Christmas Sugar Cookies
 2 cups sifted all purpose flour
 1 teaspoon baking powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 cup shortening
 1 cup Imperial Granulated Sugar
 1 egg
 1/4 cup milk
 1/2 teaspoon lemon extract
 Sift together flour, baking powder and salt; set aside. In a mixing bowl blend the shortening

and Imperial Granulated Sugar and mix in the eggs. Add dry ingredients alternately with milk and lemon extract and blend thoroughly. Chill dough overnight. Preheat oven to 400 degrees F. Roll dough to 1/4" thickness on floured pastry cloth. Cut out shapes with knife or cookie cutters. Transfer to greased cookie sheet and bake 7 to 10 minutes. Yields about 4 dozen cookies.

Decorating and Icing
 3 1/2 cups Imperial 10X Powdered Sugar (1-lb. carton)
 4 tablespoons milk (approx.)
 Food coloring

Combine Imperial 10X Powdered Sugar with milk; stir until smooth. Add more milk, 1 teaspoon at a time, to achieve desired spreading consistency. Divide icing into several small bowls and tint with several drops of food coloring. Trim with colored decorator sprinkles, cinnamon red hots and candies.

Representing former Warren Teacher James Wolf, TSTA lawyers filed a lawsuit in federal District Court last Thursday charging Warren School Trustees and Warren Superintendent Adolph Hryhorchuk with breach of contract and racial discrimination. Wolf, alleges that even though he did not meet certain Texas Education standards for teacher certification, Warren Superintendent Adolph Hryhorchuk promised Wolf he could retain his job as coach and detention center teacher

and resume a regular teaching assignment when certified. In addition, Wolf alleges Warren District replaced him, the districts only black teacher, with white teachers who also lacked TEA certification according to TSTA Uniserve Representative Pat Morahan. The other TSTA grievances to be discussed by Warren Trustees are promised reimbursement for certification expenses of Warren teacher Bonnie Burrows and TSTA as well as parent complaints about the school day length and bus schedule at Fred Elementary School. Woodville School District Management Discipline Management policy as required by recently passed state legislation.

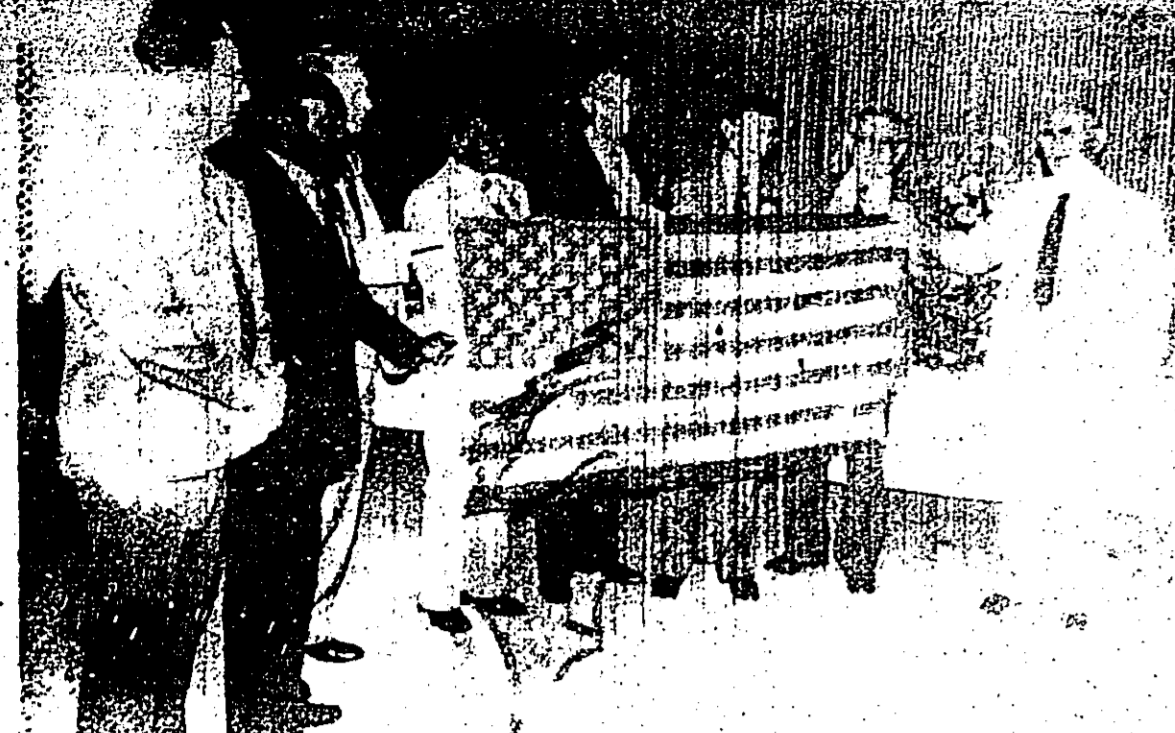

THE CHRISTMAS TREE

How did it all begin? No one really knows, though the custom of having Christmas trees certainly comes from Germany. At one time 'Adam and Eve Day' was celebrated on December 24. They decorated a tree, known as the Paradise Tree, with apples and fruit. And they acted the story of the Garden of Eden and how, in the beginning, the world was spoiled.

A legend links the Christmas tree with St. Boniface of Crediton, who left England to bring the good news about Jesus to the tribes of Germany. One dark night he and his monks came upon a group of villagers preparing to sacrifice a boy to their god, Odin. They had tied him to an oak tree. Boniface set the boy free and chopped the oak tree down. He pointed instead to an evergreen fir and his followers stepped forward and put their candles on its branches. By its light, the people listened as Boniface told them of a loving God who had brought life and light to the world through his son.

Some say it was Martin Luther, the great sixteenth-century reformer, who first brought the lighted Christmas tree indoors. As he walked through the forest one night he looked up to see the stars shining through the branches. It was so beautiful he went home to tell his children how the lighted tree was like a picture of Jesus, who left the starry heaven to bring light to earth.
