

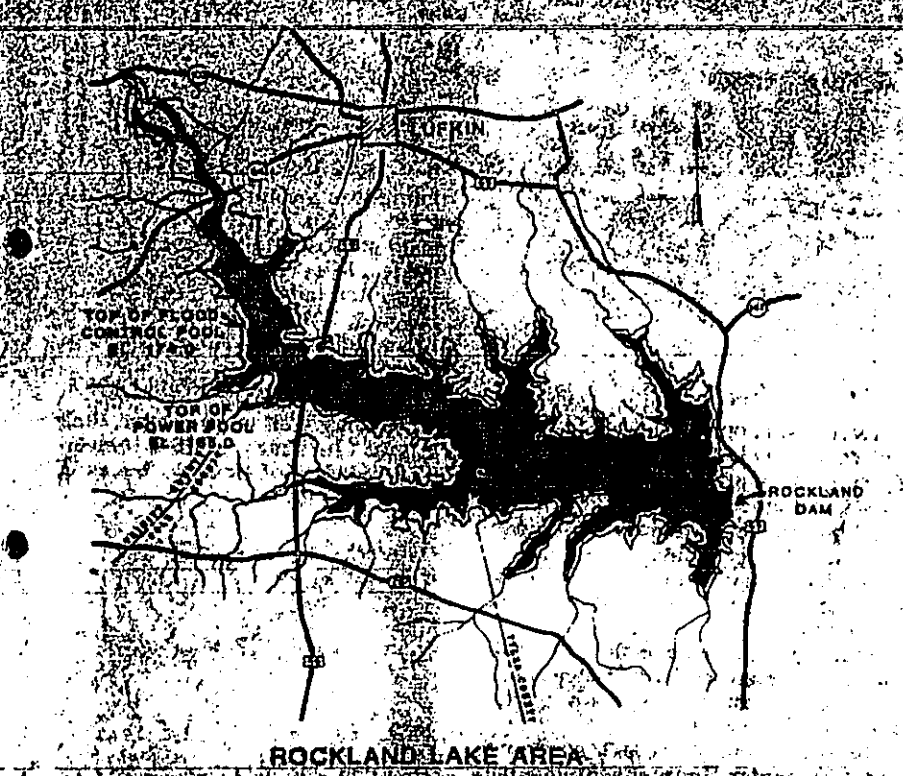



Save The Battleship Campaign Underway

HOUSTON, Texas — The Battleship Texas, which survived action in two world wars, is now being restored to its former glory. The Battleship Texas is the state's most cherished historical landmark, and its restoration is a project of national significance.

The Battleship Texas is a 16-inch gun battleship that served in the United States Navy from 1914 to 1948. It is the only battleship in the world that has survived in its original configuration. The ship is currently on display at the Battleship Texas Museum in Houston, Texas.

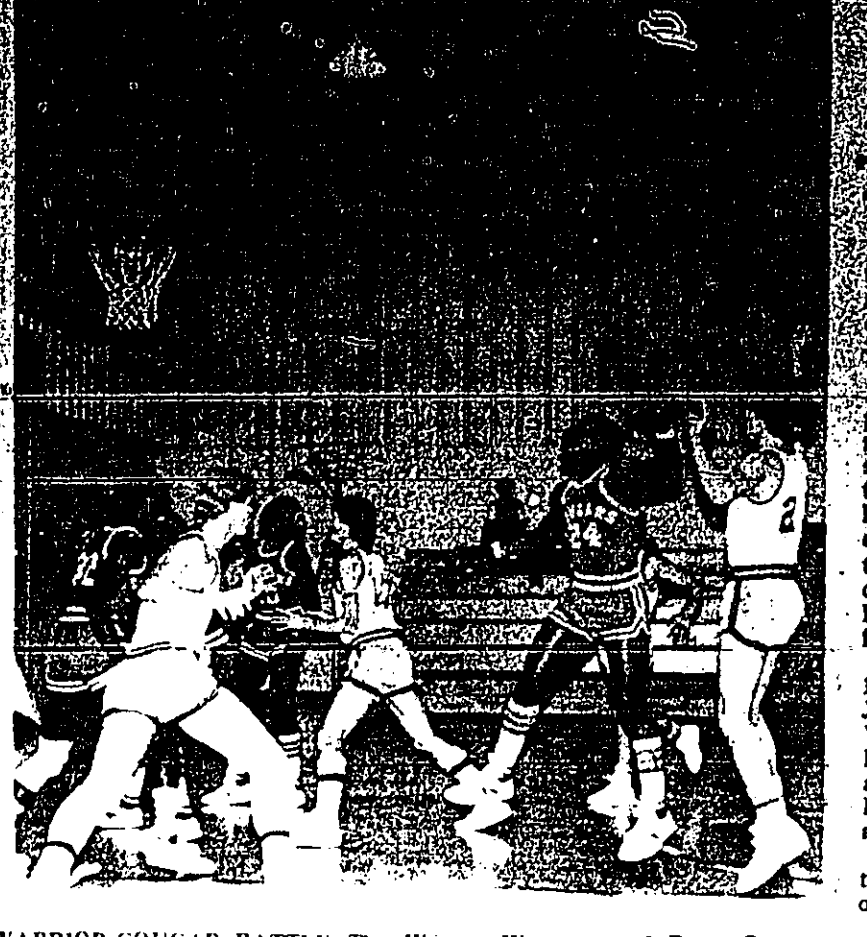

An idiot thought came to my mind, and I wonder if they know this is an polluting the city of New Orleans water system.

After what seems like fifteen minutes, the hydrants are turned off, the fire trucks disappear and the Captain is back on the horn manhandling about sump pumps, too much fuel and now we are ready to leave for Washington, DC.

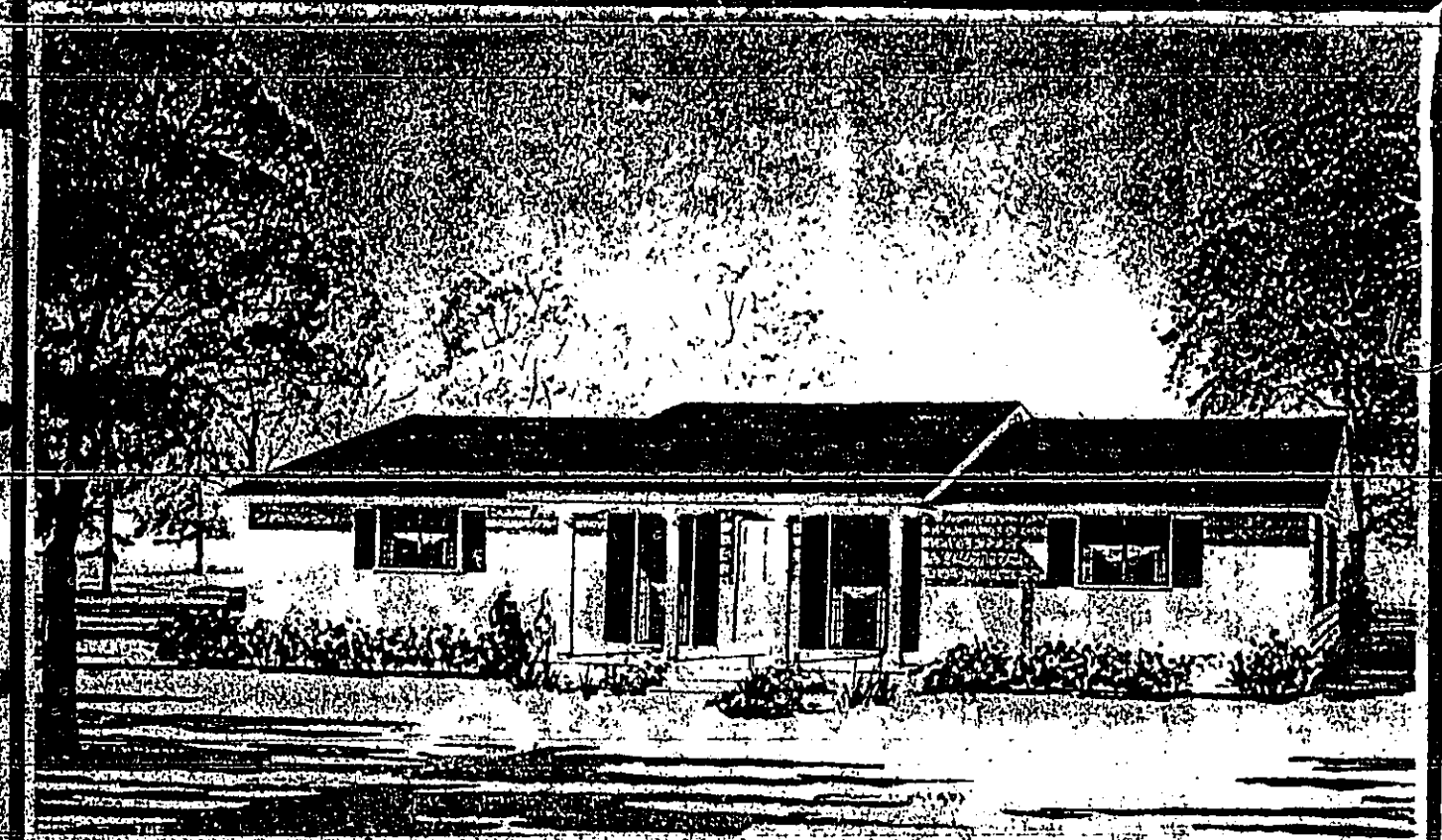

Buy Wool Clothes Now Says Texas A & M Consumer Specialist

The combination of unusually cold weather and traditional winter sales have made this an excellent time to buy wool clothes, says a Texas A&M University consumer information specialist.

"Often when you buy wool items on sale in south Texas, you can look forward to months of storing them in a closet until winter sets in again," says Beverly Rhoades. But this year looks like it will provide a longer wearing season, she adds.

Wool fashions are an investment in quality and long life. Rhoades says, "Remanufactured from items used before and is usually of lower quality than reprocessed wool. It is often used in suits."

Wool is often blended with other fibers to produce fabrics which cost less than pure wool or to enhance care, appearance or wearability features for a particular type of clothing. Rhoades says, "But if a garment contains at least 50 percent wool fibers, it will behave much like pure wool, she adds."

While consumers are out looking for bargains at the winter sales, they could be contributing to the Texas wool industry, Rhoades observes. Texas is the number one wool producing state and it provides almost 50 percent of the nation's fine grade wool. According to the specialist, the \$120 million dollar industry also employs about 10,000 Texas in fiber production, warehousing and some processing.

Sign Up Now For 1985 Programs

In an effort to control excess crop supplies and meet demand, the Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, on October 15th, began accepting applications for the 1985 feed grain, wheat, cotton and rice acreage reduction programs. The sign up period ends March 31st. Farmers who meet the requirements will be eligible to receive price support loans and target price protection, in addition to land diversion payments on wheat, upland cotton and rice, according to county ASCS official Kathy O. Lowe.

"By reducing planted acreage and production, farmers minimize the excess supply situations and low prices, and also maintain a level of stocks in line with market demand," Mrs. Lowe said.

The 1985 commodity programs call for a 35 percent reduction in rice, a 30 percent reduction in wheat and upland cotton, and a 10 percent reduction in feed grain, wheat, cotton and rice acreage reduction programs. The sign up period ends March 31st. Farmers who meet the requirements will be eligible to receive price support loans and target price protection, in addition to land diversion payments on wheat, upland cotton and rice, according to county ASCS official Kathy O. Lowe.

"By reducing planted acreage and production, farmers minimize the excess supply situations and low prices, and also maintain a level of stocks in line with market demand," Mrs. Lowe said.
