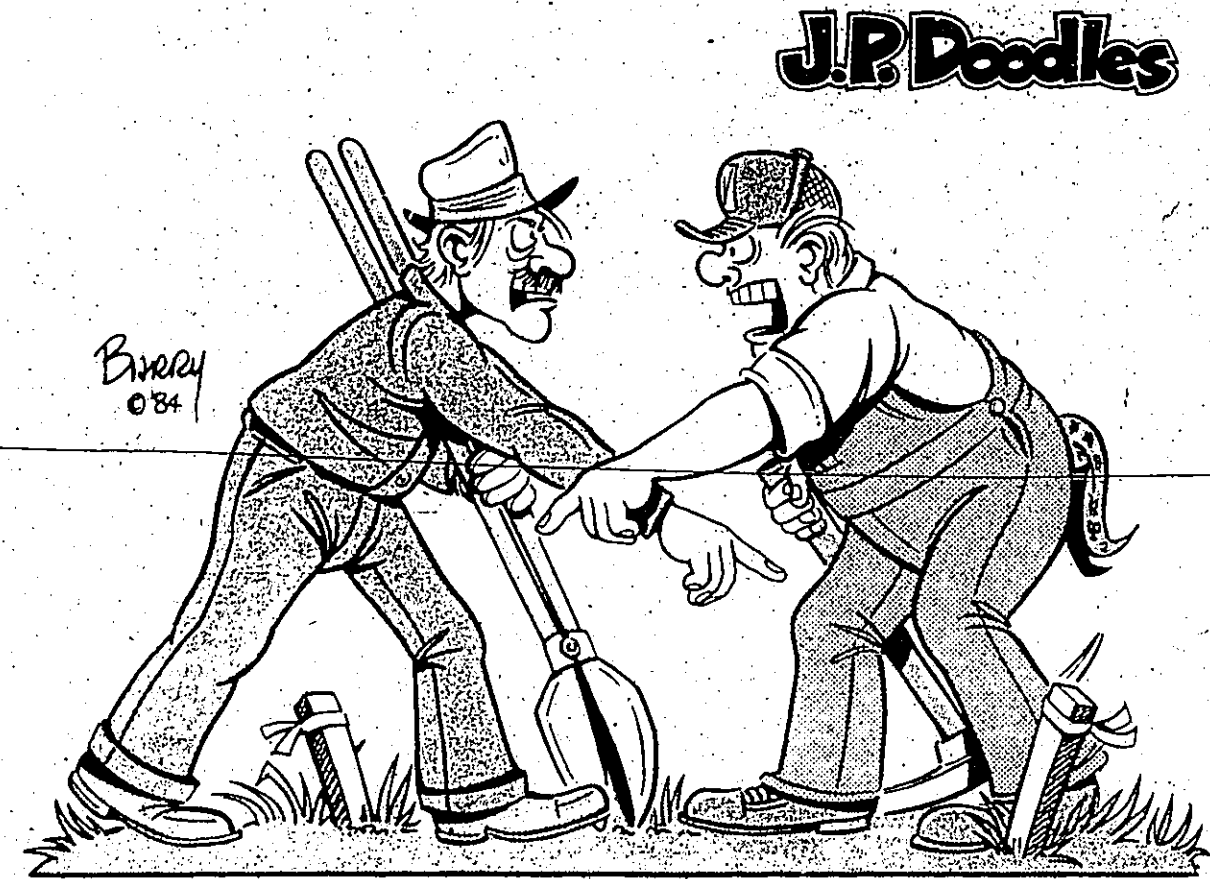
