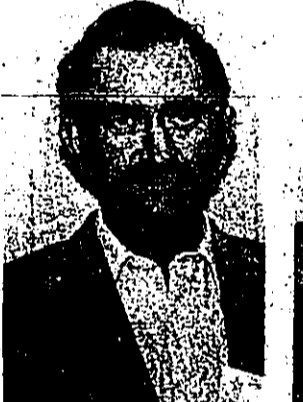
Woodville City Council Meets

Woodville City Fathers grappled with a question of water rights ownership Monday, raised City sewer rates substantially, held the line in holding down a hotel/motel tourism tax to four (4) percent and approved a plat for the Timberland West subdivision.

Lloyd Fortenberry presented a request to City Fathers asking their help in gaining water pipeline access to a water pump which is currently located at the site of the now-defunct Dogwood Country Club west of Woodville which is currently on the market. According to For-

tenberry, Don Cole, of New Braunfels, who is the owner of the property apparently, told Fortenberry that he would have to pay some \$20,000 for that access. Fortenberry told the council that he needs

Peacock on the publication of his book, "The Big Thicket of Texas-America's Ecological Wonder". The book has just been released by Little, Brown and Company (Boston, since 1837), one of the nation's oldest and most prestigious publishers. Peacock, a native of

Beaumont, now resides in Woodville. He and his wife Kitty lived in Houston for 25 years before moving to Tyler County. He served as a volunteer worker, officer, and president of the grass-roots' movement to save portions of the Big Thicket, resulting in the creation of America's first national

preserve. Congress set aside 84,550 acres in 12 units for the Big Thicket National Preserve and President Gerald Ford signed the bill into law in 1974. A full-time freelance journalist, Peacock's articles appear in such national and regional publications as

Exxon USA, Texas Highways, Arizona Highways, the New Book of Knowledge, and Fodor's Modern Travel Guide. He is a contributing editor of Texas Business magazine. He was selected as a contributor to the landmark manual for freelancers, "The Complete Guide to Writing Nonfiction," published by Writer's Digest Books, and won a national award for his filmstrip, "Tribute to a Texas Artist". For those who wish an autographed copy, a supply of the new books will be available at the reception. Refreshments will be served.

Wiley Lauded

BEAUMONT-Dr. Charles A. "Pete" Wiley, longtime director of bands at Lamar University, and a former resident of Woodville, was named "Professor Emeritus" by the university's Board of Regents at their meeting Thursday. Wiley, who retired in May, served the university for 32 years. Under his direction, the Lamar bands received many national honors. His father, an associate of John Phillip Sousa received dozens of scores from Sousa which Wiley donated to Lamar. He is a member of the American Bandmasters

Association, Texas Music Educators Association and the Music Educators National Conference. He is past national president of Kappa Kappa Psi, national music society. A regents professor of music, Wiley has published 11 musical works. Dr. David Geddes, in making the recommendation to the board said of Wiley, "Pete" Wiley devoted his energies to the development of a strong instrumental music program at Lamar. His concert bands consistently earned recognition and honors in regional and national competition.

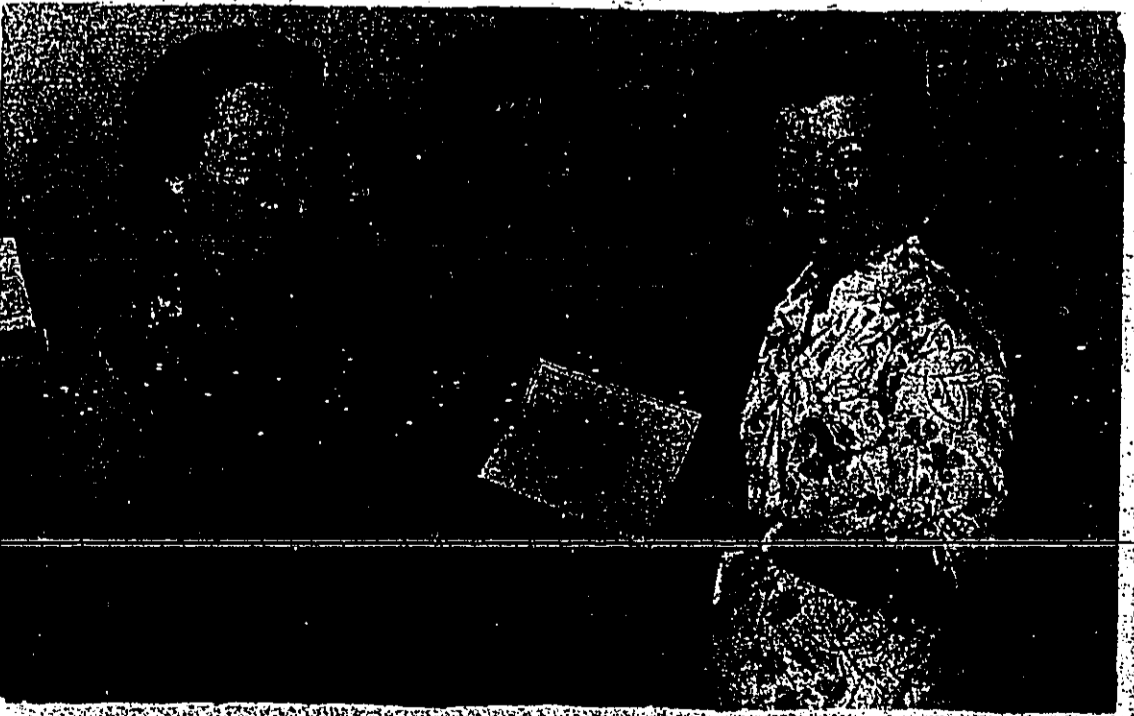
Chamber To Meet
