## Restaurant To Open Soon

"We are looking forward to being in Woodville; our product is First Class and we will be something that will be a real plus for Woodville," said Robert T. Jackson, legal representative for the Mississippi based Ward's Western, Inc. chain of fast-food restaurants, about locating the company's first Texas restaurant in Woodville.

Jackson described Ward's as "Similar to McDonald's, Burger King and Wendy's, but of course, a lot better. We are a sit-down restaurant serving hamburgers, hot dogs and chicken sandwiches. Ground-breaking will take place January 15, 1985 with opening about two months later." The Woodville Ward's location will be

off Hwy 190 south of Wal-Mart parking lot.

The new hamburger restaurant will be located adjacent to the new location of the Furniture Center. Both businesses are situated on property being developed by Harry Stafford, Josiah Wheat and Lloyd Fortenberry.

The Woodville location will be operated by the company using locally hired personnel which will be trained at the company's other locations. Ward's currently operates 40-45 restaurants in Mississippi and eastern Louisiana with leases for five new locations in Texas "in the Conroe area" due to be signed in January, says Jackson.

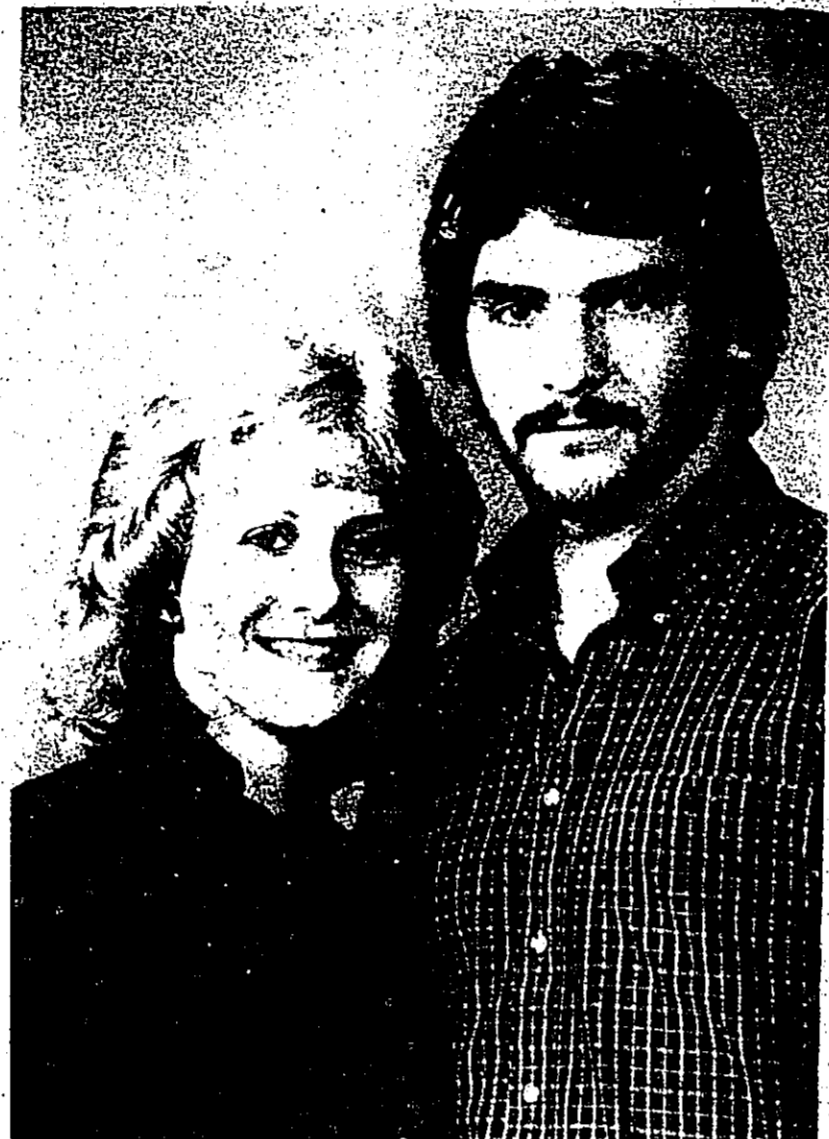

Open season was declared again this year on alligators. The closed season lasted some fifteen years and the hunting season lasts about seventeen days. They say it is against the law to sell gator meat in Texas but over in the neighboring state of Louisiana it sells for around five dollars a pound. A ten foot alligator will weigh somewhere around two hundred and fifty pounds. A good gator hunter can make up to six thousand dollars during the short season. The hides bring between eighteen and twenty dollars a linear foot. Alligators average from seven to twelve feet long. But some are bigger. After the hard freeze last winter a big bull gator was found near Port O'Conner, Texas that measured just over sixteen feet. These big creatures will attack a man but not me as I won't give them a chance. **Texas Christmas Trees: Fresher And Less Costly**

This year don't settle for just any type of Christmas tree. Instead make sure it's a genuine Texas-grown Christmas tree. Texas-grown Christmas trees should be available in most areas of the state this year. Says Dr. Mike Walterscheidt, forester with the Texas Agricultural Extension Service, Texas A&M University System. "Although most are grown in eastern counties, consumers should find them in retail lots throughout the state. Texas-grown Christmas trees offer a number of advantages. They are fresher, more durable and usually less expensive than those shipped in from other states. Most are cut while those shipped in from northern states are cut in October. More than four million Christmas trees are sold in Texas each year, imported mainly from northern and western states. Nearly 300,000 Texas-grown trees should be available this year and should push sales beyond the \$3 million mark. Texas currently boasts about 3,200 acres of Christmas trees, with some 1,000 trees per acre. Most of these are "choose-and-cut" operations in which the shopper selects the tree, cuts it and takes it home. These are popular, says the forester, because they restore the old-fashioned idea of making the selection of a Christmas tree an outing the entire family can enjoy. Anyone interested in a Texas-grown Christmas tree can contact their county Extension agent for a listing of tree farms, adds the forester.

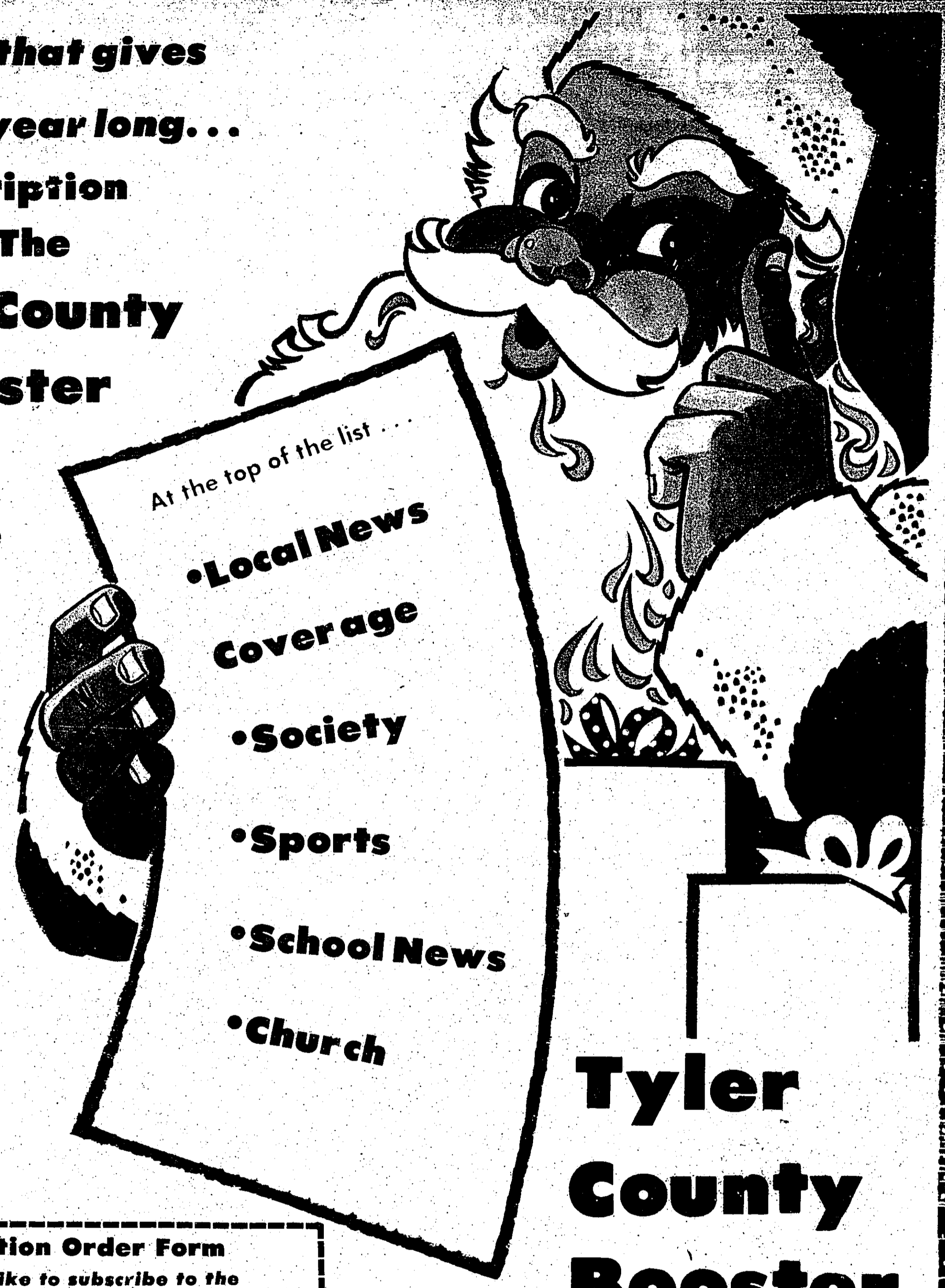

Sometime in the not too distant future, we may be getting a "Dear John" letter from the folks in Washington who write the tax laws.

Some of us remember the original "Dear John" letter. It arrived for most of us at some time when we were in the service, and the love of our life that we had courted before joining up had written to tell us she had married the pimply-faced soda jerk at the drugstore.

In this case, the "Dear John" will come in the form of a re-write of present federal tax law. On the face of it, we will all be told that our individual tax rates will be lower. Something about simplifying the present tax code so that all of us give our fair share and not a penny-weight more.

But there is a hitch or two in there somewhere. You see, some deductions we had always counted on may no longer exist. If we own more than one home, only one can qualify for mortgage interest deduction. That will be tough for folks with condominiums in Old Mexico or Padre Island.

We may not be able to deduct for state sales taxes. And that may be a little more painful than in years past, because while Washington, DC is picking our pockets, don't forget that the Texas legislature will be trying to find more money too, and it will probably arrive as an increase in the sales tax.

Why this all of a sudden interest in federal taxes? Didn't we hear from the Republicans that they were going to raise taxes only as a last resort?

Believe us, we are at the last resort. So with apologies to Mr. Mondale, maybe if he had said "last resort" instead of "right off the bat", the polling might have been slightly different last November.

We would assume the Coast Guard and the Navy are having better luck capturing drug smugglers in the Caribbean, if we compared their success rate with trapping taxpayers with funny tax shelters.

We will also hear about squeezing the \$450 hammers out of the defense budget. But we would have to guess maybe not too much screaming from us Texans. You see, the US Navy wants to station a new battleship group somewhere on the Gulf Coast, and it would not be in our best interests to yell at the Defense Department for their frivolous spending, if there was a battleship group to be corralled that would put cuddly little sailor boys on the beachfront of Galveston and the lined parlors of downtown Houston.

Believe us when we say there are things in that new tax proposal you aren't going to like. And that chocolate covered pill will taste as quinine when you bite into it.

We have been postponing any real job on the problem for so long, it is probably pretty easy just to bury it in subcommittee and worry about starvation in North Africa in the meantime. Or how many communists there are on Mindanao in the Philippines.

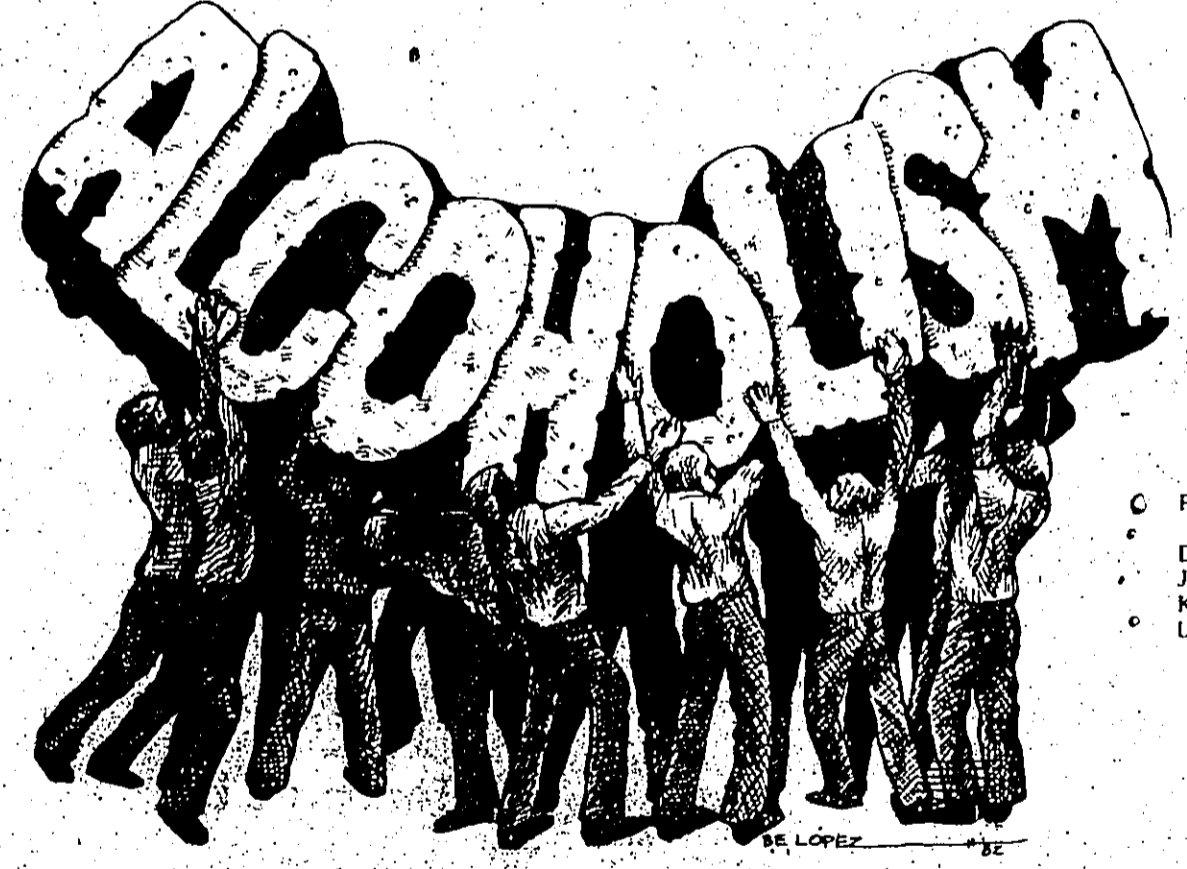
