Leonard S. Patillo, the executive vice president and General Manager of the Houston Chamber of Commerce, was the special guest speaker.

The banquet honored the Chamber business members. It also featured the installation of the new elected officers of the Chamber of Commerce.

Alva Cook was acknowledged for his outstanding work in the community Thursday night. Cook, Woodville's Outstanding Citizen

of 1984, became a member of the Volunteer Fire Department of Woodville in 1970. He became the fire department chief in 1978. In April of 1979, he was elected to the Woodville Independent School Board. Cook was chosen by the members of the school board as President in 1981. When Cook is not concentrating on the school board by the fire department, he can be found performing one of his many "good" deeds for strangers, neighbors, friends and the community.

Leonard S. Patillo, the special guest speaker at this year's annual banquet, has been in organization management since 1946. He is the organization's Chief Administrative officer and is responsible for the day-to-day staff and program operations of the 6,000 member Chamber

of Commerce.

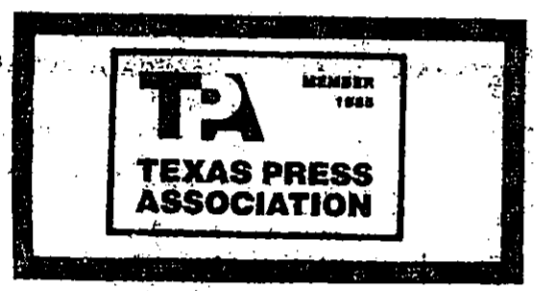

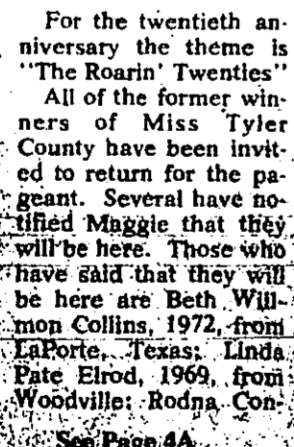

Court Hires Jail Consultant

Commissioner's Court Friday approved hiring Bond Consultant George E. Cooper and the firm of Schneider, Bernet and Hickman, Inc. of Longview, Texas, in consulting with the county and the County Jail Committee on financing expenses for a possible new county jail.

Cooper formerly advised the Spurger School District on financing of new school buildings completed last fall.

Cooper, speaking to Commissioner's and Jail Committee member's at Friday's meeting, advised Commissioner's on its many

advantages and disadvantages of either holding a bond election or the "more economical and timely action" of issuing certificates of obligation. Cooper's firm will either handle the sale of bonds for the county or purchase the certificates of obligation.

In other business, Commissioner's approved a resolution memorializing former Texas Governor and childhood county resident, Allan Shivers, and approved a report of the County's Texas Sesquicentennial Committee on its many

plans for the county's celebration of the 150th Birthday of the Independence of Texas from Mexico in 1886.

Commissioner approved the paying of Pct. #3 Commissioner December bills with the

exception of several "unsigned" bills left from former Commissioner Pct. #3 Jerry Mahan's term which ended in December. Current

Among Patty's interests are collections of antique jewelry, horses and birds. She is also into physical fitness and recently received a trophy for finishing first in a 5 mile run. Patty

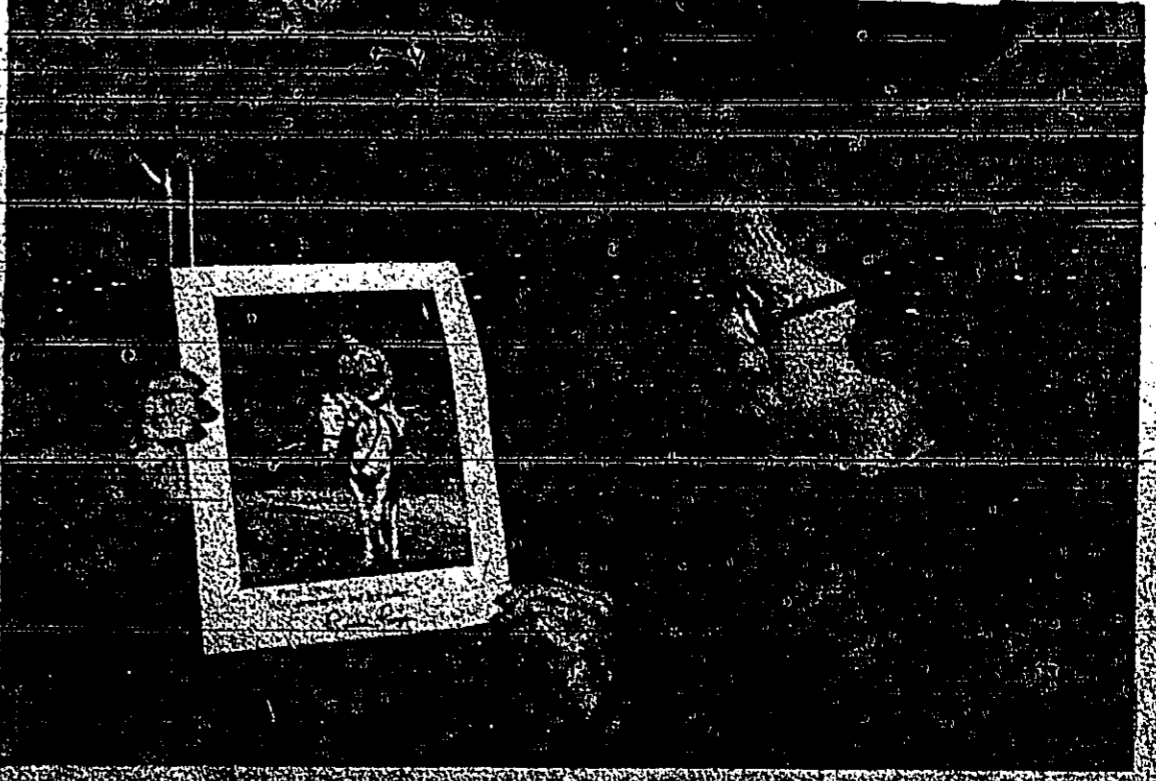

The GOLDEN YEARS

One of the many myths about aging is that older people are so much alike in their ideas and habits, in fact, the opposite is true. According to Dr. Robert Butler, a psychiatrist and former head of the National Institute on Aging, we are most alike when we are infants. Our lifetime experiences make us more and more dissimilar as we get older.

There was good reason for scholars to visit 82-year-old Tevfik Evcen in a remote Turkish village. They went to hear him speak the language known as Ouhukh, a tongue once spoken by as many as 50,000 tribesmen in the Caucasus valleys. Tevfik flew to Europe several times to record the words and folk tales of the colorful language. He composed the epitaph for his gravestone. "He was the last person able to speak the language they called Ouhukh."

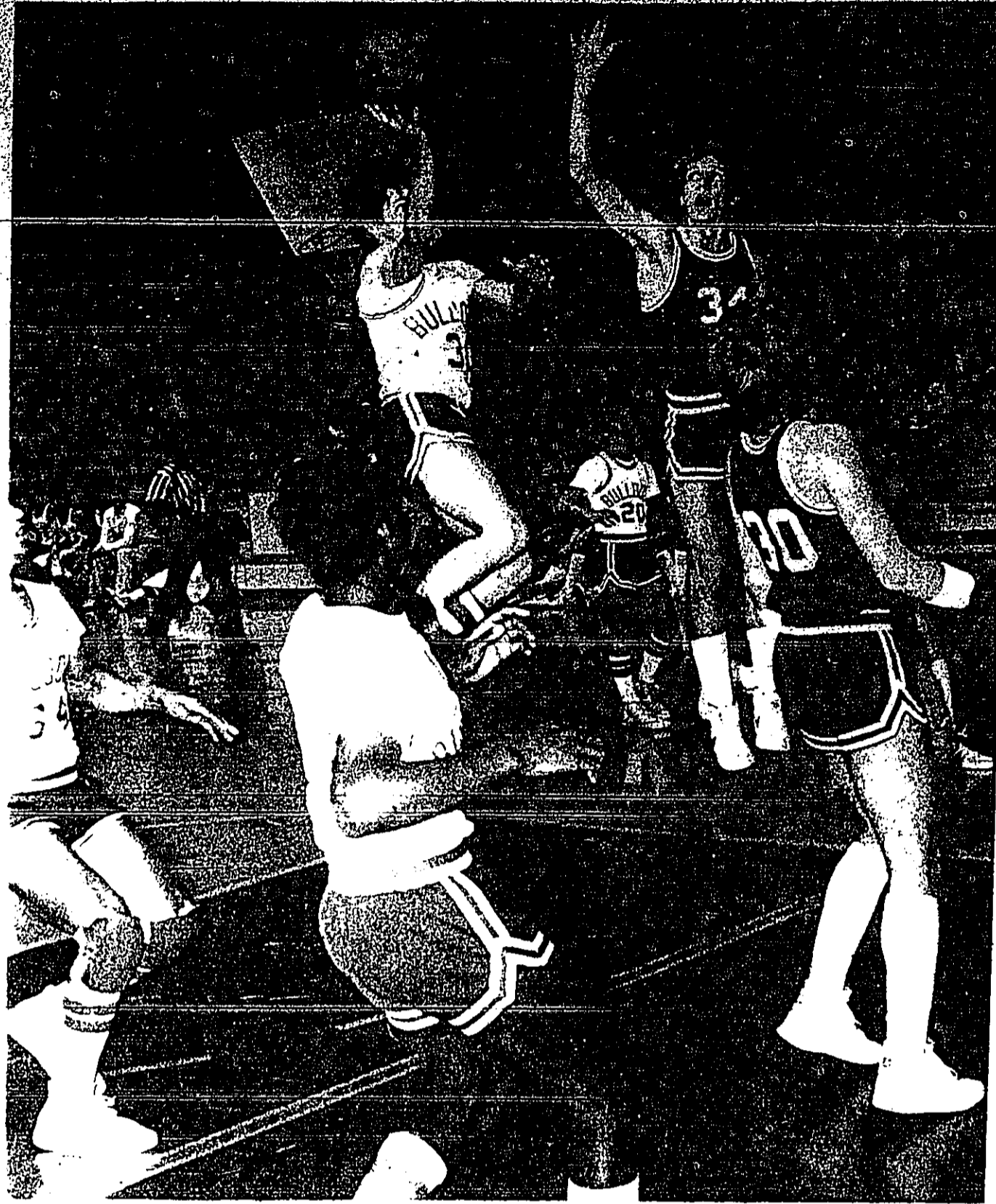
