Jail Escape Foiled

Indictments charging three former inmates of Tyler County jail with felony escape were handed down by the Tyler County Grand Jury Friday June 8th. Indicted were George David Lindsey, 18, formerly of Fred, James David Lindsey, 28, formerly of Warren and Thomas E. Simmons, 43, formerly of Houston. All three men were awaiting trial on other charges at the time of their escape according to officers on April 29, 1984, and all three have since been remanded to the custody of the Texas Department of Corrections. Felony Escape is a third degree felony punishable upon conviction by no more than 10 or less than 2 years in the State Department of Corrections and may also involve a fine not to exceed \$5,000.

The indictments conclude a two month investigation by the Tyler County Sheriff's Department and Texas Ranger Roscoe Davis, of an incident which took place on April 29 in which Chief Deputy B. J. Var-

At Colmesneil

Suicide Ruled

The effort of concerned neighbors and Tyler County officials to provide a 47-year-old Tyler County man "help with drinking problems" failed when the man, Colmesneil resident James Anderson, apparently took his own life rather than accompany Sheriff's officers back to Woodville.

Neighbors had contacted the Sheriff's office Sunday night "out of concern that Anderson might either harm someone else or himself." Monday morning after listening to Anderson neighbors' concerns, County Judge

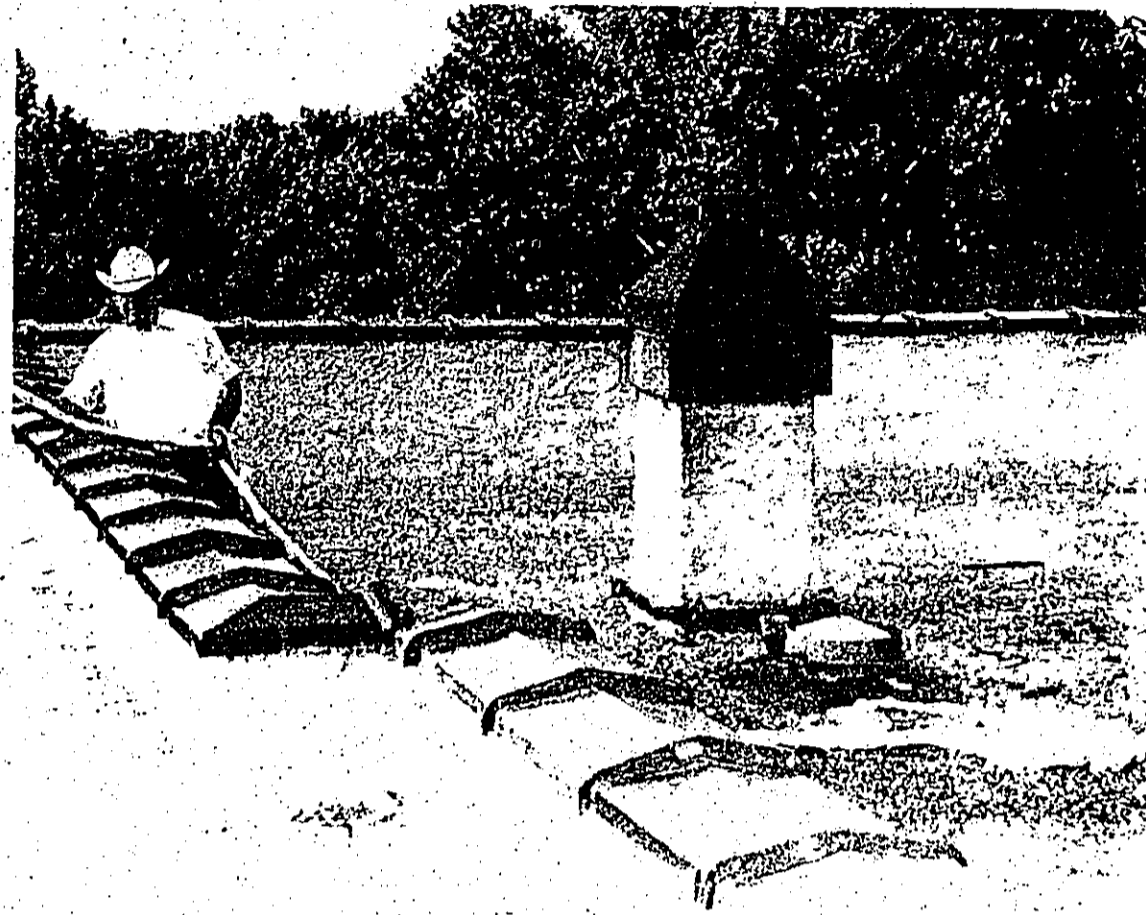
Allen Sturrock issued a Order of protective custody for Anderson for treatment of his drinking problems. Sheriff Leon Fowler and Deputy John Hanks served the order Monday morning arriving at the Anderson residence between 11:00 to 11:15 a.m.

After explaining the order Fowler and Hanks were apparently asked to wait in Anderson's living room for him to get his shoes, the two officers then heard one shot and found Anderson lying on the floor in a back bedroom

with a .357 revolver beside his body. Anderson with a bullet wound to the right

Houseparents Resign

At a hastily arranged meeting Tuesday evening, the Board of Directors of the Tyler County Youth Development Association accepted the resignation of two recently hired houseparent staff "for personal reasons" and clarified houseparent staff confusion regarding pay and other compensation for the seven days of in-service training worked in June.

House parent Darlene Daughy and relief houseparent DeAnna Scott's resignations were accepted with placements "to be made from existing list of applicants" for the jobs, according to TCYDA President Brad Smith.

Houseparents related inconsistent information regarding pay provided at the time of their job interviews by a committee of the Board of Directors and present situation of no financial compensation for the in-service work.

Acting on a request forwarded by Shelter Director Richard Bowen the board of directors resolved not to compensate shelter staff financially for the in-service work but to allow one-half day "comp-time leave" for each day worked in in-service.

"Houseparent salaries cannot begin until we begin delivering services and that cannot begin until we receive our licenses, which better be soon," Smith said.

The fund raising Committee has tentatively set Saturday, June 30, as the beginning date of a Pre-Fourth of July Pizza Sale to raise funds to meet local match needs for the TCYDA Shelter.

Registration Fee Hiked

Tyler County Commissioners met in regular session Monday, approving a \$5 increase in county vehicle registration fees beginning January 1985. The additional \$50,000 to \$60,000 in county revenue produced from this fee will be earmarked by commissioners for repair and replacement of county bridges. According to County Judge Allen Sturrock the \$5 vehicle registration fee was the response of the state

legislature to the counties request for a one cent county sales tax. The state legislation provides that the counties may add or delete the added registration fees only in years ending in '0' or '5'. In other business, Commissioners decided to go out for bids on one police car for the sheriff's office with delivery to be made in October or November and also bids on an additional 3 police cars for possible delivery

in January of 1985. Commissioners approved the soliciting bids for pre-mix and road oil for the county with bids to open Monday June 25, and tabled, will Friday further consideration of a bid by Clyde Street of Spurger for extermination of the courthouse and discussion of installation of added phones to the District Clerks Office. The resignation of Kitty Peacock as chairman of the Tyler County Historical Com-

mission was accepted and Jack Whitmeyer appointed to replace her. County Extension agent Clinton Curry presented Donce Gregory and Seta Birdwell of the County Clerks Office; Louise Herndon of the District Clerks Office; Judge Allen Sturrock and County Treasurer Austin Fuller with certificates certifying their completion of Training Seminars held at Texas A&M February 28 through March 1, 1984.

The following is a first of several weeks of reports to Tyler County Booster readers through the eyes of one here at home.

Cattle, canals, castles and cathedrals...these four words best describe Holland and Germany as I reflect back on three days spent there. We drove into Holland from Brussels, and I was amazed at the large number of cattle

as we traveled through the Dutch countryside. They were not beef cattle, as we are used to in Texas, but beautiful dairy cattle on large farms. The pastures were bright green and windmills were scattered along the way, although not as many as I had expected. The Dutch

people are restoring the old windmills, so this part of their heritage will not be lost. From the countryside into the busy city of Amsterdam, with its network of canals. It is possible to travel all over the city via boat on one of the canals or, if you prefer, you may take a trolley, bus or

taxi. The taxis are Mercedes and some of the policemen drive Porsche. The architecture in the city is unbelievable beautiful. There are dozens of cathedrals and churches, the ornateness of which is breathtaking. The train station looks like the palace. [See Page 8A]

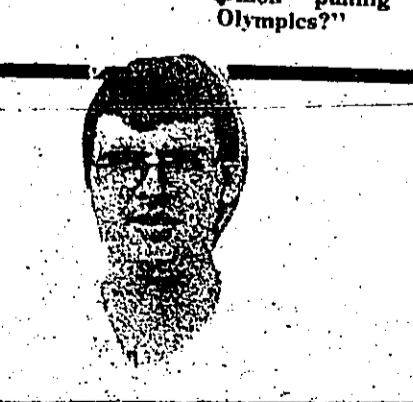

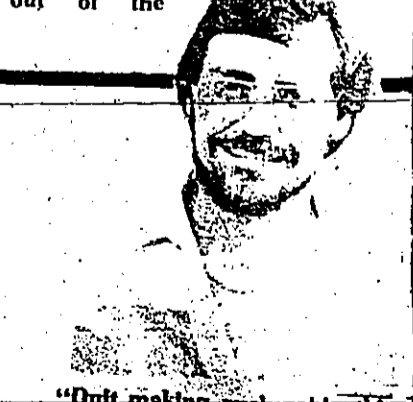

In comes Hal Davis, general manager of KIPR Radio in Lufkin.

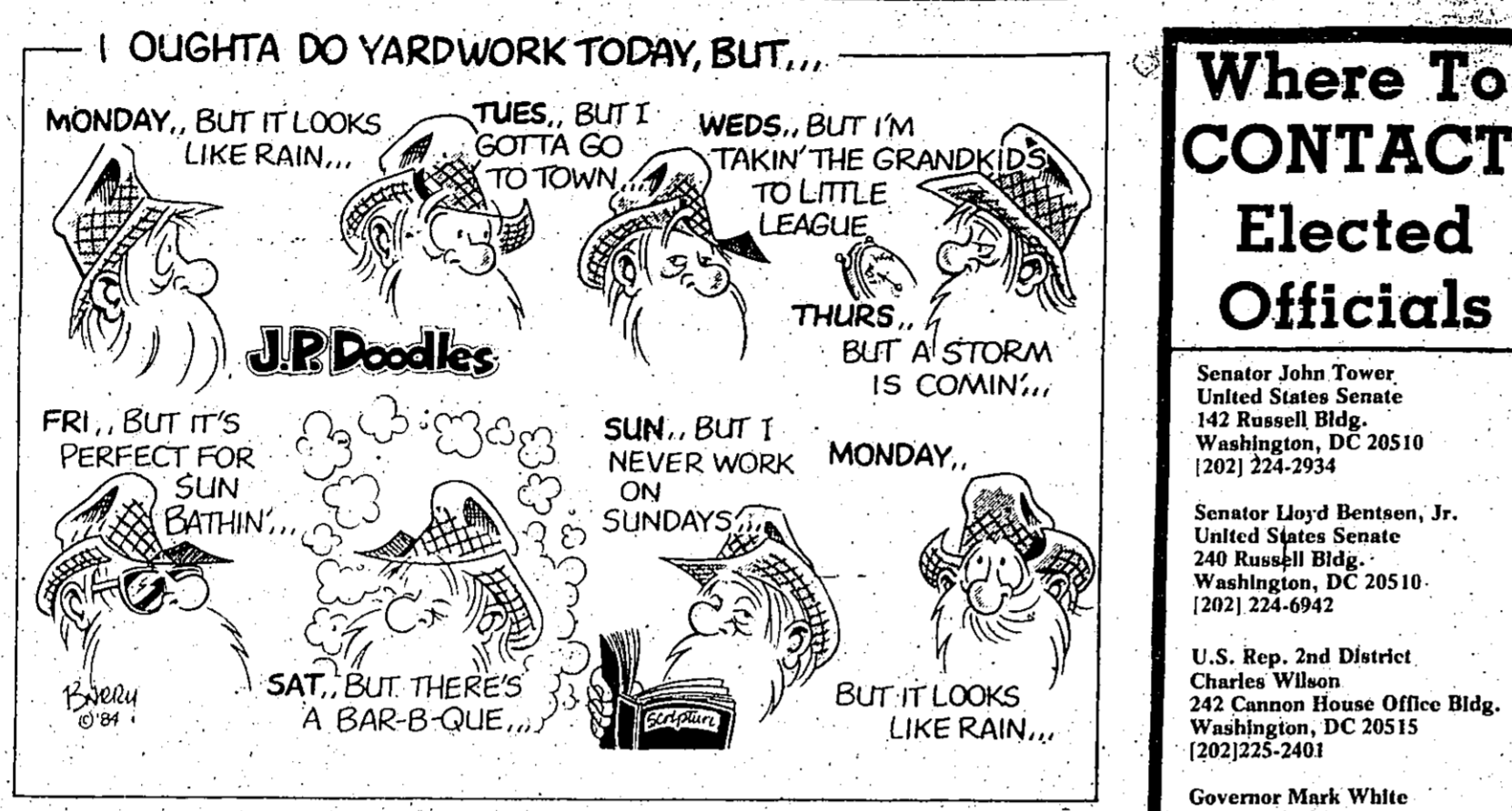
"There's got to be some way to get rid of the damn things after the election is over. The candidates won't do it. Their volunteers won't do it."

Reflections Of Europe

[From Page 1A]

It has become one of the classic notions of literature produced in this century. You cannot visit this place without recalling the terrible events of World War II and thinking how fortunate you are to have escaped such persecution. And you cannot help but be inspired by the faith and spirit of the old girl who rode in a small house in Amsterdam before the Gestapo found them in the secret annex of a small house in Amsterdam. Anne's father, the only survivor, returned to the house after the war and found the diary kept by his daughter during their two years in hiding.

From Holland, we traveled to a small village in Germany on the Rhine River. We boarded a steamer and for two hours cruised along in a land that looked like long ago. There were quaint German villages along the way, each with a beautiful church, the steeple of which towered above the village. Hugh castles overlooked many of the villages, and grape vineyards were all over the place. The people who pick the grapes strap a basket to their backs, cut the grapes with scissors, and throw them into the baskets. It has been done this way for centuries with no thought of automation.

From the beautiful Rhine, through the forests, to the city of Cologne, Germany. There is a national tragedy in Germany regarding the forests. At the present time, sixty percent of the trees in the forests have a disease caused by sulphur dioxide poison in the air. These trees will soon be dead. Hopefully, the disease will be stopped. It is hard to imagine Germany without her forests.

In Cologne, there is a cathedral that took 600 years to build. Work began in the 13th century and was not completed until the 19th century. The bell towers, stained glass, and ornateness of design are something to behold.

Azalea Care In Summer

Azaleas may now be at the rate of 1/2 to 1 pound per square several inches that may be yard of soil surface. Be corrected. Take care of them during summer that is all that is necessary, but it must be done thoroughly. Azaleas have shallow feeder roots which quickly dry out in dry soils. A loamy-type soil which allows good water penetration and water-holding ability will require less frequent watering. Spring rains or frequent watering may compact the soil in an azalea planting. To insure a good soil aeration, the gardener would be wise to gently loosen compacted soils around the plants, being careful not to disturb shallow roots. When reworking soils, be careful not to add excessive soil over the root area. Deeply covered roots may cause serious damage. A mulch of pine needles or compost will reduce evaporation, prevent water loss, and will aid in keeping the soil cool and moist over the plant's root area.

Often, winter with sudden and hard cold is severe on many woody plants, including the popular azaleas. Azaleas may develop symptoms of freeze damage as the lower bark near ground level splits and the plant wilts when hot weather arrives. Damaged branches should be cut back to sound, healthy wood to encourage new growth below the damaged area. The gardener must take special care to see that azalea plants remain healthy and protect the potential flowers.

**Acreege Reports
Due June 15**

Farmers who have planted corn (grain, silage, sweet), dry beans, grain sorghum, peanuts, peppers, potatoes, sugar cane, or tomatoes are reminded that now is the time to report the sizes and intended uses of their 1984 program crops. Kathy O. Lowe, ASCS Director said. Crop certification is necessary before the farmer can receive def-

ciency payments, price support loans and other program benefits, she said. Farm program participants are required to report crops and acreages planted, the uses to be made of these crops, and cropland acres to be devoted to the acreage conservation reserve. nonparticipants need to certify their crops for future programs. In addition to history purposes, Mrs. Lowe said the acreage reports are also necessary for pro-

venyields. To be certain that crop acreages are accurate, farmers may request measurement services from ASCS for a certain fee. This is a valuable service not only to farmers participating in the acreage reduction programs, but to any farmer who desires an accurate acreage measurement for any reason. The ASCS official said. Acreage reports may be filed Monday through Friday between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. at the local ASCS office. Tyler county farmers are encouraged to certify crops well in advance of the June 15th deadline.
