

# 1984 Tyler County Fair Opens Thursday, October 4

The 1984 Tyler County Fair opens its three day run this Thursday, October 4, at the Tyler County Fair Grounds located north of Hwy 190 west of Woodville.

"We have the big tents and livestock pens set up and the carnival is also setting up. They should be open Wednesday night for anyone who wants to come out and ride," Tyler County Fair Chairman Ben Worthy said Tuesday evening about preparations for the Fair opening Thursday, October 4.

"We have a larger than normal number of entrants for the County livestock events but the

open events—the beef breeder and dairy cattle shows will be smaller than normal because out-of-county youth will not be able to get out of school to participate," Worthy indicated.

This year's fair will feature in addition to the livestock, canning, handicrafts and foods exhibits, a new Adult Art and Youth Poster exhibit and a Children's barnyard. In addition there will be a large Commercial Booth area and a wide variety of Carnival rides provided by Crabtree Amusements. Friday will be Children's Day with County School Districts taking a holiday.



## October Attendance Push Asked By School League

The Woodville School League has mounted an aggressive campaign during the month of August which is aimed directly at an increase of state funding as a "reward" for high daily student attendance. Since the state funds school districts on a service provided on a daily basis, otherwise known as average daily attendance (ADA), the Woodville School Service League, headed by President JoElla Knapp says she feels it's the least the league can do to help take some of the dollar pressure off the local schools which are "poor enough as it is".

Knapp said the Service League would be offering prizes, one to each class, for 6 through 12 grades and said the lucky winners will be notified at the end of the month.

"We're trying to inform the parents that this is a specific way they can help by encouraging child attendance. We want them to know just how important October is," Knapp said.

Our district counts on state reimbursement and since the State Board of Education has chosen October as the month to identify ADA figures across the state, we thought we'd take advantage of this with prizes for the top attendance.

Knapp said the state usually picks random dates. "But this time they've chosen October." The School Ser-

vice League President said also that other districts are trying the same tack, like Houston Schools and schools in Newton County.

"It would be an excellent idea for all the schools in Tyler County," she said.

The greatest need is in secondary school attendance, Knapp reported.

The students who have perfect attendance will place their names in a box after which a drawing will be held with the winner earning a prize to be announced later. "There will be one prize per grade."

Grades K through 5 will continue their "Cupcake Attendance Award". Everyone with perfect attendance gets a cupcake.

"The School Service League is a tremendous help to us," said Woodville School Superintendent Dorman Jackson Tuesday. "The four weeks in October plus another four weeks later

used to determine our Average Daily Attendance (A.D.A.) for this school year. Our state money is based on our A.D.A. If we were to have low attendance in October," continued Jackson "it could really hurt us but the School Service League's 'High Attendance Program' may help us get the kids to school and keep our A.D.A. up."

"I also want to point out how much help the School Service League was to us on the first day of school when they supplied parents to help the students in the kindergarten through third grade find their way to their classrooms."

## Fired Four Plan Appraisal District Appeal

"None of us were ever told we were doing a bad job, as a matter of fact, they told us we were doing a good job, we don't know why we were fired," said former Tyler County Appraisal District Appraiser Arthur McInnis Monday morning after he and three other employees of the Tyler County Appraisal District Staff

were fired by Chief Appraiser Officer Mary Mann. Mann terminated entire staff of the controversial County Appraisal District "without explanation" excepting her secretary and herself.

Fired, were former Asst. Chief Appraiser and two year employee, Mark Allen, Appraiser and two year employee

McInnis, Data Processor, one year employee, Diane Hanks and Data Processing Manager and one year employee, Gaynell Sirmons.

"We want to be very professional about this, but we want an explanation as to why we were fired and would like to have our jobs back," said Allen.

According to the four employees there was no notice given that their work performance was in anyway unsatisfactory.

According to the Appraisal Districts Employee Handbook the Chief Appraiser is in charge of personnel matters but in the case of termination of an employee "The Chief Appraiser at a prior time

must take reasonable action to correct the shortcoming before it becomes serious enough to warrant discharge."

Asked to comment on recent rumors of a threatened employee walkout, if the 1985 Budget of the Appraisal District cut employee insurance benefits, the former employee Diane Hanks stated that isn't true. We did go to the board meeting on the budget, but that was because we wanted to know what was going to happen. No one told us they were going to cut our insurance, one of us saw the notice through and we went to the meeting to see what was going to happen; No one told us anything!"

Chief Appraiser Mann confirmed Monday afternoon that the four employees had been terminated and that a meeting on the matter

was planned for next week. Mann indicated that she would not comment on the matter until after the meeting.

Where did I go wrong? Is not the question. The question is "Where did these changes occur?" I think they occurred with President Reagan.





# Reduced School Lunches Available At Spurger

The Spurger School serves nutritious meals every school day. The following prices will be in effect for the 1984-85 school year: Elementary School Lunch 80c, Breakfast 40c, Extra Milk 25c. Children from families whose income falls within the levels shown on the scale below are eligible for either FREE OR REDUCED MEALS. The cost of a reduced-price lunch is 25c and breakfast is 15c.

If your child is approved for benefits, you must tell the school when your household income increases by more than \$50 per month (\$600 per year) or when your household size decreases. You may apply for benefits at any time during the school year. If you are not eligible now, but have a decrease in household income, become unemployed, or have an increase in family size, fill out an application at that time.

If you have foster children living with you, they are eligible for these benefits. If you wish to apply for these benefits for them, please contact the school and they will help you complete the application.

Children who receive free or reduced-price meal benefits are treated the same as children who pay for meals. In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of race, sex, color, national origin, age or handicap. If you believe you have been discriminated against, write immediately to the Secretary of Agriculture, Washington, D. C. 20250.

If you do not agree with the school's decision on your application or the result of verification, you may wish to discuss it with the school. # Election Set For Oct. 4 Blueberries On Horizon

Production and marketing potentials of the emerging blueberry industry will be the primary topics when growers meet Oct. 12-13 at Stephen F. Austin State University in Nacogdoches.

Growers from Texas, Arkansas and Louisiana are expected to attend the day-long meeting. According to Dr. Terry Menges, horticulturist for the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System, blueberries have the potential for producing one of the highest returns per acre of any agricultural crop in the South. "The potential is for at least a \$200 million industry within the Ark-La-Tex area, with East Texas being the primary growing area."

The early harvesting season of the region and the accessibility to markets offers a tremendous potential, says Menges. The crop is excellent for small landowners and offers good returns for proper management and marketing.

The meeting is being planned by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas Agricultural Experiment Station and Texas Blueberry Growers Association, with registration beginning at 9 a.m., Oct. 12. The morning session is designed especially for new and potential growers and will be moderated by Menges. Basic production information will be highlighted.

The afternoon program will be moderated by Dr. David Creech, Texas A&M University. Topics include:

# Roy Blake Comments On House Bill 72

This report on HB 72, the Education Reform Bill, will deal with removal of incorrigible pupils alternative education programs and expansion of incorrigible pupils.

REMOVAL OF INCORRIGIBLE PUPILS  
To find a student guilty of incorrigible conduct, a school board must find that the pupil has engaged in serious or persistent misbehavior in the classroom.

present a clear, present or continuing danger of physical harm to the pupil or other individuals; or that the pupil has engaged in serious or persistent misbehavior that threatens to impair the educational efficiency of the school, that the misbehavior violated published standards of conduct, and all reasonable alternatives have been exhausted.

Upon finding a pupil guilty of incorrigible conduct, a school board or its designate may remove a student from a classroom but must make reasonable efforts to provide for the continuing education of the pupil. A board shall provide for the pupil to be in a supervised educational setting such as an in-school suspension, a reassignment of classes, transfer to a different school campus, transfer to a school-community guidance center or assignment to a community-based alternative program.

home-based instruction. The reassignment of an incorrigible pupil may not extend beyond the end of the term in which the pupil is found guilty, unless that occurs in the last six weeks of school. In that case, the student may be reassigned until the end of the following semester.

Alternative Education Program  
If, after being placed in an alternative program, the student continues to be guilty of incorrigible conduct, the board or its designate can expel the student only for the balance of the current term or until the end of the next term if the action is taken in the final six weeks of a term.

A copy of the written order of expulsion must be delivered to the parent or guardian of the pupil, and another copy must be delivered to the authorized officer of the juvenile court in the county in which the juvenile resides.

# Legislative State Board Is HB 72 Subject

This report on HB 72, the Education Reform Bill, will be devoted to a discussion of the Legislative Education Board and the State Board of Education.

HB 72 abolished the member elected State Board of Education and replaced it with a 15 member board. The initial 15 members of the State Board of Education will be appointed by the Governor but will revert to an elected board in four years.

LEGISLATIVE EDUCATION BOARD  
HB 72 created a Legislative Education Board composed of the Lt. Governor, Speaker of the House, Chairman of the House Public Education Committee, Chairman of the Senate Education Committee, Chairman of the State Finance Committee, two State Representatives appointed by the speaker and two Senators appointed by the Lt. Governor.

The State Board with the assistance of the Commissioner of Education will be responsible for implementing the provisions of HB 72. The Board is given considerable responsibility in developing rules and guidelines to implement the provisions of the bill.

One of the chief responsibilities of the Board will be to adopt rules for certification of teachers, administrators and other professional personnel.

The Board will also decide what is and what is not appropriate higher education course work for teachers to take in order to advance on the career ladder.

It will also play a large part in developing the guidelines for conducting extracurricular activities.
