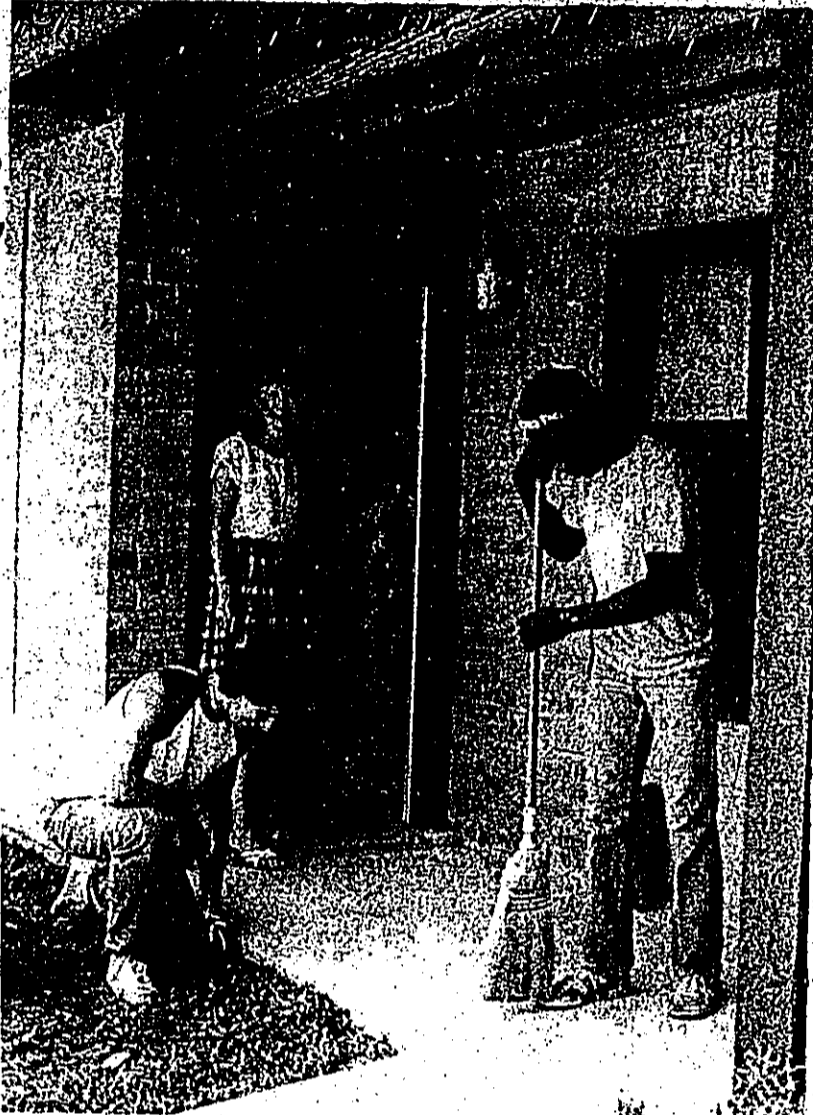

Thompson 'Not Guilty'

"You know, it's not really hard to look brilliant when you're up against a weak case," said successful defense attorney Zeke Zebranic to Tyler County District Attorney Pat Hardy, following the trial of Houston Thompson of Hardin County which ended Tuesday.

Earlier Tuesday morning and after listening to closing arguments, visiting state District Judge W.C. (Pete) Moore had ruled the case presented by Hardy "did not convince beyond a reasonable doubt" and pronounced Thompson "not guilty."

Hardy had attempted to prove that a statement, which Thompson had made in an earlier June, 1983 trial of Frank Galen Morris, constituted perjury. Thompson was representing Morris as defense attorney and was under cross-examination by Hardy, having testified in behalf of his client, when the allegedly perjurious statement, "there was a fresh cut on his eye," was made.

Hardy, in an interview after the trial, indicated, "I am disappointed; I feel we did show beyond a reasonable doubt that Houston was guilty. Though the judge was fair in his decision, it is hard in the pages of a transcript of an earlier trial to read the expressions used and accurately tell the way things were said."

Hardy stated he felt that Thompson was going to use the "cut" in 'trying to throw out the confession given by Morris at the earlier trial.

Thompson said, regarding the trial, which had been closely followed by Tyler and Har-

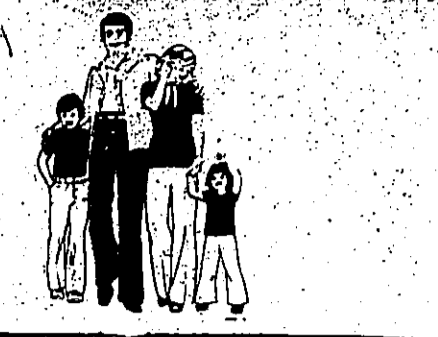

Texans' Recreation Expenditures

Texans spent more than \$1 billion on travel for fishing trips between July 1982 and July 1983, according to the Texas Agricultural Experiment Station, A&M University.

Researcher Allan Mills said fishing trips were second only to sightseeing in the amount of money spent on recreational travel. Mills directed a statewide telephone survey to estimate the amount Texans spend on travel associated with outdoor recreation. He found that Texans spent total of \$9.3 billion during the year-long period on travel in the state to participate in the 20 most popular outdoor activities, which ran the gamut from jogging and tennis to picnicking and camping.

The four activities requiring water (swimming, fishing, water skiing, and boating) accounted for more than \$2.25 billion for travel expenditures.

The report said in addition to the \$1.1 billion for travel to their favorite fishing holes, Texans annually spend \$583 million on swimming trips; \$300 million on travel for boating, and \$181 million to go water skiing.

Mills said the average family taking trips for fishing spent \$583 annually on travel associated with the sport.
