## State Grants License

Jubilant Tyler County Youth Development Center Board members celebrated the official state licensing Monday of the Center Shelter for children aged 10-17 with a Pizza Party, of sorts, as planning was begun for a July 4 fundraising drive...and you guessed it, selling pizza.

Marsha Guillory, Department of Human Resources Institutional Licensing representative of Orange reported to the Booster late Monday that the State Licensing Review Committee met that day and granted the 6-month provisional license. According to Guillory, Barbara Varner, the director of the Agency for Institutional Licensing made the final decision at Department of Human Resources offices in Austin.

The license enables the Tyler County Youth Development Center to

begin accepting children who are in need of adult supervision, runaways, and children who are having difficulty adjusting to society, grow in a sheltered environment until families and/or the courts figure out a solution to the problem.

The Center concept developed three years ago and during that time the Tyler County Community has donated several acres of land and re-

furnished a three bedroom home, licensed now to care for 8 children.

According to Guillory, during the three month period, her office would inspect the facility three times; once unannounced. The operating board, its directors and staff and the facility itself must meet the planned minimum standards on a continuing basis to earn a biennial license which is

then good for two years. "We can't evaluate the quality of the care until it's actually begun," Guillory said, "but the facility is really a nice one and it has met the pre-operational standards."

Five months into the program Guillory emphasized the program will again be examined closely and a recommendation will be made which will reveal the strong points and weak-

nesses of the program.

Guillory, who said she expected to meet with the Tyler County Youth Development Center Board, soon said she "hopes that they'll soon be exceeding the minimums."

The Department of Human Resources Agency Contracting offices located in Nacogdoches are responsible for the auditing and fiscal functions of the program.

Hightower Says Now...

## Pay Teachers 'Worth'

"If we're going to pay teachers what their worth, then I say let's do it and do it now" is the view of State representative Allen Hightower on education reform and pay raise legislation currently being debated by the Texas Legislature.

Hightower, in a Booster interview Monday evening explained that under legislation that "hopefully be reintroduced Wednesday, teachers would receive a minimum pay raise of \$170 per month."

The state base pay levels under a totally restructured system would vary from a bottom step of \$1,520 per month to a top step of \$2,660 per month (12 month) according to legislative re-

search analyst Vic Hines.

Tyler County school districts would gain considerably in state aid under the proposed totally new system of state aid to local school districts included in the bill. The new system in the proposed legislation would result in state funding for Tyler County school districts for 1986-1987 of \$790,000 an increase of \$196,800 for Colmesneil district, \$2,991,000 or an increase of \$686,200 for Woodville district, \$1,562,600 an increase of \$367,300 for Warren District, \$863,700 an increase of \$327,200 for Spurger District and \$639,200 an increase of \$246,800 in state funding for Chester Schools. Of the 16

school districts in Hightower's district 15, all except the k-8 grade Onalaska system in Polk County would receive "substantial increases in state funding" stated Hines.

According to Hightower, the bill approved

by the House Public Education Committee Monday, which did not include a teacher pay raise, "does not reflect the beliefs of most House members and I would not vote for it," Repres-

# USDA Seeks Public Comment

# Governor Says June 1984 Hire A Veteran Month

Governor Mark White proclaimed June, 1984 as "Hire a Veteran" month in an official memorandum stating: "All citizens of the State of Texas are urged to hire a veteran or support Public Law 98-77, enacted by our national Congress, which provides eligible employers with reimbursement of 50 percent of the starting wages paid of eligible Korean and Vietnam veterans if employers provide on-the-job training. It is fitting and proper that we recognize the many sacrifices of these men who have fought for their country. Public Law 98-77, known as the Emergency Veterans Job Training Act, provides an employer reimbursement of up to \$10,000 for hiring and training qualified veterans. The employer can receive reimbursement of 50 percent of the veteran's starting salary, up to a maximum of \$10,000 during the training program. Participation in the program requires certification by the Veterans Administration or the Department of Labor. Initial contact may be made with the Veterans Employment Representative at any Texas Employment Commission office. The employer must certify his/her intention to employ the veteran on a permanent basis after training is completed and must guarantee that the veteran will be comparable to those normally paid to trainees. To be eligible for the training program, veterans must have been unemployed 15 of the 30 weeks prior to application. The training program must be in a growth industry which sets permanent full-time employment.

# USDA Seeks Public Comment

The U.S. Department of Agriculture is seeking public comment on the extent of such diversion and the level of payment; whether barley should be eligible for payment purposes under the feed grain program; whether malted barley should be exempt from any acreage reduction program; if an acreage reduction or set-aside program is necessary, whether to allow haying and grazing of acreage conservation reserve acreage; provisions of the farm-owned reserve; whether to require offsetting compliance if an acreage reduction program is established; whether non-recourse loans and purchases should be made available to producers who cut their corn crop for silage; and whether to sign to participate in the program should be binding after the sign-up period.

# Governor Says June 1984 Hire A Veteran Month

Governor Mark White proclaimed June, 1984 as "Hire a Veteran" month in an official memorandum stating: "All citizens of the State of Texas are urged to hire a veteran or support Public Law 98-77, enacted by our national Congress, which provides eligible employers with reimbursement of 50 percent of the starting wages paid of eligible Korean and Vietnam veterans if employers provide on-the-job training. It is fitting and proper that we recognize the many sacrifices of these men who have fought for their country. Public Law 98-77, known as the Emergency Veterans Job Training Act, provides an employer reimbursement of up to \$10,000 for hiring and training qualified veterans. The employer can receive reimbursement of 50 percent of the veteran's starting salary, up to a maximum of \$10,000 during the training program. Participation in the program requires certification by the Veterans Administration or the Department of Labor. Initial contact may be made with the Veterans Employment Representative at any Texas Employment Commission office. The employer must certify his/her intention to employ the veteran on a permanent basis after training is completed and must guarantee that the veteran will be comparable to those normally paid to trainees. To be eligible for the training program, veterans must have been unemployed 15 of the 30 weeks prior to application. The training program must be in a growth industry which sets permanent full-time employment.

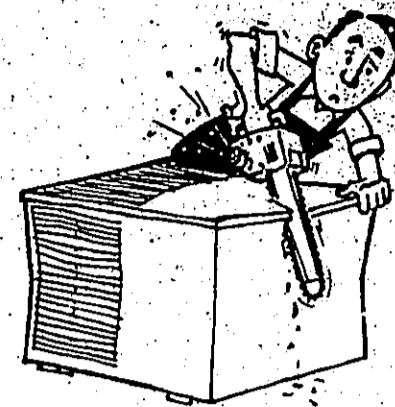

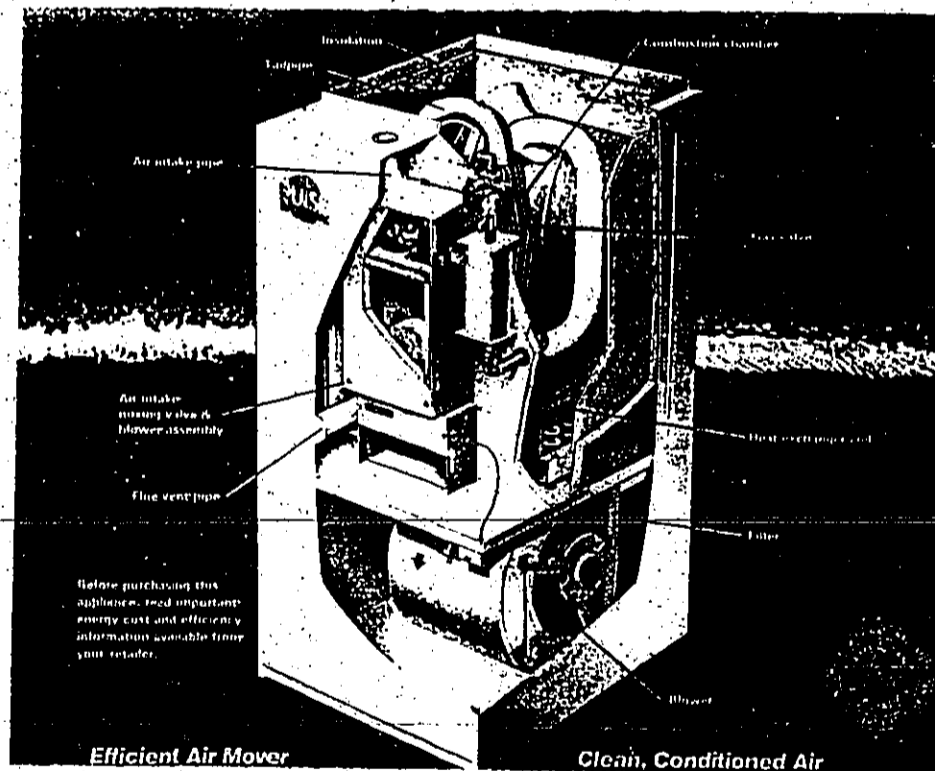
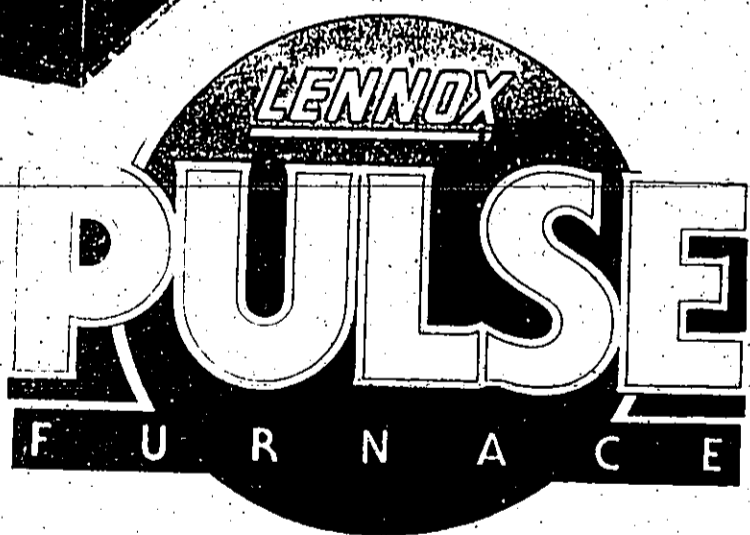
