Vaughn & Owens To San Antonio

At the 13th Annual Texas Folklife Festival, August 2-5, Texas' proud history is brought vividly to life by talented and friendly folks like chair maker Hugh Vaughn and whittler Sid Owens, both of Woodville.

Vaughn demonstrates how his large, hand-made wooden rocking chairs—better known as "Texas Rockers"—are made, and Owens gives visitors the benefit of his 50 years as a whittler by showing them the finer points of the craft.

Sponsored by the University of Texas Institute of Texas Cultures at San Antonio,

the Festival is an annual celebration of the state's ethnic diversity and pioneer heritage. Each August nearly 6,000 hard-working, fun-loving Texans come together to share the folkways of their ancestors with more than 100,000 visitors. Many facts of life on the Texas frontier are spotlighted at the Festival, along with the contributions of the more than 30 ethnic groups who settled and built the Lone State.

Everyone is encouraged to participate in the various activities. For example, festival-goers can try their hand at spinning a wheel and

operating an old-fashioned spinning wheel; milking a goat; shearing a sheep and making adobe bricks; baking "Depression" bread; patting out tortillas and cooking hoe-cakes. They can learn folk dances, like the spirited Filipino tinkling; clap along with the fiddlers and other folk musicians; and sing along with the gospel groups.

The Festival menu features both country cooking and exotic cuisine. Visitors can sample such authentic dishes as Jewish falafel (pita bread with stuffing), Mexican

fajitas, six varieties of sausage and three kinds of egg rolls, to name just a few.

The Texas Folklife Festival is held on the 15-acre grounds of The University of Texas Institute of Texan Cultures, located on HemisFair Plaza in downtown San Antonio. Tickets for the 1984 Festival are \$5 for adults, \$1 for children ages 6-12, and children under six are admitted free. Texas Metal Works

Construction Underway

"They are working at the site now, we expect to begin operations by the end of September," is the tentative timetable for Texas Metal Works Company to begin operations at their new Woodville plant according to George B. Morgan Jr. President of the 40 year old Beaumont manufacturer of forged steel pipe flanges.

The plant expects to begin with about four to six people and build

from that" which according to Morgan, plans to hire most of the employees for the new plant from the Woodville area. "We would hire right now any good turret lathe or drill press operators. We would start them in Beaumont and bring them up with us to Woodville," according to Morgan. The firm could eventually expand to employ as many as 200 workers with firm billings "in the millions" according

to one company official. "We see this as an opportunity to build a plant, to invest in new equipment, and have it prosper," says Morgan.

Texas Metal Works, Inc. manufactures forged steel pipe flanges in various sizes (1/2" through 18") and pressures (150# through 2500#) from over 30 types of alloy steels, such as stainless, nickel, "chrome-moly", aluminum, etc. Pipe flanges

are used to connect two joints of pipe together, and are required in pipelines all over the world.

According to a company news release, Texas Metal Works, Inc. has been in business in Beaumont for over 40 years, and was founded by George B. Morgan, now deceased.

This family-owned business has grown to over 140 employees. By expanding their operations to the Woodville area, the Company ex-

pects to install heavier, newer forging equipment, and as additional machine shop equipment is moved in and as business improves, is expected to grow substantially.

"We are looking forward to opening our plant in Tyler County, and anticipate a successful relationship with Woodville citizens. We expect to be a productive business partner in your city," concludes Morgan.

Woodville

Classes Begin August 21

"School will begin for Woodville students August 21 and for teachers August 20," Woodville School Superintendent Dorman Jackson stated in last Tuesday night's monthly meeting of the Woodville School Trustees. In clarifying the impact of the Texas Legislature's recently passed education reform package on the local district, Jackson indicated the "after September 1" date requirement for beginning school in Texas would not be in effect until after the 1984-85 school year.

In other business, Woodville School Trustees elected Board Member George Jarrott to serve as Vice-President of the board. Jarrott replaces recently resigned board member Fred Sullivan in that position.

Trustees announced the hiring of John Dubose as a coach and teacher; Jeff Collins as a high school Science teacher; and Mary Stagg as an elementary teacher. The resignation of Donna Erickson as a Special Education teacher was accepted.

Board members conducted a public hearing on the proposed uses of approximately \$12,000 in Chapter II Federal Block Grant funds. Mrs. Mary Nell Rainey, Instructional Coordinator for the Woodville district, stated the funds in the past had been

used to buy computers for the high school and middle school and if used for this purpose could result in a total of 12 micro-computers available for student instruction at the high school and 12 at the middle school. District officials indicated interest in further comments from the public on uses for these funds.

Rainey also reported on the district's annual report to the Texas Education Agency on progress on meeting the district's five year priority plan. According to Rainey, the district met

its 1984 goal of 65% of students scoring above the 30th percentile on total reading score on the California Achievement Test. However, in written composition skills, grades 9-11 scored 70%, 70% and 67% respectively, not reaching the goal for grades

7-11 of 75%. Rainey reported that four of the five grades did, however, raise their class percentages over the previous year's scores. Woodville Trustees authorized the letting of bids for sale of two 72 passenger 1968 Intern-

County Unemployment Down

The unemployment rate in Tyler County continued to decline with an official June rate of 9.2 percent of the workforce according to figures released Monday by Raymond Fore of the Lufkin Office of the Texas Employment Commission. June's figures indicated that there were 538 unemployed members of an official total Tyler County workforce of 5,818. The unemployment rate for May was 9.6 percent and April's rate was 11.1 percent.

In addition, according to figures from the Federal-State funded Job Training Partnership Program, Tyler County has had 105 wor-

kers enrolled in "on the job training" in recent months. This, according to Tyler County Judge Allen Sturrock, is

"more than any other county in the Deep East Texas area except for Angelina County with a 115 total."

A New Hanging Basket BY TED BRICE

Over the years many outdoor use that makes container for indoor or outdoor use that makes plants care a snap. This basket is made of a transparent plastic that lets you see the entire soil at all times. The basket is fifteen inches in diameter and will hold four 6-inch plants. The basket has a cone coming up in the center where a clear plastic rod, that is three feet long comes through the cone for hanging the basket. New "Premises Work Charges"
 There has been an important change recently regarding telephone wiring. The change involves the installation and repair of jacks and inside wiring. Inside wiring is required from the point where our lines end in a network interface. On most new homes, this interface—a large plastic box—is usually installed near the power meter. (In new apartments, it's usually located near the circuit breaker box.) If you don't have a new home, you probably don't have a network interface (we just started installing them in 1982). Instead, you have a similar device called a "protector." Like a network interface, the protector is the point where our line ends and your inside wiring begins. Until recently, we did all the installation and repair of wiring inside our customers' homes. We will still perform that work if you ask us—but the way the work is charged has now changed. If we do the wiring, we'll now bill you "Premises Work Charges." These charges are billed for each 15-minute period required on the job. Charges cover all costs associated with the work, including materials, but costs differ for installation and repair. Here's how the charges break down if we do the work for you:

New rates—Small increase to you
 By now, you are probably aware that Southwestern Bell Telephone received final approval for a rate increase effective June 1, which included the change in Premises Work Charges. I say you are "probably aware," because most customers will hardly notice it on their local exchange phone bill. The rate increase sounds like a lot of money—and it is, but the increase for residence flat-rate local exchange service is only 30 cents per month or less. Most of the increase (about 80%) was put on one group—Texas long distance companies (who pay for access to Southwestern Bell Telephone's network).

Institute Gets Grant

A \$64,000 grant has been awarded to the East Texas Business Institute, a division of the Nacogdoches County Chamber of Commerce, to administer an employer assistance program in twelve Deep East Texas counties. This grant, co-sponsored by the Nacogdoches and Lufkin TEC offices, will allow the business institute to offer seminars in the area of personnel recruitment, management, and retention to businesses within the area.
