County Jail Fails

"It doesn't look like the Texas Commission on Jail Standards is going to certify the jail any more," announced Tyler

County Sheriff Leon Fowler after state jail inspector Bob Dearing concluding his annual inspecting of the county jail, pronounced the county

detention facility "not in compliance" having exceeded state standards as to the number of prisoners which can be legally confined in the

jail at one time. The county jail, renovated only three years ago, is certified for an 11 prisoner capacity, not the 11.86 average prisoner level which the jail

has held over the past few months. The county jail has eleven bunks and cannot keep a prisoner over 72 hours without a bunk. Prisoners without bunks sleep on mattresses on the floor up until the 72 hour limit, according to Fowler.

"This is something which has been a problem for a long time; the Jail Commission certified us for the last year because we kept our population of prisoners down."

County officials do not expect the Commission to close the Tyler County Jail, a step which would require local law enforcement to pay adjoining counties to house Tyler County prisoners "as long as we show them we are genuinely trying to solve the problem" according to County Judge Allen Sturrock. Commissioner's appointed a New Jail Committee two months ago following filing of a lawsuit by former prisoner Thomas Simmons alleging sub-standard jail conditions. The committee headed by Commissioner Maxie Riley and consisting of Sheriff Leon Fowler, County Attorney Pat Hardy, Criminal Investigator B. J. Vardaman, Judge Allen Sturrock and citizens Grady Hold-

erman, James Jordan, Bobby Kinnon, and Jim Dillon, "will be considering what we need to solve this problem" says Sturrock, "we will just have to see what they can come up with." Fowler indicated he expected the lack of certification to effect the Simmons lawsuit "as we were in compliance on all the areas listed by Simmons."

White Lauds State Role In Registering Voters

AUSTIN—A record 7.7 million voters are expected to register in November's general election, and despite criticism from the federal government, I am proud of the state's role in that effort. Last week I testified before the House Subcommittee on Manpower and Housing in Washington, DC, reviewing Texas legisla-

tive mandate for state agencies to assist in the non-partisan voter registration of any Texas resident. Donald Devine, director of the U.S. Employment and Training Administration, ignored this mandate in a September 24th letter to my office in which he warned that the purpose of interfering with or affecting the result of the upcoming general election.

Devine expressed concern that voter registration activity on state government property would cause employees for partisan political purposes or allow them to use their official authority for the purpose of interfering with or affecting the result of the upcoming general election.

At no time is any state of illegal activity reported to his office. Voter registration in Texas is conducted primarily by mail. The majority of voter registration occurring in state agencies entails making available to employees a 20a, Subdivision 3, which instructs the head of any department of the state government, with the approval of its governing board, to "permit the officers and

employees under his control to become deputy registrars of voters and to register persons on any premises and facilities under his control during the regular office hours of the deputized officer or employee." I believe that any attempt to diminish voter participation in the electoral process is intolerable, and I strongly urge every citizen to exercise his or her right to vote.

Voters Can Use Split-Ticket Vote Procedure

Correction of an error in Texas rules for counting paper ballots by Election Judges if not followed could measurably affect the vote totals of voters choosing to vote a split-ticket in next Tuesday's election says local attorneys and Republican Party Chairman Jim Dillon. Under the correction to rules promulgated in the Texas Secretary of State's Handbook for Election Judges and Clerks using Paper Ballots, voters who vote a party ticket by marking boxes at the top of the ballot and then also vote individually for one or more candidates from other parties will be counted as voting for each candidate marked individually plus a vote for the nominees of the party where no opposing candidate has been marked. Before correction the Election Judge Handbook indicated that where a voter has voted for a party ticket and voted for several candidates from another party as well, that votes for the other party's candidates "may" be counted. The correction changed the word "may" to "must".

Dugas Brings Legislative Experience

ORANGE—Some people work their way through law school by waiting tables or washing dishes—or perhaps by pumping gasoline or jerking sodas. Orange's Louis Dugas, Jr. did it the hard way, by serving in the Texas Legislature. That was back in the late '50's when Louis was a few years younger, but not as young as he looked. Proceedings committee turned up some sizzling and shameful facts about the hippie movement in Washington during the 1950's and Louis says it was unlike any experience he has had before or since, even during his years as Orange County's chief prosecutor.

Owning land and property is a fundamental right of all Americans. The Veterans Land Board continues to assist Texas Veterans in purchasing property by offering low-interest, long-term loans.

The Veterans Land Program will loan up to \$20,000.00 less a 5% down payment creating a net loan of \$19,000.00. Effective August 1, 1984, the interest rate

charged to Veterans is 9.25%, payable on a monthly basis for a term of 30 years.

To qualify the Veteran must have served 90 consecutive days on active duty in the Army, Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard after Sept. 19, 1940 unless discharged earlier due to

service-connected disability; be a resident of Texas for 5 years immediately prior to applying for a loan, or entered the Armed Services as a resident of Texas; be a resident

To qualify the Veteran must have served 90 consecutive days on active duty in the Army,

Navy, Air Force, Marines, or Coast Guard after Sept. 16, 1940 unless discharged earlier due to service-connected disability; be a resident of Texas for five years immediately prior to applying for a loan, or entered the Armed Services as a resident of Texas; be a resident of

Texas at the time of application is made; have an honorable discharge from the Armed Services, and have not previously participated in the Veterans Land Program. The land must contain at least 10 net acres, excluding all public road or right-of-way being the minimum

width required by the County.

To request your application materials, a non-refundable fee of \$25.00 must be submitted to the Veterans Land Board. The application materials will then be mailed to the Veteran who will have 90 days to file a completed application for purchase of property.

Another program designed to assist Texas Veterans in purchasing their own home is the Veterans Housing Assistance Program (VHAP). This program, like the Veterans Land Program, provides long-term, low-interest loans up to \$20,000.00 and may be used in conjunction with a mortgage loan from

other, private lending institutions. There is no limit on the amount of acreage bought with a home, however, the VHAP cannot be used for the purchase of a mobile home. The house must be the primary residence of the Veteran-his homestead.

The VHAP and the Veterans Land Program are two different programs. The VHAP is available to those Veterans who have not used their eligibility for the Veterans Land Program. If you have questions or would like more information regarding the Veterans Land Board, contact a member of THE TYLER COUNTY BOARD OF REALTORS.

Thicket Notes 10th Year

The Big Thicket National Preserve invites the public to attend a ceremony commemorating its 10th anniversary and its recent designation as a unit of the Man and the Biosphere International Reserves.

This special event will be held on Saturday, November 10th at 11:00 a.m. at the Triple D Guest Ranch, Dr. Phillip Johnson of the John Gray Institute will deliver the keynote address. A brass ensemble from Lamar will offer musical selections and at 12:30 p.m. the guest ranch will serve a \$5.50 barbecue luncheon.

Beginning at 2:00 p.m., Preserve naturalists will conduct two-hour long guided nature walks into nearby units of the Preserve.

To reach the Triple D Guest Ranch, turn east off highway 69 onto a dirt road five miles north of Village Mills and three miles south of Warren. Follow the dirt road four miles to the ranch.

Big Thicket National Preserve was established by an act of Congress on October 11, 1974. The Act authorized 84,550 acres to be set aside to assure the preservation, conservation and protection of the natural, scenic, and recreational values of a portion of the area called Big Thicket.

The "Man in the Biosphere" program (MAB) was established as an international activity of UNESCO to develop within the natural and social sciences a basis for rational use and conservation of the resources of the biosphere, and for the improvement of the relationship between man and the environment; to predict the consequences of today's actions on tomorrow's world and, thereby, to increase man's ability to manage efficiently the natural resources of the biosphere.

Over 220 MAB sites have been designated internationally with approximately 38 of them in the U.S.A. Big Thicket National Preserve was added to the MAB system in December of 1981 and became one of 17 such areas under management by the National Park Service.
