Would it surprise you to know that come September, most of us may be trussed up in our automobile seats like a pig on a barbecue pig. Seat belt tightening is back, if we listen to the politicians currently writing the laws in Austin.

And if you think our elected are sincerely concerned about the lives to be saved if we all buckle up, be advised that pickups and four wheel drives are exempt.

Are you beginning to get the picture?

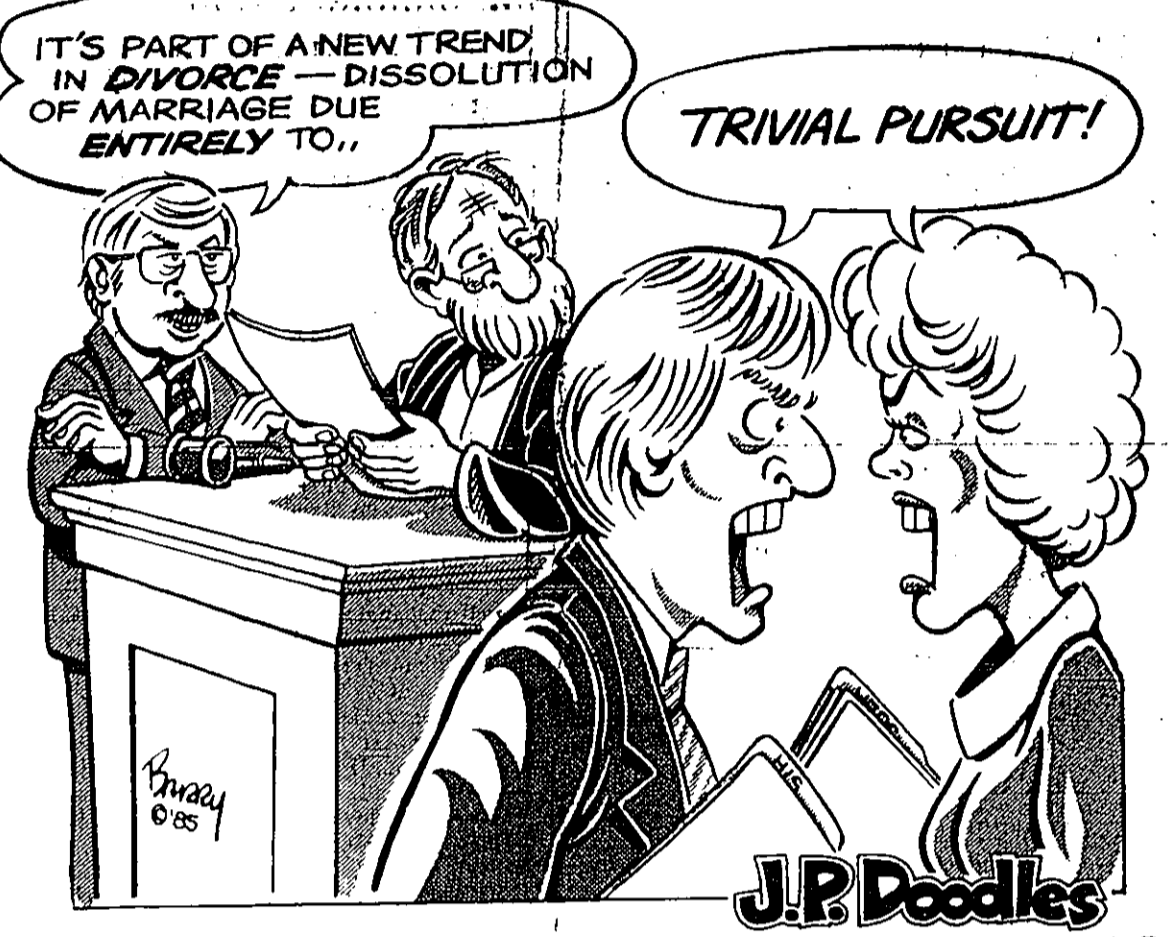

Commodities Info Given

Persons who did not receive U.S.D.A. commodities at all in 1984, but wish to apply to receive them in 1985, should come by the Tyler County Expanded Services Office in Tyler County located at 600 Elm Street in Woodville during the week of March 11th through March 15th. To complete the application, you will need to provide proof of identity by presenting your social security card, driver's license, or similar document. Proof of address will also be required. A voter's registration card driver's license, or utility bill would serve this purpose. Homebound persons must furnish a note of authorization from the individual who will be receiving the commodities for them. These forms can be obtained at the Tyler County Expanded Services Office. No foods will be distributed at this time of presentation. The actual date of commodity distribution will be announced at a later time. We urge you to take advantage of this pre-certification opportunity, as it will save you hours of waiting at the March distribution. It will not be necessary for anyone who received commodities at all in 1984 to pre-certify, as you already have a folder on file. Wheat Producers To Vote

Texas wheat producers will vote in April to decide if they want to expand the check-off territory from the existing 34 counties under the jurisdiction of the Texas Wheat Producers Board.

To learn more about the upcoming wheat referendum, producers in Tyler and surrounding counties will want to attend an informational meeting sponsored by the Texas Agricultural Extension Service on March 20 at Crockett, says Janie Marquis, county extension agent. The meeting will be at the Allied Trust National Bank conference room (back entrance) and will start at 10 a.m.

Producers will hear from an Extension economist regarding the current wheat situation, outlook and changing wheat production process in the state, says Marquis. Also, the mechanics and timing of the referendum voting process will be discussed, including recent changes in the commodity reference law.

Following these discussions, Texas Wheat Producers Board representatives will present information on the existing wheat check-off program and the potential outcome of a total state-wide effort, says Marquis. There will be ample time for questions from producers regarding the program.

For additional information, please contact the county Extension office, says Marquis.

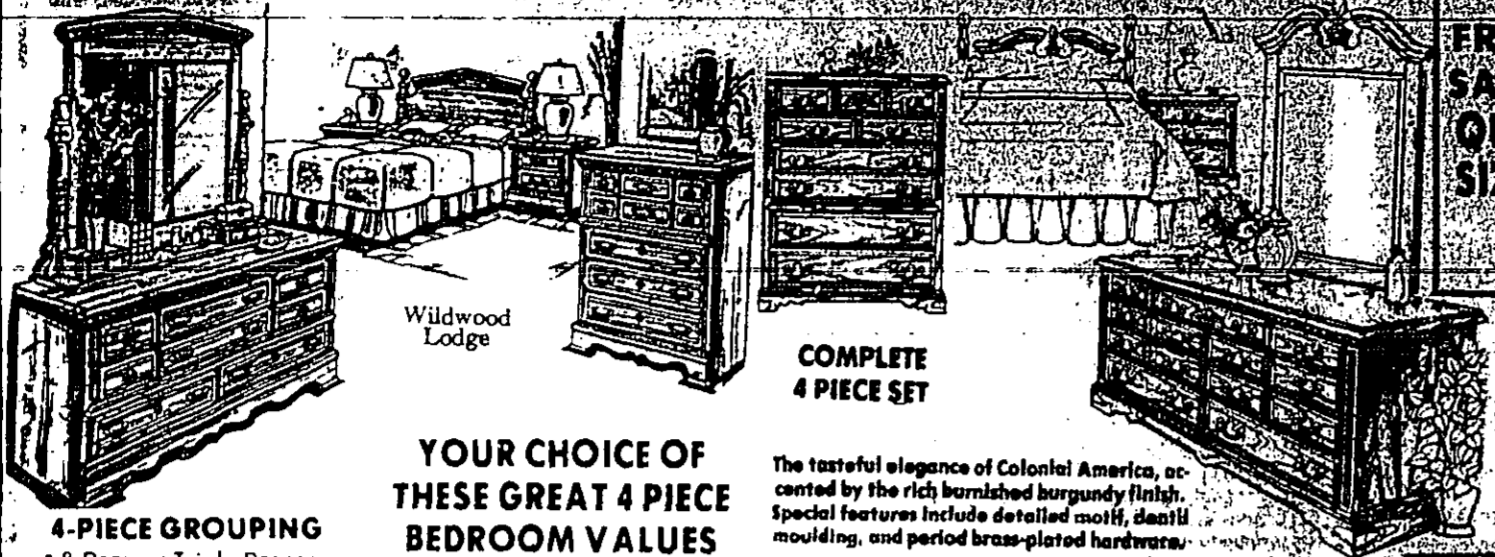

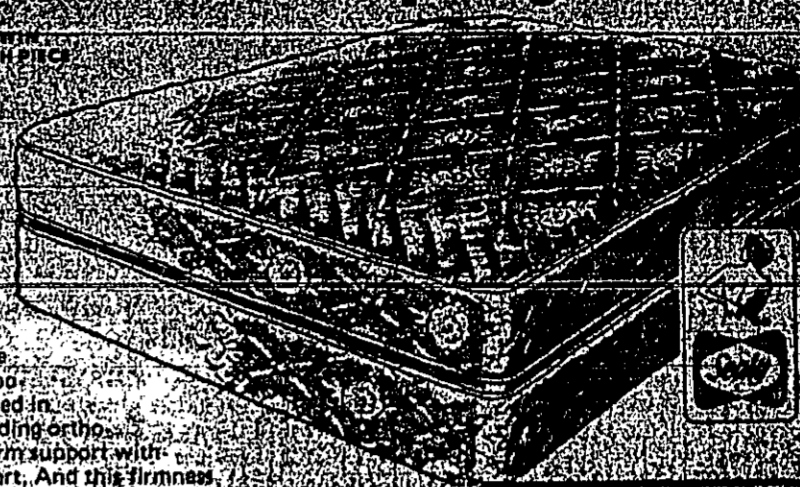
