

The most widely believed and

plausible theory for the holiday traces its origin back to the Roman festival Lupercalia, a feast held in February in honor of the pastoral god Lupercus. During the Lupercalia, in honor of the goddess Juno Februata, names of young women were put in a box. Each young man then drew a name and for the next year the couple was considered a match.

Where the Christians came into power, they adapted the holiday and customs to their own creed. Instead of names of saints were drawn and the young people were challenged to emulate the virtues of whichever saint they

panied St. Valentine's Day.

In France, according to documentation written in 1698, it had become custom for both sexes to draw names from Valentine boxes. Young British ladies believed they could conjure up their future spouses by going to the graveyard on St. Valentine's Eve at midnight. Once there they would sing a prescribed chant and run around the church twelve times. It was hoped that when they returned home, they would see their true love

following.

In Sicily, young girls would stand at their windows for half an hour before subtries. If no one passed by, they believed they would not marry that year.

Valentine cards, with poetic or amorous addresses, also have a long history. In 1415, records indicate, a Charles Ducd'Orleans, confined to the Tower of London, sent his wife rhymed love letters. They were considered

"early!" valentines.

Valentines probably came to this country with the earliest English settlers.

John Winthrop, Governor of the Massachusetts Bay Colony settled in 1630, started a letter to his wife before leaving for America. It read: "February 14, 1629. Thou must be my valentine.

All of the early valentines were decorated and lettered by hand. Most were adorned with lace and ribbon.
