Post Office Seeks Eligibles

The Woodville, Texas Post Office will accept applications Feb. 11, 1985 through Feb. 22, 1985 and examinations will be given to establish a register of eligibles from which future clerk and carrier vacancies in the local Post Office will be filled.

No experience is required. All applicants will be required to take a written examination designed to test aptitude for learning and performing the duties of the position.

The general age requirement is 18 years or 16 years for high school graduates, except for those for whom age limits are waived. In general, there is no maximum age limit. All applicants must be citizens of or owe allegiance to the United States of America. Non-citizens of the United States who have been accorded permanent resident alien status in the United States are also eligible for appointment.

Starting salary for substitute employees is \$9.20 per hour with increases to \$12.48 per hour. Beginning salary for regular employees is \$18,532 per year with increases to \$25,117 per year. Substitute and regular employees will be paid 10 percent extra for work performed between 6:00 p.m. and 4:00 a.m.

U. S. Postal Service jobs offer such fringe benefits as job security, paid vacations, on-the-job training, liberal retirement, sick leave with pay, free life insurance, low cost health insurance, cash for suggestions, promotional opportunities and paid holidays.

Interested persons may apply at the U. S. Post Office, All Post Offices in the 759 zip code area, before Feb. 22, 1985. All applicants will be notified by mail, of the date and place of examination.

County Go-Texan Reps Will Meet At Rodeo

HOUSTON—Stiff competition for Go Texan county representatives will take place during the opening weekend of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, Feb.

16-17. These Show events draw contestants from a 55-county Go Texas area and Tyler County will be one of this year's participants. Scheduled

for the 1985 Show are contests in bar-b-que cooking, whistling, fiddling, hay hauling, washer pitching and horseshoe

pitching. Entries in the 1985 Area Go Texan quilting contest, held the first time this year, will also be displayed and judged. held on Sunday, Feb. 17 in the Astro-

dome complex, these Go Texan events add even more flavor and excitement to the opening weekend.

Bar-b-que judging will be held in the northwest corner of the Astro-dome parking lot at 1:30 p.m. Whistling and fiddling contests will take place in the Super Sale Salon located in the Astrodome. The whistling contest begins at 1 p.m. and the fiddling contest follows. Another new event at the Show this year, the washer pitching contest, will be held at 1 p.m. in the main cattle arena.

Also in the main cattle arena on Sunday, Feb. 17, will be a horseshoe pitching contest beginning at 10 a.m. The hay hauling contest to be held in the Astrodome is scheduled for noon.

Judging in the quilting contest will be at 2 p.m. in the Super Sale Salon.

Many of the contest participants have already won championship honors at their county fairs, held to promote the area and further support the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo.

In the bar-b-que contest, the Area Go Texan cooks compete against teams from all over the world. Contestants must cook the meat over a woodburning fire with meat categories of beef, lamb, pork, poultry, rabbit, turkey or any combination.

Fiddling contestants must play two tunes, a waltz and a breakdown, while whistling contestants must whistle two contemporary songs.

In the washer pitching contest, each participating county will send a team of players, with each player pitching three washers. After each throw by opposing players, the washer that is closest to the cup scores one point, with the game played until a

team scores 21 points or more.

Horseshoe pitchers competing in the Area Go Texan contest must use regulation competition horseshoes and categories are scheduled for men, women, boys and girls.

In the hay hauling contest, the object is to load 42 bales of hay on a conventional pick-up truck, drive through an obstacle course and unload and stack the hay.

Entries in the Show's first quilting contest must be quilted by hand within the last two years. The three categories of quilts are applique, patchwork and pictorial.

County winners will be announced during a special performance of the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, with recognition given on the Astrodome scoreboard.

Additionally, Eastern Airlines is awarding free trips to top winners in each of the Area Go

Texan contests as an added incentive.

The performance scheduled to salute and recognize Tyler County's overall participation in the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo will be on Feb. 23 at 11:00 a.m.

The 1985 Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo begins Feb. 16 and runs through March 3.

Hightower On Law Committee

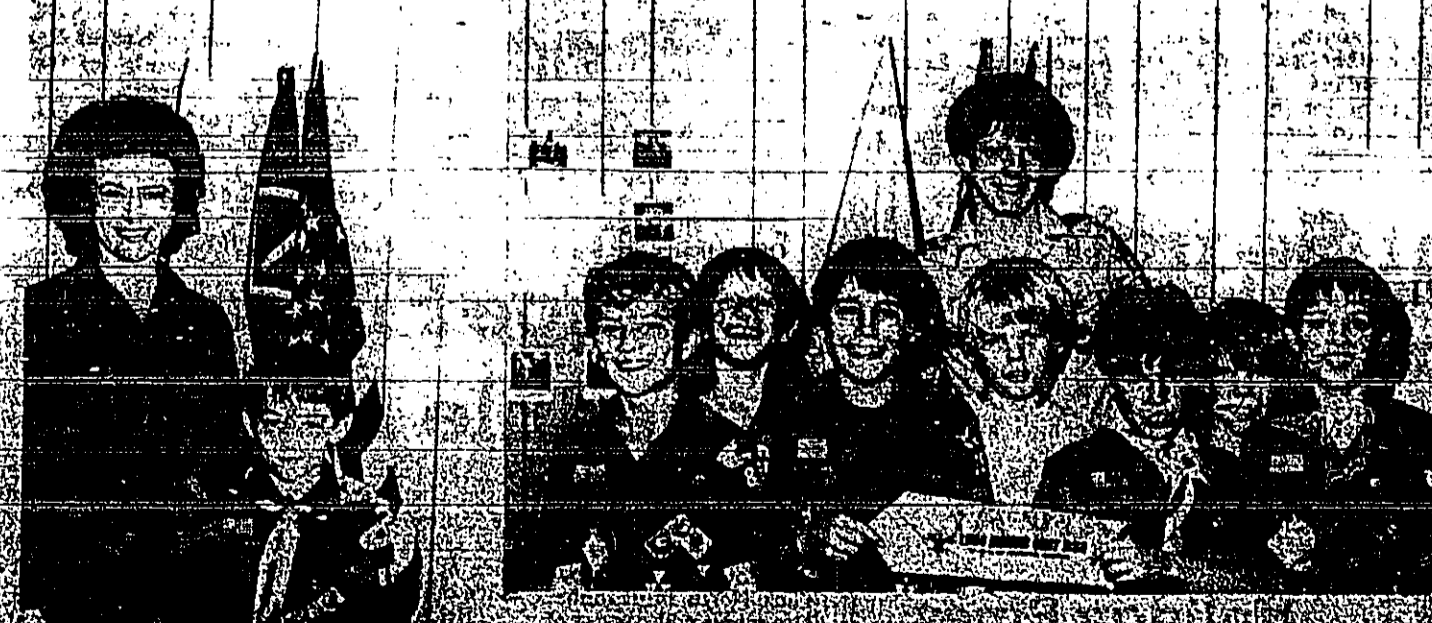
AUSTIN—Representative Allen Hightower (D-Huntsville) has been appointed by House Speaker (Gib) Lewis (D-Ft. Worth) to be Vice-Chairman of the Law Enforcement Committee.

This committee consists of nine members, with jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to (1) public safety and emergency preparedness, enforcement, and development; (2) incarceration and rehabilitation of convicted felons; (3) commitment and rehabilitation of youth; and (4) the following state agencies; the Texas Adult Probation Commission, the Texas Juvenile Probation Commission, the Commission on Law Enforcement Officer Standards and Education, the Department of Public Safety, the Texas Department of Corrections, the Polygraph Examiners Board, the Texas Board of Private Investigators and Private Security Agencies, the Crime Stoppers Advisory Council, the Texas Youth Commission, and the Texas Work-Furlough Program Advisory Board.

Hightower stated "I plan to take advantage of this position to work toward the needs and requests of my constituents. This is a great opportunity for me to have a major role

in how these particular Law Enforcement institutions can be improved and directed. I am looking forward to a challenging 69th Legislative session."

Representative Hightower was also appointed to be a standing member of the Environmental Affairs Committee. This committee consists of nine members, with jurisdiction over all matters pertaining to: (1) air and water pollution; (2) the creation, operation, and control of state parks; (3) the regulation and control of the propagation and preservation of wildlife and fish in the state; (4) hunting and fishing in the state, and the regulation and control thereof; (5) the development and regulation of the fish and oyster industries of the state; and (6) the following state agencies: The Texas Air Control Board, the Texas Coastal and Marine Council, the Texas Conservation Foundation, the Office of Gulf State Marine Fisheries Compact Commissioner for Texas, the Veterans Land Board, the School Land Board, the Parks and Wildlife Department, the Texas Low Level Radioactive Waste Disposal Authority, and the General Land Office.

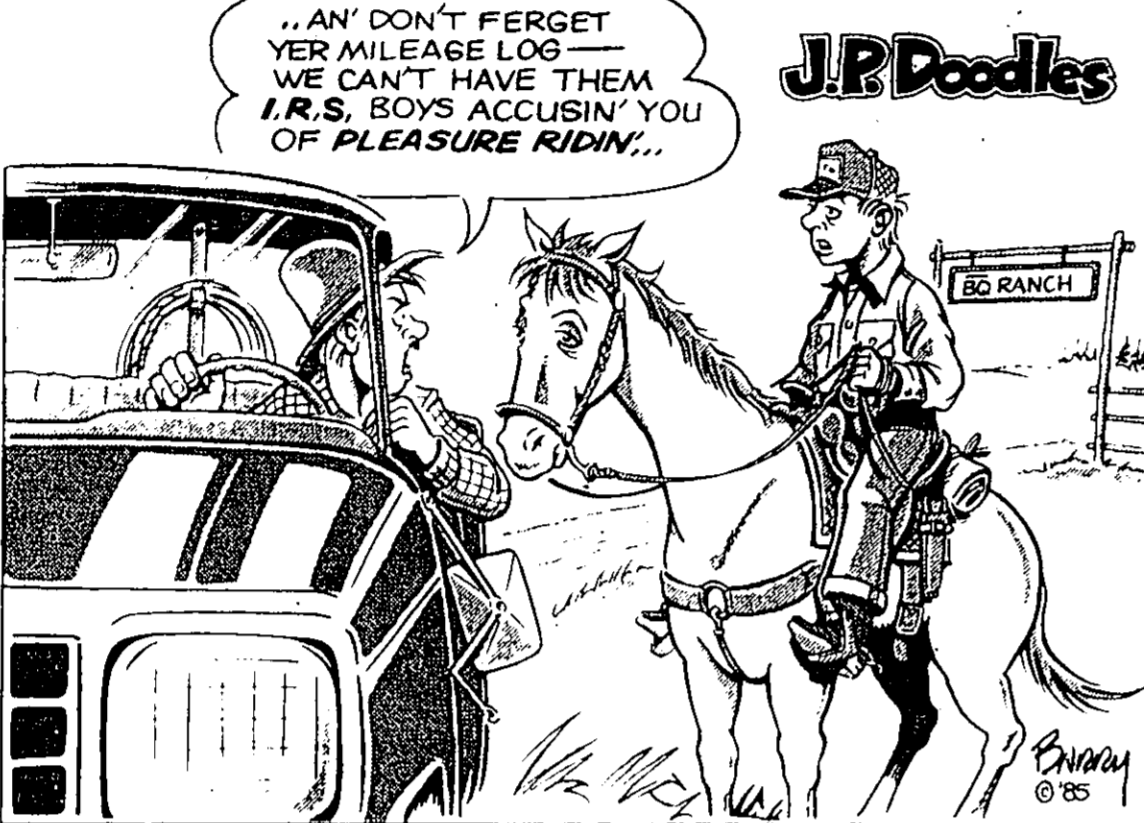

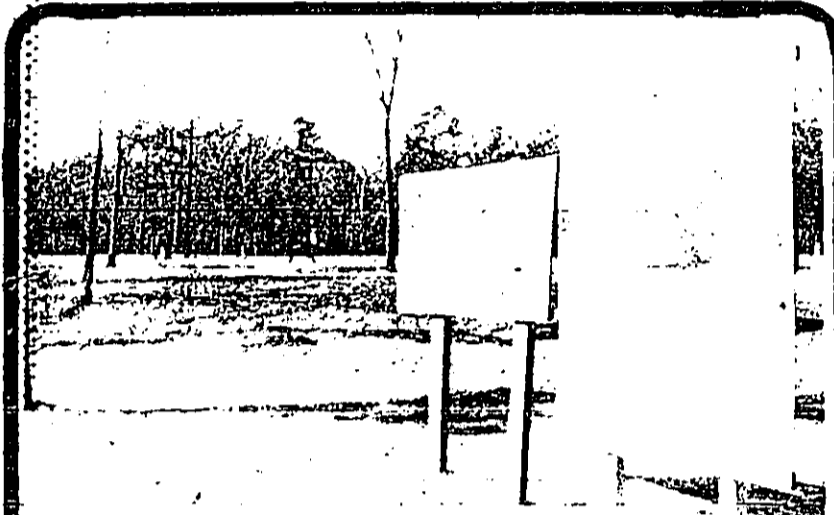

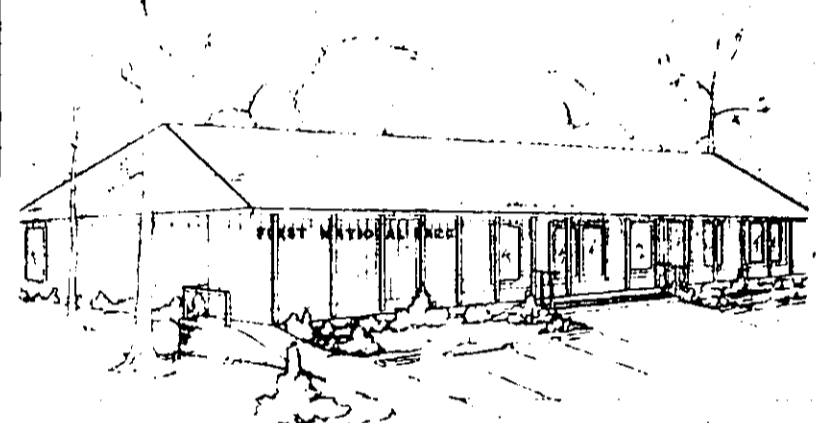
