## W.I.S.D. Eyes New Classrooms

## Center Director Decker Enjoys Challenge

I've put in more hours on this job than on any job or in any business I've ever had," says former Probation Officer and businessman Ron Decker about his first month as the Executive Director of the Tyler County Youth Development Center, and he added, "I realized when I accepted this job there were lots of problems and that lots of work would have to go into meeting all the standards you have to comply with."

Decker, the TCYDC's third Director of a twenty-four-hour emergency child care shelter, said "the Board of Directors have pretty well given me a free rein as far as carrying on the work of the Center."

"My priority right now is to improve the working conditions for my staff. The staff out here has pretty well held this place together. I've got to give them a lot of credit because they have been through some real tough times. Even under normal conditions, according to Decker, the Shelter staff jobs would be "very high stress work with a quick burnout; your working with kids with a lot of problems."

Decker, has proposed an addition of \$27,750 to the already approved one year of funding of \$111,061.75 in state Department of Human Resources money in order to give the three full time house parents "an extra day a week off, increase the number of hours worked by relief

houseparents, and provide extra staff for peak-time or problem times at the shelter." The Shelter let \$29,432 in funds lapse so this will be like spending those funds. You cannot operate a adequate child care facility without an adequate staff," says Decker.

The shelter has been "pretty well filled" to its capacity of eight clients between the ages of 10 to 17 years for the last month, says Decker. "At first, when the kids come in here they're confused, most of them have no idea where they will be going to live when they leave here. Basically the kids who come to the Shelter are kids who have had problems at home or in a foster home or other long-term placement to where they can no longer stay where they were. They stay here thirty days then go to an alternative placement, maybe home, maybe to a foster home or maybe to one of the Church affiliated or other long-term child care facilities," says Decker. The Shelter receives placements from 12 Counties in the Deep East Texas Area.

In addition, Decker is developing a truancy intervention program for Tyler County and a family crisis intervention program for the Deep East Texas Area which should be ready by January says Decker. Both programs would include placement of children at the TCYDC Shelter as one alternative for dealing with truancy and family crisis situations," says Decker.

"For the future," Decker said, "I would like to see us add a separate house for the boys, and recreation facilities like a basketball court, and establish a mini-farm, with animals like horses, goats and problems but we're taking action to try to work them out as we go along," concluded Decker.

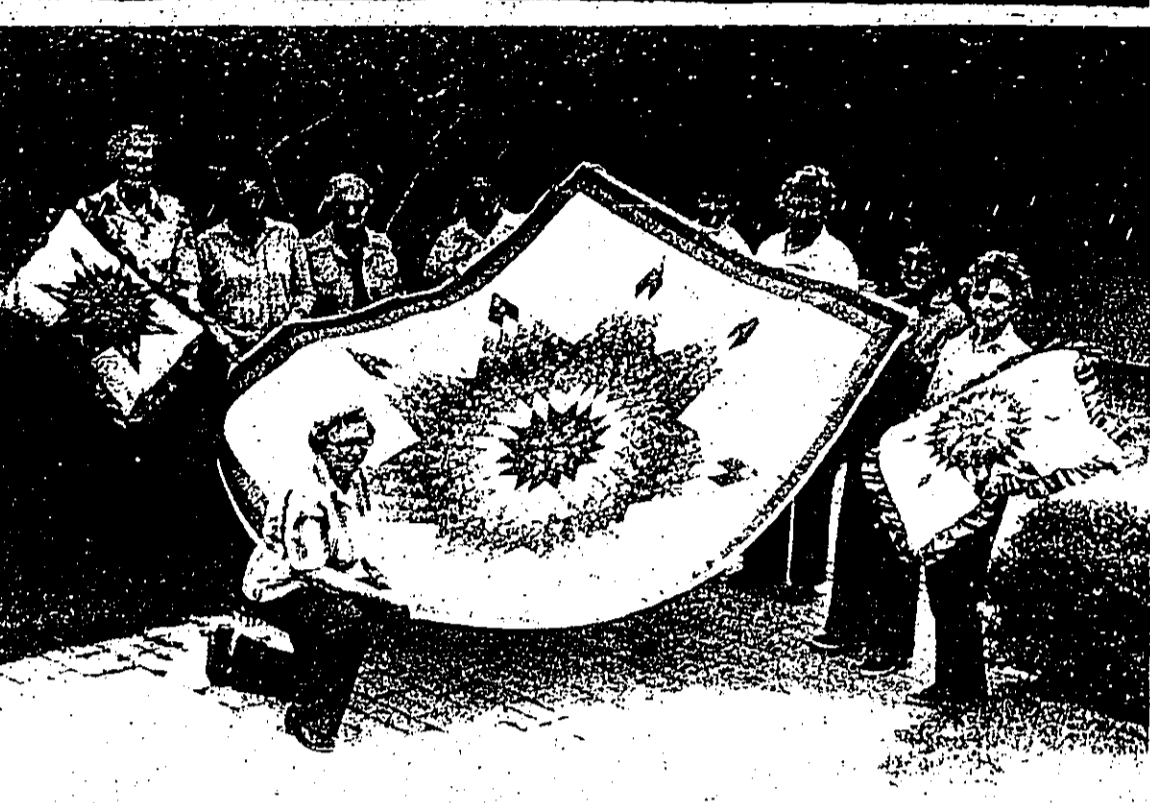

It was a rather startling comment from Mr. Mondale at the San Francisco Democratic convention, and I just found out he was moving into the Oval Office in January.

He saw it as a way to reduce the deficit, that only barely understood budget item that most of us choose to ignore in this political season.

Maybe part of it is because we haven't been operating on a "budget" in this country for years. The President proposes one. The Congress dithers over the consequences. And we operate on "continuing resolutions," which means simply that we don't have a budget, so we just fund more money to keep the government operating.

You probably caught the consternation in the House and Senate a few days ago, when they couldn't leave their desks to go home and campaign, because they hadn't budgeted for the funds needed to keep the money flowing.

So far years, budgets have been nothing more than noise emanating from political mouths, hence deficits have very little credibility, because most of us can't understand what the fuss is all about.

And that's a little remarkable. A flock of states and most county and local governments operate on budgets. You only spend what you take in. And legislators and city councils seem to cut and fit things come out even.

Of course, those same governments don't have printing presses as the federal government does, and that's where everything comes unstuck.

We love to pass laws that give something to darn near everybody, if there's a vote-out there to be caught as well. It's biting the bullet for the money that gets the Congress in trouble.

We have created a "social needs" agenda that touches everybody. Some with financial assistance. Some with shelters that divert what otherwise would be dollars.

We all have our noses buried in the trough and we haven't come up for air in years.

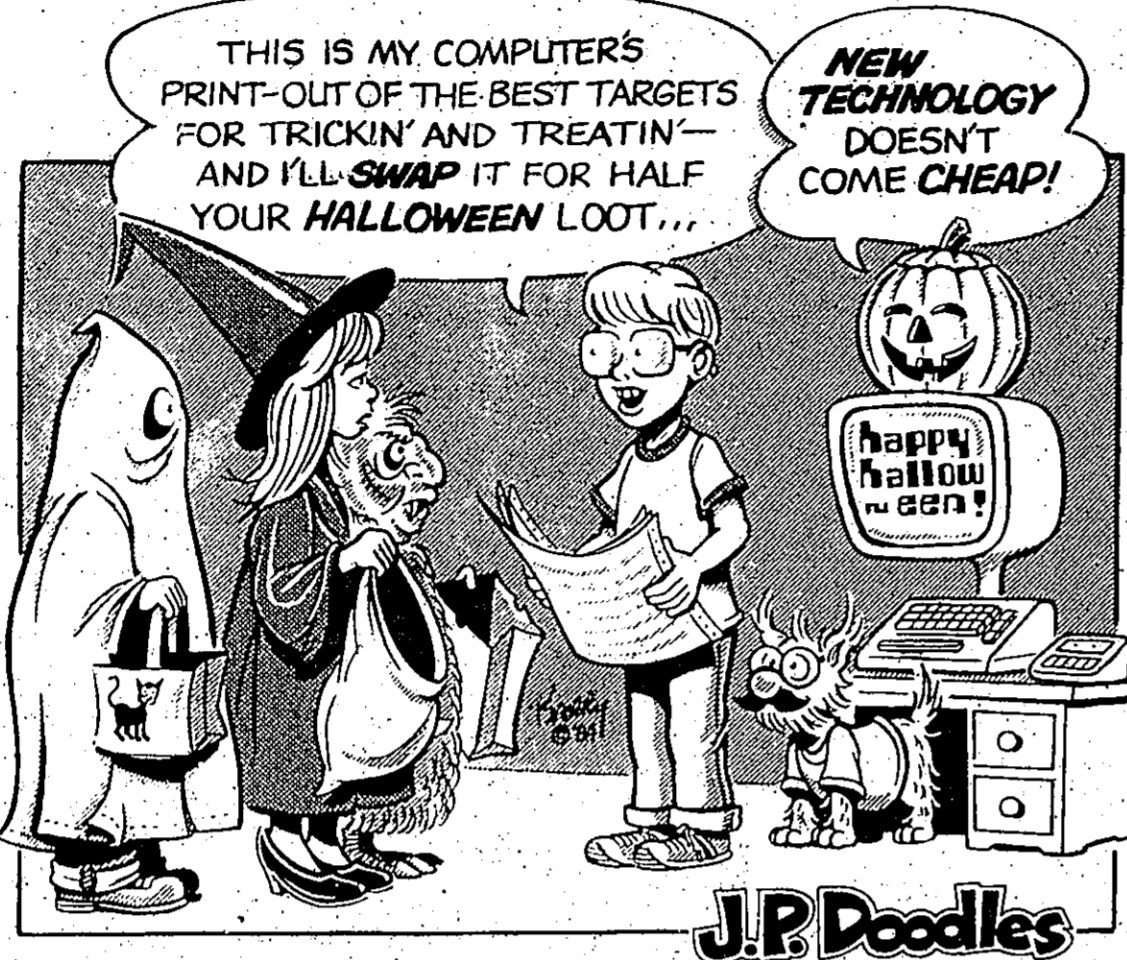
That may explain why Mr. Mondale assumes the onus answer to the problem is to go on doing what we've been doing for years under Democratic and Republican administrations.

Raise taxes.

If you'll remember the Reagan tax cuts didn't really help most of us, because the increased social security taxes wiped out the income tax cut. And for most of us, local taxes have been on the increase as well.

Where Mr. Reagan veers away from Mr. Mondale is his assumption that a growing economy will generate additional tax dollars, and those in turn will help out the deficit. How much? No one knows for sure.

But again, most of you out there seem to feel that things are better now than they were four years ago, and that Mr. Reagan might be on the right path. Tighten up loopholes, make the tax bite a little more equitable. And count on the overall stronger economy to squeeze that deficit down. And most of you, if the pollsters are right, don't think that an income tax hike is the best way to ap-

de with a positive note. While there are those who don't want the new system to work, there are many who are doing their very best to make it work. In a survey that was taken in one school district, this question was asked of teachers: "Do you feel the overall reform bill is good for education?" A majority, although not overwhelming, answered "Yes."

Teachers were asked what they liked least about the bill. The teachers ranked their responses in order as the career ladder, competency testing, the appointed State Board of Education, tutorial services and the requirement that participants in extracurricular activities pass all their courses. Teachers were also asked what they liked most about the bill. They ranked the following in order: the limiting of unexcused absences, the elimination of social promotion, the requirement that all schools in Texas begin the same year on the same day, the requirement that participants in extracurricular activities pass all their courses, and tutorial services.

I attended a meeting last week at a school with sixty school officials a few days ago. While some expressed outright disgust with the bill, the overall attitude was "Like it or not, we'll try to make it work."

In a recent conversation that my administrative assistant had with a retired administrator who had coached football and taught mathematics, he told him "If this bill had been passed four years ago, she wouldn't have retired. He had become frustrated with the system and with what he termed some incompetent personnel that he could not get terminated even with documentation. "Every good teacher should welcome competency testing," he said, "because that's the strongest case they'll ever have for improved salary structures."

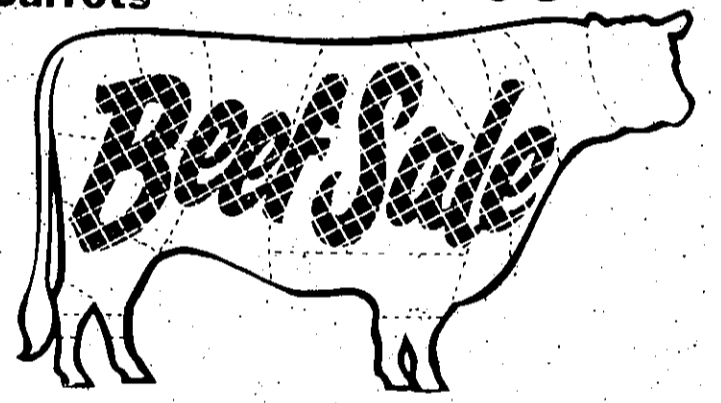
