Country Club Property Sold! City Gets Water Line Right From Allison Following Land Sale

Woodville City Council accepted from Colmesneil Chevrolet dealer Robert Allison, the new owner of property west of Woodville where the Dogwood Country Club was formerly located, a water line servicing that area. Allison, stating that the property he had purchased recently would not be developed as a Country Club, donated the .0092 acres of land and a permit from the State Highway Department where the water line runs. "It's unfortunate the city went through what it did over this in the past; all I want for this is the city to provide water through the water line," Allison said.

The city held a public hearing on the 1985 Budget of approximately \$1,745,184 an increase of approximately 12% or 186,286 over last year's Budget of \$1,558,898. Federal revenue sharing funds are estimated at approximately \$38,716 and income from the city motel tax budgeted at \$17,000. The Tyler County Tax Appraisal District according to City Secretary Walt Davis has appraised city taxable property at \$44,183,997. Davis estimates a tax rate of 24.94 cents per \$100 valuation down 13 cents from last year's rate of 38 cents per \$100 valuation will be needed to produce the same tax income to the city as last year. Davis said this year's tax role showed no new property add-

ed to the role this year. Davis stated the budget increases were "mostly caused by the cost of selling bonds" and a projected 20% increase in electric power rates. A pay increase request by City Corporation Judge Joe Cash was refused. The only pay increase proposed in the city 1985 Budget is for Randy Ray who will add to his present responsibilities as Water Superintendent the supervision of the city gas system.

American Cablevision engineer Bob Carter, presented to council plans to change the companies channel "line-up", replacing Cinemax with the Disney Channel; Houston's channel 26 with Channel 20, which will provide coverage of Houston Astros baseball and Rockets Basketball; and to drop Houston Channel 2 in favor of ESPN sports on cable channel 2 and Christian Broadcast coverage on cable channel 3. In other action, the contract of independent auditing firm of Clinton L. Kennedy of Alvin, Texas was extended to cover the County's 1984 records and accounts for a cost of \$10,300.

The changing responsibility for retirement withholding from pay of county employees from the County Treasurers to the County Auditors Office was approved.

County Clerk Grace Bostick was given approval to solicit bids which will be opened at Friday's meeting for a new typewriter and the monthly Extension office report was approved.

County Judge Allen Sturrock announced that Texas Governor Mark White has been invited to attend the ribbon cutting ceremony, October 16, marking the completion of a federal-state funded road and bridge improvement project in the Warren area. Also invited to attend the ceremony is U. S. Second District Congressman Charles Wilson, and state Senator Roy Blake. The group of officials plans to proceed from Warren ribbon-cutting to dedicate the Beach Cove School area

House Bill Examines 'Extracurricular' Activities

Austin-In this report on HB 72, the education reform bill, extracurricular activities, school day interruptions and limitations on unexcused absences will be discussed.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES
Webster defines extracurricular as "not falling within the scope of a regular curriculum; specifically, of or relating to officially or semi-officially approved and usually organized student activities (as athletics), connected with school and usually carrying no academic credit."

According to figures released by the Texas Research League which were gleaned from reports by local school districts to the Texas Education Agency, school districts of Texas spent \$166,790,171 for extracurricular activities in the 1983-84 school year. This amounts to an expenditure of \$61.15 per student in average daily attendance. The average would obviously be much higher if it were participated on actual participants.

While the Select Committee recommendations on extracurricular activities received many bad reviews, it echoed the comments I have received from many of those whom I represent. There is no question of the value of extracurricular activities, but there was question of the perspective in which they had been placed insofar as the objectives of public education were concerned.

HB 72 provides: "The State Board of Education, by rule, shall limit participation in and practice for extracurricular activities during the school week. The rules shall, to the extent possible, preserve the school day for academic activities without interruption for extracurricular activities."

The bill further states: "A student, other than a mentally retarded student enrolled in a school district in this state shall be suspended from participation in any extracurricular activity sponsored or sanctioned by the school district during the grade reporting period after a grade reporting period in which the student received a grade lower than the equivalent of 70 on a scale of 100 in any academic class."

While there was and still is considerable opposition to this portion of the reform bill, it is doubtful that it will diminish the quality of extracurricular activities. It should improve the academic achievements of many of those who participate and thus contribute to their chances of success in life after their high school careers are over.

HB 72 addresses this problem by stating:

"The board of trustees of each school district shall adopt and strictly enforce a policy limiting interruption of classes during the school day for nonacademic activities such as announcements and sales promotions. At a minimum, the policy shall eliminate other than emergency announcements to 'once during the school day.'"

One complaint I have heard many times from teachers is about students who don't come to school. I have heard of parents who take their children out of school for vacation trips during the school year and ask the teacher to "prepare assignments for a week or so in advance. When these children return many haven't completed their assignments, and it must all be done over again. A teacher's job is difficult at best, and it is asking too much for a teacher to provide extra instruction for students who missed school for less than valid reasons."

HB 72 takes a firm position on this problem by stating: "A student may not be given credit for a class if the student has more than five days of unexcused absence during a semester."

While some public resentment will probably linger over the provisions of HB 72 discussed in this report, I believe they will improve the opportunity for students in our public schools to learn, and that is what it's all about.

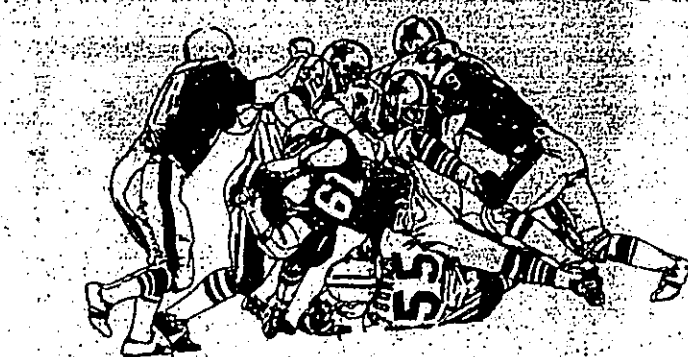

PUBLIC NOTICE
BRIEF EXPLANATORY STATEMENTS OF PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS GENERAL ELECTION NOVEMBER 6, 1984

PROPOSITION NO. 1 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 29 proposes a constitutional amendment that provides to state-chartered colleges that are or may be granted national banks of the United States chartered in this state. For example, if national banks become authorized to maintain branches in this state, the same privilege to state banks would be extended to state banks.
The proposed constitutional amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide state banks the same rights and privileges as national banks."

PROPOSITION NO. 2 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 19 proposes a constitutional amendment that restructures the Permanent University Fund to provide: (1) eligible to participate in the bond-issuing capacity of the fund to include the components of The University of Texas and Texas A&M University systems that have been added by constitutional amendment; (2) the expansion of the fund for the purposes for which bond proceeds can be expended from new construction to include major repair and rehabilitation projects and the acquisition of major capital equipment (e.g., computers and laboratory equipment) and library books and materials. Additionally, each institution would be authorized to issue bonds backed by a pledge of up to 50% of its share of the \$100 million annual appropriation for repair and rehabilitation projects.

PROPOSITION NO. 3 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 65 proposes a constitutional amendment which authorizes the legislature to provide for the payment of assistance to the surviving dependent parents, brothers, and sisters of certain public servants killed while on duty. The proposed amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide assistance to the surviving dependent parents, brothers, and sisters of certain public servants killed while on duty."

PROPOSITION NO. 4 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 20 proposes a constitutional amendment which abolishes the office of county treasurer in Bexar and Collin counties if a majority of the voters in each of those counties vote in favor of abolishing the office of county treasurer in a local election to be held on the issue. All the powers, duties, and functions of the office of county treasurer in each of those counties would be transferred to the county clerk.

PROPOSITION NO. 5 ON THE BALLOT
Senate Joint Resolution 22 proposes a constitutional amendment which provides a new method of filling a vacancy in the office of Lieutenant Governor. The amendment requires the President pro tempore of the Senate to call together the committee of the whole Senate within 30 days after a vacancy occurs in the office of Lieutenant Governor. The committee would be required to elect one of its members to perform the duties of the Lieutenant Governor until the next general election. This individual would continue his duties as the Lieutenant Governor until the next general election, another Senator must be elected according to the above procedure to perform the Lieutenant Governor's duties. The President pro tempore would be required to perform the Lieutenant Governor's duties pending the election of one of its members by the committee of the whole Senate.

PROPOSITION NO. 6 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 73 proposes a constitutional amendment that permits the use of public funds and credit for payment of premiums on non-occupational life, health, or accident insurance policies and annuity contracts issued by a mutual insurance company authorized to do business in this state. The constitutional prohibition against a grant of public money to an individual, association, or corporation or against becoming a stockholder in a corporation, association, or company has limited life and health group policies of political subdivisions to non-mutual insurance companies. The amendment would permit mutual insurance companies to bid for those policies.

PROPOSITION NO. 7 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 4 proposes a constitutional amendment to change the membership of the State Commission on Judicial Conduct to include one Judge of a District Court and one Judge of a County Court at Law, who shall be elected at large and appointed by the Supreme Court with the advice and consent of the Senate.

PROPOSITION NO. 8 ON THE BALLOT
House Joint Resolution 21 proposes a constitutional amendment which increases the per diem of members of the Legislature. The amount of per diem allowed during a calendar year would be equal to the maximum amount set in federal income tax statutes as of January 1 of that same year as a deduction for ordinary and necessary business expenses incurred by a state legislator. Current per diem is \$30; the maximum deduction is now \$25.

PROPOSITION NO. 9 ON THE BALLOT
The proposed constitutional amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide a deduction for ordinary and necessary business expenses incurred by a state legislator."

PROPOSITION NO. 10 ON THE BALLOT
The proposed constitutional amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide a deduction for ordinary and necessary business expenses incurred by a state legislator."

PROPOSITION NO. 11 ON THE BALLOT
The proposed constitutional amendment will appear on the ballot as follows: "The constitutional amendment to provide a deduction for ordinary and necessary business expenses incurred by a state legislator."
