Gov. Shivers Dead At 77

Gov. Allan Shivers, who came to office in 1947 and served until his death in July of 1956, died Monday of a heart attack in Austin, Texas.

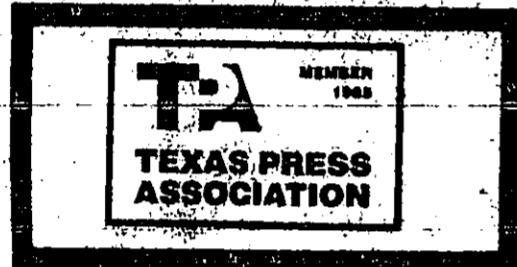
Shivers was born in Tyler, Texas, in 1909. He attended the University of Texas and served in the military during World War II. He was elected Governor in 1947 and served two terms until 1956.

During his tenure, Shivers was known for his efforts in expanding state education, mental health services, and state roads. He was also a strong supporter of the Texas State Cemetery in Austin.

Shivers is survived by his wife, Maryalice, and several children. He was a member of the First Baptist Church of Woodville and the Tyler County Chamber of Commerce.

Funeral services will be held Wednesday afternoon at 2 at the First Baptist Church of Austin. Burial will follow at the Texas State Cemetery in Austin.

Shivers was one of the early owners of the Tyler County Booster.

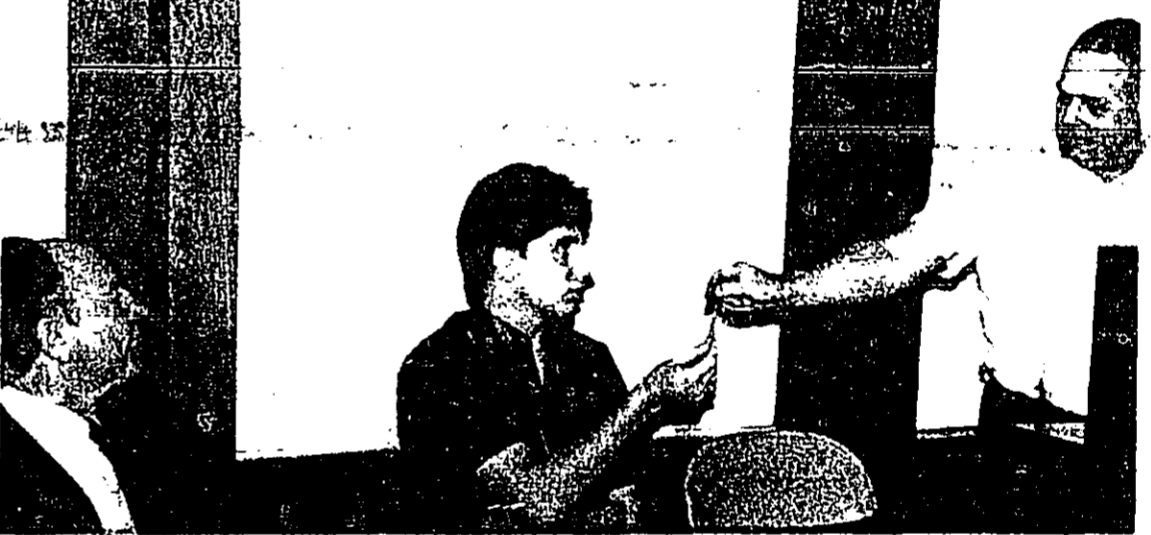

Chief Ray To Retire

Woodville City Police Chief for six years Grady Ray announced his retirement to take effect April 1, at Monday night's City Council meeting. In a letter read by Mayor John Gillchrist, Ray listed personal reasons for leaving the police chief's job.

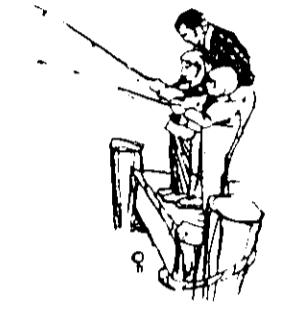

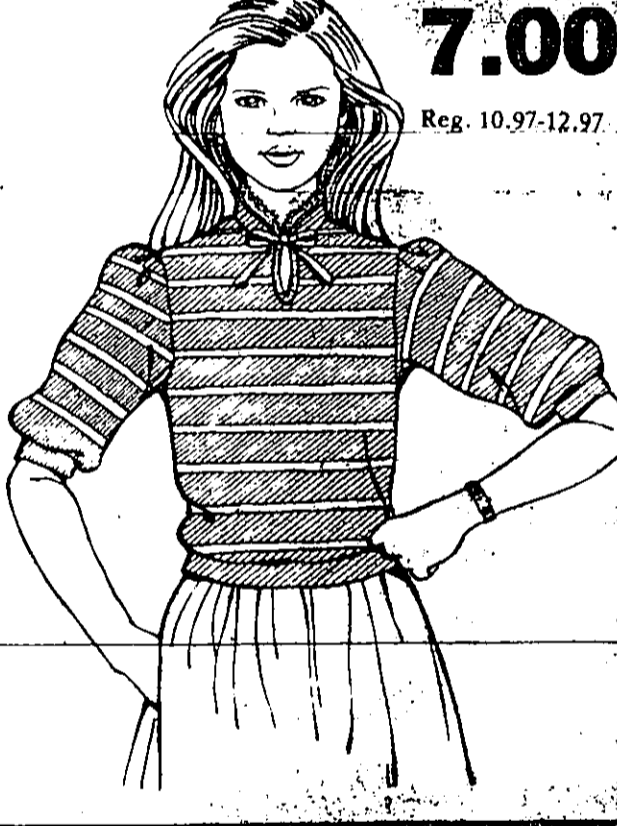

Energy Saving LANDSCAPING

Plan Your Landscape Before You Build
Pioneer farmers who planted an oak tree on the south side of the farmhouse and rows of evergreens to the north and west had a good reason for landscaping principles. The oak tree shaded the house in summer, the evergreens blocked harsh winter winds and helped funnel summer breezes toward the house.
