Dogwood Pageant Postponed

The operating Board of Directors of the Tyler County Dogwood Festival met Monday, April 9, along with Josiah Wheat, President of the Festival, and the heads of writing, production and music, Fred and Kaaron Sullivan and Dr. Jim Jinnette for the purpose of making a decision regarding the presentation of the Pageant that was curtailed by rain on Saturday, April 7.

Jim Clark, Executive Director of the Festival, announced that due to the difficulties regarding reassembling the cast and the unavailability of the southernaires, the Robert E. Lee High School Choir which is an integral part of the production, it would not be feasible to present the Pageant this year.

Herb Branch, Director of Properties, assured the Board that he and his staff would be able to seal the existing set and that the Pageant production "The Ties That Bind: Frontier Days of Tyler County" would be presented as the Pageant in 1985.

Clark announced that this decision also would enable the creative staff under Becky Jinnette, Director of Pageantry, to expend their energies toward the 1986 production which is the year of the Texas Bicentennial.

It was also discussed that any late production would be antithetical in that it would not be "Dogwood Time in Tyler County" and the peak of the two week celebration. The enthusiasm generated in Tyler County by the coming of "Dogwood Time" would be missing.

for distribution to potential members. A membership drive is also in the very near future for the Chamber of Commerce. Monthly meetings are held at noon on the fourth Monday of each month in the Heri-

tage Room at the Woodville Inn. The business meeting is concluded at 1 p.m. to accommodate members. The next meeting is April 23 and you are welcome to attend.

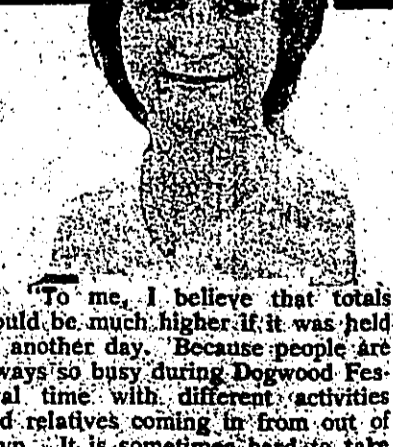

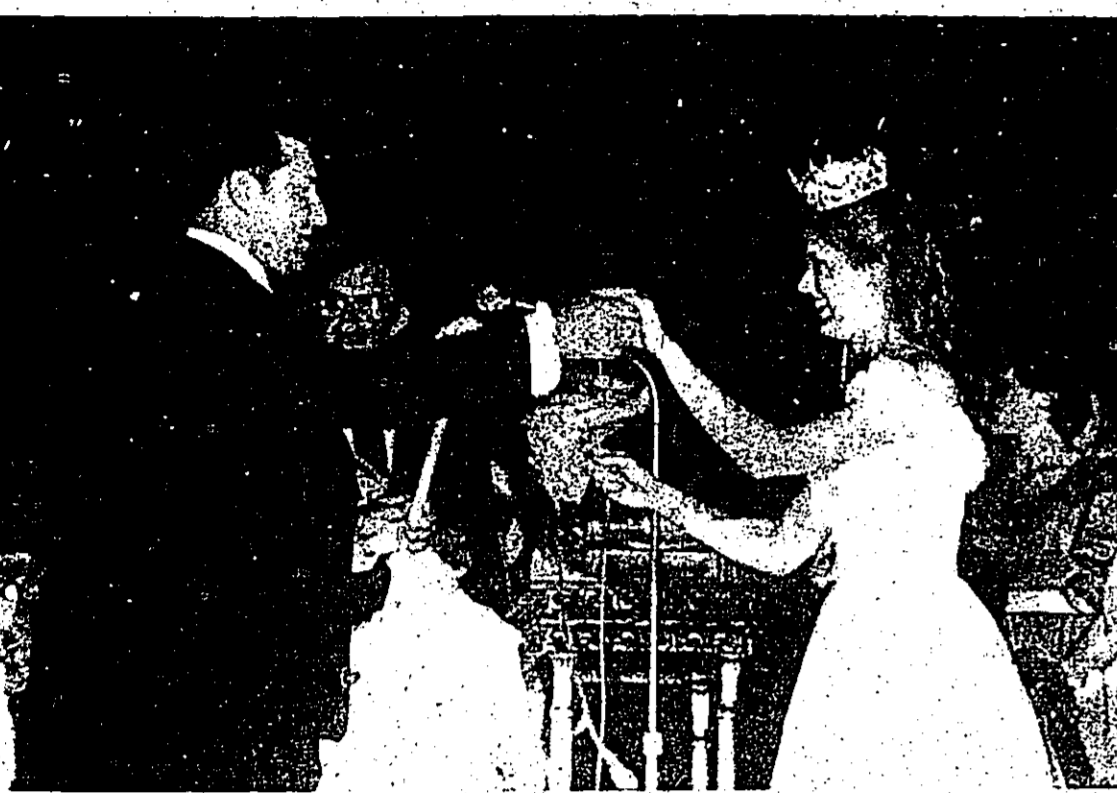

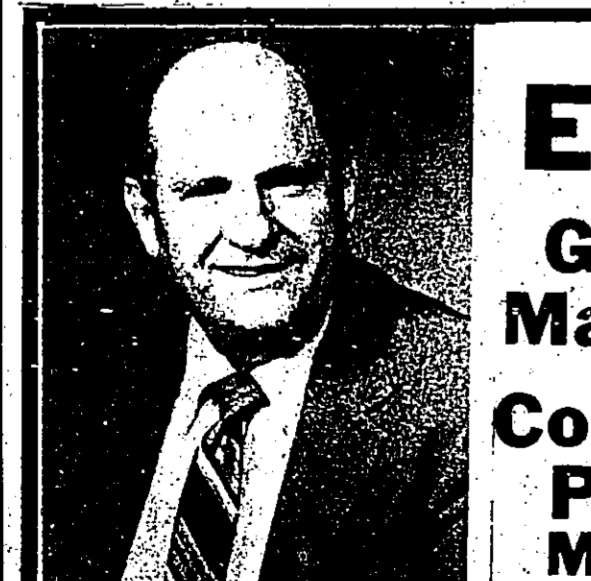
Sunny Dell News

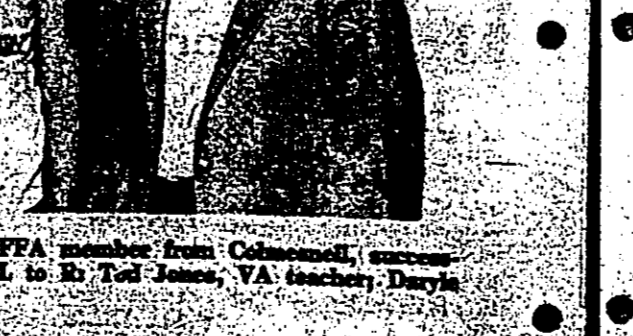
Bass Club Report

Celebrate Private Property Week April 8-14

Each year, Americans celebrate their freedom to own, use and transfer real property during Private Property Week. April 8-14 has been designated Private Property Week and the Tyler County Board of Realtors offers the following suggestions to homebuyers.

Buying an existing home in an established neighborhood can save many thousands of dollars over the cost of buying a new home. However, it's important that prospective homebuyers thoroughly inspect the house. Most people are proud of their homes and keep them in good condition, but turning on light switches and faucets, flushing toilets and looking over the general appearance of the house do not give a clear picture of its condition, according to the Tyler County Board of REALTORS.

You should look for signs suggesting serious problems. Stains or discoloration around water pipes may be a sign of leaking plumbing. Mildew, water stains on walls, floors or beams, or sagging beams or crumbling wood are other characteristics of water leaks.

Also, look for signs of termites or other pests. Operate the heating and cooling systems and thermostats to see if they're working properly. Rust around light registers should have easy access. No-dielectric fumes near the furnace and crumbling chimney brick may indicate problems in the ventilation or heating system.

Electrical systems should not be overloaded, and there should be grounding connections to plumbing fixtures near the outlets. If exposed wiring is frayed or there is an insufficient number of electrical outlets, the system may be outdated. Does the house use fuses or circuit breakers? If you have any doubts about the safety or load capacity of the electrical system, contact an electrician for a reliable inspection.

On the exterior of the home, look for sagging downspouts or gutters and faded or chipped paint which show a lack of maintenance. Land should be graded away from the house for proper drainage.

If you notice any of these problems, you may wish to have the house professionally inspected before you sign a contract. A professional building inspector usually gives a written summary and list of downspouts or gutters needed corrective work. This can be a useful tool in negotiating the selling price or it can serve as a list of conditions to be included in the sales contract.

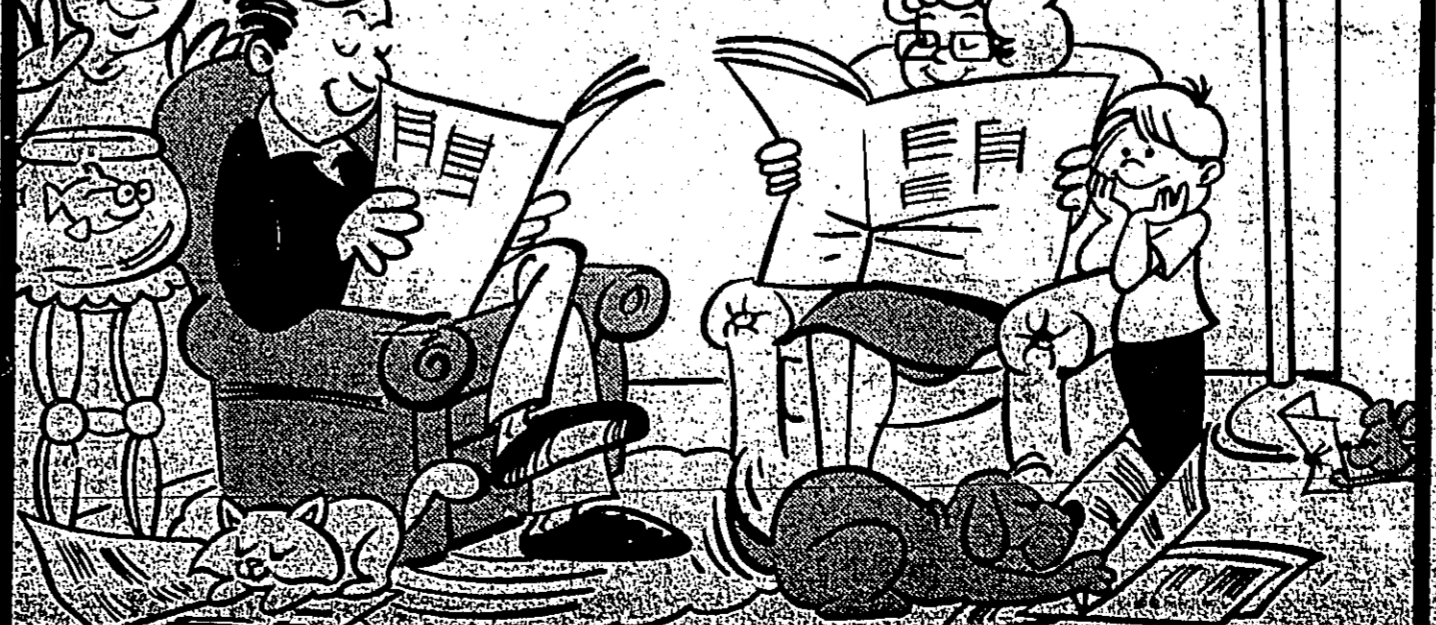
