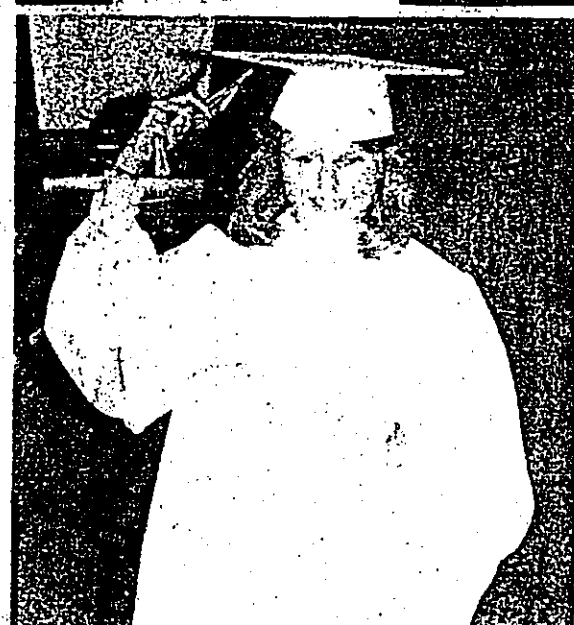

Bond Set In Shooting

Tom Holcomb, 49, of Spurger has been charged in the shooting last Wednesday of Wallace B. Dailey, Jr., 40, of Woodville. According to Woodville Police Department reports, the shooting took place at the Woodville Beech Street apartment of Holcomb's estranged wife, Ann.

According to Tyler County attorney, Pat Hardy, Dailey and Mrs. Holcomb were allegedly sitting in her living room when Holcomb reportedly knocked on the door. After entering, Holcomb, officers reports indicate, asked if "you are W.B." then pulled a revolver from his pocket and shot Dailey once. Mrs. Holcomb told officers that she left the apartment, went to a neighbors and called the sheriff's office and an ambulance.

Woodville police officer Tracy Ferguson was notified of the shooting at approximately 8:26 p.m., arriving to find Dailey standing in front of the Beech Street Apartments from which the officers took him to the hospital. Dailey was later transferred to St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Beaumont with wounds to the wrist and stomach and was released from St. Elizabeth hospital Tuesday morning.

Holcomb, after turning himself in to Sheriff's Officers late Wednesday night, was arraigned on charges of aggravated assault, causing bodily injury, a felony three offense, and posted \$10,000 bail.

The revolver reportedly used has not been recovered having been "thrown in the Neches River," according to police department information.

Two County Search Jails Man

A Woodville man remains in the Tyler County jail Tuesday, charged with "unauthorized use of a motor vehicle" after a one-and-one-half-hour search by area law enforcement officers in Northern Hardin and Southern Tyler Counties Monday night.

Bruce D. Bailey, 24, of Woodville allegedly stole a 1976 Buick owned by Cheryl Greenway of Woodville from the parking lot of Little Ace Grocery in Warren around 9 p.m. Monday.

Hardin County law enforcement officers spotted the car and stopped the vehicle on Hwy. 92 at Rush Creek at 10:30 p.m.

Bailey was arraigned by Justice of the Peace, Jimmy Davis who set bond at \$5,000. Bailey was arraigned Tuesday morning before Justice of the Peace Wanda Brasher and charged with misdemeanor DWI with bond set at \$500.

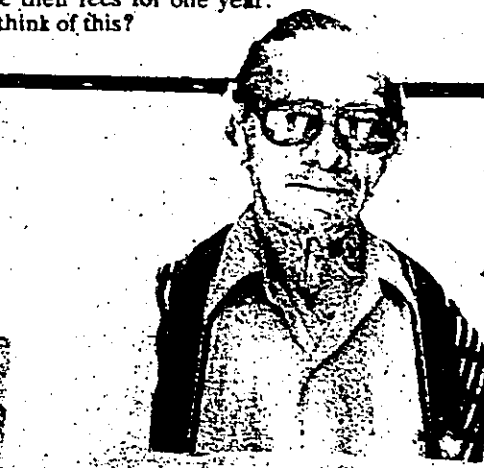

Fishing was slow and crowded on Rayburn last week.

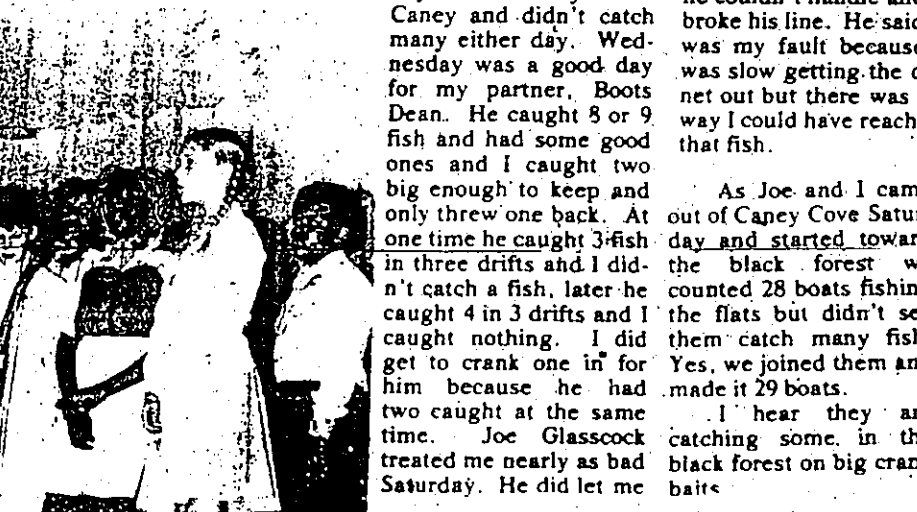
