New School Program Costs Questioned

"My viewpoint on the \$674,300 in added state aid dollars to the Woodville Independent School District is that I remain skeptical," says Woodville School Superintendent Dorman Jackson, Monday afternoon.

"And before changing my mind, I'll have to know what the hidden costs of this will be."

"I expect the added money will be spent just meeting the requirements of the reform bill," Jackson said.

The new W.I.S.D. top man will attend a meeting in Austin July 28, where the requirements of the Reform Bill will be explained to administrators.

According to State Representative Allen Hightower the final bill grants Woodville School District an added \$674,300 in state aid of which \$212,500 is earmarked for teacher pay raises. Warren schools will receive \$379,700 with \$147,500 for teacher pay; Colmesneil \$178,700 with \$110,000 for teacher pay increase; Spurger \$296,500 with \$50,000 for teacher pay; and Chester with a \$237,600 increase and \$40,000 for pay increases for teachers.

Required changes for this fall are a school calendar beginning "not before September 1 and running 175 days" and

Looks Good Texas Metals Eyes Woodville

Negotiations are currently underway for the possible move of the Texas Metal Works, Inc. a forging company located in Beaumont, which specializes in flange production and pipefitting requirements.

According to Texas

Foundries Representative Mark Moore, "Negotiations are currently underway, surveys are being taken, but it looks good."

The plant calls for a startup crew of 14 but expansion could result

in 200. The planned facility is estimated to be approximately one-half the size of the former Livingston Products Building but will have the ability to expand.

Annual billings for the firm is expected to be in "the millions."

Shopping Mall Plan Aired At City Council

Former Woodville Mayor Doug Tolbert was appointed to fill the

city council seat recently vacated by Councilwoman Donna Porter at a lengthy City Council meeting Monday. Tolbert, who retired from public office last year because of health problems, was reported "in good health now" and according to Mayor John Gilchrist, "I don't see how we could find a better qualified person."

The developers of the Timberland West subdivision and Kirby Industries, who had originally planned to tap the line in question, are instead accessing city water through a line down the Old Livingston highway, and other customers on the line, including the Tyler County Airport-Rodeo Grounds and Little League Park, may be accessible to water through lines from the Cyprus Creek Water System according to Davis.

Gramm Gives Doggett Issue Advice

Gramm, drawing a crowd of approximately 75 people to the Woodville Inn, characterized the differences between him and opponent Doggett as being ones of "basic values and philosophy of government" with Gramm standing

for "traditional values and beliefs of most Texans." "I have spent six years in Congress working for a balanced budget, lower taxes, greater economic opportunity for the working people of this country and a strong defense. My opponent has consistently demanded higher taxes, more spending and less defense," Gramm characterized the answer to current high federal deficits as being in establishing a set of firm priorities for funding federal programs and sticking to them."

In conclusion, Gramm described himself as doing his job, "doing a big job with a small shovel" and now is asking the Club property whose people for a "bigger shovel."

Jordan Gets COG Post

Commissioner's Court in regular session Monday appointed Bo Jordan Commissioner of Pct. #4 to replace County Judge Allen Starrock as the county's representative on the Board of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments.

Starrock, who has served as President of the Board of Directors of the DETCOG for four two year terms will retain a seat on the Executive Board of the area council as immediate past president of the organization.

Shopping With Diane

RESOURCEFULNESS: Early Tyler County pioneers had it and from the looks of things today, alot of it has been passed down through the generations. In certain cases, in Tyler County, that good old fashion resourcefulness has teamed up with a creative flare. The results: hand-constructed and handcrafted items made by our neighbors. This week, let's visit with some of them and learn about these special shopping opportunities.

LIGHTING THE WAY - How many of you remember pierced-paper lamp shades? They were popular many years ago. Recently, they've been making a comeback and through the talented hands of local artist Bob Woods, they've been given some new dimensions. Bob says he got interested in the art form through a magazine article. After mastering the basic technique, he began adding special touches of his own. His lamps, which he describes as cut and pierced, and sculptured, are now available at Dayspring Christian Center, 1103 West Bluff. To enhance the heirloom designs of his shades, Bob uses pewter, brass and ceramic bases. The shades themselves are made of heavy watercolor paper, which has been pierced with a needle, delicately painted and, in some cases, layered for a three dimensional effect. Each is original and signed by the artist. One, in particular, appeals especially to Tyler County residents. The shade, which is off-white, features a fragile dogwood design. The centers of the flowers are tinted soft gold; the leaves, moss green. The lamp stands approximately 12 inches high.

BUILDING ON TRADITION - Sometime around 1750, according to historical record, Benjamin Franklin invented the rocking chair. Comfortable and cool on the front porch in summer, or snug by the fire in winter, this functional piece of furniture has been enjoyed by the young and young-at-heart for over 200 years. About 7 years ago, Hugh and Jennie Vaughn of Woodville, equipped with strong determination and an old sheet of measurements from a Louisiana craftsman, began making their own version of rocking chair. Today their big Texas Rockers are enjoyed throughout East Texas and the United States. Most of the rockers are made from East Texas ash, according to Hugh, although black-walnut is used for Special Edition Chairs. Each rocker must be cut out, assembled, sanded and stained. Single rockers contain 36 parts and require over 100 separate steps from start to finish. If you'd like to visit Hugh and Jennie, or pick out your own Texas Rocker, you'll find them on Cobb Mill Road in Woodville. Watch for the big sign and the sign that reads "Texas Rockers".

LETTING THE CHIPS FALL - "Woodcarving", says Whittlin Sid Owens of Woodville, "is actually an American craft. When America was settled, and later, when pioneers pushed west, heavy, cumbersome tools were often left behind. Knives could be carried easily, however, and were used to carve out new wood tools. One can almost see the rugged pioneers, covered with dust from the trail, bending forward towards a flickering fire, intent on their whittling and scraping. Whittlin Sid, kindred in spirit to these early pioneers, whittles not from necessity, but from the sheer joy of it. And he's been doing it since he was 10. The first thing you'll notice about the collection is its western focus: cowboys, horses, longhorns and stagecoaches. You'll also notice that each piece has been stained with Sid's own special blends. He uses coffee grounds, tobacco or clay to obtain the rich, natural shades. Sid's work can be seen on Highway 190 West.

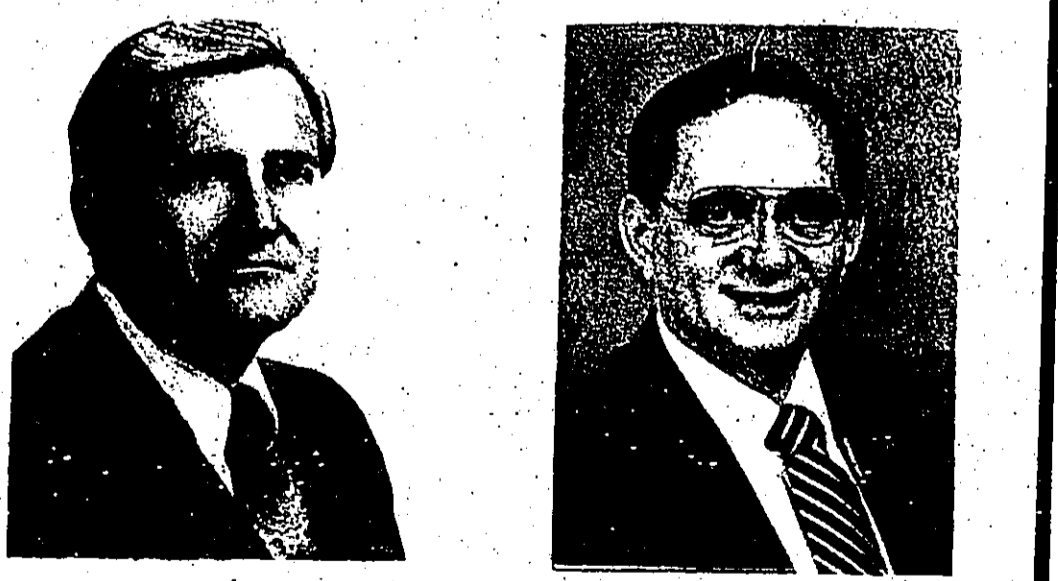

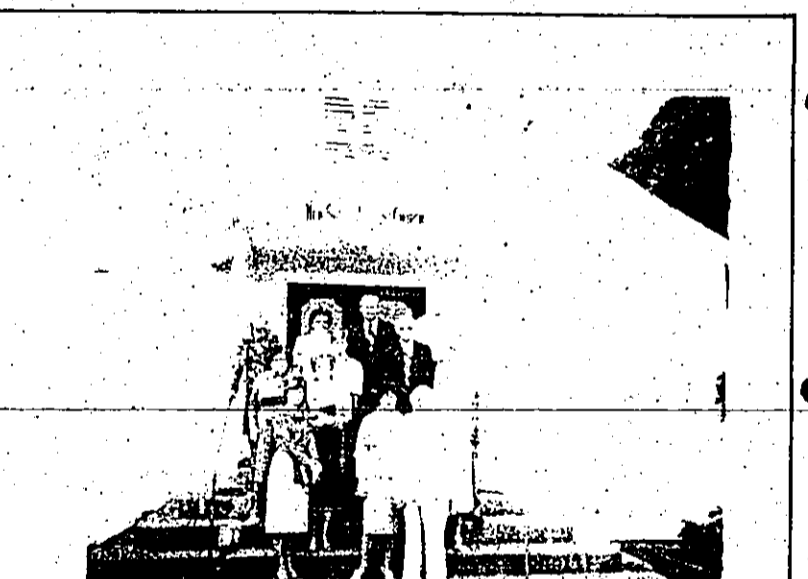

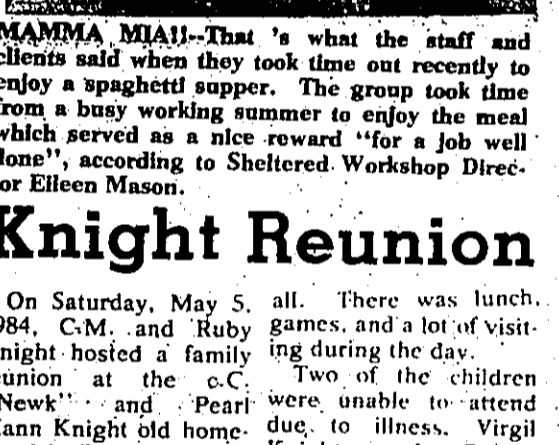

Woodville Bass Club

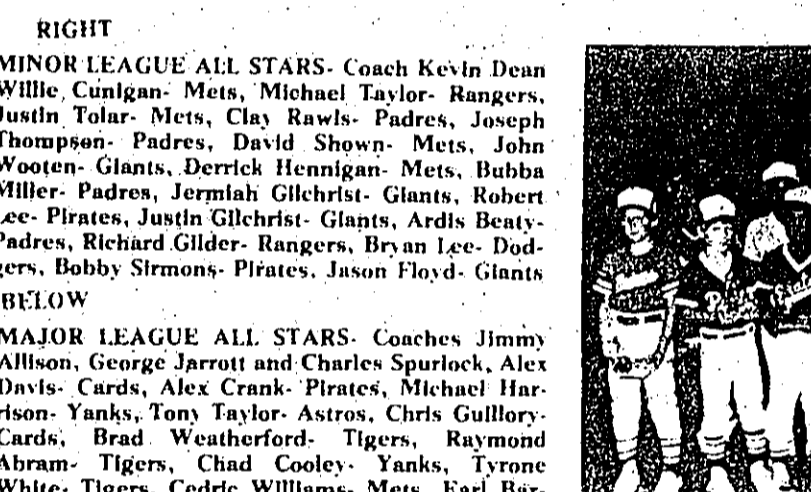
