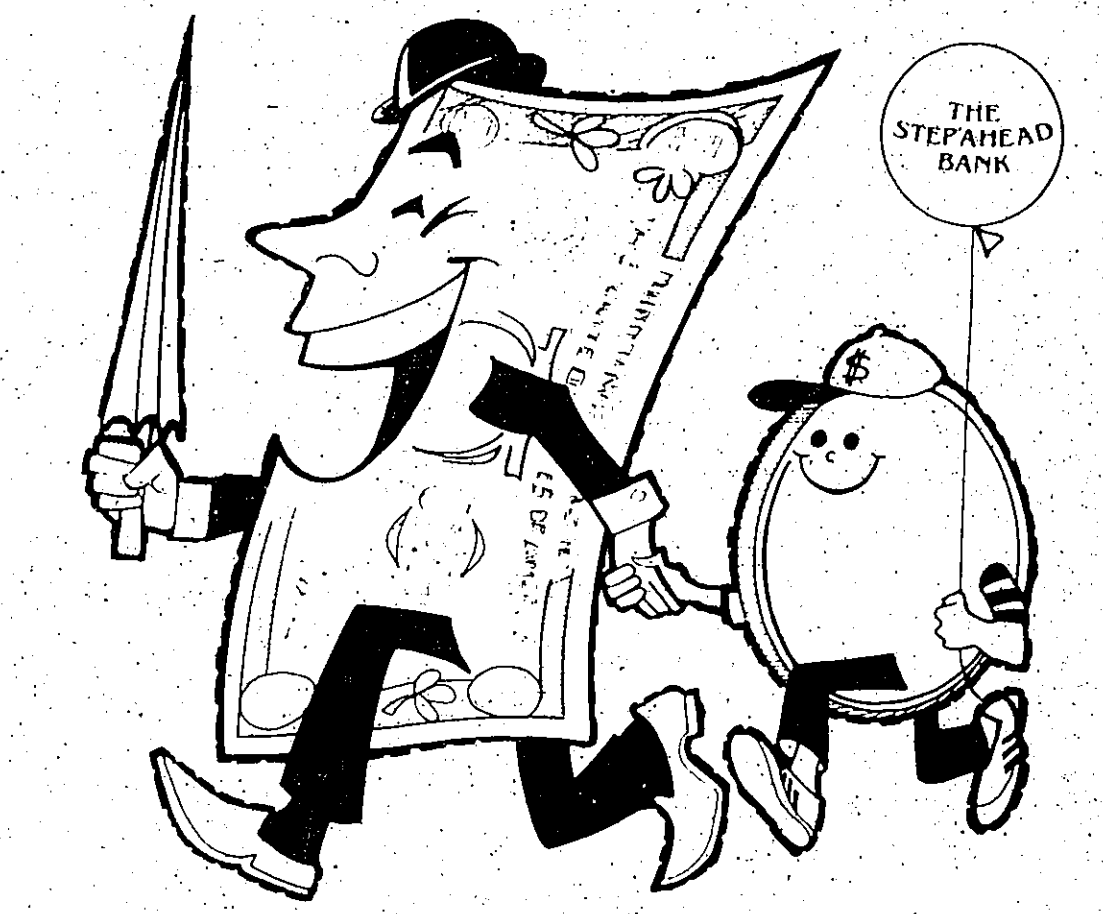

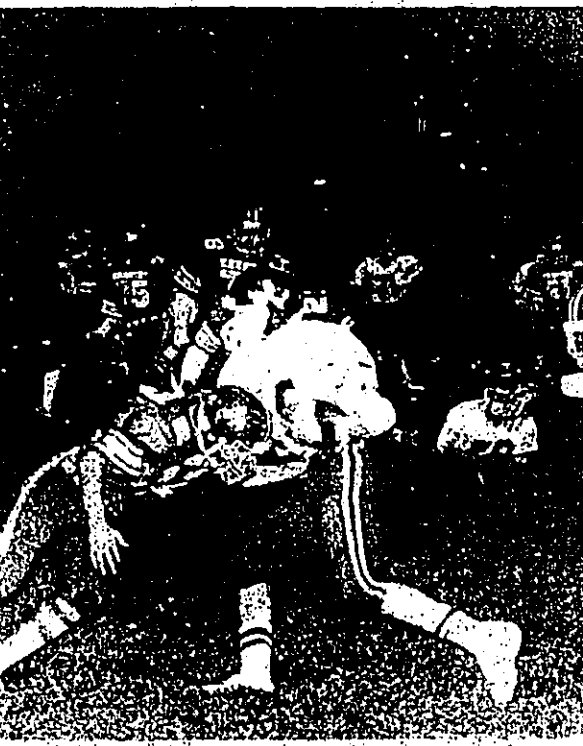

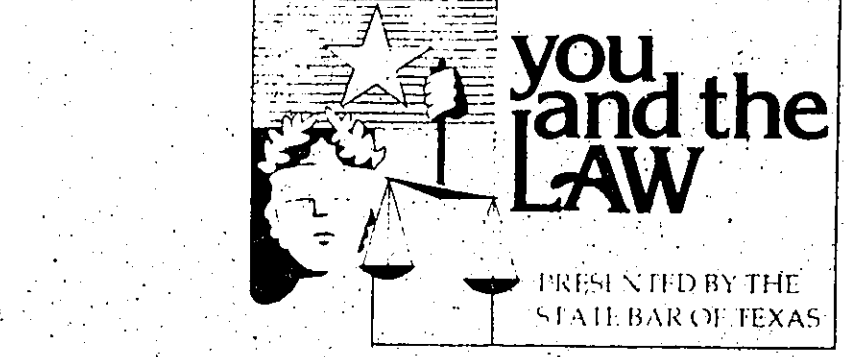

The national election of 1984 was decided by those who carry the lunch pails in this country. By an overwhelming margin, voters went to the polls and elected to support the premise that an expanding economy, and broader job opportunities were preferable to higher taxes that fuel the growth of federal spending.



The Reagan plurality, as evident all across the voting spectrum, with only two exceptions, the black and Jewish vote. The ethnic coalitions that were dominant in Democratic politics, the "labor" vote, the traditional Democrats that forged Franklin Roosevelt's victories in the '30s and '40s has all but disappeared.



The Republican resurgence after almost fifty years of a Democratic electorate is a result of voters' dissatisfaction with the federal government's policies. The choices in many cases will be difficult. Whatever we do is dependent on an economic economy, with affordable interest rates, and an expansion of foreign trade to handle the massive surplus in agricultural products, and not affiliated with either major party.

What we need at this time is a little Lyndon Johnson's "renewing together". It will be interesting to see if any of it comes to pass, if there really is a bi-partisan understanding of the job that needs to be done.

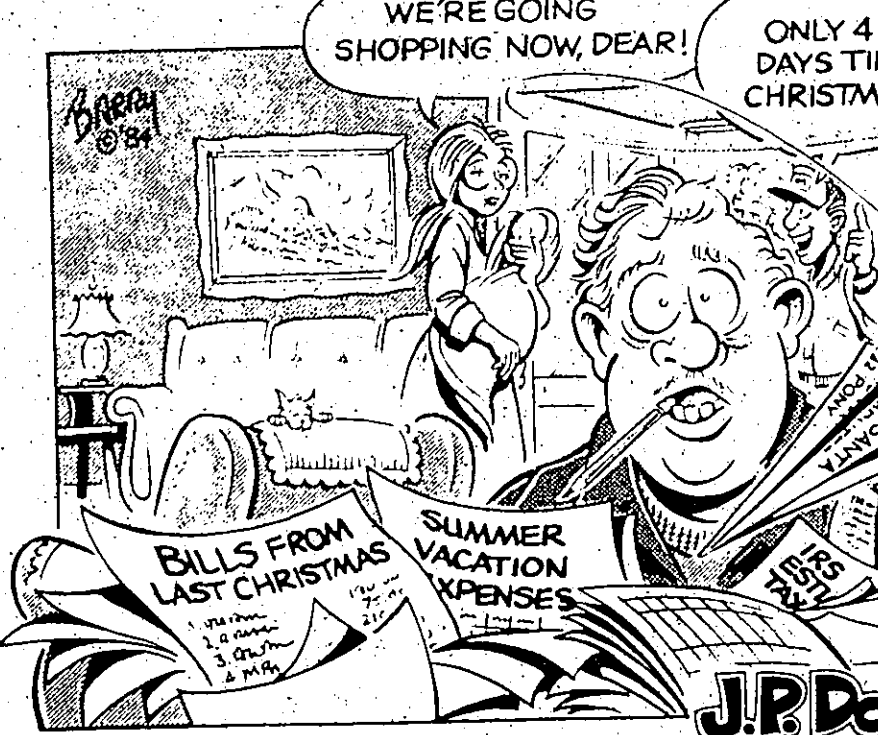
Letters To The Editor
