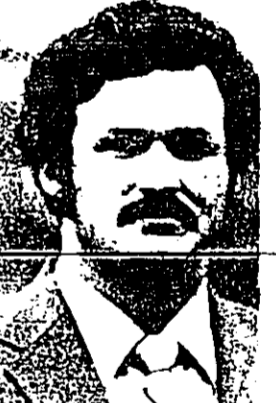

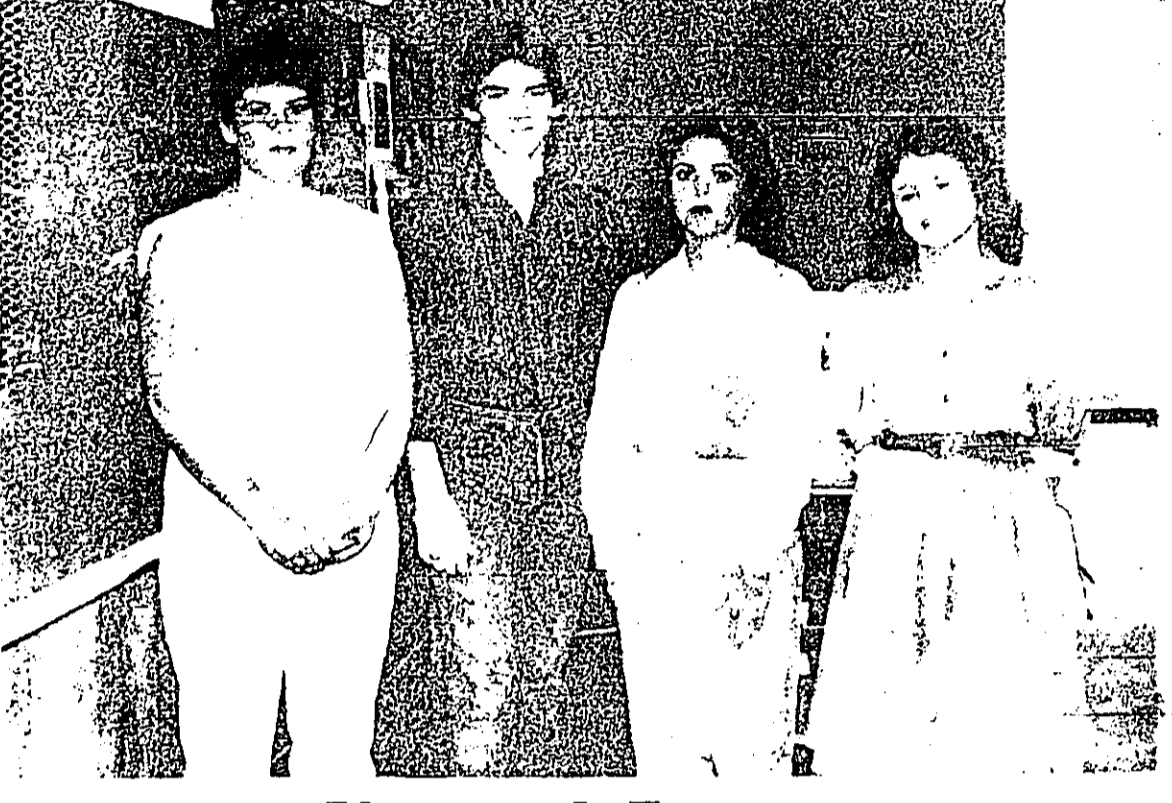
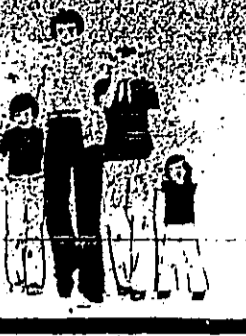
Tyler County MHMR Advisors To Meet

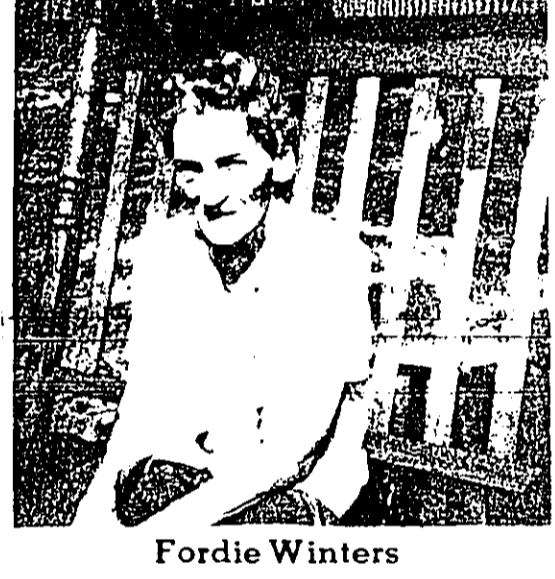

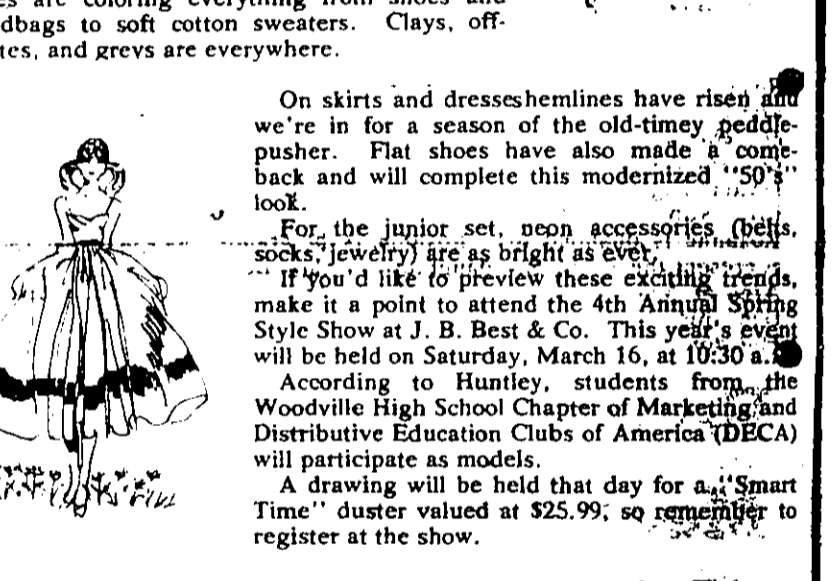
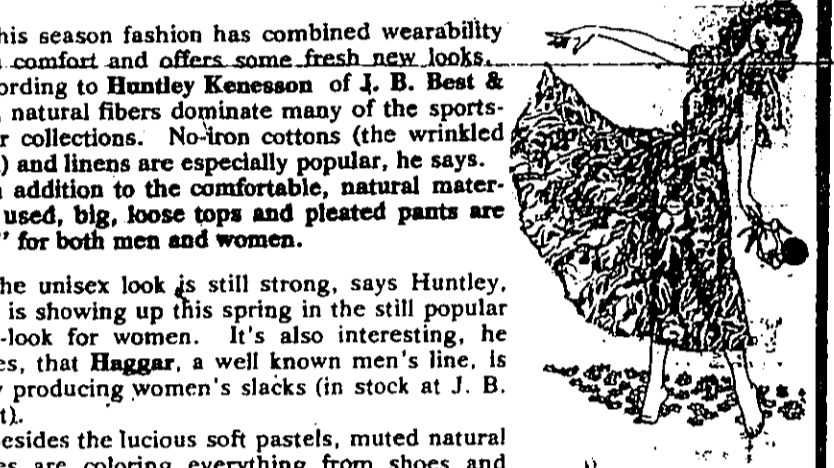
Ruling Allows "Cooling Off" For Purchases

COLLEGE STATION - A new set of pots and pans, a Bible, burglar alarm or family photo album may seem like a good idea when a salesperson brings them to your door. But what if you decide you don't want or can't afford the merchandise you buy from a door-to-door salesperson? You can cancel your order if you don't delay, says a Texas A&M University Agricultural Extension Service consumer economics specialist. A Federal Trade Commission (FTC) ruling allows a three-day "cooling off" period to cancel if the purchase is \$25 or more, says Bonnie L. Piernot. This rule applies only to door-to-door sales not in-store sales. The sales person must provide a fully completed contract including the date of the sale, name and address of the seller, and a statement in Spanish, French or German. The specialist points out that the contract and notice must be in the same language as the salesperson uses in the sales pitch. If the sale was made in Spanish, for example, then the contract notice must be in Spanish. The specialist says the seller must refund the money within 10 business days of up at your home. If you agree to ship the item back, the seller must pay the shipping costs. But if the merchandise is not picked up within 20 days, you may keep the goods without obligation.

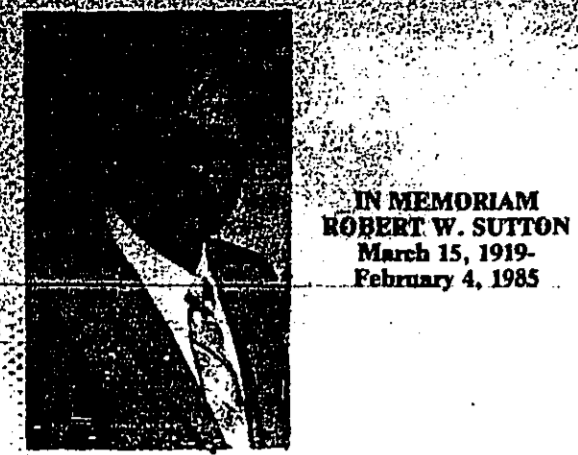

My first trip to the grand state of Texas proved Solomon's wisdom true beyond a doubt. For what was originally planned as a cheerful three-day visit to Beaumont before taking up a new reporting assignment, changed profoundly in character when it happened to coincide with the death of a uniquely Texas man, Robert Sutton.

Coincidentally with this Dole announcement, a very significant report was published by the Council of Economic Advisors stating that the elderly are well off and had fared very well over the last years. While elderly economic status has improved the fact is that they are not better off. Older persons still have the highest rate of poverty of any adult age group. The median income of an elderly household is only half that of the non-elderly household. A one year freeze in Social Security would push 500,000 into poverty. "In addition to our major concerns is the additional burden the budget will place on Medicare benefits. Their premiums will more than double by 1990. This proposal, in addition to huge increases in beneficiaries cost sharing under Medicare Part B, will increase costs for many years. They are already paying for over 60 percent of their health care charges," he said. Beyond increasing the cost to beneficiaries, these proposals will also encourage physicians and other providers to shift costs to other patients, merely continuing the enormous inflation rate in the health care sector. What is needed, Brickfield said, are effective policies to reduce the nation's health care bill not more money to pay the bill. In addition to health care cost constraints, AARP advocates reform that will curb unwarranted tax preferences as methods to deal with the budget deficit. Brickfield said that AARP would mobilize its extensive grass-roots advocacy network to influence congressional committees to reshape the budget in ways that will better serve the needs of older Americans.
