





On the average, taxpayers aged 65 or older pay higher federal income taxes than their younger counterparts, according to a new report by the Internal Revenue Service. The IRS found that the elderly pay more dollars at higher rates

and with fewer itemized deductions. During the tax years studied, 1977 through 1981, the average adjusted gross income of taxpayers over 65 and of those under 65 was almost dentical, yet the effective tax rate for the older filers was 18.87 percent compared with 16.24 percent for those under 65. In 1981, when the gross income for each group averaged a little more than \$22,000, older persons paid an average of \$544 more in federal tax than younger

Thirteen senior citizens in Parsippany, N.J., gather twice a week to take part in an activity usually associated with younger people playing video games. It's part of a study by Fairleigh Dickinson University to determine whether the games could help improve the eye hand coordination of older patients who now take part in boring therapy exercises.
